GREETING-

WHEREAS by divers Commissions now in force, certain persons have been assigned to Keep the Peace within the limits mentioned in such Commissions: And whereas we are about to issue new Commissions of the Peace, and it is expedient that all existing Justices of the Peace should be superseded: Now, therefore, know ye that we do by these presents supersede, annul, and determine every Commission now in force whereby any person or persons is or are assigned to Keep the Peace in our Colony of Victoria, or in any part thereof; and we do hereby discharge every such person or persons from the office of Justice of the Peace.

In testimony whereof we have caused these our letters to be made patent.

Witness our trusty and well beloved Sir Henry Brougham Loch, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, and its Dependen-cies, &c., &c., &c., at Melbourne, this seventh day of July One thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.

That any person desiring ground for a private grave or a vault, tomb, monument, cenotaph, tombstone, or for any other purpose in the cemetery under the above Act, shall apply to the trustees therefor. If approved, the trustees, on the payment of the required fees, shall issue to such person so applying a certificate of right of burial.

3. That any person desiring to construct a brick grave, vault, or tomb, or to erect a monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection in any part of the cemetery, shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit a plan, design, or drawing of such, with full particulars, for approval.

4. That any order for interment shall be given at the cometery six working hours prior to the time fixed for the burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be made. No free interment shall be allowed without said notice.

5. That the name, age, late place of residence, probable cause

allowed without said notice.

5. That the name, age, late place of residence, probable cause of death, of the deceased shall be furnished at the time of giving the order.

6. That the trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person wanting a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same, under directions of the surveyor, on payment of the required fees; and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.

7. That every coffin shall have on the lid a lead or copper plate, with the name of the deceased stamped thereon.

8. That every grave shall be at least seven feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than three feet from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the ground after such interment.

9. That no interment shall be permitted in any private grave or vault, without the production of the certificate of right of burial, or other satisfactory evidence that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so, except as provided for in the next rule.

10. That in the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault, to which during life the deceased person had no claim, the written consent of the owner shall be given in

with the order.

11. That no burial shall be permitted to take place in said cemetery without a certificate from a Deputy Registrar of Deaths or a Coroner. Such certificate shall be delivered to the gate-keeper before the funeral enters the cometery.

12. That the hours fixed for burial shall be as follows:—On week days, September to April inclusive, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; May to August inclusive, from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. On Sundays, throughout the year, from 2 to 5 p.m.

13. That no burial shall be allowed to take place between the hours of 7 p.m. and 7 a.m., except by special permission of the trustees.

14. That the time fixed for any burial shall be the time when the funeral is to be at the cemetery, and the same shall be punc-

14. That the intention of any sound shall be punctually observed.

15. That every funeral entering by the principal entrance shall has so to the west of the enclosure opposite thereto, and no vehicle, except the hearse and mourning coaches, shall be permitted to pass the line of posts fixed to the north-west of said entrance, or to stand south of the said line of posts. Breaking out of the procession after passing the point indicated by the notice board in the cemetery croscent is forbidden. Horses shall not be allowed to proceed faster than at a walking pace within the cemetery.

16. That every grave, vault, tomb, monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other crection, shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owner.

17. That any person desiring to place any inscription or epitaph in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit a copy thereof.

18. That any person putting up any erection, or placing any inscription or epitaph in any part of the cemetery, without the permission of the trustees, shall be liable to the penaltics imposed by the above Act for so doing, and to be further dealt with as a trespasser.

19. That every erection shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations (extending to the bottom of the grave when ordered). No Bath, Caen, or other soft stone shall be allowed to be used in any work. All stones, refuse, and rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be removed at once. Copper cramps only shall be allowed in the erection of tablets or other exposed stonework.

20. That all materials required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery, and shall be admitted only at the principal entrance; and no vehicle conveying any such materials with wheels less than four inches broad shall be permitted to enter.

21. That no extacomb shall be allowed.

22. That no extacomb shall be allowed.

23. That the trustees shall not (unless in very exceptional cases) permit the removal of any corpse from any grave for re-interment either in said or any other cemetery.

24. That before any such exceptional case can be dealt with by the trustees, a written application, setting forth the reasons for the proposed removal, and verified by a statutory declaration, shall be produced by the nearest available representative of the deceased; and, in the event of said application being granted, the permission of the Minister administering The Coroners Statute 1805 and the Act numbered cccxxxviii., in addition to that of the trustees, shall be obtained. If found necessary, the coffin shall be enclosed in a second and air-tight coffin prior to removal.

25. That any workman not employed by the trustees shall be numbered satisfactorily and with despatch, and to remove him summarily from the cemetery upon any cause of offence.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person, or any member of the family of any person, registered as aforesaid or not so registered, but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or

member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the local board or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said local board or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, until dauger, in the opinion of such local board or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vossels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business he himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or husiness until, in either case, all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshel or dairy, or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the local board, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force; and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep, or permit, or suffer to be kept, any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or

Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, and every person having the management of any such trade, shall forthwith report, in writing, to the Health Officer the occurrence of any disease in any of his milch cows, or of any contagious or infectious disease in man or animal apon the premises upon which such trade is carried on.

4. If any person commit a breach of this by-law he or she shall, for every such breach, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, or to a penalty not exceeding One pound for each day duting which such breach shall be committed or continued. Provided the justices before whom any penalty imposed hereby is sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid. And overy person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the foregoing penalty, notwithstanding that the said Local Board of Health may be empowered by this by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such Local Board of Health has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

5. This by-law (numbered 15) shall apply to, and have operation in, the whole of the place or places within the jurisdiction of the Local Board of Health aforesaid.


