The estimated population of Melbourne and suburbs (Greater Melbourne) about the end of the third quarter of 1884 was 322,690, the increase upon the estimate made twelve months previously being 18,281.

The births in 1884 numbered 10,911, or 33.81 to every 1,000 of the population. This birth-rate is higher than that recorded in any year since 1873, except 1878.

By the following figures, which relate to the census year, it would appear that the birth-rate of Melbourne is slightly higher than that of Hobart, but lower than that of the metropolis of any other Australasian colony:—

The deaths in Melbourne numbered 6,628, or 20.53 per 1,000 of the population. This death-rate was slightly above the average of the decade 1871-80, and was also above that in 1881 and 1883; it was, however, lower than that in 1882.

In the census year the death-rate of Melbourne was below that of Adelaide or Hobart, but was above that of Sydney or Brisbane, as is shown by the following figures:—

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the year was 100.7° on the 13th February, and the lowest was 29.9° on the 24th July. The mean temperature of the year (55.7°) was half a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (41.5°) took place on the 19th January, viz., from a maximum of 97.8° to a minimum of 56.3°. The least range (3.6°) was on the 11th May, viz., from a maximum of 56.0° to a minimum of 52.4°. The mean daily range was 17.9°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.945 inches) was slightly above the average. Rain fell on 157 days, and the amount of rain was 23.8 inches, which, though a fraction above that in 1883, was nearly 2 inches below the average.

Of the births registered in 1884, 51.3 per cent. were of males, and 48.7 per cent. were of females. Of the deaths during the year, 53 per cent. were of males, and 47 per cent. were of females. Children under the age of 5 years contributed 41 per cent. to the total mortality, as against 36 per cent. in 1883; 40 per cent. in 1882; 38 per cent. in 1881; 40 per cent. in 1880 and 1879; 37 per cent. in 1878; 42 per cent. in 1877; 40 per cent. in 1876; 48 per cent. in 1875; 43 per cent. in 1874, and 42 per cent. in 1873.

The deaths of 261 persons, viz., 129 males and 132 females, of the age of 75 years or upwards, occurred during 1884, or only 11 less than in the previous year. Of these, 140 were between 75 and 80; 72 between 80 and 85; 42 between 85 and 90; and 7 between 90 and 95. Of the deaths recorded during the year, 268—of which 206 were of males and 62 of females—were from external causes; 218 being ascribed to accident, 13 to homicide, 35 to suicide, and 2 to judicial hanging. The accidental deaths occurred as follow:—(1) *Railway accidents*, 10, viz.:—Run over on line, 8; crushed by carriage, 1; collision, 1. (2) *Mechanical injuries, &c. (not on railways)*.—Falls, 37, viz.:—In walking 1, from a height 3, from a scaffold 3, down stairs 3, into a hole 2, into the graving dock 1, off an omnibus 1, out of bed 2, turning a somersault 1, in ships &c. 2, of heavy substance on 5, unspecified 13; accidents with horses, 5; with horse-vehicles, 29; fractures (unspecified), 8; crushed by machinery, 2; explosion of boiler, 2; injuries at birth, 4; gunshot, 2; cuts, 3; injuries with tetanus supervening, 4. (3) *Chemical injuries (not on railways)*.—Burns, 9, viz.:—Clothes catching fire 3, conflagration 1, unspecified 5. Scalds, 6, viz.:—By hot water falling upon 1, falling into hot water 2, drinking hot water 1, unspecified 2; sunstroke, 1; poison, 6, viz.:—morphia 1, laudanum 1, green paint powder 1, spirit of salt 1, lead 1, snake-bite 1. Of the homicidal deaths, 4 infants were strangled at birth, and 2 others died of hæmorrhage from the navel, wilfully or negligently caused; 2 females, aged 50 and 57 respectively, were murdered by their husbands, and a publican, aged 58, died of injuries inflicted by his wife (manslaughter); a female, aged 48, was shot in the head; a market gardener, aged 40, died of gunshot wounds wilfully inflicted; a storekeeper, aged 48, was suffocated, and a prisoner was shot dead by a warder, whilst attempting to escape from custody. Of those who committed suicide—9 shot themselves, 6 cut their throats, 6 poisoned themselves, viz.:—1 with laudanum, 1 with strychnine, 1 with arsenic, 1 with corrosive sublimate, and 2 with poisons unspecified; 7 drowned and 4 hanged themselves, and 1 jumped from a house-top. The 13 victims to homicide comprised 2 male and 4 female infants, 3 female adults, and 4 male adults, viz.:—1 publican, 1 market gardener, and 2 laborers. Of those who committed suicide, the following were the occupations:—Missionary, 1; medical student, 1; merchant, dealer, 2; storekeeper, 1; hawker, 1; accountant, 1; bank clerk, 2; clerks (undefined), 2; hotelkeeper, 1; cook (female), 1; blacksmiths, 2; carpenter, 1; painter, 1; station servant, 1; woolsorter, 1; farmer, 1; carrier, 1; cabdriver, 1; ship's watchman, 1; lumpers, 1; baker, 1; meat preserver, 1; dairyman, &c., 2; caterer, 1; laborers, 2; gentleman, 1; no occupation, unspecified, 3, of whom 2 were females.

Twelve hundred and eighty-five deaths, or 19 per cent. of the whole, took place in Public Institutions, viz.:—568 in the Melbourne, 140 in the Alfred, 118 in the Lying-in, 33 in the Children's, 9 in the Homœopathic, and 14 in the Austin Hospital; 72 in the Yarra Bend, and 89 in the Metropolitan (Kew) Lunatic Asylum; 90 in the Immigrants' Home, 107 in the Benevolent Asylum; 1 in the Blind Asylum, 2 in the Infant Asylum, 8 in the Protestant Refuge, 28 in the Melbourne Gaol, 5 in the Penal Establishment at Pentridge; and 1 in the Inebriate Retreat.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 2745, of whom 1440, or 52 per cent., were males, and 1305, or 48 per cent., were females. Of those who died, 1832 were under one year of age, 522 were between one and two, 198 were between two and three, 109 were between three and four, and 84 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 3883. Of these 2094, or 54 per cent., were males, and 1789, or 46 per cent., were females; 155 were between five and ten, 101 were between ten and fifteen, 192 were between fifteen and twenty, 334 were between twenty and twenty-five, 305 were between twenty-five and thirty, 255 were between thirty and thirty-five, 277 were between thirty-five and forty, 270 were between forty and forty-five, 319 were between forty-five and fifty, 334 were between fifty and fifty-five, 318 were between fifty-five and sixty, 302 were between sixty and sixty-five, 255 were between sixty-five and seventy, 204 were between seventy and seventy-five, 140 were between seventy-five and eighty, 121 were upwards of eighty, and of 1 the age was unspecified.

It has been already stated that, as compared with the previous year, there was an increase of 705 in the total number of deaths. This increased mortality was mainly confined to children under the age of five years, whose deaths were more numerous by 594 than in 1883; whereas those of persons over the age of five years increased by only 111. The following table shows the cause of death of persons of both sexes under and over five years of age, and the proportions per cent. of deaths from each cause in Melbourne and suburbs during the year under review:—

As compared with the previous year, there was an increase in the deaths from all classes of diseases, except the violence class—in which a decrease of 33 occurred; thus, deaths from zymotic diseases increased by 204, constitutional diseases by 137, local diseases by 328, and developmental diseases by 68. In regard to zymotic diseases, it is noticed that an outbreak of measles and whooping-cough in an epidemic form occurred during the year, the former of which caused 176 deaths, or 2 more than in the outbreak of 1880, and the latter caused 161 deaths, a number which had only been exceeded twice in the previous 13 years. Amongst other zymotic diseases, fatal cases of croup and diphtheria rose from 59 in 1883 to 99 in the year under review, and cases of metria from 17 to 33; but, on the other hand, deaths from dysentery and diarrhoea decreased from 506 to 384—an unusually low number, and those from typhoid fever from 275 to 220—a number still somewhat above the average. The increase in deaths from constitutional diseases is mainly due to phthisis, which caused the unprecedented number of 789 deaths, or 111 more than in 1883. Under the head of local diseases, the increase was chiefly made up of an increased mortality of 118 from brain diseases, of 37 and 68 from bronchitis and pneumonia respectively, and of 70 from stomach and liver complaints—all which causes were far more fatal than in any previous year; also an increase of 43 from kidney diseases and other urinary complaints. The developmental diseases from which an increased mortality occurred were childbirth, which caused 60 deaths as against only 37 in 1883, and atrophy and debility, which caused 482 as against 417; but from other diseases in this class there was a net decrease of 20. Deaths from violence as a whole decreased, as already stated, by 33; but notwithstanding this, murders and homicides increased from 8 in 1883 to 13 in 1884, suicides from 30 to 35, and executions from nil to 2. Childbirth and metria combined, as is usual during the prevalence of any epidemic, caused a very high mortality, viz., 93 deaths, or 39 more than in the previous year. In proportion to the births registered, the fatality of these complaints in 1884 was much above the average, one death of a mother having occurred to every 117 births as compared with 1 to every 187 in 1883, and the high rate of 1 to every 90 in 1881, the average during the period 1871–80 being 1 to every 155. The following is a summary of the deaths from some of the principal diseases during the last fourteen years, the average of the ten years 1871–80 being also shown:—

The Proclamation bearing date the twenty-seventh day of January One thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, proclaiming the locality known as Simmons' Reef, near Blackwood, a District under the provisions of the said section.

And, with the advice aforesaid, do proclaim an area within half a mile radius of the State School Reserve, on the Samaria Road from Benalla to Mansfield, to be a District wherein publicans' licenses may be specially granted under the provisions of the 44th section of the said Act.

FORAGE AND TRAVELLING EXPENSES TO POLICE MAGISTRATES, ETC.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has rescinded, from the 31st January last, the Orders, bearing date the 30th May 1864 and 13th November 1865 respectively, on the subject of allowances for Forage and Travelling Expenses to Police Magistrates when travelling on duty, and has substituted in lieu thereof the Allowances and Regulations relating thereto following, to take effect from and inclusive of 1st February 1885, that is to say:—

SCHEDULE OF ALLOWANCES FOR FORAGE AND TRAVELLING EXPENSES TO POLICE MAGISTRATES, WARDENS, AND CORONERS OF VICTORIA WHEN TRAVELLING ON DUTY.

Clause 1.—Police Magistrates shall be paid the actual cost of the necessary means of conveyance for the performance of their official duties on accounts supported by vouchers, or they may be allowed commuted allowances in lieu of the whole or part of such cost, to be fixed by the Solicitor-General or other Minister of the Crown administering the Department, who shall also have power to increase or reduce such allowances at any time.

Clause 2.—Police Magistrates shall, in addition to either of the foregoing allowances, be entitled to the following allowances for personal expenses and livery of horses, or the Minister may fix a commuted allowance in lieu thereof, and may increase or reduce such commuted allowance at any time:—

(a) For every day on which a Police Magistrate necessarily travels on duty within his district a journey of fifteen and less than thirty miles	£ s. d. 0 5 0
(b) The like thirty miles and over; or for every full day on which a Police Magistrate is necessarily detained on duty at any place within his district other than his head quarters and does not actually travel any journey	0 8 0
(c) For every occasion on which in travelling on duty within his district a Police Magistrate actually and necessarily stays for the night at an hotel	0 7 0
(d) And actually and necessarily puts up his horse at a livery stable or purchases forage for the night	0 7 0
(e) The like for two horses when the distance to be travelled or the state of the roads necessitates the use of two horses (a special report of the same to be attached to the account)	0 14 0

Clause 3.—A Relieving Police Magistrate or any other Police Magistrate who is required to perform temporarily, in addition to his own duties, those of a Police Magistrate absent either on leave or through illness or otherwise, shall, in addition to either the actual cost of conveyance or commuted allowance in lieu thereof, as mentioned in clause one, and to either the personal allowances or commuted allowance in lieu thereof as mentioned in clause two, as may be decided by the Minister, be paid a relieving allowance of eight shillings, or such other sum as may be fixed by the Minister, for each full day during which such relieving or other Police Magistrate is doing relieving duty in, or in charge of, or in travelling to and from the district or districts. Such daily allowance shall not be paid for any days for which leave of absence may be granted nor for any other days which the Minister may think proper to except, nor for any relieving duty performed in a Melbourne or suburban district, unless sanctioned by the Minister. A Police Magistrate, not being the Relieving Police Magistrate, when acting temporarily out of his district, and who has a commuted allowance for his own district under clause one, shall not, except by sanction of the Minister, be paid in addition thereto, either the actual cost of conveyance or a commuted allowance for the district in which he acts temporarily, unless the travelling by horse and conveyance, &c., in his own district is up to the standard on which the commuted allowance for such district was based.

Clause 4.—A Police Magistrate, having a commuted allowance under clause one, who keeps horses of his own for the performance of his duties, and is absent from duty either on leave or through illness for a period over a fortnight, but not exceeding a month, shall be paid for such period at the rate of half his commuted allowance only. A Police Magistrate, having a commuted allowance under clauses one and two, who keeps horses of his own for the performance of his duties, and is likewise absent, shall be paid at the rate of one-half of that part of his commuted allowance which is left after deducting the portion representing the personal and livery allowances. Except under special circumstances, and upon the approval of the Minister, no commuted allowance shall be paid for any period exceeding one month, nor shall any such allowance be paid to a Police Magistrate who has not kept horses during any period of absence.

NOTES.

Police Magistrates having periodical railway tickets shall use such tickets when travelling on duty only.

All questions as to the interpretation and intention of these regulations shall be decided by the Minister.

These regulations shall not apply to a Police Magistrate when travelling on duty for any other Department, nor to a Police Magistrate of another colony acting within Victoria, nor to any Coroner of Victoria who is not also a Police Magistrate.

COLAC COLAC.—The Order in Council of the 15th November 1880, withholding from the operation of the 19th section of *The Land Act 1869* the Crown land situate within a distance of twenty chains from either bank of a portion of Thowgla Creek, has been revoked, so far as it relates to the portion thereof, in the parish of Colac Colac, applied for under the said section by Henry Nankervis (No. 9416).

EAGLEHAWK.—Land excepted from occupation for residence or business under any miner's right or business license.—One acre three roods thirty-six perches, county of Bendigo, parish of Sandhurst, municipal district of Eaglehawk, being allotments 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, and 13, of section 11, temporarily reserved as sites for a Post Office and Public Buildings.—(S.198⁽⁵⁾) (85.B.37401.)

WYCHEPROOF.—The Order in Council of the 23rd January 1883, excepting from occupation for residence or business under any miner's right or business license, and withholding from sale, leasing, and licensing, three hundred and nineteen acres three roods thirty-three perches of land in the parish of Wycheproof, being allotment 10 of section 1, has been revoked, excepting so far as it relates to the portion thereof hereinafter described, viz.:—Ten acres; Commencing at a point bearing west eight chains eighty-five links from the north-west angle of allotment 9; bounded thence by lines bearing respectively south ten chains, west ten chains, and north ten chains; and thence by a road bearing east ten chains to the point of commencement. The bearings are from the true meridian.—(W.287⁽¹⁾) (82.8202/10.)

A BILL TO CONFER POWERS UPON THE AUSTRALIAN EXECUTORS AND TRUSTEES ASSOCIATION LIMITED.

NOTICE is hereby given that application is intended to be made in the ensuing session of the Parliament of Victoria for leave to bring in a Bill for the following objects, that is to say:—

1. To enable the Australian Executors and Trustees Association Limited, a company incorporated under the Companies Statute 1864, hereinafter referred to as "the company," to act as executor or administrator whether upon an intestacy or with the will annexed or as a trustee.
 2. To enable executors or persons entitled to obtain administration of estates to appoint the company to obtain probate or letters of administration as their nominee.
 3. To enable the company to be appointed and to act as a temporary executor, administrator, or trustee during the temporary absence of an executor, administrator, or trustee.
 4. To provide that, when the paid-up capital of the company shall amount to £20,000, no administration bond shall be required when administration is granted to the company.
 5. To enable any court having power to appoint a trustee or receiver or committee of the estate of a lunatic to appoint the company to be a trustee, receiver, or committee.
 6. To enable any executor or administrator, trustee, or receiver, howsoever appointed, or any committee in lunacy, to appoint the company to act as executor, administrator, trustee, receiver, or committee in his stead.
 7. To make the manager of the company personally responsible to the court for the acts and defaults of the company.
 8. MODEL BY-LAWS UNDER "THE PUBLIC HEALTH AMENDMENT STATUTE 1883," PREPARED FOR THE GUIDANCE OF LOCAL BOARDS OF HEALTH, UNDER THE DIRECTION OF THE CENTRAL BOARD OF HEALTH.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and of every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Local Board of Health for Shire of Jilka for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within its jurisdiction, doth hereby make the by-laws following, that is to say:—

Interpretation of Terms.

1. In the construction and for the purposes of these by-laws, the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them.

"House" shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public-houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging-houses, or other buildings or premises.

"Cesspool" shall mean any receptacle for night-soil or for noxious or offensive matter below or above the ground.

"Street" shall mean and include any highway and any public bridge, and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

Premises to be kept so as not to be a Nuisance.

2. Every occupier or person having the management or control of any house or premises shall cause the same to be kept in such a state as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

Removal of Refuse from Places where Animals are kept.

7. Every occupier of land on which is erected any stable, shed, sty, yard, or other place for the keeping of animals shall from time to time remove from such premises all dung, soil, or other manure produced or accumulated thereon as often as the same shall amount to [two cubic yards] (or once at least every week); and in case of the default of such occupier the Local Board may remove the same.

Power to use Refuse as Manure.

8. Nothing contained in the foregoing by-laws shall be taken to prevent the occupier of any premises from causing any dung, soil, or other refuse matter produced or accumulated on any premises to be at any time removed, or to be used as manure on any garden or land, or to be kept for the purpose of being used on any garden or land contiguous to such premises as manure, so that the same be not so removed, kept, or used as to contravene any by-law of the Local Board of Health, or so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

Removal of Refuse from Places where Noxious or Offensive Trades are carried on.

9. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of premises used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, or manufactory whatsoever shall cause all rubbish, filth, offal, soil or other offensive matters, and all waste products of such manufacture from which effluvia may arise, to be removed from such premises once at least in every [twenty-four] hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and so that no noxious or offensive effluvia arise therefrom; and if any such occupier or person shall neglect or fail to have removed any such offensive matter or waste products as aforesaid the same may be removed by the Local Board of Health.

Removal of Blood from places where Animals are Slaughtered.

10. Every occupier, licensee, or person having the management or control of an abattoir, slaughter-house, or place where any cattle or other animals are killed, shall cause all the blood from the animals killed therein, as soon as conveniently may be, to be collected in a fit receptacle to be provided for that purpose, and to be effectually deodorized by mixing therewith commercial sulphate of iron or chloride of lime, in the proportion of 1lb. to the gallon, or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient to effectually deodorize the same, and to be removed from the premises within [twenty-four] hours after such blood is shed.

Removal of Offal.

11. Every occupier of any premises on which may be any offal, shall forthwith effectually deodorize the same, and remove the same from the premises within twenty-four hours.

Construction of Privy.

12. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than 3 inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan or other movable receptacle for night-soil, the content whereof does not exceed 1 cubic foot, and with the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and the contents thereof, and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, workroom, or common lodging-house, and every public privy, shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half-an-inch to the foot. [See section 97 of "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883" (2).]

Supply of Deodorizing Material to Earth-closets.

13. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises, shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

Emptying Receptacles for Night-soil.

14. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises once at least in every week shall empty or cleanse, or cause to be emptied or cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

Removal of Night soil to be by properly constructed Conveyances.

15. No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents or of any portion thereof, or of effluvia therefrom.

Hours within which Night-soil may be removed.

17. No person shall empty, assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, except between the hours of 10 and 5, or until the contents thereof have been properly deodorized; and every person emptying, or causing to be emptied, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, shall cause the night-soil taken therefrom to be removed as soon as the same is emptied.

Construction of Cesspools.

18. Every cesspool shall be furnished with a watertight cover or roof, and every cesspool which shall be formed or made below the surface of the ground shall be constructed with watertight walls or sides which project on all sides at least 6 inches above the surface of the ground. [See section 92 (sub-section 2) and sections 123, 124, and 125 of "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883."]

Emptying of Cesspools.

19. Every occupier of premises, and every person having the management or control of premises, on which there shall be any cesspool shall cause the same to be emptied once at least in every week.

Times within which Cesspools may be emptied.

20. No person shall empty or assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied, any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse and offensive matter, except between the hours of 10 p.m. and 5 a.m., or until such contents have been properly deodorized; and every person emptying, or causing to be emptied, any cesspool, shall remove, or cause to be removed, the contents thereof so soon as the same is emptied.

Conveyances by which Cesspools may be emptied.

22. No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse and offensive matter except by means of a cart, carriage, or other conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents, or of any portion thereof, or of any effluvia therefrom.

Disposal of Refuse and Offensive Matter.

23. No person shall place or deposit any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil, or any night-soil or other offensive matter, in any place so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to health.

Earth-closets, &c., not to be emptied into Drains or Sewers.

25. No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter, into any drain or sewer, or so that the contents thereof may find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any drain or sewer.

Prevention of Pollution of Water.

26. No person shall place, assist in placing, or cause or permit to be placed, in or so that the same may, or may be likely, to find its way into any water used, or likely to be used, by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used, in any dairy, any matter or thing likely to endanger the health of any persons using such water or drinks or milk or other produce of such dairy. [See also section 112 of "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883."]

Cesspools not to be emptied into Water used for Drinking or Domestic Purposes.

27. No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse matter, into any water supplied, used or likely to be used, by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, or so that the contents or any portion of the contents thereof may find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any such water.

28. Every accumulation or deposit of offensive matter so situated as to find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or likely to be used in any dairy, shall be deodorized and removed by the owner of the property upon which such accumulation or deposit is situated within [one week] of notice given by the Local Board or by one of its officers. [See section 142 of "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883."]

Keeping of Animals.

29. No person shall keep any animal of any kind so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health. [See also sections 128, 129, and 130 of "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883."]

Animals not to be so kept as to pollute Water.

30. No person shall keep any animal in such a manner as to pollute any water used, or likely to be used, by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used, or likely to be used, in any dairy, so as to endanger the health of any person using such water or drinks or milk or other produce of such dairy.

Supply of Water to Slaughter-houses.

31. Every occupier or licensee or person having the management or control of a slaughter-house or abattoir shall cause the same to be supplied with a sufficient quantity of water for all purposes.

Drainage of New Buildings.

32. Every person erecting, or causing to be erected, any new building shall cause the foundations thereof, and the ground over which such building is to be placed, to be rendered dry, sound, and well drained, so that no water soakage or damp shall lodge there. [See section 24 of "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883."]

Drainage of Existing Buildings.

33. Every owner of a building shall cause the same to be provided with proper and sufficient drains, so constructed as to prevent any nuisance arising therefrom, and to secure the health-

fulness of the inmates of such building; and every tenant of a building under a lease of which fourteen years or upwards is unexpired shall be deemed an owner within the meaning of this section. [See sections 114 and 112 of "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883."]

Registration of Cow-keepers, Dairymen, and Purveyors of Milk.

34. Every person carrying on the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of [March] in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of One pound.*

35. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the secretary for the Local Board of Health shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

Milk Stores and Shops to be kept clean.

36. Every person following the trade of cow-keeper or dairyman shall cause every milk store or milk shop in his occupation, or under his management or control, and every milk vessel used by him for containing milk for sale, to be kept thoroughly clean.

Dairymen, &c., to report Disease to the Health Officer.

37. Every person carrying on the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, and every person having the management of any such trade, shall forthwith report in writing to the health officer the occurrence of any disease in any of his milk cows, or of any contagious or infectious disease in man or animal, upon the premises upon which such trade is carried on.

Extent of Application of By-laws.

38. The foregoing by-law, numbered 19, shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the place or places within the jurisdiction of the Local Board of Health for

39. A By-law of the Local Board of Health for Shire Jika for the prevention of the use of Steam Whistles at factories or other establishments so as to be a nuisance to any person.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, the Local Board of Health for Jika doth hereby make the by-law following, that is to say :-

No person shall use, cause to be used, or assist in using, any steam whistle at any factory or other establishment so as to be a nuisance to any person; and no person who occupies or has the management or control of any factory or other establishment shall suffer or permit any steam whistle to be used thereat so as to be a nuisance to any person.

Every person who shall commit a breach of this by-law shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings.

This by-law shall apply to and be in force in the whole of the place or places within the jurisdiction of the Local Board of Health aforesaid.

40. The foregoing by-law [numbered 20] shall apply to and have operation in the part of the place or places within the jurisdiction of the Local Board of Health for the Shire of Jika following, that is to say, the said Shire.

Penalties.

41. If any person commit a breach of any of the foregoing by-laws, he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10, or to a penalty not exceeding £5 for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued. Provided the justices before whom any penalty imposed hereby is sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid. And every person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the foregoing penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by these by-laws or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such Local Board of Health have or have not taken advantage of such powers.

* The amount of the fee must not exceed £1.



