WHEREAS by *The Discipline Act 1870* it was provided that the Governor in Council might make rules and regulations for the employment, removal or dismissal, and for the better government of persons engaged by virtue of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Act, and from time to time amend, alter, or amend the same and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order make the following additional regulations for rifle clubs, that is to say:—

- 1.—Members of rifle clubs who take and subscribe the oath prescribed by "The Discipline Act" to serve for a period of three years, or until sooner legally discharged, may be allowed to resign fourteen days after having given notice, in writing, to their captain.
- 2.—Boys may be engaged for the purpose of being trained as buglers to mounted rifles. Not more than two per company will be allowed—age, 14 to 18 years.

And the Honorable Frederick Thomas Sargood, Her Majesty's Minister of Defence for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The births of 1,054 children, viz., 524 boys and 530 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of June. In the month of May 977 births were registered, or 77 more than in the month under review. The births were 264 above the average of the previous ten years, but only 125 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in June numbered 509, viz., 280 of males, and 229 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 545. The deaths were fewer than those in May by 17, but exceeded the average of June during the previous ten years by 94. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded that average by only 21.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 3.27, and of deaths registered 1.58.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 62.1° on the 1st, and the lowest was 30.2° on the 22nd. The mean temperature of the month (48.1°) was exactly a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (22.8°) took place on two occasions, viz., the 23rd and the 30th; in the first instance from a maximum of 55.1° to a minimum of 32.3°, and in the second instance from a maximum of 58.1° to a minimum of 35.3°. The least range (5.3°) was on the 16th, viz., from a maximum of 55.0° to a minimum of 49.7°. The mean daily range was 11.0°. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.048 inches) was a fraction above the average.

Rain fell on 20 days, the amount of rainfall being 3.629 inches.

Males contributed 55 per cent., and females 45 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 31 per cent. to that mortality, as against 32 per cent. in June 1884; 28 per cent. in June 1883; 35 per cent. in June 1882; 32 per cent. in June 1881; 36 per cent. in June 1880; 27 per cent. in June 1879; 20 per cent. in June 1878; 38 per cent. in June 1877; 30 per cent. in June 1876; and 32 per cent. in June 1875.

The deaths of 27 persons who had attained or passed the age of 75 years were recorded during the month, viz.—Those of a female, aged 75, who died of cancer; a female, aged 75, and a gentleman, aged 84, of apoplexy; a sawyer, aged 77, of meningitis;

a carter, aged 77, of pleurisy; a female, aged 79, of heart disease; a surveyor, aged 80, of paralysis; a male, of occupation unknown, aged 81, of inflammation of the bladder; a female, aged 83, of fracture of the thigh; a female, aged 84, and a laborer, aged 85, of pneumonia; a female, aged 85, of congestion of the lungs; a quarryman, a chemist, and a female, each aged 77, a sailmaker, aged 78, a dyer, aged 82, a tentmaker and a female, each aged 83, a female, aged 84, a farmer and a female, aged 85, a female, aged 87, a female inmate of the Immigrants' Home, aged 88, a female, aged 89, a laborer, aged 92, and a sailor, aged 104, the last two being inmates of the Immigrants' Home, of old age.

Twenty-one deaths were ascribed to external causes, of which 20 were set down to accident and 1 to homicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A Jockey, aged 21, died of rupture of the liver, &c., a horse falling on him; a laborer, aged 23, of fracture of the spine, a telegraph-pole falling on him; a laborer, aged 32, was killed by a train whilst crossing a railway line; a laborer, aged 66, died of inflammation of the lungs, resulting from injuries received through a dray-wheel passing over him; a carter, aged 30, of fracture of the skull, occasioned by a fall through a hatchway; a groom, aged 40, of laceration of the brain, caused by a fall down stairs; a female, aged 59, of dislocation of the neck, the result of a fall received during a fit of temporary insanity; a female, aged 69, of compound fracture of the leg; a millwright, aged 72, and a female, aged 83, of fracture of the thigh, all due to falls; a laborer, aged 18, died of an axe wound in the leg, received whilst engaged in clearing scrub; a female, aged 50, was burnt to death; a female, aged 66, died of burns, through her clothes catching fire; and a carpenter, aged 55, of plumbism or lead poisoning. A hawkster of poultry, aged 33, was found drowned in the Yarra. A female infant was suffocated at birth; 2 female infants, aged 21 days and 3 months respectively, were overlain; a male, of occupation unknown, aged 54, was choked whilst eating a piece of meat; a marble mason, aged 55, was suffocated. The homicidal death was that of a female, aged 50, who was killed through being knocked down by a horse and buggy—verdict manslaughter.

One hundred and twenty-one deaths, or 24 per cent. of the whole, were registered as having occurred in public institutions, viz.:—58 in the Melbourne Hospital, 11 in the Alfred Hospital, 1 in the Homeopathic Hospital, 7 in the Children's Hospital, 2 in the Lying-in Hospital, 10 in the Immigrants' Home, 9 in the Benevolent Asylum, 8 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 7 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 4 in the Austin Hospital, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Infant Asylum, and 2<sup>1</sup> in the Sanatorium at Williamstown.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 160, of which 82, or 51 per cent., were of males, and 78, or 49 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 104 were under one year of age, 24 were between one and two, 11 were between two and three, 15 were between three and four, and 6 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 349. Of these, 198, or 57 per cent., were males and 151, or 43 per cent., were females; 10 were between five and ten, 10 were between ten and fifteen, 21 were between fifteen and twenty, 23 were between twenty and twenty-five, 24 were between twenty-five and thirty, 22 were between thirty and thirty-five, 19 were between thirty-five and forty, 17 were between forty and forty-five, 26 were between forty-five and fifty, 32 were between fifty and fifty-five, 48 were between fifty-five and sixty, 33 were between sixty and sixty-five, 21 were between sixty-five and seventy, 21 were between seventy and seventy-five, 9 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 18 were upwards of eighty.

In June, as compared from previous month, deaths from zymotic diseases decreased from 81 to 65, whereas those from constitutional diseases increased from 98 to 108. Under the former head, deaths from typhoid fever, fell from 29 to 15; those from dysentery and diarrhoea from 16 to 5; those from want of breast-milk, from 6 to 1; those from intemperance, from 7 to 3; and those from hydatids, from 5 to 3. On the other hand, deaths from diphtheria rose from nil to 7; those from whooping-cough, from 2 to 4; those from erysipelas, from 1 to 3; those from metria, from 1 to 5; those from influenza, from nil to 2; and those from septicaemia, from nil to 3. Under the head of constitutional diseases, deaths from dropsy rose from 2 to 4; those from cancer from 14 to 20; those from scrofula, from 1 to 3; and those from hydrocephalus, from 3 to 7; but those from phthisis fell from 74 to 67. Nine deaths were due to circumstances attendant on childbirth. Compared with the births (1,054) this number gives an average of 1 death of a mother to every 117 children born alive. In May only 2 deaths occurred in childbed, or an average of 1 death of a mother to every 488 children born alive.

## REGULATIONS.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Victorian Water Conservation Acts 1883-1884, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881-1884, make the Regulations following.

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said Urban District, that is so say:—

- (1.) For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of twenty pounds annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.
- (2.) For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than twenty pounds annual value, an amount equal to five per cent. on the amount of the municipal valuation.
- (3.) For every water trough, not exceeding ten feet in length, supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the sum of Two pounds per annum.
- (4.) For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, One pound ten shillings per annum on each inch of the diameter of the cylinder.
- (5.) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons; and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purposes of irrigation or for ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

$\frac{1}{2}$ of an acre and less, per annum ... ..	8,000
Exceeding $\frac{1}{2}$ of an acre, but not exceeding $\frac{3}{4}$ of an acre, per annum ... ..	12,000
Exceeding $\frac{3}{4}$ of an acre, but not exceeding $1\frac{1}{2}$ of an acre, per annum ... ..	16,000
Exceeding $1\frac{1}{2}$ of an acre, but not exceeding $2\frac{1}{2}$ of an acre, per annum ... ..	28,000
Exceeding $2\frac{1}{2}$ of an acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum ... ..	40,000

And at the rate of forty thousand gallons per acre for every additional acre, and proportionately according to the foregoing scale for every fractional part of an acre.

- In livery and carriers' stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be Three thousand gallons per stall used for stabling horses. In open sheds used for above purposes, each space of five feet shall be charged for as a stall.
2. That each syphon pump must have a meter affixed, and that Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons be charged for all water registered at such meter.
  3. Any person receiving water from the Trust, who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
  4. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust, who shall take or carry away from any drinking tap, trough, or public or private service-pipe, any water, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
  5. The Trust may cause a meter or meters to be affixed in any case where they may consider it necessary, such meter or meters to be provided and fixed at the expense of the consumer, and the water supplied to be charged for by measurement at the aforesaid rate. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering one million gallons.
  6. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except

under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

7. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of any lands or tenements, who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being supplied, for the provision and laying of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundary of such land or tenement abutting upon the street or road in which are pipes of the Trust.

8. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for such breach.

9. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler, for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, under a penalty of Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence, to a penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice from the Trust.

10. Overflow-pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

11. No person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter or repair, or in any manner interfere with, any pipe of the Trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, until he shall have obtained from the Trust a license in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, or repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

12. Before any such license shall be granted by the Trust, the person applying for the same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber. The Trust shall have the power of cancelling such license at any time.

13. Any person, whether licensed or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Trust, without giving two days' notice to the Trust of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without the permission of the Trust, in writing, being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

14. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit, unless the necessary repair shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier, if any, and if none, the owner, shall, in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

15. Before any licensed person shall break up any footpath for the purpose of laying on water from the main to any house or premises, he shall deposit with the Trust the sum of Two pounds, and in case he shall not, immediately after laying on the water as aforesaid, make good and restore the said footpath to the satisfaction of the Trust, then the said sum of Two pounds shall be absolutely forfeited to the Trust, which shall be at liberty to expend the same in making good and restoring the said footpath or otherwise as to the Trust shall seem best.

16. Any person watering any street or footpath by means of a hose, except under the direction of the officers of the Trust, shall be liable to a penalty of Two pounds for each offence.

17. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does or causes or permits to be done anything in contravention of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

18. The water supplied in the waterworks district of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these regulations and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed, and being in accordance with the said regulations and not otherwise.

19. In the construction of these regulations the word "person" shall extend to and be deemed to include a corporation whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean "The Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust."

## KATAMATITE RACECOURSE AND RECREATION RESERVE.—REGULATIONS.

**W**E, George Jessop, Allan McLean, Thomas Cahir, Henry C. Moore, John Hayes, David Thomas, Andrew Donaldson, and James A. Whitty, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the reserve for Racecourse and other purposes of public recreation in the parish of Katamatite, at Katamatite, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering in or upon the said reserve, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 133 of *The Land Act 1884* :—

## REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on such days as may be set apart by the committee of management for the holding therein of races, sports, &c., on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.
6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.
8. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

## THE YARRA FLATS PARK.—REGULATIONS.

**T**HE Council of the Shire of Eltham, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Public Park in the parish of Tarrawarra known as "The Yarra Flats Park," having

framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 133 of *The Land Act 1884* :—

## REGULATIONS.

1. The park shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
  2. No person shall enter or remain in the park who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
  3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the park, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
  4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, gates, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the park.
  5. No person shall put in the park any goats or pigs, and no person shall place therein any cattle or sheep without the permission, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the park, and an account thereof furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
  6. No person shall bring into the park any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management.
  7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the park, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.
  8. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the park, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees and shrubs.
- Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

*Purposes to which proceeds of disposition are to be applied.*—To pay the money coming to their hands by virtue of any such power of disposition to the treasurer for the time being of the Presbyterian Church of Victoria, to be by him applied first in payment of all incidental costs next in payment to the said Presbyterian Church of Victoria of all deductions heretofore authorized or hereafter to be authorized by the General Assembly of the said Church to be made from such money, and lastly as to the residue for such purposes as the said Assembly has heretofore authorized or may hereafter authorize.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the "Local Government Act 1874," the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the shire of Caulfield order as follows:—

1. Any street musician or vocalist shall, when required by any householder or his servant, or by any member of the police force, depart from the neighborhood of the premises of such householder.
2. No procession of persons or of vehicles, or both, for other than funeral purposes shall parade or pass through any of the streets or roads, unless with the previous consent in writing of the president, or in his absence, the secretary of the shire, and only by the route specified in such consent, nor unless and until the recipient of such consent shall have given at the least twenty-four hours' notice, with particulars of such consent and route, to the officer in charge of the police station.
3. Whenever, for the prevention of accident or the maintenance of order, and for such time as by notice in writing under the hand or by direction of the president, or in his absence or the case of sudden emergency, under the hand of the shire secretary or the officer in charge of the police stationed at Caulfield, any carriage-way, foot-way, street or other public place shall be declared to be closed against traffic of vehicles or persons, or both, the drivers of vehicles and all persons contemplated by such notice shall, when required by any member of the police force, obey and conform to such notice by abstaining from going or by withdrawing and removing from where mentioned therein. And the drivers of all vehicles, whether private or public, which may be there, whether plying for hire on any duly appointed stand or otherwise, shall, when so required by any member of the police force, remove their vehicles thence, and if desiring to remain in the vicinity, shall proceed to any other carriage-way, street, or public place, which may be indicated by the police for that purpose, and there arrange and order their vehicles in the manner directed by any member of the police force.
4. Upon any occasion when any number exceeding ten vehicles shall be assembled and waiting at any one and the same place, the driver of every such vehicle shall, as to the placing and otherwise thereof, comply with the directions given by any member of police force placed on duty there for the preservation of safety and order.
