PUBLIC HIGHWAYS IN THE BOROUGH OF HAWTHORN.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and such land should thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Borough of Hawthorn has requested that the streets hereinafter mentioned within the said borough be so declared public highways: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice declare the lands acquired or used for the streets hereinafter described, and situate in the Borough of Hawthorn, to be Public Highways within the meaning of the said Act, viz. :-

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the session held in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign (No. 265), called *The Police Offences Statute 1865*, it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might, by proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, extend all or any of the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, and might define the limits of any such city, town, district, or place, and vary and alter such limits, and might revoke any such proclamation; and upon any such proclamation the provisions so proclaimed should extend to and be in force in such city, town, district, or place: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby extend the provisions of Section 5, Part I., of the said Statute to
