## POPULATION OF VICTORIA.

NOTE.—This estimate of population is brought on from the census of 1881 by the addition—to the numbers then obtained—of the recorded arrivals by sea and births, and the subtraction of the recorded departures by sea and deaths which have taken place since the census was taken.

The records of arrivals and deaths are believed to be substantially accurate, but the records of departures and births are known to be defective, the former much more so than the latter; therefore, unless there should have been a large addition to the population by overland immigration, which has not been the case of late years, the estimates made up in the manner stated are always in excess of the truth.

A partial check upon the population estimates is afforded by means of returns obtained annually from the municipal authorities. These have been made up to the end of 1885, and show smaller numbers by 5,800 than the official estimate for the same period. There is reason to believe, however, that even if this number should be deducted the residue would still overstate the truth. Calculations have therefore been based upon the probable as contrasted with the apparent marriage, birth, and death rates at the present time, the mean of which shows a population of 993,262, or 27,240 less than that set down in the table. All such figures, however, must be received with extreme caution. There can be little doubt that the apparent population is greater than that actually existing, but the extent of such excess cannot be safely estimated within several thousands at this distance from a census.

The apparent increase of population in the first three quarters of 1886 was 28,633, viz., 9,881 in the quarter ended 31st March, 8,003 in the quarter ended 30th June, and 10,749 in the quarter ended 30th September, as against an apparent increase of only 20,189 in the first three quarters of 1885.

During the third quarter of 1886 the excess of registered births over registered deaths was 4,570, viz., 2,075 males and 2,495 females; that by excess of recorded arrivals by sea over recorded departures by sea was 6,179, viz., 4,222 males and 1,957 females. The total increase of population thus appears to have been 10,749, viz., 6,297 males and 4,452 females, as shown in the table. This apparent increase exceeded by 2,687 that in the corresponding quarter of the previous year, and was by far the largest shown for any quarter during several years, being 375 in excess of the number in the last quarter of 1885, in which, for the first time, the apparent quarterly increase exceeded 10,000. The apparent net gain by immigration (6,179) was exceeded in the last quarter of 1885 and the first quarter of the current year by 502 and 433 respectively, but was not equalled in any other quarter during the last six years.

The influx of immigrants from South Australia—referred to in the last Quarterly Abstract—has subsided considerably. The maximum was reached in the first quarter of this year, when the net immigration from South Australia amounted to 3,767 persons; this fell to 1,537 in the second quarter, and to 1,387 in the quarter under review.

The arrivals from the United Kingdom during the quarter under review numbered 5,108, the departures therefor only 974. The former were doubtless swelled by the large number of returned colonists who left Victoria in the early portion of the year for the purpose of visiting the Colonial and Indian Exhibition.

## ENGINEER-IN-CHIEF'S BRANCH.

4 Students for Engineering and Architecture. Rate of pay to be determined after one month's trial.

Of which 2 are required for Telegraph Branch. 15 and 16 years of age, £45 per annum; 17 years, £55 per annum; 18 years and upwards, £65 per annum. Successful candidates will be allocated according to the requirements of the service.

Candidates must not be under 15 nor over 21 years of age; and must produce a certificate of having passed an examination by the Examiners appointed in that behalf in the following subjects, viz.:—Reading and explanation, dictation, writing, arithmetic, grammar, geography, as taught in the Sixth class of State schools.

Candidates must be strong, healthy, and active. They must prepare their applications in their own handwriting, stating their age, and, where a standard is fixed, their exact height, without boots, otherwise their names will not be registered. They must produce to the Examiners satisfactory written testimony that they are of respectable character, and must furnish names of any persons or firms with whom they may have been employed during the previous two years. They must also produce to the said Examiners a certified extract from the register of their birth, or, in default, a statutory declaration as to their age last birthday, giving the date thereof; and before being finally approved they must pass the examination of a Railway Medical Inspector as being up to the standard height, where required, and free from bodily ailments, defects, and colour-blindness, or defective sight of any kind. For such examination they are to pay 20s. 6d. into the hands of the Secretary.

In case the number of Candidates be more than three times the number of persons required, such Candidates will be reduced by lot to such number.

If a greater number of Candidates obtain certificates from the Examiners than are required, such unsuccessful Candidates shall, in the presence of the Secretary, draw lots for the determination of the order of precedence for appointment in which their names shall be placed, and their appointments—subject to medical approval—will be made accordingly.

The persons in excess of the number required will be eligible for appointment in like order for a period of twelve months from the date of such determination without further examination.

All appointments will be made to the lowest grade in each of the various branches of the Railway Service, and on probation only, for a period of six months. After such probation, and upon production of a certificate of fitness from the head of the Branch in which the probationer was employed, and of evidence that his life is insured in Victoria as prescribed by Regulations, such appointment may be confirmed.

All applications must contain *the correct postal address and the name of the nearest railway station thereto*, and must be posted, duly stamped, so as to reach the office of the Secretary, Victorian Railways, Spencer street, Melbourne, not later than Noon on the 24th day of November 1886, such day and hour having been fixed by the Commissioners for opening and dealing with the applications received.

Candidates who pass the preliminary registration will be communicated with as to the time and place when and where they shall attend for examination, and subsequently for medical inspection.

2. Position of Metis Rock, supposed to be identical with the shoal marked "Wesley" on Chart No. 2421, lat.  $19^{\circ} 13' 20''$  S., long.  $174^{\circ} 48' 50''$  W. This rock is 300 yards long, and 151 feet high.

3. Position of the new volcanic island (now named Falcon Island), lat.  $20^{\circ} 19' 5''$  S., long.  $175^{\circ} 21' 1''$  W. The island is  $1\frac{1}{2}$  miles long, and 164 feet high.

The eastern end lies north  $33\frac{1}{2}$  miles from Cape Cleveland Lighthouse. Position of the eastern end, lat.  $18^{\circ} 38' 5''$  S., long.  $147^{\circ} 54' 7''$  E.

6. The shoal marked doubtful in lat.  $18^{\circ} 41\frac{1}{2}'$  S., long.  $146^{\circ} 52\frac{1}{2}'$  E., does not exist.

REGULATION UNDER "THE EDUCATION ACT 1872."

WHEREAS by the 18th section of *The Education Act 1872* it was enacted that the Governor in Council might from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this Order direct that the following new regulation be added to the existing Regulations under *The Education Act 1872*, that is to say:—

SCHOLARSHIPS.

The Minister of Public Instruction will annually award Scholarships to two hundred pupils of State schools in the manner and on the conditions hereinafter mentioned:—

1. Scholars will be selected upon competitive examinations held during the last three months of each year. No competitor will be permitted to attend any such examination unless he shall have been classified in the sixth class of his school from at least the first day of July immediately preceding, and shall have produced a certificate of birth showing that he will not have completed the statutory age for attendance before the first day of January succeeding the examination: and no competitor will be selected unless he shall, during the two years immediately preceding the latter date, have been continuously on the rolls of, and in attendance at, a State school.

2. The subjects for examination will be:—  
Spelling from dictation.  
Composition.  
Penmanship.  
Arithmetic,  
Grammar,  
Geography,  
History.

3. Each scholarship will be of the annual value of £10, tenable for three years upon the following conditions:—

(a.) That the scholar shall, at the commencement of the session following the award of the scholarship, become a student in one of the following public grammar schools:—Church of England Grammar School, St. Patrick's College, Scotch College, or Wesley College, all of Melbourne; or in the Church of England Grammar School of Geelong; or in one of such other schools as may be approved of by the Minister; or in one of the Schools of Mines at Ballarat, Sandhurst, or Geelong; or in an Agricultural College.

(b.) That he shall continue to attend one of the above schools, and shall obtain at the end of each year a report from the authorities of the same. If no report or an unfavorable report be received, or if at any time the Minister be satisfied that the conduct of any scholar has been disorderly or immoral, the scholarship and all the advantages connected therewith shall thereupon cease and determine.

4. Where a scholar does not reside within three miles of an approved place of education, the Minister may, at his discretion, allow him such sum as will cover the cost of transit to and fro, if the school is easily accessible by rail or coach; or may commute the scholarship for one of Forty pounds tenable for a year.

5. Students whose scholarships have been commuted may be examined again at the end of a year, when the best thirty will have the scholarship renewed for another twelve months.

6. Six scholarships will be allotted to each single inspectorial district, and twelve to each double district. When these have been assigned, the remainder will be allotted to the best in order of examination, without regard to their place of residence.

7. Payments will be made quarterly. All payments, however, by the Minister will be conditional on moneys being placed at his disposal by the Legislature.

## CASTLEMAINE MINING DISTRICT.

BYE-LAW 31 (11TH OCTOBER 1886).

At a meeting of the Mining Board of the Mining District of Castlemaine, begun and holden at the board-room, Castlemaine, in the said district, on the eleventh day of October One thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, the following bye-law was made.

## No. 31.—EXTENDED CLAIMS.—ALLUVIAL DEEP SINKING.

1. Any one person, being the holder of a miner's right, may take possession of any number of separate claims (for one person) not exceeding fifty, or any two persons, each being the holder of a miner's right, may take possession of any number of separate claims (for two persons) not exceeding fifty, and so on in like manner in proportion to the number of persons who shall join together.

2. It shall not be necessary at the time of taking possession of a registered claim to mark or define the boundaries thereof accurately and completely, but at the time of making survey the boundaries shall be adjusted so as to include the land taken possession of, and which shall have been applied for; and the boundaries of every claim shall, at the time of making survey thereof, be completely and accurately defined by cutting at each angle of such claim a V trench not less than nine (9) inches deep, and not less than six (6) feet along each line, and erecting at each such angle a post not less than three (3) feet high; and such boundaries shall be correctly delineated upon a plan.

3. Any number of adjacent claims may be amalgamated, and, for the purposes of working, the claims which are amalgamated shall be deemed to be one claim, and work done upon or in connection with any one of the claims so amalgamated shall be deemed to be done upon or in connection with each and every of the claims so amalgamated; provided always that within and in respect of every forty men's ground comprised in any claim a separate shaft or such other works as shall be necessary to thoroughly and expeditiously develop the mine shall be constructed.

4. Upon the application of the holders of any number of adjoining claims made in the form in the Schedule hereto numbered IV., and signed by the persons interested therein, the mining registrar shall forthwith amalgamate such claims, and shall record such amalgamation upon the register relating to such claims under the proper date, and shall issue to the holders of such amalgamated claim a certificate in the form in the Schedule hereto numbered V.

5. At the time of, or at any time subsequent to, the amalgamation of any two or more claims, the holders of such claims may, on payment of the fees prescribed for the registration of a mining tenement, and of the holders of a mining tenement, require the mining registrar to re-register such claims as one claim, and to re-register the holders of the several claims as the holders of one amalgamated claim.

## SCHEDULE I.

## Size of Registered Alluvial Claims.

Where the depth of sinking exceeds 150 feet, and does not exceed 200 feet:—

A claim for one person shall be any area not exceeding five acres.

A claim for two persons shall be any area not exceeding ten acres.

A claim for three persons shall be any area not exceeding fifteen acres.

And so on in like proportion according to the number of persons, that is to say—

# LODDON UNITED WATER TRUST.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations, made in pursuance of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881* (No. 715, sec. 44).

THE Commissioners of the Loddon United Water Trust, in pursuance of powers conferred by section 44 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881*, do make the following Regulations:—

## REGULATION No. 1.

Regulation for the imposing, levying, and receiving all rates for the year 1886 on all the rateable property in that portion of the Loddon United Water Trust District of which notice has been given that the same has been supplied with water under the provisions of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881*, and which notice was published in the *Government Gazette* of 13th August 1886.

And whereas the Governor in Council has, by an Order made the 2nd August 1886, under the provisions of section 93 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881*, divided the Loddon United Waterworks District into divisions, and has directed that the rates necessary for paying interest on all moneys borrowed by the Loddon United Water Trust for the construction and maintenance of their works, or to meet any other expenses in connection therewith, shall be levied only in the following divisions, viz.:—The Shire of Marong Division, the Shire of East Loddon Division, the Shire of Gordon East Division, the Shire of Gordon West Division, and the Shire of Korong Division; and has further directed that such rates shall be levied differentially as between such several divisions.

Now therefore the Commissioners of the said Loddon United Water Trust do hereby make the following rates for the year 1886 on all the rateable property in the following divisions of the Loddon United Waterworks District, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rates of the shires within which such divisions are situated respectively, that is to say:—On rateable property within the Shire of Marong Division, a rate of Sixpence in the pound sterling of such valuation; on rateable property within the Shire of Korong Division, a rate of Sixpence in the pound sterling of such valuation.

Such rates are hereby made payable on the twentieth day of November 1886.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

The foregoing Regulation No. 1 was made by the Commissioners of the Loddon United Water Trust, under and by virtue of section 44 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881*, this eighteenth day of September 1886.

## REGULATION No. 2.

1. All water supplied from the works of the Trust for the irrigation of land shall be paid for by measure. All measurements of water shall be by gauges of form and pattern approved by the Trust, and fixed under the direction and to the satisfaction of the officer appointed by the Trust for that purpose. The registration of the quantities of water delivered shall be made by the Trust's officers.

2. No irrigation outlet or other outlet from any of the channels or works of the Trust shall be constructed until the occupier of the land to be supplied from such outlet has entered into an agreement with the Trust for the purchase of water, and has received authority in writing from the Trust to construct such outlet.

3. Every outlet for the supply of water for irrigation shall be constructed under the supervision and to the satisfaction of the Trust, or of its duly authorized officer; and shall have a proper gauge fixed therein to indicate the quantity of water passing through such outlet.

4. Before constructing any outlet, the owner or occupier (as the case may be) of the land to be supplied therefrom shall give notice to the superintending officer of the Trust, and receive his authority in writing to construct such outlet.

5. No person shall construct any outlet from the works of the Trust without the written authority of the Trust, or otherwise than under the supervision and to the satisfaction of the authorized officer of the Trust. And any person who shall construct any such outlet without the authority of the Trust, or without the supervision of the authorized officer of the Trust, or in any manner other than that authorized by such officer, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this regulation, and shall be liable to a penalty of Five pounds for every such breach.

6. The rate or price to be paid for water delivered from the works of the Trust for irrigation purposes shall be Sevenpence and one halfpenny per inch per acre, payable in advance.

7. All persons agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall take delivery thereof through their respective outlets at such times, in such order, and in such manner as the Trust shall direct. No person shall be supplied with a less quantity of water than is equal to the value of Two pounds sterling; and the delivery of water shall be continued on Sundays as well as on ordinary working days.

8. Every person agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall receive notification of the dates and quantities in which it will be delivered to him.

9. The outlets for the delivery of water shall be opened only by the authorized officers of the Trust, and no person other than such officers shall under any circumstances open any such outlet, or otherwise do any act that may permit of the escape of water from the channels or works.

10. Any person not being a duly authorized officer of the Trust who shall open any irrigation outlets or do any act that may cause the escape of water from the channels or works of the Trust shall be guilty of a breach of this regulation, and shall be liable to a penalty of Five pounds for every such breach.

11. No person shall injure or damage any of the works of the Trust, or waste or defile the water therein; and any person who shall injure or damage such works or any part thereof, or waste or defile the water contained therein, shall be deemed to be guilty of a breach of this regulation, and shall be liable to a penalty of Five pounds for every such breach.

12. In the event of the Trust being unable, through failure of the works or from any other cause, to deliver or supply water to persons who it shall have agreed to supply, such persons shall be entitled to a rebate of the price agreed to be paid for such water. But the Trust shall not be answerable for any damage which may have been sustained by any person by reason of such failure or non-delivery.

13. The foregoing regulations shall not apply to gardens of less than five acres in extent.

8. BYE-LAW No. 11, AS TO DAIRIES, DAIRY CATTLE, AND MILK.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Borough Hawthorn, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and every other power enabling the said Local Board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 11 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the borough of Hawthorn.

#### REGISTRATION OF COWKEEPERS, DAIRYMEN, AND PURVEYORS OF MILK.

4. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, shall, on or before the first day of July in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the Secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall, with every such application, pay a fee of Five shillings.

5. Upon receipt of every such application and fee the secretary for the Local Board of Health shall endorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause same to be properly indexed.

6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said local board, or by any person authorized, in writing, by the chairman or secretary of the said local board; and if, on inspection, such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them, are, or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said local board may, by an order, in writing, signed by the secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or in the case of an unregistered person, served personally or left at his dwelling-place or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle, either absolutely or any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said local board may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered

or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated; and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept and be kept perfectly clean, and shall within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person or any member of the family of any person registered as aforesaid, or not so registered, but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge shall immediately give notice thereof to the local board or officer of health or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said local board or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk until danger, in the opinion of such local board or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until in either case all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk, or of its contamination, has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the local board, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep, or permit or suffer to be kept any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

13. In the interpretation of this bye-law, words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

14. Every person guilty of any breach of this bye-law or of any of its provisions shall be liable in the discretion of the convicting justices to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

*For keeping free from noxious matter yards, stables, and places used for noxious trades, slaughter-yards, &c.; and for regulating management of earth-closets, privies, &c., disinfecting and deodorizing nightsoil, and other offensive matter, and for regulating its removal and final deposit.*

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Borough of Hawthorn, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and every other power enabling the said local board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said local board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 12 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matter and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this bye-law coming into operation.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said borough.

4. The occupier of every house and premises within the said borough shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto, or occupied in connection therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the local board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

5. The occupier of any land in the said borough on which there shall be erected any stables, cowyard, cattle-shed, or pigsty shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

6. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement within the said borough shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of one foot from the top of the sides, walls, or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Five a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

7. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall once at least in every week empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of nightsoil on or belonging to such premises.

8. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of nightsoil except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed, and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof or of effluvia therefrom. In the said borough a nightman, licensed by the municipal authorities, shall be employed by the occupier of the premises for such removal of nightsoil.

9. All nightsoil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and deposited in such place or places only as may be appointed by the local board from time to time for the final reception of the same.

10. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited or spread, or assisting in placing or depositing or spreading on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any nightsoil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place, shall immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof cover the same, or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered, with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness.

11. The occupier of any premises within the borough used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be removed therefrom once in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia; and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

12. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered so as to be water-tight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet.

13. No closet-door or trap shall shut or open upon a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding ten feet in width.

14. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties—such portion not being less than Five shillings—to be paid. And any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such local board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

## BYE-LAW No. 12, AS TO DAIRIES, DAIRY CATTLE, AND MILK.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Borough of Williamstown, in the colony of Victoria, being the municipal council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and every other power enabling the said local board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said local board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 12 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matters and things herein provided for are hereby repealed.
2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Borough of Williamstown.

*Registration of Cowkeepers, Dairy-men, and Purveyors of Milk.*

4. Every person carrying on the trade of cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of May in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the Secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person with every such application pay a fee of Ten shillings:—

To the Secretary of the Local Board of Health for Sir.

I desire to be registered in accordance with the particulars in the schedule hereunder:—

5. Upon receipt of every such application and fee the Secretary for the Local Board of Health shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said local board, or by any person authorized in writing by the chairman or secretary of the said local board, and if on inspection such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them are or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said local board may, by an order in writing signed by the secretary and served personally or left at the dwelling house of the registered person, or, in the case of an unregistered person, served personally or left at his dwelling-place or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid; and any such order as aforesaid the said local board may revoke, but upon fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state, in respect of cleanliness, as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated; and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept and be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed as may be in such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person or any member of the family of any person registered as aforesaid or not so registered, but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge shall immediately give notice thereof to the local board or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health; and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said local board or officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk until danger, in the opinion of such local board or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until, in either case, all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the local board, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep, or permit or suffer to be kept, any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking-yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

13. In the interpretation of this bye-law words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

14. Every person guilty of any breach of this bye-law, or any of its provisions, shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

1. All former bye-laws on the matter and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this bye-law coming into operation.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said borough.

4. The occupier of every house and premises within the said borough shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto or occupied in connection therewith to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the Local Board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.



5. The occupier of any land in the said borough on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, or pigsty, shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state, in respect of cleanliness, as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health; and shall cause all soil, dung, and other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said Local Board at the expense of such occupier.

In the said borough a nightman licensed by the municipal authorities shall be employed by the occupier of the premises for such removal of night-soil.

9. All night-soil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and deposited in such place or places only as may be appointed by the Local Board from time to time for the final reception of the same.

10. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed, or deposited, or spread, or assisting in placing, or depositing, or spreading on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place, shall immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof cover the same, or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered, with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness.

11. The occupier of any premises within the borough used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be removed therefrom once in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia; and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever it may be removed by the said Local Board at the expense of such occupier.

Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties—such portion not being less than Five shillings—to be paid.

And any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such Local Board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

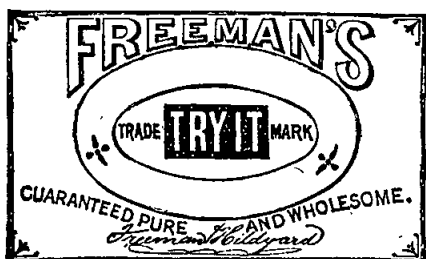
