WHEREAS by the 4th section of the Stamp Statute 1869 (No. 355) it was provided that, from and after such time or respective times as the Governor in Council should from time to time by notice published in the Government Gazette appoint, the following Fees, or such of them as should be specified in such notice, or respective notices, should be collected by stamps, namely:— All fees payable to the Crown or the Consolidated Revenue of Victoria, or to the several officers of Government in the several courts and offices in respect of matters or things to be done or performed under certain enactments specified in the schedule to the said Act; and all fees payable to the Crown or the Consolidated Revenue of Victoria, or to any officers of the Government under any other enactment which the Governor in Council should by any such notice in the Government Gazette direct to be collected by stamps: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this present Order give the notice hereinafter contained, viz:—

All fees payable under the subjoined Act, viz:—

An Act for the Legalization of Trades Unions, No. 822,

shall be collected by stamps from and after the date hereof, and all the rules in relation to fee-stamps now in force shall, so far as the same are applicable, be applied in regard to the collection of fees by virtue of this notice.

ADDITIONAL LIGHT, TANGALUMA, AND ALTERATION OF COWAN COWAN LIGHT, MORETON BAY.

NOTICE is hereby given that, in pursuance of a notice issued from this office on the 15th ultimo respecting an alteration in the lighting of the North Channel into Moreton Bay, the new light at Tangaluma was exhibited on the 4th instant, and the light at Cowan Cowan opened out so as to show to the eastward of the Floating Beacon.

Vessels from the southward will, after shutting in the red sector from Comboyuro Point, open out the light at Tangaluma as a faint light, clear of the high land of Moreton Island on a S. 4 E. bearing. The light will increase in power until it bears about S. by E. southerly; its full brilliancy extending over a sector of about 10°.

The Cowan Cowan Light opens out when in line with the position of the lighthouse at Comboyuro Point.

When vessels are meeting one another with the lights in line, the vessel inward bound is, in passing, to keep the lights open to the westward.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony bearing date the twentieth day of June One thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, and issued in pursuance of *The Public Health Statute 1865*, it was notified that all the Chinese Ports were infected with Small-pox, and that it was probable that such disease might be brought from such places to Victoria: And whereas by another Proclamation, bearing dated the nineteenth day of May One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, it was similarly notified that the island of Sumatra was infected with Cholera: And whereas by another Proclamation, bearing date the fourth day of September One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, it was similarly notified that all the Ports in the Philippine Islands were infected with Cholera: And whereas by another Proclamation, bearing date the sixteenth day of July One thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, it was similarly notified that the Ports of China, the Islands of the Eastern Archipelago, and the Colony of Fiji were infected with Cholera: And whereas by a Proclamation, bearing date the seventeenth day of September One thousand eight hundred and eighty-three the hereinbefore mentioned Proclamation of the sixteenth day of July One thousand eight hundred and eighty-three was revoked so far as it related to the colony of Fiji: And whereas it is expedient to revoke the said Proclamations hereinafter specified: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the following Proclamations, that is to say:—

1. The Proclamation dated the twentieth day of June One thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.
2. The Proclamation dated the nineteenth day of May One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.
3. The Proclamation dated the fourth day of September One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.
4. The Proclamation dated the sixteenth day of July One thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, so far as it relates to the Ports of China and the Islands of the Eastern Archipelago.

North-Western Part.—Commencing at a point on the south bank of the Murray River where the boundary-line between South Australia and Victoria meets it; thence south along the boundary-line to its intersection with the 37th parallel; thence along that parallel to its intersection with the 144th meridian; thence north along that meridian to the Murray River; thence north-westerly along that river to the starting point.

South-Western Part.—Commencing at the intersection of the 37th parallel with the 144th meridian; thence west along the 37th parallel to the South Australian boundary-line; thence south along that line to the coast; thence easterly along the coast-line to the 144th meridian; thence north along the 144th meridian to the starting point.

Eastern Part.—Commencing where the 146th meridian line meets the Murray River; thence south along that meridian to its intersection with the Yarra Yarra River; thence along that river to Hobson's Bay; thence along the bay and the coast-line easterly to Cape Howe; thence north-westerly along the boundary-line between Victoria and New South Wales to its intersection with the Murray River; thence along that river to the starting point.

FORAGE AND TRAVELLING EXPENSES TO POLICE
MAGISTRATES, ETC.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has rescinded, from the 31st January last, the Orders, bearing date the 30th May 1864 and 13th November 1865 respectively, on the subject of allowances for Forage and Travelling Expenses to Police Magistrates when travelling on duty, and has substituted in lieu thereof the Allowances and Regulations relating thereto following, to take effect from and inclusive of 1st February 1885, that is to say:—

SCHEDULE OF ALLOWANCES FOR FORAGE AND TRAVELLING
EXPENSES TO POLICE MAGISTRATES, WARDENS, AND CORONERS
OF VICTORIA WHEN TRAVELLING ON DUTY.

Clause 1.—Police Magistrates shall be paid the actual cost of the necessary means of conveyance for the performance of their official duties on accounts supported by vouchers, or they may be allowed commuted allowances in lieu of the whole or part of such cost, to be fixed by the Solicitor-General or other Minister of the Crown administering the Department, who shall also have power to increase or reduce such allowances at any time.

Clause 2.—Police Magistrates shall, in addition to either of the foregoing allowances, be entitled to the following allowances for personal expenses and livery of horses, or the Minister may fix a commuted allowance in lieu thereof, and may increase or reduce such commuted allowance at any time:—

Clause 3.—A Relieving Police Magistrate or any other Police Magistrate who is required to perform temporarily, in addition to his own duties, those of a Police Magistrate absent either on leave or through illness or otherwise, shall, in addition to either the actual cost of conveyance or commuted allowance in lieu thereof, as mentioned in clause one, and to either the personal allowances or commuted allowance in lieu thereof as mentioned in clause two, as may be decided by the Minister, be paid a relieving allowance of eight shillings, or such other sum as may be fixed by the Minister, for each full day during which such relieving or other Police Magistrate is doing relieving duty in, or in charge of, or in travelling to and from the district or districts. Such daily allowance shall not be paid for any days for which leave of absence may be granted nor for any other days which the Minister may think proper to except, nor for any relieving duty performed in a Melbourne or suburban district, unless sanctioned by the Minister. A Police Magistrate, not being the Relieving Police Magistrate, when acting temporarily out of his district, and who has a commuted allowance for his own district under clause one, shall not, except by sanction of the Minister, be paid in addition thereto, either the actual cost of conveyance or a commuted allowance for the district in which he acts temporarily, unless the travelling by horse and conveyance, &c., in his own district is up to the standard on which the commuted allowance for such district was based.

Clause 4.—A Police Magistrate, having a commuted allowance under clause one, who keeps horses of his own for the performance of his duties, and is absent from duty either on leave or through illness for a period over a fortnight, but not exceeding a month, shall be paid for such period at the rate of half his commuted allowance only. A Police Magistrate, having a commuted allowance under clauses one and two, who keeps horses of his own for the performance of his duties, and is likewise absent, shall be paid at the rate of one-half of that part of his commuted allowance which is left after deducting the portion representing the personal and livery allowances. Except under special circumstance, and upon the approval of the Minister, no commuted allowance shall be paid for any period exceeding one month, nor shall any such allowance be paid to a Police Magistrate who has not kept horses during any period of absence.

NOTES.

Police Magistrates having periodical railway tickets shall use such tickets when travelling on duty only.

All questions as to the interpretation and intention of these regulations shall be decided by the Minister.

These regulations shall not apply to a Police Magistrate when travelling on duty for any other Department, nor to a Police Magistrate of another colony acting within Victoria, nor to any Coroner of Victoria who is not also a Police Magistrate.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled *An Act for Hospitals and Charitable Institutions*, No. 220, it was amongst other things enacted, that any institution established for the cure of disease, or for the relief of diseased, aged, incurable, or destitute persons, and supported in whole or in part by the voluntary contributions of not less than fifty persons, each of whom should have paid not less than One pound per annum or Twenty pounds in one donation, might be incorporated as thereinafter mentioned, and all persons who should have paid as aforesaid should be deemed contributors within the meaning of the said Act; And it was also enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council, on the receipt of a petition signed by not less than twenty-five of the said persons, praying that such institution might be incorporated, to cause the substance or prayer of such petition to be published in the *Government Gazette*, and (if no counter-petition signed by an equal or greater number of such persons, should have been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary within one month after the date of such publication) the Governor in Council might declare the contributors for the time being to such institution to be, and they should thereupon become and continue, a body politic and corporate by the style and title named in the Order in Council, and should have perpetual succession and a common seal: And whereas by an Act passed in the forty-eighth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intitled *An Act to amend an Act intitled "An Act for Hospitals and Charitable Institutions," and for other purposes*, it was enacted that any institution, society or association of persons established or formed or to be established or formed having for its object the saving of human life, the promotion of health, temperance or morality, the prevention of cruelty or vice or other cognate objects of a philanthropic or humane nature, should, subject to the requirements as to voluntary contributions contained in section one of the hereinbefore in part recited Act, be and be deemed to be an institution capable of incorporation under the provisions of the said Act No. 220 and might be incorporated accordingly: And whereas the Governor in Council has received a petition, signed by not less than twenty-five contributors to the society known as the Royal Humane Society of Australasia, praying that the said society may be incorporated: And whereas the substance or prayer of the said petition has been published in the *Government Gazette*, and no counter-petition has been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary within one month after the date of such publication: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, declare the contributors for the time being to the society called and known as the Royal Humane Society of Australasia, situated at Melbourne, in the colony of Victoria, to be a body politic and corporate by the style and title of "The Royal Humane Society of Australasia."

SHIRE OF LEIGH.

BYE-LAW No. 1.

A Bye-law of the Shire of Leigh, made under Section 213 of the "Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 1, for regulating the Proceedings of the Council.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the "Local Government Act 1874," the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Leigh order as follows:—

1. *Ordinary meetings.*—The ordinary meetings of the council shall be held at the Shire Hall on the second Wednesday of every month, at Eleven o'clock in the forenoon. The business to commence as soon as the required quorum is present; but should a quorum not be present at the expiration of one hour after the time appointed for meeting, no business shall be transacted at the meeting, and the names of all councillors present shall be recorded in the minute-book by the secretary.

2. *Minutes to be confirmed.*—At every meeting of the council the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any committee presented at such preceding meeting; and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed as required by the Act.

3. *Order of business at meetings.*—After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the council at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (i.) Reading copies of letters sent by the council's authority.
- (ii.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (iii.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (iv.) Presentation of reports of committees.
- (v.) Payments.
- (vi.) Ordinary business.
- (vii.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- (viii.) Extraordinary business and new rules and regulations.
- (ix.) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (x.) Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

4. *Divisions.*—Whenever a division shall be demanded by any councillor, the councillors voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result shall be declared by the chairman. Any councillor present and not voting, not being disabled by law from so doing, shall be guilty of an offence.

5. *Notices of motion.*—All notices of motion shall be in writing, dated and numbered, and shall be given by the intending mover to the secretary at the close of the meeting of council previous to that at which the same is intended to be moved, and all notices so received by the secretary shall be then read aloud by him.

6. *Notices of motion for expenditure.*—No councillor shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion, or any motion, the effect of which, if carried, would involve the expenditure of a sum of money exceeding £50, unless notice of such motion has been given as directed in the last preceding clause.

7. *Motions to be moved in consecutive order.*—All motions on the notice paper shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and numbered; and no such motion shall be proceeded with unless the councillor who has given notice of same, or some one authorized by him, be present when the business is called on. Notices not proceeded with shall be struck off the paper, or may by resolution, duly carried, be allowed to stand over until the next meeting.

8. *Councillors to stand when speaking.*—Any councillor desirous of making a motion or amendment, or of taking any part in discussion, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall stand during the whole time he is speaking, and he shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the councillor calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the councillor in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

9. The chairman shall also stand while addressing the council.

10. *Withdrawal of motions.*—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the council.

11. *Motions must be seconded.*—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote unless it be seconded, but a councillor may require the enforcement of any standing order of the council by directing the chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

12. *Mover and seconder held to have spoken.*—Any councillor moving or seconding any motion or amendment shall be held to have spoken on that motion or amendment.

13. *Priority in speaking.*—If two or more councillors rise to speak at the same time the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority, and neither of them shall speak until the chairman shall have so decided.

14. *Councillors not to speak twice on same question.*—No councillor shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in explanation, when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

15. *Mover to have right of reply.*—The mover of every original motion, but not of any amendment, shall have the right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair, but no councillor shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

16. *Chairman to decide on points of order.*—The chairman when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the

case, without discussing or commenting on the same, and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

17. *Digressions and imputations.*—No councillor shall digress from the subject matter of the question under discussion, and all imputations of improper motives, and all personal reflections on councillors, shall be deemed highly disorderly.

18. *Offensive or disorderly language.*—Whenever any councillor shall make use of any expression disorderly, or capable of being applied offensively to any other councillor, the councillor so offending shall be called to order, and required by the chairman to withdraw the expression, and make a satisfactory apology to the council. Any councillor having been twice called to order, or to withdraw and apologise for offensive or disorderly language, and refusing or omitting to do so, shall be guilty of an offence.

19. A councillor called to order shall sit down unless permitted to explain.

20. Any councillor may require the secretary to take down in writing any particular words used by a councillor immediately on same being spoken.

21. *Disorderly strangers.*—Any person not being a councillor who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the council, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when lawfully requested by the chairman to do so, may be forthwith removed by him, and shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

22. *All motions to be entered on minutes.*—Every motion or amendment shall be entered on the minutes, with the name of the mover and seconder, and the result of the voting thereon, and on a division the secretary may be required by any councillor to record the names of the voters, both in the affirmative and also in the negative.

23. *All motions to be in writing.*—At every meeting of the council all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall be reduced to writing and signed by the mover, and delivered to the chairman immediately on being moved.

24. *Amendments.*—No second or subsequent amendment on any motion or amendment shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of; but, if an amendment be negatived, then another one may be moved to the same question; but only one amendment shall be submitted to the council at a time.

25. *Questions, how decided.*—All questions before the council shall be decided by a show of hands, and the chairman shall, on taking the sense of the council, put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative, and he may do so as often as may be necessary to enable him to decide which side has the majority. Provided always that if at any meeting for the election of president there should be an equality of votes, it shall be decided by lot which of the councillors having equal votes shall be elected president.

26. *Motions for adjournment.*—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the council, but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

27. *Protests.*—Any councillor may protest against any resolution of the council, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the council by the protesting councillor in a book to be kept for that purpose, and signed by such councillor, and shall also be entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given, previous to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the council to be not in accordance with truth, or in its terms disrespectful to the council.

28. *Orders of the day.*—The orders of the day at every meeting of the council shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings, all business of which due notice has been given, and any subject which the president may think fit to bring under consideration.

29. *Petitions.*—Every petition or memorial addressed to the council must be presented by a councillor, who shall acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and ascertain that it does not contain any language disrespectful to the council, and that the contents do not violate any bye-law, or any provision hereof.

30. Every councillor presenting a petition or memorial to the council shall write his name at the commencement thereof.

31. *Appointments to be advertised.*—No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the council shall take place until seven clear days' notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the shire, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same.

32. *Salaries to be fixed.*—The salary or allowance attached to all offices at the disposal of the council shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same; and the amount of such salary or allowance shall be specified in the advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid.

33. *Contracts to be advertised.*—All contracts amounting to £50 or upwards shall be made by tender, and advertised not less than twice in the local newspapers. Tenders shall be addressed to the president, and only opened at the time of their consideration by the council; the respective amounts, together with the names of the parties tendering, to be entered in every case on the minutes of the council.

34. *Tenders and preliminary deposits.*—No tenders for works shall be received unless accompanied by a preliminary deposit according to the following scale, as a guarantee of the *bona fide* intention of the tenderer:—

If the tender does not exceed £100, a deposit of	£2
If the tender is over £100, but does not exceed £200	£3
And for every extra £100, or portion of £100, £1 in addition to the above.	

In the event of the tender not being accepted this deposit to be returned; if the tender is accepted, then this deposit to be taken

as part of the ten per cent. deposit on the contract, or to be absolutely forfeited to the council if the tenderer fails to take up the contract allotted to him.

35. *Securities on contracts.*—In all cases of contract a cash security of £10 per cent. upon the amount of the contract shall be paid by the contractor into the hands of the treasurer, to be deposited in the bank with the other moneys of the council; and only repaid to the contractor when he obtains his final certificate that the works under such contract are satisfactorily completed.

36. *Signing of contracts.*—Within seven clear days from the day on which any tender shall have been accepted by the council, the tenderer or tenderers shall pay the full amount of security, as fixed by the preceding clause, to the treasurer of the shire, and shall sign the contract agreement and all other papers relating to the contract; and if this is not done within the above stated time, the preliminary deposit may be forfeited, and the contract re-advertised, or otherwise dealt with as the council shall direct.

37. *Payments.*—Advances may be made to contractors at a rate not exceeding 90 per cent. on the engineer's estimate of the value of work then done.

38. *Councillors not to be interested in contracts.*—No officer or councillor shall have any pecuniary interest (either directly or indirectly) in any contract under the council, nor shall any such be received as surety for any officer of the council, or for any work to be performed for the council.

39. *Surplus metal.*—When any surplus metal remains after a contract is finished, and the contractor desires to dispose of it to the council, it shall only be purchased subject to the following deductions from the contract price, viz:—

For 10 cubic yards or under	5 per cent. deduction.
From 10 to 20 cubic yards	10 per cent. deduction.
For exceeding 20 cubic yards	25 per cent. deduction.

40. *Payments.*—All payments shall be made by cheque, signed by the president and two other councillors; and no such cheque shall be given unless the account for which it is given be passed at an ordinary meeting of the council.

41. *Statement of accounts.*—The treasurer shall present a statement of the monetary affairs of the council at each ordinary meeting of same.

42. *Collection of rates.*—In all cases it shall be sufficient for the collector to call once for payment of any amount due on the assessment roll, and in the event of any such amount not being paid to him, a notice shall be left stating that unless the amount be paid before the expiration of fourteen days from the date thereof legal proceedings shall be taken for its recovery.

43. *Clauses may be suspended.*—Any one or more of the clauses of this bye-law may be suspended temporarily for a special purpose by the unanimous vote of the council.

44. *Usages of Parliament to be observed.*—In all cases not herein specially provided for, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the council.

45. *Penalty for offences.*—If any person shall be guilty of any wilful offence or of any misfeasance or wilful or negligent act of commission or omission contrary to any provision contained in this bye-law, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding five pounds.

46. *Former bye-laws repealed.*—All bye-laws heretofore made for regulating the proceedings of the council are hereby repealed.

The above bye-law, No. 1, was made by "Special Order" the tenth day of December One thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, and the "Special Order" was duly confirmed, and the Common Seal of the Corporation of the Shire of Leigh was hereunto affixed the fourteenth day of January One thousand eight hundred and eighty-five—

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SHIRE OF LEIGH.
 BYE-LAW No. 2.

A Bye-Law of the Shire of Leigh, made under Section 213 of the "Local Government Act 1874" (No. 506), and numbered 2, for controlling, managing, and preserving the Water Reserves, Reservoirs, and Waterworks in the Shire.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the "Local Government Act 1874," the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Leigh do order as follows:—

1. The water reserves under the control and management of the council, and the ground appertaining thereto, herein called "the Reserves," shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserves who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall in any way damage the trees, shrubs, or young plants, fences, pumps, troughs, pipes, or any other property of the council in or about the reserves.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut their names on fences, seats, or trees, or shall throw stones, or discharge firearms in the reserves.

5. No person shall interfere with, or in any way injure the pipes, valves, taps, standpipes, or other works connected with the reserves or water supply, or shall wilfully or negligently suffer any water to run waste from the same.

6. No person shall bathe in any reservoir, conduit, aqueduct, or other waterworks belonging to or under the control or management of the council, or shall wash, cleanse, throw, or cause to enter therein, any animal, whether alive or dead, or any rubbish, filth, stuff, or thing of any kind whatsoever, or shall cause, permit, or suffer to run or be brought therein the water of any sink, sewer, drain, engine, or boiler, or other filthy, unwholesome, or impure water, or shall do anything whatsoever whereby any water or waterworks belonging to the council, or under their

management or control, shall be fouled, obstructed, or damaged. Any person committing any of the offences mentioned in this clause shall, for every such offence, forfeit on conviction a sum not exceeding Five pounds, and a further sum not exceeding Twenty shillings for each day while such offence is continued after written notice in that behalf.

7. No person shall use any means for taking fish from any reservoir, dam, waterhole, or lagoon, under the control or management of the council, or for destroying any fish in same without the written permission of the council.

8. No person shall place any cattle, sheep, horses, pigs, or goats in the reserves, or allow them to wander on same without the written permission of the council.

9. All dogs, goats, geese, ducks, and poultry found within the enclosed portion of the reserves may be destroyed by any person duly authorized by the council to do so.

10. In addition to the provisions herein contained, it shall be lawful for the council from time to time to make regulations for the maintenance and management of the reserves, reservoirs, and waterworks in the shire.

11. Every person offending against this bye-law, or any portion thereof, or against any regulation hereunder, shall, in accordance with section 108 of the "Land Act 1869," on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each such offence; and every person who shall knowingly and willfully offend against any portion of this bye-law, or any such regulation, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before a justice of the peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

BYE-LAW XII.—NIGHTMEN'S LICENSES.

A Bye-Law for the Licensing and Government of Nightmen within the Shire of Kyneton, and numbered XII.

WHEREAS by the Police Offences Statute 1865, Act 265, it is provided that any person emptying any privy or cesspool, or carting away any nightsoil or any other offensive matter, without a license form, and without having given such security as is required by the local authority (being so far as relates to the said Shire Council thereof), shall on conviction pay a fine not exceeding Twenty pounds.

Now the Council of the Shire of Kyneton doth hereby order and direct as follows, that is to say—

Every person desiring to be licensed as a nightman for the Shire of Kyneton shall yearly lodge with the shire secretary an application in writing setting forth his full name and address, with a certificate of his good character and fitness to be licensed, signed by two respectable householders, appended thereto; and shall deposit the sum of Ten pounds as security, and sign a defesance providing for forfeiture of such sum on any breach of conditions of such license.

Every license shall be numbered with a consecutive number, and the cart employed by any licensed nightman shall bear a corresponding number to that of his license; and such license shall continue and be in force from the date thereof until the 31st day of December then next.

All carts used by any licensed nightman shall be constructed in conformity with the Bye-Laws and Regulations in force in the Shire of Kyneton, and of like pattern and material to those belonging to and in use by the Shire Council.

Every licensed nightman shall produce his license upon demand made by any officer or servant of the Shire Council.

Every nightman's license shall be in the form and be issued subject to the general conditions of license to be endorsed upon such license respectively set forth in the Schedule hereto.

CONDITIONS OF LICENSE.

Every person desirous of carrying on the business of a nightman within the Shire of Kyneton shall make application in writing, stating his true residence, for a license so to do, addressed to the Council of the said shire, and deliver the same at the shire secretary's office. Such application shall be accompanied by a certificate, signed by two ratepayers, certifying to the applicant's fitness to receive such license, and a declaration,

in writing, by the applicant that he will comply with and fulfil in all respects all bye-laws or regulations made by the Council of the said shire, under the Public Health Amendment Statute 1883, as well as all municipal bye-laws or regulations and also all regulations made by the said Council, or under the principal Police Offences Statute or any amendment thereof.

Such license shall remain in force, at whatever period of the year the same shall be granted, until the 31st December next ensuing, unless in the meantime the holder of the same or any of his workmen or servants while acting in the ordinary course of his business shall have been convicted of any offence under any of the bye-laws of the Shire of Kyneton, made under either the Public Health Amendment Statute 1883, the Local Government Act 1874, or any amendment thereof, or under the principal Police Offences Statute or any amendment thereof.

The Council, upon being satisfied of all the premises as to the applicant's fitness, and the fitness and efficiency of the cart proposed to be used, shall be at liberty to issue such license; and in the construction of these conditions "Nightman" shall mean any person who for any monetary remuneration or for any other consideration shall remove any nightsoil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter, whether disinfected or deodorized or not, or any ammoniacal liquor or other offensive liquor.

Before any applicant for the issue of a nightman's license shall be entitled to the issue of the same after approval by the council as aforesaid, he shall deposit with the shire secretary of the said shire the sum of Ten pounds, to be absolutely forfeited to the municipal fund if he or his workmen while acting as aforesaid be convicted of any offence as aforesaid or on breach of these conditions, and such deposit shall be held by the shire secretary during the existence of the license.

Every such licensed nightman shall endorse on his license on the issue of the same the true name and address of his workmen, and shall as frequently as his workmen are changed endorse such change of name and register the same with the shire secretary, and shall while he or any of his workmen are employed about his said business carry with him his said license or a copy thereof certified as such under the hand of the said shire secretary, and produce the same respectively when required by any officer of the local board of health, any police constable, or any other municipal officer.

Every such nightman shall, whilst using any cart, have painted in white on a black ground on the right or off side in a conspicuous place his name and the number (of not less than two inches in length and of proportionate breadth) assigned to his license, together with the words "Licensed Nightman" in letters of not less than two inches in length and of proportionate breadth, and shall keep the same clear and distinguishable during the existence of his license.

He shall also, while such cart is being used in the course of his business, keep two lamps (on the front glass of which respectively shall be painted the number of his license) properly lighted and at all times legible and conspicuous, one affixed to his cart at the front and the other at the back thereof.
