PROCLAMATION OF SPECIAL LICENSING¹ DISTRICTS REVOKED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1870* (No. 566, section 44) it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained, it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exists to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses might be specially granted; and from time to time to revoke any such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke all and every proclamation issued under the authority of the 44th section of the said Act, in relation to the places or districts named or specified in the subjoined Schedule, that is to say:—

Reefs near Noord Island.

THE commander of H.N.M. surveying vessel *Blommendal* reports a reef, with precipitous sides, to lie in the vicinity of Noord Island. This reef, composed of coral, stones, and hard bottom of bright-red color, is 440 yards long E. by W.—N. by E., and nearly 160 yards in width. The shallowest patch, 3½ fathoms at low water, lies nearly on the centre bearings, as follows:—

South point of Poe. Sina	... N. 274° E.
South point of Noord Island	... N. 293° E.
Conspicuous tree on Noord Island	... N. 315° 5' E., distant 1420 yards.

North-east point of Noord Island ... N. 323° E.
Goenoeng Lagoendie in line with the right (north-west) point of the northern of the Gezusters.

Goenoeng Suemoer in line with Poe. Logok.

This reef is distant 820 yards of the reef surrounding Poe. Sina. Three hundred and thirty yards N.N.W. of this reef, and east of the south point of Noord Island, lies a coral patch, 5½ fathoms least water, about 330 yards in extent E.—W.

Unequal soundings of 6½ to 8½ fathoms, stone bottom, sand and small stones, have been obtained between the two shoals; 9 to 15 fathoms are found, mud and sand, all round.

No discolored water was seen.
To avoid these dangers, Noord Island and Poe. Sina should be given a berth of not less than 1600 yards.

THE SHIRE OF PRESTON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed by the Parliament of Victoria in the forty-seventh year of Her Majesty's reign, intituled *An Act to remove doubts as to the power of the Governor in Council to change the names of Shires, Boroughs, Towns, or Cities, and of the Corporations thereof*, it was enacted that the Governor in Council might at any time, on the request of the council of any shire, borough, town, or city, alter, by proclamation, to be published in the *Government Gazette*, the name of any such shire, borough, town, or city, and of the corporation thereof: And whereas the council of the shire of Preston has requested that the name of that shire be changed to Preston: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this proclamation alter the name of the said shire of "Jika" to

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Governor in Council might from time to time make an Order to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight; and it was also enacted that the Governor in Council might exercise any of the powers thereinbefore conferred after the presentation of a petition in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act for the exercise thereof, and after the publication of such petition as therein described and the lapse of one month at the least from the day of such publication, and except as thereinafter provided not otherwise, but it should be in the discretion of the Governor in Council absolutely to refuse the prayer of any such petition or to grant the whole or any part thereof; and it was also enacted that every petition to subdivide or re-subdivide or to alter the boundaries of or abolish the subdivisions existing in any municipal district should be signed by one-fourth of the persons whose names were for the time being inscribed on the municipal roll: And whereas a petition has been addressed to the Governor in Council, signed by not less than one-fourth of the persons whose names are for the time being inscribed on the municipal roll of the city of South Melbourne praying for the subdivision of the said city into five separate wards: And whereas the substance and prayer of the said petition have been duly published in the *Government Gazette* and in a newspaper circulating in the said city, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act: And whereas no counter petition, signed by an equal or a larger number of persons qualified to sign a like petition, has been presented to the Governor in Council within one month after the publication of the substance and prayer of the petition aforesaid: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth, by this present Order, subdivide the city of South Melbourne into the five separate subdivisions or wards hereinafter named and described, that is to say:-

FAWKNER WARD.—Commencing at a point on the River Yarra on the northern boundary of the city, immediately opposite the centre of Clarendon street; thence north-easterly

by the said boundary to the Main Brighton road; thence south-easterly by the said road and city boundary to a point on same east of the centre of Dorcas street; thence south-westerly to and by the centre of Dorcas street to its intersection with Clarendon street; and thence north-westerly by the centre of the last named street to the commencing point.

QUEEN'S WARD.—Commencing at the intersection of Clarendon and Dorcas streets; thence north-easterly by the centre of the last named street to the city boundary at the Brighton road; thence south-easterly by the said road and the city boundary to the south-east angle of the said city; thence south-westerly by the city boundary to a point on same in Albert Park, opposite the centre of a continuation of Clarendon street; thence north-westerly to and by the centre of Clarendon street aforesaid to the commencing point.

CANTERBURY WARD.—Commencing at the intersection of Clarendon street and Bridport street; thence south-westerly along the centre of Bridport street to the intersection of Gatehouse street; thence southerly along the centre of Gatehouse street to the city boundary at the sea-coast; thence south-easterly by the sea-coast, being the city boundary, to the south-west angle thereof; thence north-easterly by the said boundary to a point on same opposite the centre of a continuation of Clarendon street aforesaid; and thence north-westerly to the centre of Clarendon street to commencing point.

BEACONSFIELD WARD.—Commencing at the intersection of Clarendon street and Bridport street; thence south-westerly along the centre of Bridport street to the intersection of Gatehouse street; thence southerly by the centre of Gatehouse street to the city boundary at the sea-coast; thence north-westerly by the sea-coast, being the city boundary, to a point on same opposite the centre of Pickles street; thence northerly along the centre of Pickles street, being the city boundary, to the centre of the Sandridge road; thence along said road to its intersection with York street; thence north-easterly by the centre of York street to the centre of Clarendon street; and thence south-easterly by the centre of Clarendon street to the commencing point.

NORMANBY WARD.—Commencing at the intersection of Clarendon street and York street; thence south-westerly by the centre of York street to the centre of Sandridge road; thence continuing south-westerly by the centre of the Sandridge road to the city boundary at Boundary street; thence north-westerly by said street, being the city boundary, to the Yarra River; thence easterly by said river, being the city boundary, to a point opposite the centre of Clarendon street; and thence south-easterly to and by the centre of Clarendon street to the point of commencement.

No. 506), § 19 vi, 38, 39 iv, and 49, it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, to annex an outlying district forming with the municipal district of some municipality one continuous area to such municipal district; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor in the sections of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition under the municipal seal of the Shire of Tambo, and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the same Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order annex to the Shire of Tambo the outlying district described in such petition as an additional subdivision to the said Shire of Tambo, to be named the Bendoc Riding: and with the advice aforesaid doth hereby re-define the boundaries of the said Shire of Tambo as hereby enlarged, and also of the said newly constituted riding of the said shire, in manner following, that is to say:-

THE SHIRE OF TAMBO ENLARGED AND RE-DEFINED.

Commencing at the mouth of the Nicholson River; thence up that river to its source; thence direct to Mount Baldhead; thence by a direct line to the junction of the Tambo River and the Back Creek; up the latter creek to its head; thence to Mount Bindi and up the eastern watershed of the Tambo River to the Great Dividing Range; along this range to Forest Hill; thence south-easterly by the boundary between Victoria and New South

Wales to Cape Howe; thence westerly by the sea-coast and north shore of Lake King to the commencing point.

THE BENDOC RIDING CONSTITUTED AND DEFINED.

Commencing on the sea-coast at the Yering River; thence northerly by a direct line, being the east boundaries of the Snowy River and Buchan Ridings, to a point on the boundary between Victoria and New South Wales six miles south-east of the Snowy River; thence south-easterly by the said boundary to the sea-coast at Cape Howe; and thence westerly by the sea coast to the commencing point.

REGULATIONS UNDER "THE AGRICULTURAL COLLEGES ACT 1884" FOR REGULATING THE TIMES AND PLACES OF AND THE PROCEEDINGS AT MEETINGS OF THE COUNCIL OF AGRICULTURAL EDUCATION.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the seventh day of September 1885.

WHEREAS by section 24 of *The Agricultural Colleges Act 1884* it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter, and repeal regulations for regulating the times and places of and the proceedings at meetings of the Council of Agricultural Education: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above-recited Act, make the following Regulations (that is to say):—

TIMES AND PLACES OF MEETINGS.

1. The council shall meet once at least in every month at the Public Offices, Melbourne, or at such other place as the Council may from time to time determine, and the chairman shall at any time convene a special meeting, if so requested, in writing, by five members.

ORDER OF PROCEEDINGS.

2. *Acting chairman.*—In the absence of the chairman at any meeting, the council may appoint any member to act as chairman in his stead during his absence.

3. *Commencement of business.*—The council shall commence business at the time appointed; but if, at the expiry of fifteen minutes after the appointed time, there shall not be a majority of members of the council present, the meeting shall lapse, but may be adjourned by the chairman, or, in his absence, by the treasurer, for fifteen minutes.

4. *Accounts.*—Before any accounts shall be paid, a resolution of the council affirming the same shall be obtained.

5. *Order of business.*—The first business at each meeting of the council shall be to confirm the minutes of the preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon, except as to their accuracy as a record of proceedings. After the signing of the minutes, the order of business shall be as follows:—

- (1.) Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the council, if called for.
- (2.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (3.) Consideration of accounts.
- (4.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (5.) Receiving deputations.
- (6.) Presentation of reports of committees, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (7.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings, and any business the chairman may think desirable, with the unanimous consent of the members of the council present.
- (8.) Motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (9.) Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

6. *Business to be transacted.*—No business other than routine shall be transacted at an ordinary meeting unless notice of motion shall have been given at a previous meeting, except as provided in part (7), clause 6.

7. *Notices of motion.*—All notices of motion shall be in writing signed by the intending mover, and given at the meeting previous to that at which the same is to be taken into consideration.

8. *Action to be taken in absence of mover.*—No motion shall be proceeded with in the absence of the member who gave notice of the same, unless by some member having authority from him to that effect.

9. *Committees.*—The council may appoint committees to report on any subject or to carry out any business, subject to approval of the council, and such committee shall report thereon to the council at its first ordinary subsequent meeting.

10. *Rescinding of resolutions.*—No motion, the effect of which would be to rescind any previous resolution of the council, shall be entertained, unless a call of the whole council be duly made for the purpose.

11. *Proposing motion or amendment.*—Any member desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down. The member calling to order shall then be heard upon such point of order, and the question decided before the subject is resumed.

12. *Nature of motion to be stated.*—Any member desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before addressing the chair in support thereof.

13. *Motion not to be withdrawn without leave.*—Motion to be seconded.—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the consent of the council, and no motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the council unless it be seconded.

14. *Mover of motion.*—A member moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a member merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

15. *When more than one member rises.*—If two or more members rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

16. *No member to speak twice.*—No member shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

17. *Members not to digress, &c.*—No member shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, and all imputations of improper motives, and all personal reflections, shall be deemed highly disorderly.

18. *Chairman's decision final.*—The chairman's decision shall be final on all questions of order or practice, and he shall state the same without comment or argument.

19. *Amendments.*—Only one amendment shall be discussed at one time, and upon the adoption of any amendment, the original motion shall be deemed rejected, and the amendment so carried shall be acted upon as an original motion.

20. *Questions, how put.*—The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the council, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative; and the votes of all members (if a division be called for) shall be entered in the minutes.

21. *Mode of voting.*—The council shall vote by show of hands; any member may, however, call for a division upon any question, in which case the members voting in the affirmative shall stand up, and those in the negative shall retain their seats, until the vote is recorded.

22. *Motion for adjournment.*—A motion for adjournment of the council or of a debate may be moved at any time, but no discussion shall be allowed thereon.

And the Honorable Jonas Felix Leven, Her Majesty's Minister of Agriculture for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by section 20 of *The Agricultural Colleges Act 1884* the Governor in Council is empowered to regulate and limit the amount to which Members of the Council of Agricultural Education shall be entitled to be paid out of the Agricultural College fund as just and reasonable expenses in travelling to and from any meeting of the council, and to fix an amount to be paid for each day of attendance or for each year: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above-recited Act, make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1884* it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in section six of the said Act, except increasing lands which might be sold by auction: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby increase and diminish the area of Crown lands comprised in Classes Nos. 2 and 3 of said section, namely, "Agricultural and Grazing Lands" and "Auriferous Lands," to the extent and as set forth in the subjoined Schedules, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE HOTSPUR TOWN COMMON.

In pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons, made by the Governor in Council on 17th March 1885, a majority of the Managers of the Hotspur Town Common, having drafted the following Regulations for management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works, and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of such common:—

Regulations.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers residing within five (5) miles of the common, may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole, or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one (1) head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle. A farmer, having under cultivation not less than one-tenth (1/10) portion of the land occupied by him, may depasture on the common one (1) additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten (10) acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. No person shall depasture on the common stock of which he is not the *bona fide* owner.

3. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable quarterly in advance, on the first day of January, the first day of April, the first day of July, and the first day of October in every year:—

For every horse, 6s. per annum.

For every head of other large cattle, 4s. per annum.

For every head of small cattle, 1s. 4d. per annum.

Progeny under six (6) months old of stock legally depasturing on the common, free.

4. All stock upon which the prescribed fees shall remain unpaid for fourteen (14) days shall be liable to be impounded.

5. Sheep shall be depastured on such portions only of the common as the managers may set apart for the purpose.

6. All persons desirous of depasturing stock on the common shall furnish the managers with a written statement of the number and brands of such stock.

7. No entire horse over the age of ten (10) months, and no bull over the age of six (6) months, shall be allowed on the common without the consent, in writing, of the managers.

8. All horses and cattle placed on the common shall be branded with the common brand H.

9. All pigs found on the common shall be liable to be destroyed if their owners, after receiving forty-eight (48) hours' notice thereof, fail or neglect to remove them.

10. No person shall wilfully disturb stock on the common, nor remove therefrom stock of which he is not the *bona fide* owner; and no stock registered in the books of the managers shall be removed from the common by the owner, unless notice of his intention so to do be first given to the herdsman, who shall obtain a receipt from the owner for the stock removed.

11. The herdsman shall muster the stock on the expiration of every quarter.

12. The managers shall not be responsible for the loss of or injury to any stock placed on the common.

13. No animal affected with any contagious disease shall be allowed to depasture on the common, and if any of the stock thereon become so affected, and be not removed within twenty-four hours after notice thereof, in writing, has been given to the owner by the managers or the herdsman, the diseased stock shall be liable to be destroyed at the owner's risk and expense.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty (20) pounds for each offence.

THE MOE RACECOURSE AND RECREATION
RESERVE.—REGULATIONS.

WE, Shirley Waldegrave Brooke, Robert B. Davies, Thomas Walker Fowler, David S. Graham, Jesse Hasthorpe, George Moore, M.D., and William S. Stewart, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the reserve for Racecourse and other purposes of Public Recreation in the parish of Yarragon, known as "The Moe Racecourse and Recreation Reserve," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance-fees, or other charges for entering in or upon the said reserve, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*.

Regulations.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on such days as the reserve may be set apart for racing, or for a cricket or football match, or for the holding therein of shows, sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements, on the occasion of any of which a fee not exceeding 2s. 6d. may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult person to the reserve.
2. The committee of management may allow any duly recognized committee of any show, sports, fête, or holiday amusements to use the reserve, and such latter committee shall abide by any order given by the committee of management in reference to the reserve, or to the buildings or other erections for the time being thereon.
3. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
4. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
5. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
6. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, without the permission, in writing, of the committee of management; provided always that all moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
7. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.
8. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.
9. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

SHIRE OF MALVERN.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Malvern Shire Council has adopted the following Bye-law, and that it will come into operation on publication hereof:—

A Bye-law of the Shire of Malvern, made under section 213 of the "Local Government Act 1874," and numbered fifteen, for preventing obstructions to streets and other places by cattle.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the "Local Government Act 1874," the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Malvern order as follows:—

1. That from and after the date of this bye-law coming into operation, if any cattle shall be found upon any land not being a common, and such that there is no fence, whether upon the same land or any other, dividing such first-mentioned land from any street or road, whether public or private, without any person having charge of such cattle, the owner of such cattle shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings for every head of such cattle, and the proper officer of the council may seize such cattle and place the same at some neighboring place of safe custody; and any justice, if such owner be not known, upon proof of the issue of a summons in the usual form, addressed to such owner as "owner" only, without otherwise naming or describing him, such cattle and the place of seizure being duly described therein, and of the publication of such summons in some newspaper commonly circulating in the neighborhood, may, after the expiration of twenty-four hours from such publication, proceed with respect to such owner not appearing as if personal service of a summons stating his name had been effected, or if such owner appear, then as in other cases. And the justice may order the cattle to be sold, and the money arising from the sale, after deducting the said penalty and the costs awarded, and the reasonable expenses, to be estimated and assessed by the justice, of seizing, keeping, and selling the said cattle, shall be paid, if demanded, within one month to the owner of the cattle, and if not so demanded, then to the municipal fund. And if the said money shall not be sufficient for all the purposes aforesaid, the amount whereby the same falls short, or if no such sale be ordered the whole of the said amount, may be recovered from the said owner if and when known in like manner as other penalties and sums adjudged or ordered to be paid by justices are to be recovered.

2. If any cattle be at any time found in any street without any person having charge thereof, the owner of such cattle shall forfeit for every head of such cattle a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings, and if such cattle shall, by reason of having been so found at large, have been impounded by the council, the amount of such penalty and costs, if adjudged respectively before the release or sale of such cattle, shall be added to the pound fees and charges payable in respect of such cattle, and the amount thereof, or such amount (if any) as, after the sale of the cattle, may remain in the hands of the poundkeeper, shall be paid over by him accordingly; and if the proceeds of any sale of such cattle shall not be sufficient, after paying the lawful fees and charges aforesaid, to satisfy such penalty and costs, or if such penalty and costs shall have been adjudged after the release or sale of the cattle, the same or so much thereof as remains unpaid shall and may be recovered from the owner of the cattle in like manner as other penalties and costs adjudged by justices are by law recovered; and if in the case of any information under this section the owner be not known, then the provisions of the last preceding section, so far as necessary to give the adjudicating justice jurisdiction, shall apply.


