Exhibition of Leading-Lights, Bluff Harbor.

The Bluff Harbor Board have given notice that, on and after the 1st January 1885, there will be exhibited at Bluff Harbor a leading-light on each of the two dolphins erected on the Middle Bank, and now used as leading-marks by day. The eastern or outer one will be a fixed red light, and the western or inner one a fixed green light. These lights are to be brought in line when abreast the Perch Buoy, off Te Waewae Point, and so maintained until the two red lights on main wharf are brought in line, when the course may be altered either direct to the wharf or an anchorage off it. The above lights have been creeted for the purpose of enabling vessels to enter the larbor at night, and lead through the worst part of the entrance channel, that is from abreast the Perch Buoy to a cable's length above the lightship. Their line will give, between the points named, from 30 feet to 33 feet at low water. They are not intended to be used for any other part of the harbor or entrance.

WHEREAS by The Mining on Private Property Act 1884 it was amongst other things enacted that where the person or persons claiming the right to mine in or on any private land under any agreement or agreements, either as tributers or sub-tributers, or upon any other condition than that of paying tribute, severally claim a mining lease of such land, the time within such agreements might be registered, the order of priority to be given to the applications of such persons for a lease of such private land, the conditions on which and the terms within which such mining lease might be granted, and generally with regard thereto, should be determined by Regulations in that behalf to be made by the Governor in Council, which Regulations he might from time to time after and repeal: Now therefore the Governor in Council, in pursuance of the said Act, doth make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

- 1. Every agreement between any person and the owner of any private land purporting to give such person the right to mine on such land, either as a tributer or sub-tributer, or upon any other condition than that of paying tribute, shall be registered with the warden having jurisdiction in the district in which the land the subject of such agreement or the greater part of such land is situate, within eight months from the passing of The Mining on Private Property Act 1884.

The order of priority to be given to the applications of such persons as aforesaid for a mining lease of such private land shall (subject to the provisions of section 7 of the said Act) be according to the time at which each application shall have been received by the warden; and if two or more applications for a mining lease of the same land shall have been received at the same time by the warden, then the order of priority shall be determined by the Minister of Mines for the time being, whose decision in that matter shall be final.

A sum not exceeding Ten shillings shall be paid to the treasurer of the managing body of any public park or garden having a claim on the vote for every One pound expended by such body on fencing, preparation of land and planting, forming of roads and paths, and such other works as the Minister may approve, in such park or garden between 1st January 1884 and 31st December 1884, out of funds locally contributed, provided such claim be received by the Secretary for Agriculture on or before the 31st January 1885. Every statement of particulars of claim on the vote must be made in the form A, and be accompanied by a declaration in the form B.

2. The term "locally contributed" shall mean and include all moneys voted by the managing body of any public park or garden, from its own funds for the fencing and planting of such park or garden, also all moneys voluntarily contributed for the same purpose, between the 1st January 1884 and 31st December 1884; but it shall not mean nor include any sums advanced by any bank, nor any subsidy paid by Government between the abovementioned dates, nor the balance of any subsidy paid by Government at any period prior to 1st January 1884.

3. The subsidy or the balance thereof last paid to the managing body of any public park or garden shall be deducted from the return of expenditure for the year 1884 (side form A), and a sum equal to one-half of the balance there flast paid to the managing body of any public park or garden shall be paid as subsidy; provided that if the claims are in excess of the vote they shall be reduced provata.

4. In every case in which a claim sent in is deemed unsatisfactory, an officer of the department may be instructed to make an inspection of the books kept by the managing body, and of the vouchers for the soveral items of expenditure; and if such inspection be refused, the claim shall be disallowed.

W HEREAS by The Local Government Act 1874 (38 Vict. No. 500, § 19, 38, and 49), it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, to sover any portion of Victoria forming part of a municipal district from such municipal district, and annex the same to any other municipal district with which the portion so severed forms one continuous area, and from time to time make any apportionment of property rights and liabilities and give any directions as to any matters and things that might be necessary to do justice as between the municipalities concerned; and every such Order should be published in the Governoment Cacette, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor in the sections of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition of the ratepayers of the shire of Buninyong, and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the same Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order sever from the West Riding of the Shire of Buninyong the portion of the shire described in such petition, and doth direct that the portion so severed from such shire shall be annexed to the North Riding of the Shire of Grenville; and with the advice of the Rorth Riding of the Shire of Grenville; and with the advice of the North Riding of the Shire of Grenville; and with the advice of the Rorth Riding of the Shire of Grenville; and with the advice aforesaid doth hereby re-define the boundaries of the said Shire of Buninyong and the

West Riding thereof, as hereby reduced, and of the said Shire of Grenville, and of the North Riding thereof hereby enlarged, in manner following, that is to say:—

THE BUNINYONG SHIRE REDUCED AND RE-DEFINED.

The Buninyong Shire Reduced and Re-Defined.

Commencing at the south-west angle of the Bonshaw pre-emptive right; thence north and east by the west and north boundaries of said pre-emptive right to the River Yarrowee; thence northerly by that river to the south boundary of the town of Ballarat East; thence east and north by the south and east boundaries of Ballarat East to the centre of the main Melbourne to Ballarat (north) road; thence easterly along the centre of the said main road to its intersection with a road forming the west boundary of allotment 1, section x., parish of Kerrit Bareet; thence southerly by the centre of that road forming the west boundary of sections x., x.II., and x.III. to the centre of a road forming the south boundary of allotment 27 of the last-named section; thence east by that road to a point due north of the north-west angle of the Borhoneyghurk pre-emptive section; thence south to the said angle and by the west boundary of said pre-emptive section to its south-west angle; thence west by the north boundary of allotment 133, parish of Meredith, to the north-west angle of said allotment; thence south by a line and centre of a road forming the east boundary of allotments 134, 131, 130, 127, 126, 125, 124, 123, 122, 121, 120, and 119, and a line in continuation thereof to the centre of the Geelong and Ballarat Railway; thence north-westerly by that railway to a point opposite the centre of a road forming the boundary between allotments 166 and 167, parish aforesaid; thence westerly by that road dividing allotments 15A and 63n, parish of Cargerie, to the south-westerly by the road dividing allotments 15A and 63n, parish of Cargerie, to the south-westerly by the centre of a road forming the south boundary of the Mount Mercer pre-emptive section to its south-west angle of the last-named allotment; 38n, said parish; and thence by a line and road forming the south boundary of the Mount Mercer pre-emptive right; thence northerly by the centre of that river to a point due east of the north

Excluding the bornuph of Euninyong. borough of Buninyong.

THE WEST RIDING REDGOED AND RE-DEFINED.

Commencing at a point on the shire boundary where it is intersected by the main road from Ballarat to Geelong; thence south-easterly by the centre of the said road to the boundary of Buninyong borough; thence west and south by the north and west boundaries of the said borough to its south-west angle; thence by a line bearing south to the shire boundary; thence following the said shire boundary westerly, northerly, and easterly to the commencing point.

THE GRENVILLE SHIRE ENLARGED AND RE-DEFINED.

The Grenville Shire Enlarged and Re-defined.
