VICTORIA, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland QUEEN, Defender of the Faith: To all to whom these presents shall come,

GREETING—

WHEREAS by divers Commissions now in force, certain persons have been assigned to Keep the Peace within the limits mentioned in such Commissions: And whereas we are about to issue new Commissions of the Peace, and it is expedient that all existing Justices of the Peace should be superseded: Now, therefore, know ye that we do by these presents supersede, annul, and determine every Commission now in force whereby any person or persons is or are assigned to Keep the Peace in our Colony of Victoria, or in any part thereof; and we do hereby discharge every such person or persons from the office of Justice of the Peace.

In testimony whereof we have caused these our letters to be made patent.

Witness our trusty and well beloved Sir Henry Brougham Loch, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, and its Dependencies, &c., &c., at Melbourne, this seventh day of July One thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.

And therefore we command you and every of you that to keeping the peace and the said ordinances and statutes you diligently apply yourselves, doing therein what to justice appertains according to the law of our colony of Victoria.

PROCLAMATIONS OF SPECIAL LICENSING DISTRICTS REVOKED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* (No. 566, section 44) it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained, it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exists to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses might be specially granted, and from time to time to revoke any such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the subjoined Proclamations issued under the authority of the 44th section of the said Act:—

The Proclamation bearing date the twenty-fourth day of March One thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, relating to—

An area of a quarter of a mile radius from the Crossing-place over the Nicholson River, on the road from Bairnsdale to the Lakes entrance and Orbost.

The Proclamation bearing date the twentieth day of April One thousand eight hundred and eighty-five as amended by the Proclamation bearing date the eleventh day of June of the same year, so far as they relate to—

THE TOWNSHIP OF GOROKE.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-ninth day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, and in the forty-ninth year of Her Majesty's reign.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. That all fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders given.
2. That any person desiring ground for a private grave or a vault, tomb, monument, cenotaph, tombstone, or for any other purpose in the cemetery under the above Act, shall apply to the trustees therefor. If approved, the trustees, on the payment of the required fees, shall issue to such person so applying a certificate of right of burial.
3. That any person desiring to construct a brick grave, vault, or tomb, or to erect a monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection in any part of the cemetery, shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit a plan, design, or drawing of such, with full particulars, for approval.
4. That any order for interment shall be given at the cemetery six working hours prior to the time fixed for the burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be made. No free interment shall be allowed without said notice.
5. That the name, age, late place of residence, probable cause of death, of the deceased shall be furnished at the time of giving the order.
6. That the trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person wanting a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same, under directions of the surveyor, on payment of the required fees; and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.

7. That every coffin shall have on the lid a lead or copper plate, with the name of the deceased stamped thereon.

8. That every grave shall be at least seven feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than three feet from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the ground after such interment.

9. That no interment shall be permitted in any private grave or vault, without the production of the certificate of right of burial, or other satisfactory evidence that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so, except as provided for in the next rule.

10. That in the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault, to which during life the deceased person had no claim, the written consent of the owner shall be given in with the order.

11. That no burial shall be permitted to take place in said cemetery without a certificate from a Deputy Registrar of Deaths or a Coroner. Such certificate shall be delivered to the gate-keeper before the funeral enters the cemetery.

12. That the hours fixed for burial shall be as follows:—On week days, September to April inclusive, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; May to August inclusive, from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. On Sundays, throughout the year, from 2 to 5 p.m.

13. That no burial shall be allowed to take place between the hours of 7 p.m. and 7 a.m., except by special permission of the trustees.

14. That the time fixed for any burial shall be the time when the funeral is to be at the cemetery, and the same shall be punctually observed.

15. That every funeral entering by the principal entrance shall pass to the west of the enclosure opposite thereto, and no vehicle, except the hearse and mourning coaches, shall be permitted to pass the line of posts fixed to the north-west of said entrance, or to stand south of the said line of posts. Breaking out of the procession after passing the point indicated by the notice board in the cemetery crescent is forbidden. Horses shall not be allowed to proceed faster than at a walking pace within the cemetery.

16. That every grave, vault, tomb, monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection, shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owner.

17. That any person desiring to place any inscription or epitaph in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit a copy thereof.

18. That any person putting up any erection, or placing any inscription or epitaph in any part of the cemetery, without the permission of the trustees, shall be liable to the penalties imposed by the above Act for so doing, and to be further dealt with as a trespasser.

19. That every erection shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations (extending to the bottom of the grave when ordered). No Bath, Caen, or other soft stone shall be allowed to be used in any work. All stones, refuse, and rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be removed at once. Copper cramps only shall be allowed in the erection of tablets or other exposed stonework.

20. That all materials required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery, and shall be admitted only at the principal entrance; and no vehicle conveying any such materials with wheels less than four inches broad shall be permitted to enter.

21. That no catacomb shall be allowed.

22. That no wooden erection shall be allowed.

23. That the trustees shall not (unless in very exceptional cases) permit the removal of any corpse from any grave for re-interment either in said or any other cemetery.

24. That before any such exceptional case can be dealt with by the trustees, a written application, setting forth the reasons for the proposed removal, and verified by a statutory declaration, shall be produced by the nearest available representative of the deceased; and, in the event of said application being granted, the permission of the Minister administering *The Coroners Statute 1893* and the Act numbered *ccxxxviii*, in addition to that of the trustees, shall be obtained. If found necessary, the coffin shall be enclosed in a second and air-tight coffin prior to removal.

25. That any workman not employed by the trustees shall be under the supervision and control of the surveyor, who shall have power to regulate his hours of labour, to see that his work is completed satisfactorily and with despatch, and to remove him summarily from the cemetery upon any cause of offence.

26. That unless otherwise ordered, the principal entrance shall be open daily from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m. from 1st September to 30th April, and from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. during the other months of the year.

27. That no child under 10 years shall be admitted into the cemetery except in charge of a responsible person.

28. That no smoking shall be allowed within the cemetery, nor any fireworks discharged therein.

29. That no dogs shall be admitted into the cemetery.

30. That any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, or otherwise infringing the above Act, or any rule, regulation, or by-law made for protecting the cemetery, shall be prosecuted as the law directs.

31. That no person shall be allowed to take any flower or plant out of the cemetery.

32. That the surveyor shall exercise a general supervision and control, under the trustees, over all matters pertaining to the cemetery.

33. That no person employed under the trustees shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of duty, nor shall be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery, other than that for which he receives payment from the trustees.

34. That any person so employed accepting any such gratuity, or being pecuniarily interested in any such work, shall be liable to be summarily dismissed.

35. That licences to grave-diggers may be issued by the trustees.

36. That a plan of the cemetery, showing the distribution of the land, compartments, situations, and numbers of the graves, and a registry of all certificates of right of burial, shall be kept at the office.

REGULATIONS.

1st. All charges must be paid when orders are given or before the ground or vault is opened.

2nd. Any person paying the necessary charges, and making a vault or erecting a monument of any kind in the cemetery by and with the permission of the trustees, under these rules, shall be entitled to have and keep such vault or monument, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the use of such persons or their representatives for ever.

3rd. Applications for permission to make a vault, or erect a monument or fence, in the cemetery must be made to the trustees, through their secretary, and if such application be approved of, a certificate of permission, in the form of Schedule A hereto, will be granted to the applicant on the payment of the proper charges.

4th. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in this cemetery on the production of a certificate from a magistrate or minister of religion, or of other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was, or that the relatives and friends of the deceased are, unable to pay the costs and charges.

5th. The trustees will cause any common grave to be dug on payment of the proper charge. All graves to be not less than six feet deep.

6th. In case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent (in writing) of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.

7th. Plans of all proposed monuments or fences must be submitted to the trustees for approval.

8th. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences to be kept in proper order and repair at the expense of the owners.

9th. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in and covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron.

10th. Every coffin must have on the lid a lead or copper plate with the name of the deceased stamped thereon.

11th. A plan of the cemetery and a register will be kept, and may be inspected on application.

12th. Any person wantonly destroying, defacing, doing or causing to be done any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the cemetery is, by the Statute, guilty of a misdemeanor.

13th. The trustees reserve the right of recommending any alterations from time to time in these regulations.

BYE-LAW No. 1.

As to Dairies, Dairy Cattle, and Milk.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Coburg, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in *The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883*, and every other power enabling the said Local Board of Health in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said local board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 1 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.
2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the Shire of Coburg.

Registration of Cowkeepers, Dairymen, and Purveyors of Milk.

4. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of July in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every application pay a fee of Five shillings per annum:—

To the secretary of the Local Board of Health for the Shire of Coburg.

I desire to be registered, in accordance with the particulars in the schedule hereunder:—

5. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the secretary for the Local Board of Health shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it was received, and of the payment of the fee, and file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said local board or by any person authorized in writing by the chairman or secretary of the said local board; and if on inspection such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them, are or is likely in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said local board may, by an order in writing, signed by the secretary and served personally or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or in the case of an unregistered person, served personally or left at his dwelling place, or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said local board may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept, and be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person, or any member of the family of any person, registered as aforesaid or not so registered, but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or

member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the local board or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said local board or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, until danger, in the opinion of such local board or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until, in either case, all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the local board, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force; and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep, or permit, or suffer to be kept, any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

13. In the interpretation of this bye-law, words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

14. Every person guilty of any breach of this bye-law or of any of its provisions shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

BOROUGH OF FOOTSCRAY.

BY-LAW No. 15.

Under the Public Health Amendment Statute 1883.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Public Health Amendment Statute 1883, and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, this Local Board of Health for the Borough of

Footscray, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution, doth hereby make the By-law following, that is to say:—

1. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, shall, on or before the first day of July in every year, register himself or herself with the Local Board of Health, and every such person shall pay an annual registration fee of One pound.

2. Every person following the trade of cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, shall cause every milk store or milk shop in his occupation, or under his management or control, and every milk vessel used by him for containing milk for sale to be kept thoroughly clean.

3. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, and every person having the management of any such trade, shall forthwith report, in writing, to the Health Officer the occurrence of any disease in any of his milch cows, or of any contagious or infectious disease in man or animal upon the premises upon which such trade is carried on.

4. If any person commit a breach of this by-law he or she shall, for every such breach, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, or to a penalty not exceeding One pound for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued. Provided the justices before whom any penalty imposed hereby is sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid. And every person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the foregoing penalty, notwithstanding that the said Local Board of Health may be empowered by this by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such Local Board of Health has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

5. This by-law (numbered 15) shall apply to, and have operation in, the whole of the place or places within the jurisdiction of the Local Board of Health aforesaid.

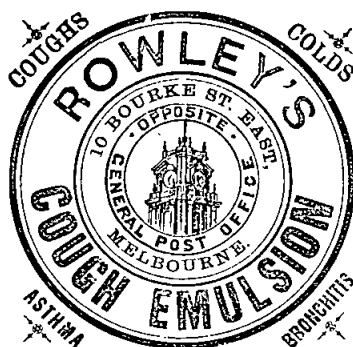
