The births of 1,009 children, viz., 545 boys and 464 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of July. In the month of June 1,054 births were registered, or 45 more than in the month under review. The births were 236 above the average of the previous ten years, but only 101 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in July numbered 521, viz., 280 of males, and 241 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 488. The deaths outnumbered those in June by 12, and exceeded the average of July during the previous ten years by 74. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been lower than that average by 5.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 3.12, and of deaths registered 1.61.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 61.2° on the 24th, and the lowest was 29.9° on the 15th. The mean temperature of the month (46.2°) was a degree and a fifth below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (23.1°) took place on the 16th, viz., from a maximum of 57.6° to a minimum of 34.5°. The least range (4.7°) was on the 3rd, viz., from a maximum of 53.8° to a minimum of 49.1°. The mean daily range was 13.6°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.503 inches on the 30th, and the lowest (29.535 inches) on the 26th. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.150 inches) was slightly above the average.

Rain fell on 10 days, the amount of rainfall being 1.133 inch. Fog occurred on 8 days, which is twice the number in any previous month of the year. There was fog on 4 days in June, 4 in April, 1 day in March, and 1 in February, but no fog in May or January.

Males contributed 54 per cent., and females 46 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 26 per cent. to that mortality, as against 39 per cent. in July 1884; 32 per cent. in July 1883; 34 per cent. in July 1882; 33 per cent. in July 1881; 36 per cent. in July 1880; 29 per cent. in July 1879 and July 1878; 33 per cent. in July 1877; 30 per cent. in July 1876; and 29 per cent. in July 1875.

As many as 34 deaths of persons who had attained or passed the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these a male, of occupation unstated, aged 75, died of hæmaturia; a laborer—a patient in the Lunatic Asylum—aged 75, a female, aged 75, a builder, aged 76, four females, aged 79, 83, 84, and 93 respectively, of heart disease; a female, aged 75, a gentleman, aged 79, a female, aged 81, a dairyman, aged 82, a mason and a female, each aged 84, of bronchitis; a plasterer, aged 77, of nephritis; a carpenter, aged 78, of meningitis; a tailor, aged 80, of typhoid-fever; a gentleman, aged 80, and a gardener, aged 89, of cystitis; a laborer, aged 83, of malignant tumor of the neck; a stonemason and a gentleman, each aged 75, a butcher, aged 76, a female, aged 76, a gentleman, aged 77, two females, each aged 79, a female, aged 80, another female, aged 82, a male, of occupation unstated, aged 83, a male cook, aged 84, a watchmaker, aged 85, and a laborer and a female, each aged 90, of old age.

Twenty-six deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which 23 were set down to accident, 2 to homicide, and 1 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A male infant, aged 3 months, died of extravasation of blood on the brain, caused by falling out of the arms of his nurse; a female child, aged 2, was killed by falling from a waggonette; a boy, aged 11, died of internal injury, the result of a fall; a foreman of sawmills, aged 21, of injuries received by the scull, a cart-wheel passing over him; a quarryman, aged 26, was killed, a piece of a crane falling on him; a boy, aged 9, died of fracture of the skull, a cart-wheel passing over him; a porter, aged 20, a dealer, aged 39, and a carpenter, aged 36, were killed, through being passed over by railway trains; a male, of occupation unknown, aged 55, was found dead, death having resulted from injury to the brain, probably caused by a heavy fall; a boy, aged 11, died of tetanus and fracture of little finger, consequent on being run over; a laborer, aged 17, of tetanus caused by accidental injury to the foot; a female, aged 4, of burns; a coachsmith, aged 25, a male of occupation unknown, aged 40, and a publican, aged 63, were drowned in the River Yarra; an able seaman, aged 48, was drowned in Hobson's Bay; two male infants, each aged 3 weeks, and two female infants, aged 1 and 2 months respectively, were overlain; a laborer, aged 45, died of asphyxia, caused by his neck becoming jammed whilst getting over a fence; a female infant, aged 2 days, of injuries received at birth. The homicidal deaths were those of a male and a female infant, who were murdered at birth, the former by suffocation and the latter by neglect and exposure. The suicidal death was that of a female, aged 39, who poisoned herself with essential oil of almonds whilst of unsound mind.

One hundred and six deaths, or 20 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—51 in the Melbourne Hospital, 12 in the Alfred Hospital, 1 in the Homœopathic Hospital, 6 in the Children's Hospital, 5 in the Lying-in Hospital, 6 in the Immigrants' Home, 9 in the Benevolent Asylum, 5 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 3 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Austin Hospital, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, 4 in the Infant Asylum, and 1 in the Protestant Infirmary.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 134, of which 69, or 51 per cent., were of males, and 65, or 49 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 90 were under one year of age, 24 were between one and two, 7 were between two and three, 7 were between three and four, and 6 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 387. Of these, 211, or 55 per cent., were males; and 176, or 45 per cent., were females; 16 were between five and ten, 9 were between ten and fifteen, 17 were between fifteen and twenty, 35 were between twenty and twenty-five, 29 were between twenty-five and thirty, 18 were between thirty and thirty-five, 24 were between thirty-five and forty, 31 were between forty and forty-five, 17 were between forty-five and fifty, 32 were between fifty and fifty-five, 43 were between fifty-five and sixty, 35 were between sixty and sixty-five, 23 were between sixty-five and seventy, 24 were between seventy and seventy-five, 16 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 18 were upwards of eighty.

The most fatal complaints during the month were those of the respiratory system; deaths from them having numbered 122 against 76 in June. Amongst these, laryngitis caused 4 deaths against 3; bronchitis, 37 deaths against 27; pleurisy, 5 deaths against 3; pneumonia and congestion of the lungs, 71 deaths against 41; asthma, 2 deaths against 1; and lung disease undefined, 3 deaths against 1. The mortality from zymotic diseases was low, deaths from croup having fallen from 7 in June to 5, those from whooping-cough from 4 to 1, those from typhoid fever from 15 to 10, and those from metria from 5 to 2. Notwithstanding the prevalence of influenza, only 3 deaths were ascribed to that complaint during the month, against 2 in June. Phthisis or consumption was not nearly so fatal as in June, deaths from it having fallen from 67 to 59. It may be remarked that, notwithstanding the population of Melbourne and suburbs must have increased by nearly 20,000, the whole mortality was less by 61, the mortality from affections of the throat and chest was less by 19, and the mortality from phthisis was less by 5 than during the same month in 1884.

REGULATIONS FOR PREVENTING COLLISIONS
AT SEA.

THE accompanying copy of an Order of the Queen in Council, which has been received by His Excellency the Governor from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, is published for general information.

AT THE COURT AT OSBORNE HOUSE, ISLE OF WIGHT, THE
11TH DAY OF AUGUST 1884.

Present:

THE QUEEN'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Order in Council made in pursuance of *The Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act 1862*, and dated the fourteenth day of August, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, Her Majesty, on the joint recommendation of the Admiralty and the Board of Trade, was pleased to direct that, on and after the first day of September, One thousand eight hundred and eighty, the Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea contained in an Order in Council, dated the 9th day of January, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, and the additions by an Order in Council, dated the thirtieth day of June, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, made thereto, should be annulled, and that there should be substituted therefor the new Regulations contained in the First Schedule to the said first-named Order in Council, and that the same should, from and after the first day of September, One thousand eight hundred and eighty, apply to ships of the countries mentioned in the said Second Schedule thereto, whether within British jurisdiction or not:

And whereas by the Orders in Council dated, respectively, the twenty-fourth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and eighty, the twenty-sixth day of August, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, the eighteenth day of August, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, the twenty-third day of August, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, and the second day of February, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, Her Majesty was pleased to direct that the operation of the Article numbered 10, of the New Regulations contained in the First Schedule of the said Order in Council of the fourteenth day of August, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, should be suspended from time to time:

And whereas the Admiralty and the Board of Trade have jointly recommended to Her Majesty that, so far as regards British ships and boats, the regulations hereinafter set forth shall be substituted for the regulations contained in the First Schedule to the said Order in Council of the fourteenth day of August, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Her by the said recited Act, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to direct that, on and after the first day of September, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, the regulations contained in the Schedule hereto shall, so far as regards British ships and boats, be substituted for the regulations contained in the First Schedule to the said Order in Council of the fourteenth day of August, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine.

REGULATIONS FOR PREVENTING COLLISIONS AT SEA.

Art. 1. In the following rules every steam ship which is under sail and not under steam is to be considered a sailing ship; and every steam ship which is under steam, whether under sail or not, is to be considered a ship under steam.

Rules concerning Lights.

Art. 2. The lights mentioned in the following Articles, numbered 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, and 11, and no others, shall be carried in all weathers, from sunset to sunrise.

Art. 3. A seagoing steam ship when under way shall carry—

(a.) On or in front of the foremast, at a height above the hull of not less than 20 feet, and if the breadth of the ship exceeds 20 feet, then at a height above the hull not less than such breadth, a bright white light, so constructed as to show an uniform and unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of 20 points of the compass, so fixed as to throw the light 10 points on each side of the ship, viz., from right ahead to two points abaft the beam on either side, and of such a character as to be visible on a dark night, with a clear atmosphere, at a distance of at least five miles.

(b.) On the starboard side, a green light so constructed as to show an uniform and unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of 10 points of the compass, so fixed as to throw the light from right ahead to 2 points abaft the beam on the starboard side, and of such a character as to be visible on a dark night, with a clear atmosphere, at a distance of at least two miles.

(c.) On the port side, a red light, so constructed as to show an uniform and unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of 10 points of the compass, so fixed as to throw the light from right ahead to 2 points abaft the beam on the port side, and of such a character as to be visible on a dark night, with a clear atmosphere, at a distance of at least two miles.

(d.) The said green and red side lights shall be fitted with inboard screens projecting at least three feet forward from the light, so as to prevent these lights from being seen across the bow.

Art. 4. A steam ship, when towing another ship, shall, in addition to her side lights, carry two bright white lights in a

vertical line one over the other, not less than three feet apart, so as to distinguish her from other steam ships. Each of these lights shall be of the same construction and character, and shall be carried in the same position as the white light which other steam ships are required to carry.

Art. 5. (a.) A ship, whether a steam ship or a sailing ship, which from any accident is not under command, shall at night carry, in the same position as the white light which steam ships are required to carry, and if a steam ship, in place of that light, three red lights in globular lanterns, each not less than 10 inches in diameter, in a vertical line one over the other, not less than three feet apart, and of such a character as to be visible on a dark night, with a clear atmosphere, at a distance of at least two miles; and shall by day carry in a vertical line one over the other, not less than three feet apart, in front of but not lower than her foremast head, three black balls or shapes, each two feet in diameter.

(b.) A ship, whether a steam ship or a sailing ship employed in laying or in picking up a telegraph cable, shall at night carry in the same position as the white light which steam ships are required to carry, and, if a steam ship, in place of that light, three lights in globular lanterns each not less than 10 inches in diameter, in a vertical line over one another, not less than six feet apart; the highest and lowest of these lights shall be red, and the middle light shall be white, and they shall be of such a character that the red lights shall be visible at the same distance as the white light. By day she shall carry in a vertical line one over the other not less than six feet apart, in front of but not lower than her foremast head, three shapes not less than two feet in diameter, of which the top and bottom shall be globular in shape and red in color, and the middle one diamond in shape and white.

(c.) The ships referred to in this Article, when not making any way through the water, shall not carry the side lights, but when making way shall carry them.

(d.) The lights and shapes required to be shown by this Article are to be taken by other ships as signals that the ship showing them is not under command, and cannot therefore get out of the way. The signals to be made by ships in distress and requiring assistance are contained in Article 27.

Art. 6. A sailing ship under way, or being towed, shall carry the same lights as are provided by Article 3 for a steam ship under way, with the exception of the white light, which she shall never carry.

Art. 7. Whenever, as in the case of small vessels during bad weather, the green and red side lights cannot be fixed, these lights shall be kept on deck, on their respective sides of the vessel, ready for use; and shall, on the approach of or to other vessels, be exhibited on their respective sides in sufficient time to prevent collision, in such manner as to make them most visible, and so that the green light shall not be seen on the port side nor the red light on the starboard side.

To make the use of these portable lights more certain and easy, the lanterns containing them shall each be painted outside with the color of the light they respectively contain, and shall be provided with proper screens.

Art. 8. A ship, whether a steam ship or a sailing ship, when at anchor, shall carry, where it can best be seen, but at a height not exceeding 20 feet above the hull, a white light, in a globular lantern of not less than eight inches in diameter, and so constructed as to show a clear uniform and unbroken light visible all round the horizon at a distance of at least one mile.

Art. 9. A pilot vessel, when engaged on her station on pilotage duty, shall not carry the lights required for other vessels, but shall carry a white light at the masthead, visible all round the horizon, and shall also exhibit a flare-up light or flare-up lights at short intervals, which shall never exceed fifteen minutes.

A pilot vessel, when not engaged on her station on pilotage duty, shall carry lights similar to those of other ships.

Art. 10. Open boats and fishing vessels of less than 20 tons net registered tonnage, when under way and when not having their nets, trawls, dredges, or lines in the water, shall not be obliged to carry the colored side lights; but every such boat and vessel shall in lieu thereof have ready at hand a lantern with a green glass on the one side and a red glass on the other side, and on approaching to or being approached by another vessel such lantern shall be exhibited in sufficient time to prevent collision, so that the green light shall not be seen on the port side nor the red light on the starboard side.

The following portion of this Article applies only to fishing vessels and boats when in the sea off the coast of Europe lying north of Cape Finisterre:—

(a.) All fishing vessels and fishing boats of 20 tons net registered tonnage, or upwards, when under way and when not required by the following regulations in this Article to carry and show the lights therein named, shall carry and show the same lights as other vessels under way.

(b.) All vessels when engaged in fishing with drift nets shall exhibit two white lights from any part of the vessel where they can be best seen. Such lights shall be placed so that the vertical distance between them shall be not less than 6 feet and not more than 10 feet; and so that the horizontal distance between them measured in a line with the keel of the vessel shall be not less than 5 feet and not more than 10 feet. The lower of these two lights shall be the more forward, and both of them shall be of such a character, and contained in lanterns of such construction, as to show all round the horizon, on a dark night, with a clear atmosphere, for a distance of not less than three miles.

(c.) A vessel employed in line fishing with her lines out shall carry the same lights as a vessel when engaged in fishing with drift nets.

- (d.) If a vessel when fishing becomes stationary in consequence of her gear getting fast to a rock or other obstruction, she shall show the light and make the fog signal for a vessel at anchor.
- (e.) Fishing vessels and open boats may at any time use a flare-up in addition to the lights which they are by this Article required to carry and show. All flare-up lights exhibited by a vessel when trawling, dredging, or fishing with any kind of drag net, shall be shown at the after part of the vessel, excepting that, if the vessel is hanging by the stern to her trawl, dredge, or drag net, they shall be exhibited from the bow.
- (f.) Every fishing vessel and every open boat when at anchor between sunset and sunrise shall exhibit a white light visible all round the horizon at a distance of at least one mile.
- (g.) In fog, mist, or falling snow, a drift net vessel attached to her nets, and a vessel when trawling, dredging, or fishing with any kind of drag net, and a vessel employed in line fishing with her lines out, shall at intervals of not more than two minutes make a blast with her fog horn and ring her bell alternately.

Art. 11. A ship which is being overtaken by another shall show from her stern to such last-mentioned ship a white light or a flare-up light.

Sound Signals for Fog, &c.

Art. 12. A steam ship shall be provided with a steam whistle or other efficient steam sound signal, so placed that the sound may not be intercepted by any obstructions, and with an efficient fog horn to be sounded by a bellows or other mechanical means, and also with an efficient bell.¹ A sailing ship shall be provided with a similar fog horn and bell.

In fog, mist, or falling snow, whether by day or night, the signals described in this Article shall be used as follows, that is to say:—

- (a.) A steam ship under way shall make with her steam whistle or other steam sound signal, at intervals of not more than two minutes, a prolonged blast.
- (b.) A sailing ship under way shall make with her fog horn, at intervals of not more than two minutes, when on the starboard tack one blast, when on the port tack two blasts in succession, and when with the wind abaft the beam three blasts in succession.
- (c.) A steam ship and a sailing ship, when not under way, shall at intervals of not more than two minutes ring the bell.

Speed of Ships to be moderate in Fog, &c.

Art. 13. Every ship, whether a sailing ship or steam ship, shall in a fog, mist, or falling snow, go at a moderate speed.

Steering and Sailing Rules.

Art. 14. When two sailing ships are approaching one another, so as to involve risk of collision, one of them shall keep out of the way of the other, as follows, viz.:

- (a.) A ship which is running free shall keep out of the way of a ship which is close-hauled.
- (b.) A ship which is close-hauled on the port tack shall keep out of the way of a ship which is close-hauled on the starboard tack.
- (c.) When both are running free with the wind on different sides, the ship which has the wind on the port side shall keep out of the way of the other.
- (d.) When both are running free with the wind on the same side, the ship which is to windward shall keep out of the way of the ship which is to leeward.
- (e.) A ship which has the wind aft shall keep out of the way of the other ship.

Art. 15. If two ships under steam are meeting end on, or nearly end on, so as to involve risk of collision, each shall alter her course to starboard, so that each may pass on the port side of the other.

This Article only applies to cases where ships are meeting end on, or nearly end on, in such a manner as to involve risk of collision, and does not apply to two ships which must, if both keep on their respective courses, pass clear of each other.

The only cases in which it does apply are, when each of the two ships is end on, or nearly end on, to the other; in other words, to cases in which, by day, each ship sees the masts of the other in a line, or nearly in a line, with her own; and by night to cases in which each ship is in such a position as to see both the side lights of the other.

It does not apply, by day, to cases in which a ship sees another ahead crossing her own course; or by night, to cases where the red light of one ship is opposed to the red light of the other, or where the green light of one ship is opposed to the green light of the other, or where a red light without a green light, or a green light without a red light, is seen ahead, or where both green and red lights are seen anywhere but ahead.

Art. 16. If two ships under steam are crossing, so as to involve risk of collision, the ship which has the other on her own starboard side shall keep out of the way of the other.

Art. 17. If two ships, one of which is a sailing ship, and the other a steam ship, are proceeding in such directions as to involve risk of collision, the steam ship shall keep out of the way of the sailing ship.

Art. 18. Every steam ship, when approaching another ship, so as to involve risk of collision, shall slacken her speed or stop and reverse, if necessary.

¹ In all cases where the regulations require a bell to be used a drum will be substituted on board Turkish vessels.

Art. 19. In taking any course authorized or required by these regulations, a steam ship under way may indicate that course to any other ship which she has in sight by the following signals on her steam whistle, viz.:

One short blast to mean "I am directing my course to starboard."

Two short blasts to mean "I am directing my course to port."

Three short blasts to mean "I am going full speed astern."

The use of these signals is optional, but if they are used the course of the ship must be in accordance with the signal made.

Art. 20. Notwithstanding anything contained in any preceding Article, every ship, whether a sailing ship or a steam ship, overtaking any other shall keep out of the way of the overtaken ship.

Art. 21. In narrow channels, every steam ship shall, when it is safe and practicable, keep to that side of the fairway or mid-channel which lies on the starboard side of such ship.

Art. 22. Where by the above rules one of two ships is to keep out of the way, the other shall keep her course.

Art. 23. In obeying and construing these rules due regard shall be had to all dangers of navigation, and to any special circumstances which may render a departure from the above rules necessary in order to avoid immediate danger.

No Ship, under any circumstances, to neglect proper precautions.

Art. 24. Nothing in these rules shall exonerate any ship, or the owner, or master, or crew thereof, from the consequences of any neglect to carry lights or signals, or of any neglect to keep a proper look out, or of the neglect of any precaution which may be required by the ordinary practice of seamen, or by the special circumstances of the case.

Reservation of Rules for Harbors and Inland Navigation.

Art. 25. Nothing in these rules shall interfere with the operation of a special rule, duly made by local authority, relative to the navigation of any harbor, river, or inland navigation.

Special Lights for Squadrons and Convoys.

Art. 26. Nothing in these rules shall interfere with the operation of any special rules made by the Government of any nation with respect to additional station and signal lights for two or more ships of war or for ships sailing under convoy.

Art. 27. When a ship is in distress and requires assistance from other ships or from the shore, the following shall be the signals to be used or displayed by her, either together or separately, that is to say:—

In the daytime—

1. A gun fired at intervals of about a minute;
2. The International Code signal of distress indicated by N C;
3. The distant signal, consisting of a square flag, having either above or below it a ball or anything resembling a ball.

At night—

1. A gun fired at intervals of about a minute;
2. Flames on the ship (as from a burning tar barrel, oil barrel, &c.);
3. Rockets or shells, throwing stars of any color or description, fired one at a time, at short intervals.

ABOLITION OF CLOSE SEASON FOR NATIVE COMPANIONS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the thirty-first year of Her Majesty's reign, intitled *An Act to protect Game*, it is amongst other things enacted that the period of the year during which the said act shall be in operation as regards Native Companions shall be from and after the first day of August until the thirtieth day of November in each year, or such other period as the Governor in Council may by proclamation, to be published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time direct: And whereas by a proclamation dated the twenty-ninth day of June One thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, and published in the *Government Gazette* of 3rd July 1868, the period of the year during which the said act shall be in operation as regards this species of native game was extended to the twentieth day of December in each year: And whereas it is deemed expedient to abolish the close season for native companions: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the proclamation dated the 29th day of June 1868 as relates to native companions, and do abolish the close season therefor.

PORT AND HARBOR REGULATIONS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Passengers Harbors and Navigation Statute 1865* it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might, by proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time, define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria, and frame rules and regulations for the governance and preservation of such ports and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and might appoint officers to carry out and enforce such rules and regulations; and from time to time in like manner might alter, amend, or repeal any such limits, boundaries, rules and regulations, and substitute others in their stead: And whereas by a Proclamation dated the thirtieth day of May 1867, made by His Excellency Sir John Henry Thomas Manners-Sutton, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the said Colony of Victoria, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the said colony on the twenty-first day of May, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, the limits and boundaries of the port of Port Phillip were defined to consist of all inlets, rivers, bays, and harbors within a line drawn from Point Lonsdale to Point Nepean, and not included in the ports of Melbourne and Geelong respectively: And whereas it is expedient to repeal the additional Port and Harbor Regulations proclaimed on the twenty-eighth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, in so far as they relate to the navigation of the West Channel: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Brougham Loch, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, the

Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the same, do hereby repeal the additional Port and Harbor Regulations proclaimed on the twenty-eighth day of March 1885, in so far as they relate to the navigation of the West Channel.

NOTE.—The apparent increase of population in the first half of 1885 has been 12,127, as against 14,013 in the first half of 1884.

During the quarter ended 30th June the increase by excess of registered births over registered deaths was 4,152, viz., 1,897 males and 2,255 females; that by excess of recorded arrivals by sea over recorded departures by sea was 2,064, viz., 1,626 males and 438 females. The total increase of population was thus 6,216, viz., 3,523 males and 2,693 females, as shown in the table. It should be stated that, whilst it is probable nearly all the deaths and arrivals by sea are noted, there is reason to believe that some births and departures by sea are not recorded; it should, moreover, be borne in mind that no attempt is made to take an account of persons who come and go overland.

The estimated population of New South Wales on the 30th June, just published, was 947,986, the apparent increase since the beginning of the year being 26,837. At the rates of increase estimated to have taken place during the past half-year, both Victoria and New South Wales should show a population of a million by the 30th June 1886.

ROMSEY SHIRE WATERWORKS TRUST.—
REGULATION.

REGULATION No. 6.

A REGULATION of the Romsey Shire Waterworks Trust, made under the 44th section of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881*, for the purpose of imposing, levying, and receiving of a rate.

In pursuance of the powers granted or conferred by section 44 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881*, the Commissioners of the Romsey Shire Waterworks Trust make the following Regulation—

A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all the ratable property in the Waterworks district of the Romsey Shire Waterworks Trust, according to the valuation for the time being, of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the shire of Romsey, in which such lands and tenements are situate, for one year: commencing on the first day of September 1885 and ending on the thirty-first day of August 1886.

Such rate shall be payable and be collected in two equal portions or instalments of One shilling each; and the first portion or instalment shall be due and payable on second day of September 1885, and the second portion or instalment shall be due and payable on the second day of March 1886.

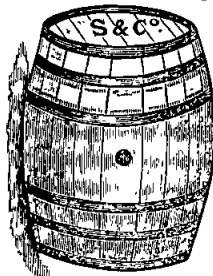
