Reported sunken rock.

MASTERS of vessels are advised to exercise caution when navigating in the vicinity of the Anser Islands, the s.s. *Gulf of Carpentaria* having foundered after striking upon an alleged sunken rock, with about 20 feet over it at low-water, and not indicated upon Admiralty charts.

The rock is stated to bear approximately about 8 cables length or $\frac{1}{3}$ ths of a mile north from Cleft Island, with the peak of Rodondo Island open to the westward of the South Anser Island.

EAST CAPE ISLET, NORTH ISLAND.

OWING to several casualties to vessels having occurred in the vicinity of East Cape, the attention of masters of vessels is specially called to the under-mentioned directions in *The New Zealand Pilot*, viz. :-

"There is a channel nearly one mile wide between the cape and the islet, but, as the winds here are liable to die away suddenly, leaving a vessel at the mercy of the tides and swell, it cannot be recommended. There are several shoal patches off East Cape, which, together with the strong tides, make the passage between the cape and the islet not a desirable one. A shoal patch, with 3½ fathoms water on it, on which the sea would break in heavy weather, lies off the north-east point of the cape, about two-thirds of a mile; this is the line of breakers reported by H.M.S. *Eclipse* in 1864. There is another patch, nearly a mile S.E. & S. of the former, with 2½ fathoms water on it, at the entrance to the passage between East Cape and the islet."

Masters are advised to avoid the passage between the islet and the mainland as unsafe.

REEF EASTWARD OF MALAY REEF.

INFORMATION has been received from Mr. Cottor, commanding the British steam vessel *Abington*, of the existence of a coral reef lying about 18 miles E. & S. from Malay Reef, westward of the outer route to Torres Strait :-

This reef (*Abington Reef*) was passed by the *Abington* at 5h. p.m., 29th April 1885, at the distance of half a mile. It appeared to extend about one mile in a north-west and south-east direction, and the sea broke slightly on its south-western edge.

Position by observations: lat. 18° 2' S., long. 149° 37' E.
(The bearing is magnetic. Variation 7½° easterly in 1885.)

The births of 1,035 children, viz., 537 boys and 498 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of August. In the month of July 1,009 births were registered, or 26 fewer than in the month under review. The births were 201 above the average of the previous ten years, but only 54 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in August numbered 657, viz., 340 of males, and 317 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 378. The deaths outnumbered those in July by 130, and exceeded the average of August during the previous ten years by 225. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded the average of those ten years by 150 only.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 3.21, and of deaths registered 2.04.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 77.0° on the 20th, and the lowest was 31.7° on the 1st. The mean temperature of the month (51.9°) was nearly a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (25.3°) took place on the 1st, viz., from a maximum of 58.0° to a minimum of 31.7°. The least range (6.8°) was on the 21st, viz., from a maximum of 61.8° to a minimum of 55.0°. The mean daily range was 15.5°. The highest atmospheric pressure (30.405 inches) was on the 25th, and the lowest (29.232) on the 14th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.907) was slightly below the average.

Rain fell on 10 days, the amount of rainfall being 1.56 inches.

Males contributed 52 per cent., and females 48 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 23 per cent. to that mortality, as against 39 per cent. in August 1884; 30 per cent. in August 1883; 31 per cent. in August 1882; 33 per cent. in August 1881; 43 per cent. in August 1880; 36 per cent. in August 1879; 31 per cent. in August 1878; 34 per cent. in August 1877; 32 per cent. in August 1876; and 33 per cent. in August 1875.

The mortality amongst old people was very high during the month, as many as 66 deaths having taken place of people who had attained or passed the age of 75 years, which is the highest number on record, the monthly average since the beginning of the year having been 26. Of these, a female, aged 75, died of apoplexy; a female, aged 75, of pleurisy; a female, aged 75, and a gardener, aged 77, were drowned; a miner, aged 76, died of uremia; a railway employé, and two females, each aged 77, of heart disease; a cabman, aged 78, of paralysis; a female, aged 79, of cancer; a female, aged 79, of shock, the result of a fall; a male,

of occupation unknown, aged 80, of rheumatic gout; a schoolmistress, aged 80, of jaundice; a station hand (an inmate of the Benevolent Asylum), aged 81, of congestion of the lungs; a gentleman, aged 83, of dropsy; a gentleman, aged 86, of inguinal hernia; a gardener, aged 87, of gangrene of the scrotum; a female, aged 75, a gentleman and two females, each aged 76, a farmer and a female, each aged 77, a farmer, aged 78, two females, each aged 79, a solicitor and a publican, each aged 80, a female, aged 84, a gentleman and a female, each aged 86, two females, each aged 90, a laborer and a female, each aged 92, of bronchitis; a female, aged 75, a female, aged 76, a farmer, aged 77, a laborer, aged 78, a female, aged 80, a carpenter, aged 81, a farmer and two females, each aged 84, and a female, aged 86, of pneumonia; two females, each aged 75, two gentlemen and a fisherman, each aged 76, two females, each aged 79, a civil servant, a cabinetmaker, and a miner, each aged 80, a farmer, and a miner, each aged 81, a groom, aged 82, a plasterer, aged 83, a tinsmith (an inmate of the Immigrants' Home), aged 84, a female, aged 85, a gentleman, an umbrella-maker, and a farm laborer, each aged 89, a sailor, aged 92, and a laborer, aged 99, of old age.

Thirty-one deaths resulted from internal causes during the month, of which 30 were set down to accident, and 1 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A laborer, aged 16, died of compound fracture of the thigh, received whilst working at a brick-making machine; a sawyer, aged 16, was killed through being caught in machinery; a chemist, aged 36, died of fracture of the skull, caused by a fall from a horse; a blacksmith, aged 46, of injury to the belly, resulting from a kick from a horse; a charwoman, aged 54, was passed over by a railway train; a laborer, aged 57, and a female, aged 79, died of injuries consequent on falls. A marker, aged 37, was shot at the Williamstown butts; a female infant, aged 1 year, a boy and a girl, each aged 6, died of burns; a laborer, aged 48, from a shock by lightning; a carpenter, aged 39, of lead poisoning, and a printer, aged 66, of the effects of carbolic acid swallowed by mistake. A male child, aged 2, a seaman and a female servant, each aged 32, a builder, aged 43, a carter, aged 55, a packer, aged 59, a charcoal burner, aged 62, a gardener, aged 77, were drowned; an engine driver, aged 43, and a female, aged 75, were found drowned. Two female infants, aged 2 days and 3 months respectively, a male infant, aged 4 days, were overlain; a girl, aged 13, was suffocated by a window sash falling on her neck; a female infant, died of injury at birth, and a male infant, aged 3 days, of umbilical hemorrhage. The suicidal death was that of a laborer, aged 62, who hanged himself.

One hundred and fifty-seven deaths, or 24 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—70 in the Melbourne Hospital, 12 in the Alfred Hospital, 11 in the Children's Hospital, 14 in the Lying-in Hospital, 23 in the Immigrants' Home, 8 in the Benevolent Asylum, 6 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 5 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Austin Hospital, 3 in the Melbourne Gaol, 2 in the Protestant Refuge, and 1 in the St. Vincent de Paul's Orphanage for girls.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 150, of which 81, or 54 per cent., were of males, and 69, or 46 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 99 were under one year of age, 23 were between one and two, 12 were between two and three, 10 were between three and four, and 6 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 507. Of these, 259, or 51 per cent., were males, and 248, or 49 per cent., were females; 27 were between five and ten, 18 were between ten and fifteen, 15 were between fifteen and twenty, 32 were between twenty and twenty-five, 45 were between twenty-five and thirty, 29 were between thirty and thirty-five, 37 were between thirty-five and forty, 25 were between forty and forty-five, 36 were between forty-five and fifty, 38 were between fifty and fifty-five, 40 were between fifty-five and sixty, 41 were between sixty and sixty-five, 36 were between sixty-five and seventy, 22 were between seventy and seventy-five, 31 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 35 were upwards of eighty.

As in the previous month the most fatal diseases were those of the respiratory system, but deaths from complaints of this character were much more numerous in August than in July, the increase being from 122 to 199. Under this head deaths from laryngitis rose from 4 to 6; those from bronchitis, from 37 to 59; those from pleurisy, from 5 to 18; those from pneumonia, from 62 to 95; and those from congestion of the lungs, from 9 to 16. It may be remarked that most of these complaints commenced as influenza, which is classed as a zymotic disease, but afterwards assumed the form of bronchitis, pneumonia, pleurisy, &c., only 3 deaths being recorded as actually caused by influenza without complication. In August 1884, only 116 deaths were set down to diseases of the respiratory system, or 83 less than in the month under review. In the latter month, phthisis, which is not classed as a disease of the respiratory system, but as a constitutional disease, caused 72 deaths against 59 in July. It has been already stated that the mortality of old people was unprecedentedly high during the month under review.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT.—REGULATIONS FOR PUPILS IN ARCHITECTURE AND ENGINEERING.

Conditions.

An applicant for appointment must be not more than 20 years, or less than 16 years of age. He will be required to produce a medical certificate that he is of sound constitution, and not affected with any physical infirmity which could interfere with the proper discharge of his profession.

Qualifications.

1. The candidate must have passed in Algebra, Euclid, and Arithmetic in a Matriculation Examination in the Melbourne or other recognized University; or
2. Passed such other recognized examination, or produce such certificates from the Education Department or other authority as shall satisfy the Inspector-General of Public Works as to his competency in those three subjects, and as to his general educational proficiency.
3. He shall also, with such certificates, submit satisfactory proof of his aptitude for drawing.

Probation.

Each candidate approved by the Minister shall enter the office as a probationer for a period of one month without pay; and at the end of that time, if reported by the Inspector-General to have displayed aptitude for the work, he shall be enrolled as a pupil, and shall be subject to the General Regulations for the Public Service so far as they can fairly apply.

No more pupils will be received than are needed for the requirements of the Department.

Term of Service.

The term of service shall be two years, and at the end of each year the pupil will be required to pass an examination on the subjects mentioned in the attached schedule.

The Minister reserves the power to dispense at any time with the services of any pupil who may in the opinion of the Inspector-General be wanting in application, or in the careful performance of his work, or whose conduct may be considered by him to be unsatisfactory.

Remuneration.

The salary for the first year shall be £40, and, subject to the passing of the required examinations, the salary for the second year shall be £60. On successfully passing the prescribed departmental examinations, a pupil will, at the end of the term of two years, receive a certificate of competency as an Engineering or Architectural Draftsman; and on his further passing the examination under the Regulations of the Public Service Board for appointment to the Clerical division, such pupil will be eligible for appointment as Junior Draftsman of the 5th class in the Public Works Department, in the order of his merit, and in accordance with the provisions of the Regulations aforesaid.

Those pupils who have been appointed as Draftsmen in the Public Works Department, and who may have further qualified themselves for professional employment, will have an opportunity of presenting themselves for a further examination, by which they may obtain a certificate of qualification as Assistant Architects or Engineers, and be eligible for such appointment should a vacancy occur.

SCHEDULE OF SUBJECTS FOR EXAMINATION.

First Year.

Tracing, Coloring, Drawing to Scale, Neat Lettering, General Knowledge of Terms used in Building and Engineering Work, Mensuration, and Elementary Freehand Drawing.

Second Year.

Simple Geometrical and Freehand Drawing, Elementary Building Materials and Construction.

Elementary Knowledge of the Styles of Architecture.
Building Quantities, Ornamental Writing and Printing.
For Engineering—Simple Practical Trigonometry and Field Work.

Tracings and Drawings connected with the subjects for examination for each year, and duly certified as being the work of the pupil, will be considered in connection with each examination.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1884* (sec. 119) power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and repeal regulations, with regard to the calling for and receipt of tenders for, and the issuing of Grazing Licenses, under Part XI. of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS.

1. Persons resident within five miles of the Ballaarat and Creswick State Forest may, subject to the conditions hereinafter specified, depasture in the said forest any number not exceeding in the whole thirty head of cattle.

2. The depasturing of the abovenamed forest shall be subject to the supervision and control of the Crown Lands bailiff for the district within which the abovenamed forest is situated, and the bailiff shall be responsible for the registration of the cattle thereon and for the prevention of trespass.

3. The fee for depasturing cattle in the said forest shall be paid half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July in each year, and shall be for unfenced reserves at the rate of Two shillings per annum for every head of cattle.

4. Every person desirous of depasturing cattle in the abovenamed forest shall pay into the Receipt and Pay Office, at Ballaarat or Creswick, the full amount of the fees prescribed by these regulations, and shall obtain a receipt for such payment in the form prescribed in schedule hereto.

5. A place shall be set apart in the said forest, as the necessities of the case may require, for branding all cattle prior to the same being depastured in the said forest, and all persons shall bring their cattle to such place to be branded by the crown lands bailiff or his assistant, on a day appointed by the crown lands bailiff for the purpose of branding cattle. The days appointed for branding shall be notified by advertisement authorized by the crown lands bailiff in a newspaper circulating in the district.

6. All cattle depasturing in the above-mentioned forest shall be deemed to be trespassers unless the same have been duly branded by the crown lands bailiff or his assistant.

7. The brand of the said state forest shall be kept in the office of the district crown lands bailiff, and, except when the same is in use, may be inspected by the public at all reasonable hours, or a description thereof may be obtained on application in writing to the crown lands bailiff.

8. The brand of the above-mentioned state forest shall be liable to alteration at any time on approval by the Minister. Notice of every such alteration shall be published in a newspaper circulating in the district, and every such notice shall specify a time when the owners of all cattle depasturing under license in the said forest shall bring the same for the purpose of being branded with such altered brand. Every person disobeying such notice shall be deemed to be a person not licensed or otherwise authorized to depasture cattle within the meaning of section 109 of *The Land Act 1884*, and may be dealt with accordingly.

9. For the purpose of these regulations the term "cattle" shall mean and include any horse, mare, gelding, colt, filly or foal, any bull, ox, steer, cow, heifer or calf, and any ass or mule.

10. When the crown lands bailiff for the district shall consider that the said state forest is stocked to its full carrying capabilities he shall notify the receiver and paymaster accordingly, who thereupon shall discontinue to issue licenses for the said forest until otherwise advised by the district crown lands bailiff.

11. For the purpose of these Regulations the Receivers and Paymasters at Ballaarat and Creswick, for the time being, shall be persons authorized by the Governor in Council to issue licenses.

- Every application for a license to enter under the provisions of the 96th section of *The Land Act 1884* upon lands other than Crown lands, shall be addressed to the Minister of Water Supply for the time being, and shall be in the form prescribed in the Schedule A hereto.
- The applicant or applicants shall, at the time of making such application, send a copy thereof to every proprietor of the land concerning which the application is made, and to every person in occupation thereof.
- The applicant or applicants shall, unless such application is for the purpose only of cleaning or repairing any race or drain, send to the said Minister, together with every such application, a map, description, and report relating thereto by an authorized surveyor, and the sum of Fifteen pounds as a deposit to defray the costs (if any) of an inquiry.
- The report of the authorized surveyor and the map shall contain definite information as to the direction, dimensions, or capacity of the proposed race, drain, dam, or reservoir, or as to the nature and extent of the proposed improvements therein, and as to the discharge or the contents at different seasons of the source of supply whenever it is proposed to divert the water, and the maximum quantity of water which it is proposed to divert at a given time.
- If the said Minister think that such application ought to be entertained, he shall send it to a warden of the goldfields for hearing and consideration by him, and the warden shall have power to hear, receive, and examine evidence for, against, or in respect of such application.
- The warden shall notify to the applicant or applicants and to every proprietor and person in occupation the time and place at which such application will be heard, and he shall require every such proprietor or occupier, if he object to such application, to be then and there present in support of the objections.
- The warden shall not consider any such application unless he is satisfied that notice has been given to the proper parties interested, and if he is so satisfied he may proceed with the case notwithstanding the absence of all or any such parties.
- The warden shall take evidence in support of the application and as to the objections (if any) made thereto, and as to the tenure of every proprietor and occupier, and he shall forward such evidence to the said Minister, and he shall report generally on the case and as to the amount of money (if any) that any such proprietor or occupier ought to receive by way of costs, and the said Minister may direct such amount or such other amount as he thinks reasonable to be paid to any such proprietor or occupier out of the deposit before mentioned.
- The balance (if any) of such deposit, after defraying all costs of the inquiry as the Minister may direct, shall be returned to the applicant.
- If, upon considering the evidence taken by the warden and his report, the Board of Land and Works be of opinion that the license ought to issue, the said Board may grant a license in the form prescribed in Schedule B hereto or to the like effect.
- The fee for such license shall be One pound sterling, and the same may be renewed annually.

12. The licensee shall pay the annual renewal fee before the anniversary of the date of such license.

13. The licensee shall comply with all the conditions of the license.

14. In the event of the non-payment of the stipulated fee for the period of fourteen days after same is due, or in the event of a breach of the conditions of the license, the said Minister may declare the license void, and the same shall thereupon accordingly become void.

15. The amount or amounts of compensation to the owner of the said land for the damages occasioned by the entry upon such lands for the purposes expressed in such license shall be fixed and determined by two arbitrators and an umpire, under and in accordance with *The Common Law Procedure Statute 1865*, one arbitrator to be appointed by the applicant or applicants and one to be appointed by the proprietor or proprietors, occupier or occupiers (if any), and the umpire to be appointed by the said arbitrators.

16. In case any such applicant, proprietor, or occupier shall refuse or neglect for fourteen days after being thereunto required by the said Minister to appoint an arbitrator, it shall be lawful for the said Minister to appoint some person to act as arbitrator for and on the part of the person so refusing or neglecting.

17. Before granting any license under these regulations the Board of Land and Works may, if it think fit, require the applicant to deposit a sum of money to be held by the Board as security for the payment by the applicant or applicants of the compensation, and the Board may apply such sum or part thereof in payment, or part payment of any sum or sums awarded or fixed in an arbitration in respect of the amount of such compensation.

BYE-LAWS OF THE MOOROOPNA HOSPITAL made by the Committee thereof and confirmed by a General Meeting of Contributors, specially convened for that purpose, on the 30th day of July 1885.

Introductory.

1. All bye-laws made prior to the date of making these bye-laws shall be and the same are hereby repealed. Provided always that any regulations made, or agreement entered into, under the bye-laws previously in force shall be taken to have been made under these bye-laws until the same be amended or rescinded.

Object.

2. The object of the institution is to afford medical and surgical relief to poor persons requiring it, and to casualties.

Constitution.

3. The institution shall consist of a President, two Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, Governors, and Subscribers.

4. Life Governors, Life Subscribers, Governors for one year, and Contributors shall be eligible to sit on committee, with the privilege of voting at all general, special, and adjourned meetings of Governors and Contributors, and with power to recommend patients according to the undermentioned scale:—Life Governors, 3 in-patients or 6 out-patients annually; Life subscribers, 2 in-patients or 4 out-patients annually; contributors, 1 in-patient or 2 out-patients annually.

£25 personal contribution in one year shall constitute a Life Governor; £20 personal contribution in one year, Life Subscriber; £50 donation by society, association, or company shall entitle same to nominate Life Governor; £15 donation by society, association, or company, to nominate Governor for one year; £30, first-named executor under will Life Subscriber; £1 yearly subscription, Contributor.

5. Ministers of religion, employers, or any person collecting shall receive one member's ticket for every £1 collected, provided that they have not availed themselves of the position of Governors.

6. Annual subscriptions must be paid in advance for the current year, such year to be computed from the day on which such subscription be paid, and no Governor or Contributor shall be entitled to any privilege until his or her subscription be paid.

7. Life, and Annual Governors, Life and Annual Subscribers, all honorary officers, and other contributors of £1 and upwards per annum, shall be entitled to one vote at all meetings of Governors and contributors to the hospital. No person shall vote as a Governor or Contributor while he is a salaried officer or pupil of the hospital, nor any new Governor or Contributor unless his subscription shall have been paid six months previously.

General Meetings.

8. At all meetings of contributors, the president, one of the vice-presidents, or treasurer, as the case may be, shall take the chair; but in their absence the meeting shall choose its own chairman, who shall have a deliberative as well as a casting vote.

9. The annual meeting of the contributors to the hospital shall be held on the last Thursday in the month of July in every year, for the following purposes:—

(a.) The election of honorary and honorary consulting medical and surgical officers and auditors for the year.

(b.) The election of members of the committee of management.

(c.) The transaction of any other business, of which due notice shall have been given, or that may arise at such meeting.

10. At all general meetings of contributors, ten shall constitute a quorum, and as soon as a quorum be present the chair shall be taken, but if no quorum be present within one hour of the time named, such meeting shall stand adjourned for the following week, at the same day and hour.

11. It shall be competent for the committee of management or any five or more contributors, by a writing under their hands, to require the secretary to summons a special meeting of contributors, the occasion of calling such meeting being specified in the requisition; and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting except that for which it shall have been summoned. Every meeting shall be called by the secretary or three members of committee.

12. All elections, when contested, shall be by ballot.

13. The common seal of the corporation shall be kept in a box at the hospital, with two keys, one of which shall be kept by the president and the other by the secretary.

14. The common seal shall not be affixed to any deed or other instrument, except by order of the committee of management at a meeting at which a quorum of members at least are present.

15. On the last Thursday in the month of July in every year one-third part of the elected members of committee shall go out of office, but may be nevertheless re-elected, and the persons who

shall go out of office shall be those who have been longest in office without re-election, or, where two or more shall have been in office the same length of time, then those who shall go out of office shall be determined by Act 27 Vict. No. 220, sec. 11.

16. If any member of committee shall die, or resign by letter under his hand addressed to the secretary, or become insolvent or compound with his creditors, or be convicted of any treason felony or misdemeanor, or be absent for four consecutive meetings from the committee, his office shall become vacant, and the remaining members of the committee may declare his office vacant, and temporarily appoint thereto some contributor to such institution until the next annual meeting for the election of the committee, when the person thus temporarily appointed shall retire as one of those who by the provisions of the said Act are required to go out of office—27 Vict., No. 220, sec. 11.

Committee of Management.

17. The institution shall be managed by twenty-one members of committee, who shall be elected from the governors and contributors at the annual meeting. And the committee at its first sitting shall elect from amongst its members a president, two vice-presidents, and treasurer.

18. The committee of management may suspend any honorary medical or surgical officer, or one or more of its own members on any well-founded charge, provided that such suspension be approved of by a majority of the members present at a special meeting convened for the consideration of such charge; to be confirmed at a special meeting of governors and contributors to be held within fourteen days from the decision of the committee.

19. The committee of management shall direct the general business of the institution, frame rules for its internal regulation, and appoint and discharge all paid officers of the institution.

20. They shall meet on the second Saturday in each month, and on such other days as they may appoint, five to form a quorum; but if no quorum is present within half-an-hour of the time appointed, such meeting, as well as every special meeting hereinafter authorized, shall stand adjourned to such day and hour as the members present may determine. The chairman of committee shall have a casting as well as a deliberative vote.

21. The general committee shall have full power to consider any application, and discharge any patient who, in their opinion, is not a fit and proper person to receive the benefits of the institution, reporting in their minutes their reason for so refusing any application or ordering any discharge.

22. No person holding any office or place of profit under or in the gift of the board, or concerned or participating in the profit in or of any contract with the board shall be capable of holding a seat thereon. Provided that nothing in the preceding part of this rule shall extend or apply to any contract entered into by any company, partnership, or association, consisting of more than twenty persons, or any incorporated company where such contract is entered into for the general benefit of such company, partnership, or association, or to any person by reason of his being interested in any public journal publishing advertisements.

23. The committee of management shall present a general report of the affairs of the institution, together with a duly-audited balance-sheet, at the annual meeting of governors and contributors in July of each year; such balance-sheet to be published in one or more of the local papers at least within fourteen days after such meeting.

24. The president and vice-presidents shall be members *ex officio* of all committees, and the treasurer *ex officio* of the committee of management.

25. The committee of management, at their first meeting after the annual meeting of subscribers, shall elect a sub-committee, consisting of three members, to be designated the finance committee, and shall at each monthly meeting elect a house committee consisting of two or more members.

Chap. I.—Order of Proceedings.

26. The board shall commence business at each meeting as soon as the legal quorum is present; but if, at the expiration of thirty minutes after the appointed hour of meeting, there is no quorum present no business shall be transacted by the board at that meeting.

27. That the minutes of the preceding meeting shall be read as the first business at all meetings of the board, excepting at special meetings of the board, unless the confirmation of such minutes be as part of the business of the special meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereupon except as to their accuracy as a record of such proceedings.

28. At all meetings of the board, the reading of the correspondence unconnected with the orders of the day, the presentation of petitions by members of the board, and the bringing up of reports of committees, shall have precedence of regular business.

29. On the presentation of a petition, no debate shall take place thereon until notice has been given in the usual manner, and the only question that shall be entertained on the occasion of its presentation shall be that the petition be received, and, if necessary, that it be referred to a committee.

30. The order of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the board, and any business which the chairman may think fit to bring under consideration. Any member of the board, however, may bring forward such business as he may consider advisable in the form of a notice of motion, such notice to be given in writing to the secretary ten clear days previous to the meeting at which the same is to be taken into consideration. All such notices of motion to be considered in the order in which they were given.

31. No motion entered on the notice-paper shall be proceeded with unless the member who has given such notice, or some one authorized by him in writing, be present when the business is called in order. Notices not so proceeded with shall be struck out of the paper.

32. The mover of any motion which may be referred to any committee shall be a member of such committee.

Chap. II.—Order of Debate.

33. Any member desirous of proposing a motion or an amendment, or of discussing any matter under consideration, must rise and

address the president or the presiding chairman, and no member when speaking shall be interrupted, unless called to order, when he shall sit down, in which case the member calling to order shall be heard thereon in preference to any other speaker, and the question of order shall be disposed of before the subject is resumed, or any other subject entered upon.

34. Any member making a motion or amendment shall put it in form, sign and deliver it to the secretary, who shall add thereto the name of the seconder, and no motion or amendment so made shall be withdrawn without the leave of the board.

35. No motion or amendment shall be entertained or discussed unless it be seconded. Any member may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the board by simply noticing that such order is disobeyed.

36. The members when speaking shall use respectful language to each other. No member of committee shall speak more than once to any motion, except in explanation or by permission of the president. If two or more members rise to speak at the same time, the president or the then presiding chairman shall decide which is entitled to precedence.

37. Any member who shall use any expression capable of being applied offensively to any other member or person shall, if required by the board, withdraw such expression, and make satisfactory apology to the board.

38. The president or the then presiding chairman shall be entitled to a deliberative and a casting vote on each occasion, and shall in taking the votes on any motion or amendment put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative, and he may do so as often as it is necessary to enable him to form and declare his opinion from the show of hands as to which party has the majority.

39. The board shall vote by a show of hands, except in cases of election when the vote shall be by open ballot. Any member of the board may, however, call for a division upon any question, in which case the members voting for the affirmative shall first stand up, and afterwards those in the negative, until their votes are recorded.

40. No motion, the effect of which, if carried, would be to rescind any motion which has already passed the board, shall be entered during the same current quarter unless a call of the board has been duly made for the purpose; and no such motion for rescinding any resolution of the board which shall have been negatived by the board shall be again entertained during the same current quarter.

Chap. III.—Elections.

41. No election to any office at the disposal of the board shall take place until seven clear days' notice shall have been given in one or more local newspapers inviting applications for the same, and the salary of such office shall in all cases be fixed for the current year before proceeding to the election.

42. No member of the board, or officer belonging to the board, shall be received as surety for any officer appointed by the board, or for any work to be done for the board.

43. Any one or more of the standing orders of the board may be suspended *pro tem.* in case of emergency, provided that a majority of the board shall deem such suspension necessary, always excepting No. 3, chap. II; No. 2, chap. III.

Treasurer.

44. The treasurer shall receive all bank-slips from the secretary, compare them with the bank pass-book and revenue book at least once in each month and submit them to the finance committee, and also check the collector's receipt book with the revenue book.

45. He, together with the secretary, shall pay all accounts, after the same have been signed by the chairman of the meeting as approved by the committee, by drafts on the bank or banks, which shall be countersigned by him, the president, and secretary. He shall also keep an account of all moneys received by him, and report the same at least once a month to a meeting of the committee.

Auditors.

46. The accounts of the charity shall be verified yearly, in the month of July, by two auditors appointed for the purpose by the governors and contributors.

47. They shall certify to the accuracy of the accounts for the preceding year and the balance-sheet, for the satisfaction of the governors and contributors.

48. They shall specially call attention to erasures or important alterations in any book or document, and shall report to the subscribers or to the committee on any matters connected with the book-keeping of the institution or otherwise within their province.

49. They shall be appointed at a general or special meeting of governors and contributors, one to retire by rotation at each annual meeting, but to be eligible for re-election.

50. It shall be competent for the committee of management to suspend any auditor for incapacity, misbehaviour, or neglect of duty, on the understanding that within one week of the date of such suspension they will proceed to convene a special meeting of contributors for the consideration of the case, and for the election (if necessary) of a successor to such auditor.

Professional Staff.

51. The professional staff may consist of honorary, honorary consulting medical officers, and a paid visiting or house-surgeon, all of whom shall be duly qualified.

52. Honorary and honorary consulting medical officers shall be elected at the annual general meeting of subscribers, and shall hold office for one year only. In the event of a vacancy occurring the position may be filled up by the committee of management, but the person so elected shall only hold office until the tenure of his predecessor has expired, but he shall be eligible for re-election. Should an honorary or honorary consulting medical officer be suspended by an absolute majority of the whole committee, a special meeting of the contributors shall be convened within fourteen days of the date of such suspension, which shall deal with the cause of suspension.
