BURIALS IN CERTAIN CHURCH LAND IN THE PARISH OF NUNAWADING DISCONTINUED.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fourteenth day of April 1885.

WHEREAS by a Statute of the Parliament of Victoria No. 310, intituled, *An Act to amend the Laws relating to or affecting the Public Health*, it was enacted, that in case it should appear to the Governor in Council that burials in any cemetery, under any law relating to public cemeteries, or in any other burial-ground or place of burial whatsoever, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, the Governor in Council might, by an Order to be published in the *Government Gazette*, direct that after a time to be mentioned in such Order, not being less than three months from the date thereof, burials in such cemetery, or burial-ground, or place of burial, should be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in the same, or in any subsequent order, and might from time to time postpone the time mentioned in such Order for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise vary any such Order, whether the time appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, should or should not have arrived : And whereas it appears to the Governor in Council expedient that burials in the Church land situate in the parish of Nunawading hereinafter referred to, should be discontinued : Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that all burials in all that allotment of land containing about two acres, situate in the parish of Nunawading, and conveyed in the year One thousand eight hundred and eighty-one to Joseph Mulhall, Oliver Daly, and William John McGlone, in trust for Roman Catholic Church purposes, shall, after a period of three months from the date of this Order, be wholly discontinued.

And the Honorable Graham Berry, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

AUSTRALIA—SOUTH COAST.

PORT PHILLIP—SOUTH CHANNEL.

(1.) *Eastern Lighthouse—Alterations in Upper Light, discontinuance of Lower Light.*

WITH reference to Notices to Mariners, No. 97, of 21st July 1874, on the establishment of Eastern light, immediately under Arthur's Seat, South Channel, Port Phillip; and No. 15, of 31st January 1878, on the exhibition of an auxiliary white light, placed 40 feet below the above-mentioned light:—

The Government of Victoria has given further notice, that on 1st January 1885, a new and more powerful light would be exhibited in lieu of the previous upper light; and that the lower light would be discontinued:—

The new Eastern light shows as heretofore fixed red between the bearings of S. by W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W. and S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E., and fixed white between S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E. and E. by N. $\frac{1}{4}$ N.; it is elevated 100 feet above high-water, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of about 13 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric, or by lenses, of the third order.

The lighthouse, constructed of iron, is painted white.

AUSTRALIA—NORTH COAST.
CLARENCE STRAIT.

(2.) *Vernon Islands—Buoy marking Shoal ground.*

The Government of South Australia has given notice, dated 5th December 1884, that a buoy has been placed near the western end of the shoal ground lying north-westward of S.W. Vernon Island, Clarence Strait:—

The buoy, conical, painted black and surmounted with a globe, is moored in about 7 fathoms water, with the following bearings and distance:—

Western point, N.W. Vernon Island ... N.E. by E.
Henry Ellis reef buoy ... E. $\frac{1}{4}$ N., distant about $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles.
Fright Point ... S.E. by E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E.

Position, lat. $12^{\circ} 5' 15''$ S., long. $130^{\circ} 57' 15''$ E.

NOTE.—Large vessels should pass westward of this buoy, as the soundings to the south-eastward are very irregular, and at the distance of 2 or 3 cables in that direction from the buoy the depth is about 15 feet at low-water spring tides.

In ordinary weather this conical buoy and Henry Ellis Reef buoy may be plainly seen from each other, thus facilitating the navigation.

The red buoy on the south-east spit of East Vernon Island, which disappeared in 1884, will not be replaced.

LIGHTSHIP, NORMAN BAR.

NOTICE is hereby given that a Lightship, painted red and showing a white dioptric light of the 5th order, is now placed in 12½ feet, at low-water, 1 cable N.W. by N. from the position of the Fairway Buoy, off the bar of the Norman River.

The light is carried at an elevation of 84 feet above the water, and is visible from a distance of 11 miles.

When vessels require to cross the bar, the depth is shown by the following code of signals made from the yard-arms of the Lightship:—

PRISONERS UNDER SENTENCE OF DEATH.—REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the provisions of sec. 9 of an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, entitled *An Act to Consolidate the Law relating to Gaols*, the Governor in Council has revoked all existing Regulations relating to prisoners under sentence of death, and has made the following Regulations in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

1. Prisoners under sentence of death shall be kept in irons in the condemned cells until the sentence be executed or commuted, and shall be dressed in prison clothing, and the hair cut close, and shall never be left without a warder, or other attendant, detailed for the duty of attending or controlling them.

2. Their relatives, friends, or legal advisers shall have access to them at all reasonable hours, at the discretion of the Governor of the Gaol, unless countermanded by the Sheriff, but shall not come into actual contact with them under any circumstances. An officer of the Gaol will remain in attendance during the visit, but no other visitors, unless by special order of the Sheriff or Inspector-General, shall be admitted to see them except the clergymen of the church to which the prisoner professes to belong; but no visitors, whether relatives, friends, clergy, legal advisers, or others, shall be allowed to see a prisoner under sentence of death without his consent to see them being first obtained.

3. They shall be allowed better food than the prison diet, and such indulgences only as tea and tobacco, subject to the approval of the Sheriff and Inspector-General; they shall not be allowed to receive anything whatever from anyone but the Gaol authorities. They shall be allowed daily exercise in one of the prison yards.

4. Visitors must not say anything to or in the hearing of the prisoner that may or can directly or indirectly lead him to think that there is any possibility of the sentence being commuted or in anywise altered.

5. No communication whatever, either written or verbal, shall be conveyed by a visitor to or from a prisoner condemned to death from or to any person outside the Gaol except through the Sheriff or Inspector-General. In no case shall any statement of importance communicated by the condemned to a visitor or the attendant, whether relative to his own particular case or otherwise, be published or made known unless it be considered of sufficient importance to require consideration at the hands of the Government, in which case it shall be transmitted to the Sheriff by the Governor of the Gaol, who will at once forward it to the Chief Secretary for his consideration.

6. These regulations shall be shown to persons visiting the prisoner, and a strict compliance with them will be the condition on which they will be allowed to visit.

7. Every person claiming admission as a legal adviser must be a barrister, or attorney, or his authorized clerk.

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1884* it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding anything therein before contained, the Governor in Council might by proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber of particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as were named in such proclamation, or should exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part VII. of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do hereby declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live trees, which at the height of two feet from the surface of the ground are of less diameter than twelve inches, or from the Crown lands situate in the parish of Axedale, and the Crown lands situate in the parish of Mandurang to which the Proclamations, dated respectively the 10th October 1881 and the 29th May 1883, do not refer.—(85.A.14870.)

BY-LAW No. 1.—SHIRE OF WARRAGUL.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Warragul, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and every other power enabling the said local board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said local board, doth hereby make the following by-law, being by-law No. 1 of the said Local Board of Health, to be in force in the Central Riding of the Shire of Warragul, that is to say :—

1. *Interpretation of terms.*—In the construction and for the purposes of this by-law the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them. "House" shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public-houses, factories, workrooms, common or other lodging-houses, or other buildings or premises. "Cesspool" shall mean any receptacle for night-soil, or for noxious or offensive matter, below or above the ground. "Street" shall mean and include any highway, and any public bridge, and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

2. *Premises to be kept so as not to be a nuisance.*—Every occupier or person having the management or control of any house or premises shall cause the same to be kept in such a state as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

3. *Removal of refuse from houses.*—Every occupier of a house or premises shall remove therefrom all dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, or such other refuse matter produced or accumulated thereon, once every week, and in case of the default of such occupier, the Local Board of Health may remove the same.

4. *Receptacle for house refuse.*—Every occupier of a house or premises shall provide and keep thereon a box or some other covered receptacle for the temporary deposit of house refuse, which box or receptacle shall be of such dimensions as that the same may, with the contents thereof, when full, be readily and conveniently movable by one man, or so many such boxes or receptacles as may be necessary to contain all the house refuse produced or accumulated on such premises during one week, and shall cause all house refuse to be deposited as soon as conveniently may be in some such box or receptacle.

5. *Removal of refuse from places where animals are kept.*—Every occupier of land on which is erected any stable, shed, sty, yard, or other place for the keeping of animals, shall, from time to time, remove from such premises all dung, soil, or other manure, produced or accumulated thereon, as often as the same shall amount to two cubic yards, and in case of default of such occupier the local board may remove the same.

6. *Construction of privies.*—No person shall construct, or cause to be constructed, any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan or other movable receptacle for night-soil, the content whereof does not exceed two cubic feet, and with the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and the contents thereof, and emptying and cleaning the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, workroom, or common lodging-house, and every public privy, shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material, having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half an inch to the foot.

7. *Supply of deodorizing material to earth-closets.*—Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately, on the deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or receptacle.

8. *Emptying receptacles for night-soil.*—Every occupier, and every person having the management or control of any premises, once at least in every week shall empty or cleanse, or cause to be emptied or cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, on or belonging to such premises.

9. *Removal of night-soil to be by properly constructed conveyances.*—No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents, or of any portion thereof, or of effluvia therefrom.

10. *Hours within which night-soil may be removed.*—No person shall empty, assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, except between the hours of twelve o'clock midnight and four o'clock a.m., or until the contents thereof have been properly deodorized, and every person emptying, or causing to be emptied, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil shall cause the night-soil taken therefrom to be removed as soon as the same is emptied.

11. *Disposal of refuse or offensive matter.*—No person shall place or deposit any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil, or any night-soil or other offensive matter, in any place so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to health.

12. *Earth-closets, &c., not to be emptied into drains or sewers.*—No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter, into any drain or sewer, or so that the contents thereof may find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any drain or sewer.

13. *Penalties.*—If any person commit a breach of any of the foregoing provisions of this by-law, he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10, or to a penalty not exceeding £5, for every day during which such breach shall be committed or continued. Provided the justices before whom any penalty imposed hereby is sought to be recovered may order the whole, or part only (not being less than five shillings), of such penalty to be paid. And every person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the foregoing penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by these by-laws, or otherwise, to remedy such breach, and whether such Local Board of Health have or have not taken advantage of such powers.

SHIRE OF DANDENONG.

BYE-LAW No. 8.

A Bye-law of the Shire of Dandenong, made under the 479 section of the Local Government Act 1874, and numbered 8, for regulating and conducting the sale of cattle in the Dandenong Market.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1874, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Dandenong order as follows:—

That all cattle yarded in the Dandenong market yards for sale by public auction shall be divided into three classes, as follows:—
No. 1 shall consist of dairy cows, that is to say, cows in milk, cows with calf at foot, and springers.

No. 2 shall consist of stores or other cattle not exceeding five in number the property of one owner.

No. 3 shall consist of stores or other cattle exceeding five in number the property of one owner.

That all cattle shall be sold in classes. Class 1 shall be sold first, class 2 second, class 3 third. All the cattle in each class shall be sold or offered for sale before the sale of another class is commenced.

That all the cattle in classes No. 1 and 2 shall be sold in the selling yard, and the cattle in No. 3 class may be sold in the pens or selling yard, at the discretion of the auctioneer having the sale of them.

That on each market day the auctioneers having the sale of cattle shall draw lots for priority of sale in each class, in the presence of the market inspector or other officer of the council; and they shall sell or offer for sale the whole of the cattle in each separate class, in the order of such drawing, before another is commenced; and any person interfering with, or in any way preventing such auctioneer from conducting such sale, shall be guilty of an offence against this bye-law.

That no two auctioneers shall sell or offer for sale by public auction at the same time any cattle in the market yard.

That all disputes as to the classification of cattle under the provisions of this bye-law shall be referred to the market inspector, and his decision shall be final.

On any breach or non-performance of any of the provisions of this bye-law, the person or persons so offending shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and not less than Twenty shillings, to be recovered before any two justices of the peace.

A Bye-law of the Shire of Coburg, made under the 215th section of "The Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 14, providing that footways may be flagged, kerbed, and paved at expense of owner.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by The Local Government Act 1874, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Coburg resolve to adopt as a Bye-law section 416 of The Local Government Act 1874, and order as follows:—

The council of the municipality may cause the footway or pathway in front of any house or ground along any street or private street within the municipal district to be flagged, kerbed, and paved or asphalted in such manner as the council think fit; and half the amount of the expense thereof shall be borne and paid by the owner of such house or land, and may be recovered from such owner, or from the occupier of such house or land, in a summary way before two justices.

Provided that no proceeding for the recovery of such amount shall be taken until at least one month after a requisition for payment of the amount hereinbefore mentioned, together with an account of the total expenditure, signed by the municipal clerk, has been sent or delivered to such owner or occupier.

Provided also that if the occupier of such house or land shall be compelled to pay for such flagging, kerbing, paving, or asphalt-ing, such occupier may either deduct the amount so paid from any rent then due or thereafter to become due to the owner, and the production of the receipt for the amount so paid by or recovered from such occupier shall be a good and sufficient discharge for the amount so paid or recovered on payment of rent to the owner; or such occupier may recover from the owner the amount so paid or recovered, or any balance thereof after deducting the rent, in a summary way before two justices.
