## IMPORTANT NOTICE TO MARINERS.—VICTORIA. PORT PHILLIP HEADS AND CHANNELS.

*Extinguishing of Lights and Removal of Buoys, also Exhibition of Electric Lights.*

**M**ASTERS of vessels and others are hereby informed that it may be necessary for the safety of the Port and the protection of life and property to, at any moment, remove the facilities now afforded for the safe navigation of Port Phillip.

As a warning that such steps have been taken, and that no vessel will be permitted to enter Port Phillip Heads between sunset and sunrise, the *Point Lonsdale* and *Queenscliffe* high and low lights will be *extinguished*.

The master or pilot of any vessel entering Port Phillip Heads between sunrise and sunset will be informed by the officer stationed at Queenscliffe whether he may proceed through the channel or whether he must be piloted by a duly licensed pilot, specially instructed.

Immediately after the foregoing lights have been extinguished the following action will be taken:—

The lights in the *South* and *West* Channels will also be *extinguished*.

### BUOYS.

The present system of buoyage in the *South*, *West*, and *Cole's* Channels will be either entirely *removed* or *displaced*, rendering the navigation therein dangerous, excepting to duly licensed pilots, specially instructed, who alone will be advised of existing dangers, and of the guiding marks which will, from time to time, be established for the purpose of facilitating the safe navigation of such channels *during day light*.

## PILOTAGE.

*Vessels prohibited from entering Port Phillip Heads between sunset and sunrise.*

No vessel will be permitted to enter Port Phillip Heads between sunset and sunrise. The pilot schooner will be withdrawn from the outside station from sunset to sunrise, but provision will be made for cruising outside and piloting vessels between sunrise and sunset only.

### Caution.—Electric Lights.

At the present juncture the Defence Department may at any time exhibit one or more Electric Lights from the vicinities of Queenscliffe and Point Nepean. Such lights will be at least 60 feet below any of the present lights, and must not be taken as guiding lights, as they will be dangerously misleading for navigating purposes, their object being a means of guarding the entrance to Port Phillip.

**IMPORTED STOCK ACT OF 1871, AND THE IMPORTED STOCK ACT AMENDMENT ACT OF 1884.**

His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to cancel Nos. 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, and 14 of the Regulations of 5th January last, issued under the above-named Acts, and to substitute the following Regulations in lieu thereof, which are hereby published for general information.

**SHEEP FROM AUSTRALIAN COLONIES BY SEA.**

1. No sheep shall be landed at any port or place in this colony except at the port of Sydney.

2. No colony shall be deemed to be a clean colony in which scab or catarrh or any other infectious or contagious disease exists, or is suspected to exist, nor any colony in which scab shall have existed within the next preceding two years, and no sheep shall be imported except from a clean Australian colony.

3. No sheep shall be imported except by vessels that have not traded to any but a clean Australian colony within the next preceding twenty-four months, nor by any vessel which shall within the period hereinbefore mentioned have had any sheep on board from any colony other than a clean Australian colony.

4. Every vessel on which it is intended to carry any such sheep shall be thoroughly cleansed and disinfected before the sheep have been shipped.

5. All such sheep shall be accompanied by a certificate and declaration to the effect of Form 2 hereto, that they have been examined one by one by the chief and another inspector for the colony from which they are exported certifying that they have been so examined, and that they are free from any infectious or contagious disease, and that scab has not existed in such colony for the next preceding two years.

6. No sheep from any clean Australian colony shall be landed in this colony until they shall have been examined and a certificate granted by an inspector of stock and a duly qualified veterinary surgeon that they are not infected to the effect of Form 4 hereto.

7. If any such sheep brought by sea into a port or place in this colony be found to be infected they may be forthwith destroyed at their owner's expense, without compensation, or otherwise disposed of, as the Minister may direct.

8. Sheep brought by sea from any clean Australian colony may, if found on inspection to be not infected, be landed, and taken by a conveyance to the quarantine proclaimed for such sheep, where they shall be quarantined, and dipped under the supervision and direction of the inspector, and the length of such quarantine, the medicaments to be used in dipping, the temperature and duration of the bath, the number of dippings, and the fees to be charged for the keeping and dipping of the sheep, shall be as follows, viz. :—

(1.) The quarantine shall extend to at least eighteen days prior to dipping.

(2.) The medicaments to be used in dipping shall be good sound tobacco, or tobacco leaves and flowers of sulphur, at the rate of 1lb. of each to every 5 gallons of water, the tobacco to be put into boiling water and infused for five hours at least, and the sulphur to be added to the infusion in the dip.

(3.) The temperature shall not be less than 100 nor more than 110 degrees Fahrenheit.

(4.) The sheep shall swim, and be completely immersed while in the bath, and the bath shall last from one to two minutes, according to its temperature, and as the case may require.

(5.) The sheep shall receive one dipping.

(6.) The rates to be charged for the keeping and dressing of sheep in quarantine shall be as follows, viz. :—

9. Sheep imported from any clean Australian colony into any other clean colony, and intended to be introduced overland into this colony may be admitted if their owner produce the prescribed certificates for the same, and the sheep are found on inspection by an inspector of this colony to be not infected; but all such sheep, unless they shall have been quarantined and dipped in such last-mentioned colony, in accordance with these regulations, and under the supervision of an inspector of this colony, shall, on crossing the border, be placed in quarantine, and kept and dipped in the same manner in every respect as next hereinbefore provided with respect to seaborne sheep, and the expenses of such inspector shall be borne by the owner of the sheep that are desired to be sent into this colony.

10. Stud and show sheep brought from any of the inland districts of this colony, or introduced overland from any adjoining clean colony, which shall be in Sydney or in any of the suburbs

during the time that any imported sheep shall remain in Sydney or the suburbs, shall, prior to their leaving the coast district, be dipped the same as if they were imported Australian sheep.

11. Every inspector or other person who shall have superintended any dipping, dressing, or disinfecting, shall make and subscribe and transmit, with due despatch to the chief inspector, a declaration to the effect of Form 5 hereto.

12. No such sheep shall be released from quarantine until they shall have been examined by the chief inspector and a duly qualified veterinary surgeon in consultation, and a certificate granted by them to the effect of Form 6 that such sheep have been duly quarantined and dressed, as prescribed by regulations, and are free from infection.

13. In any case where a special quarantine has been granted, an attendant may, where necessary, be placed by the chief inspector of stock in charge of the sheep in such quarantine; and the person to whom such quarantine has been granted shall pay the expense of such attendant.

14. No fodder or other food or straw which shall have been used for, with, or about imported sheep, nor any litter, manure, nor any fittings on board any vessel for such sheep shall be landed, and all cases or cages brought with such sheep shall be cleansed and disinfected as the chief inspector shall direct.

15. Should any sheep be imported into this colony by a vessel which shall not have been cleansed and disinfected as provided by these regulations, or should any such sheep have been examined by one inspector instead of two in the colony from which the sheep are exported, then such sheep may, with the sanction of the Minister, be admitted to quarantine; but shall in every such case receive three dippings, at intervals of not less than ten nor more than fifteen days.

## REGULATIONS UNDER "THE EDUCATION ACT 1872."

THE Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, has rescinded the Regulations contained in Section XIII. of the Regulations made in pursuance of Section 18 of *The Education Act 1872*, and has made the following Regulations in lieu thereof, that is to say :—

## REGULATIONS.

## XIII.—TRAINING.

1. The training institution will consist of a training college in Melbourne, and of district training schools, not exceeding twenty in number, in various parts of the colony. The members of the training institution will be a Superintendent, who will be principal of the training college, a vice-principal of the college, lecturers, associates, and students.
2. Training will be conducted in the training college in Melbourne by the principal and the other officers of the college, and in the district training schools by the associates.
3. The district training schools will be such State schools as shall be determined under regulations framed under section 47 of Act No. 773, and the head teacher for the time being of each such school will hold the office of associate so long as his school continues to be a branch of the institution.
4. The course of instruction in the training institution will be free, and will extend over two years, the first of which will be passed in a district training school, and the second in the training college.
5. Associates will be required to train and adequately instruct all students placed in training with them by the Department, and to provide for their receiving, outside of the ordinary school hours, not less than six hours' instruction per week in the subjects prescribed for study during the first year's course. They will also be required to train in the practice of teaching any teachers who may be temporarily transferred to their schools for that purpose.
6. Each associate of the training institution will receive a fixed sum of £50 per annum, and £10 for every student whom, after not less than six months' instruction in his school, he qualifies for admission to the second year's course of training.
7. Students will receive allowances as under :—
  - (a.) If paid as pupil-teachers and residing at home, £5 per annum in addition to their salaries.
  - (b.) If residing at home and not paid as pupil-teachers, £35 per annum.
  - (c.) In all other cases, board and lodging free of cost.
8. Every student will be required to enter into an agreement by himself and an approved surety not to relinquish his course of training without the permission of the Minister, and for four years after the termination of his studentship to teach in any school to which he may be appointed.
9. The course of instruction in the training institution will be as under :—

Arithmetic.*

As may be from time to time prescribed for the Certificate of Competency.

*History.*—General outlines of history of the British Empire, with a more detailed knowledge of Australasian discovery and settlement, and of the history of Victoria.

*Euclid.*—Book I.

*Algebra.*—The four simple rules, and easy simple equations.

*Latin, or  
French, or  
German.*

Accidence and easy exercises.

*Theory and practice of teaching.*—Discipline, methods of teaching, registration; preparing lesson notes and giving class lessons; class drill.

## DURING THE SECOND YEAR.

1. *Theory and Practice of Teaching.*—

- (a.) The leading principles of education; the faculties, their training and development; habit and character. (b.) School organization and management; methods of teaching; notes of lessons. (c.) Controlling and teaching a class, or two classes simultaneously; and class drill.

(Marks obtainable at final examination—150.)

2. *English Language and Literature.*—

Structure of the English language, Chaucer and the chief authors since, with a knowledge of prescribed selections;

or *History of England and Australia.*—

- (a.) Outlines of history of British Empire.

(Marks obtainable at final examination—100.)

6. *Music* ... .. (Marks obtainable at final examination...50).

7. *Drawing* ... .. ( " " " " ...50).

8. *Gymnastics* ... .. ( " " " " ...30).

9. *Military Drill* or *Needlework* ( " " " " ...30).

10. During the first year's course students will be required to attend regularly the meetings of the school to which they are attached, and to take part in the ordinary work of the school for at least half of each day—or for a greater portion, at the discretion of the head teacher. The time not employed in actual teaching will be devoted, under the direction of the head teacher, to the study of the subjects prescribed above.

11. Students will at the end of their first year be examined in the subjects prescribed for study during the first year's course, and those who pass a satisfactory examination will be admitted to the second year's course.

12. Students who fail to pass a satisfactory examination at the end of their first year may, at the discretion of the Minister, have their studentships suspended or forfeited altogether.

13. During the second year's course students will be required to attend lectures at the training college in the subjects in which they must pass in order to obtain a trained teacher's certificate, and in Music, Drawing, Gymnastics, Drill or Needlework, and such other subjects of the course as the principal may direct. Students will also, from time to time, attend and teach classes at the practising schools.

14. At the end of their second year students will be examined in the subjects prescribed during the second year's course, and a trained teacher's certificate will be awarded to those who pass in the subjects numbered 1 to 5 and obtain a total of 350 marks. (In estimating this total, no credit will be given for less than 25 per cent. of marks in any subject.)

15. Students who fail to pass in all the subjects prescribed for the completion of the first or second year's training, but who have passed in those which form part of the examination for the certificate of competency, may receive the certificate of competency on passing at one examination in the remaining subjects required for such certificate.

16. Students will be liable to dismissal from the training institution for idleness or misconduct.

17. The Superintendent will periodically inspect and report on the district training schools, and the students therein, and will furnish an annual report to the Minister on the training institution generally.

18. All examinations of students will be conducted under the direction of the Inspector-General.

19. Clauses 11 and 14, so far as they alter the conditions for admission to the second year's course and for passing the final examination for a trained teacher's certificate, will not apply to the examinations to be held in June, 1885, nor to the final examination to be held in December, 1885.
