## BELGIAN VESSELS.

THE accompanying copy of an Order of the Queen in Council exempting from re-measurement in any port or place in Her Majesty's dominions, Belgian vessels, the tonnage of which is denoted in the certificates of Belgian nationality or registry, issued after the 1st of January 1884, which has been received by His Excellency the Governor from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, is published for general information.

PRESENT:

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by *The Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act 1862* it is enacted that, whenever it is made to appear to Her Majesty that the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of merchant ships for the time being in force under the Principal Act have been adopted by the Government of any foreign country, and are in force in that country, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by Order in Council, to direct that the ships of such foreign country shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry, or other national papers; and thereupon it shall no longer be necessary for such ships to be re-measured in any port or place in Her Majesty's dominions, but such ships shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry, or other papers, in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purpose, in, to and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificates of registry of British ships is to be deemed the tonnage of such ships:

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of merchant ships now in force under *The Merchant Shipping Act 1854* have been adopted by the Government of His Majesty the King of the Belgians, with the exception of a slight difference in the mode of estimating the allowance for engine-room, and such rules are now in force in that country, having come into operation on the 1st day of January 1884:

Her Majesty is hereby pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to direct as follows:

- As regards sailing ships, that merchant sailing ships belonging to Belgium, the measurement whereof on or after the said 1st day of January 1884 shall have been ascertained and denoted in the certificates of registry, or other national papers of such sailing ships, testified by the dates thereof, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in such certificates of registry, or other national papers, in the same manner, and to the same extent, and for the same purpose, in, to and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificates of registry of British sailing ships is deemed to be the tonnage of such ships.
- As regards steamships, that merchant ships belonging to Belgium which are propelled by steam or any other power requiring engine-room, the measurement whereof on or after the said 1st day of January 1884 shall have been ascertained and denoted in the certificates of registry, or other national papers of such steamships, testified by the dates thereof, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in such certificates of registry, or other national papers, in the same manner, and to the same extent, and for the same purpose, in, to and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificates of registry of British ships is deemed to be

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the tonnage of such ship, provided, nevertheless, that, if the owner or master of any such steamship desires the deduction for engine-room in such ship to be estimated under the rules for engine-room measurement and deduction applicable to British ships, instead of under the Belgian rules, the engine-room shall be measured, and the deductions calculated, according to the British rules.

## EXHIBITION OF LEADING-LIGHTS, BLUFF HARBOR.

THE Bluff Harbor Board have given notice that, on and after the 1st January 1885, there will be exhibited at Bluff Harbor a leading-light on each of the two dolphins erected on the Middle Bank, and now used as leading-marks by day. The eastern or outer one will be a fixed red light, and the western or inner one a fixed green light. These lights are to be brought in line when abreast the Perch Buoy, off Te Waewae Point, and so maintained until the two red lights on main wharf are brought in line, when the course may be altered either direct to the wharf or an anchorage off it. The above lights have been erected for the purpose of enabling vessels to enter the harbor at night, and lead through the worst part of the entrance channel, that is from abreast the Perch Buoy to a cable's length above the lightship. Their line will give, between the points named, from 30 feet to 33 feet at low water. They are not intended to be used for any other part of the harbor or entrance.

MINING ON PRIVATE PROPERTY ACT 1884, SEC. 51.  
REGULATION.

WHEREAS by *The Mining on Private Property Act 1884* it was amongst other things enacted that the owner of any private land should be at liberty to enter into agreements in writing with the holders of miners' rights, giving them power to take possession, for gold-mining purposes, of such land as if it were Crown land subject to the mining bye-laws of the district in which such land was situated, and it should not be necessary to obtain any mining lease from the Crown of such private land: Provided that every such agreement should be approved by the warden for the district in which such land was situated, and should also be registered in accordance with Regulations to be made by the Governor in Council: Now therefore the Governor in Council, in pursuance of the said in part recited Act, doth make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

Every agreement entered into between the owner of any private land and the holders of miners' rights shall, if approved by the warden having jurisdiction in the district in which the land the subject of such agreement or the greater part of such land is situated, be registered with such warden within sixty days from the date of such agreement, and such registration shall be in the form in the Schedule hereto, or as near thereto as circumstances will admit.

THE MINING ON PRIVATE PROPERTY ACT 1884,  
SEC. 6.

## REGULATIONS.

**WHEREAS** by *The Mining on Private Property Act 1884* it was amongst other things enacted that where the person or persons claiming the right to mine in or on any private land under any agreement or agreements, either as tributors or sub-tributors, or upon any other condition than that of paying tribute, severally claim a mining lease of such land, the time within such agreements might be registered, the order of priority to be given to the applications of such persons for a lease of such private land, the conditions on which and the terms within which such mining lease might be granted, and generally with regard thereto, should be determined by Regulations in that behalf to be made by the Governor in Council, which Regulations he might from time to time alter and repeal: Now therefore the Governor in Council, in pursuance of the said Act, doth make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

1. Every agreement between any person and the owner of any private land purporting to give such person the right to mine on such land, either as a tributor or sub-tributor, or upon any other condition than that of paying tribute, shall be registered with the warden having jurisdiction in the district in which the land the subject of such agreement or the greater part of such land is situate, within eight months from the passing of *The Mining on Private Property Act 1884*.

2. The order of priority to be given to the applications of such persons as aforesaid for a mining lease of such private land shall (subject to the provisions of section 7 of the said Act) be according to the time at which each application shall have been received by the warden; and if two or more applications for a mining lease of the same land shall have been received at the same time by the warden, then the order of priority shall be determined by the Minister of Mines for the time being, whose decision in that matter shall be final.

3. The conditions on which every such mining lease shall be granted shall be those set forth in the second schedule to *The Mining on Private Property Act 1884*.

4. Every mining lease applied for under the said Act shall, if the application therefor be not previously abandoned or refused, be granted within twelve months after the registration of the agreement as herein provided for, unless the Governor in Council by order under his hand direct the time to be extended in any particular case.

5. The register to be kept in accordance with section 8 of the said Act shall be kept by the warden aforesaid, and shall be in the form set forth in the Schedule to these Regulations, or as near thereto as circumstances will admit.

**GRANT TO AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES.**

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations in connection with the above-named Grant-in-Aid, 1884-85, viz.:—

Regulations for the distribution of the sum of Fifteen thousand pounds (£15,000) granted by Parliament to Agricultural Societies, 1884-85.

1. Each society shall furnish to the Secretary for Agriculture, on or before the 23rd January 1885, a statement in the form marked A, which must be verified by statutory declaration in the form marked E.
2. On receipt of the above-mentioned statement so verified, the Minister of Agriculture may cause to be paid to the treasurer of each society a sum equal to two-thirds of the amount shown

to have been awarded and paid away in prizes not exceeding £25 each (except for the exhibits mentioned in the statement above referred to, and such other exhibits the Minister may consider unsuitable), on condition that this sum do not exceed the amount raised by members' subscriptions and private donations; and if it do exceed the same, that it be in that case reduced to a sum equal to the amount so raised.

3. Of the whole grant (£15,000), a sum not exceeding Fourteen thousand five hundred pounds shall be so divided; and if the sums claimable be in excess of this amount they shall be reduced *pro rata*.

4. A sum not exceeding Five hundred pounds shall be paid to the Echuca Agricultural and Pastoral Society towards the expenses of its spring show, held on the 17th, 18th, and 19th September 1884, under the patronage of the Department of Agriculture.

5. No society located within twenty miles of any other society shall be entitled to participate in the vote unless the sum awarded and paid away in prizes by such society as hereinbefore specified amounts in the total to One hundred pounds at least.

GRANT FOR PUBLIC PARKS AND GARDENS.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations in connection with the above-named Grant, 1884-85, viz. :—

Regulations in connection with the Vote of Nine thousand five hundred pounds (£9500) for Fencing and Improving Public Parks and Gardens under the control of Borough Councils, Trustees, Committees of Management, &c.

1. A sum not exceeding Ten shillings shall be paid to the treasurer of the managing body of any public park or garden having a claim on the vote for every One pound expended by such body on fencing, preparation of land and planting, forming of roads and paths, and such other works as the Minister may approve, in such park or garden between 1st January 1884 and 31st December 1884, out of funds locally contributed, provided such claim be received by the Secretary for Agriculture on or before the 31st January 1885. Every statement of particulars of claim on the vote must be made in the form A, and be accompanied by a declaration in the form B.

2. The term "locally contributed" shall mean and include all moneys voted by the managing body of any public park or garden from its own funds for the fencing and planting of such park or garden, also all moneys voluntarily contributed for the same purpose, between the 1st January 1884 and 31st December 1884; but it shall not mean nor include any sums advanced by any bank, nor any subsidy paid by Government between the above-mentioned dates, nor the balance of any subsidy paid by Government at any period prior to 1st January 1884.

3. The subsidy or the balance thereof last paid to the managing body of any public park or garden shall be deducted from the return of expenditure for the year 1884 (vide form A), and a sum equal to one-half of the balance then remaining, if made up of local contributions as above interpreted, shall be paid as subsidy; provided that if the claims are in excess of the vote they shall be reduced *pro rata*.

4. In every case in which a claim sent in is deemed unsatisfactory, an officer of the department may be instructed to make an inspection of the books kept by the managing body, and of the vouchers for the several items of expenditure; and if such inspection be refused, the claim shall be disallowed.

5. 7. A sum of Five hundred pounds shall be paid to the Trustees of the Royal Park, Melbourne, to be expended on such works as may be approved by the Minister of Agriculture, and on production of proof of past expenditure of a like amount.

THE TALLYGAROPNA COMMON, Proclaimed by Order of the 18th January 1877, and diminished by Order of the 17th February 1880, is hereby further diminished by deducting therefrom 4500 acres, more or less, of land, being the portion situate within the Municipal District of South Shepparton.—(84.C.44573.)

## PART OF THE SHIRE OF BUNINYONG SEVERED THEREFROM, AND ADDED TO THE SHIRE OF GRENVILLE.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the sixth day of January 1885.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 500, § 19, 38, and 49), it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, to sever any portion of Victoria forming part of a municipal district from such municipal district, and annex the same to any other municipal district with which the portion so severed forms one continuous area, and from time to time make any apportionment of property rights and liabilities and give any directions as to any matters and things that might be necessary to do justice as between the municipalities concerned; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor in the sections of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition of the ratepayers of the shire of Buninyong, and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the same Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order sever from the West Riding of the Shire of Buninyong the portion of the shire described in such petition, and doth direct that the portion so severed from such shire shall be annexed to the North Riding of the Shire of Grenville; and with the advice aforesaid doth hereby re-define the boundaries of the said Shire of Buninyong and the

West Riding thereof, as hereby reduced, and of the said Shire of Grenville, and of the North Riding thereof hereby enlarged, in manner following, that is to say:—

## THE BUNINYONG SHIRE REDUCED AND RE-DEFINED.

Commencing at the south-west angle of the Bonshaw pre-emptive right; thence north and east by the west and north boundaries of said pre-emptive right to the River Yarrowee; thence northerly by that river to the south boundary of the town of Ballarat East; thence east and north by the south and east boundaries of Ballarat East to the centre of the main Melbourne to Ballarat (north) road; thence easterly along the centre of the said main road to its intersection with a road forming the west boundary of allotment 1, section XI., parish of Kerrit Boreet; thence southerly by the centre of that road forming the west boundary of sections XI., XII., and XIII. to the centre of a road forming the south boundary of allotment 27 of the last-named section; thence east by that road to a point due north of the north-west angle of the Borhoneyghurk pre-emptive section; thence south to the said angle and by the west boundary of said pre-emptive section to its south-west angle; thence west by the north boundary of allotment 133, parish of Meredith, to the north-west angle of said allotment; thence south by a line and centre of a road forming the east boundary of allotments 134, 131, 130, 127, 126, 125, 124, 123, 122, 121, 120, and 119, and a line in continuation thereof to the centre of the Geelong and Ballarat Railway; thence north-westerly by that railway to a point opposite the centre of a road forming the boundary between allotments 166 and 167, parish aforesaid; thence westerly by that road to the west boundary of the parish; thence south-westerly by the road dividing allotments 15A and 63B, parish of Cargerie, to the south-east angle of the last-named allotment; thence west by the south boundary thereof and of the Cargerie pre-emptive section to its south-west angle; thence south-westerly by the centre of a road to the south-east angle of allotment 33B, said parish; and thence by a line and road forming the south boundary of 33B, 34B, and 35B, parish of Cargerie, to the River Leigh; thence northerly by the centre of that river to a point due east of the north boundary of the Mount Mercer pre-emptive right; thence by a line bearing west, forming for a portion of the distance the

north boundary of the said Mount Mercer pre-emptive right, eleven miles twenty chains to a point due south of the south-west angle of the parish of Yarrooee; thence north to and by the west boundary of that parish to the south-west angle of allotment 110D; thence east, north, and east again by the boundary of that allotment to its south-east angle; thence east to the continuation of the road forming the east boundary of allotment 109B, same parish; thence north by said road to the south-east angle of said allotment; thence east to and by the north boundary of allotment 129D, parish of Yarrooee, to the north-east angle of same; thence north by the road on the west of allotment 131D to the north-west angle thereof; thence east by the road north of allotments 131D, 131E, 131H, to the north-east angle of allotment last-named; thence north by the road on the east of allotments 83C, 80A, 73A, and 73C, to the north-east angle of allotment last-named; thence east by the road forming the boundary of allotment 72C, portion of 72A, 72B, 52A, and 51A, to the south-east angle of allotment 50; thence north by the east boundary of allotments 50, 59, 66A, and 66B, to the road forming the north boundary of the last-named allotment; thence east to the road forming the east boundary of allotment 148A; thence north by that road to the north-east angle of allotment 12, section XIII, parish of Yarrooee; thence east by the road forming the south boundary of allotments 12, 13, 14, and 15, section XI, to the south-east angle of the last-named allotment; and thence north by the road forming the east boundary of the last-named allotment to the commencing point. Excluding the borough of Buninyong.

#### THE WEST RIDING REDUCED AND RE-DEFINED.

Commencing at a point on the shire boundary where it is intersected by the main road from Ballarat to Geelong; thence south-easterly by the centre of the said road to the boundary of Buninyong borough; thence west and south by the north and west boundaries of the said borough to its south-west angle; thence by a line bearing south to the shire boundary; thence following the said shire boundary westerly, northerly, and easterly to the commencing point.

#### THE GRENVILLE SHIRE ENLARGED AND RE-DEFINED.

They therefore pray that the area above described may be constituted a separate municipality, and that the number of the councillors be nine (9).
