BREAKERS REPORTED OFF NORTH REEF, CAPRICORN GROUP. NOTICE is hereby given that heavy breakers, lying N.N.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ miles from North Reef Lighthouse, were seen by the s.s. *Guthrie* when coming south, in September last, during a south-easterly gale.

INNER EDGE OF BARRIER BETWEEN HOLBORNE ISLAND AND THE PALM ISLANDS, AND SHOALWATER OFF CAPE BOWLING GREEN.

Notice is hereby given that the following detached reefs at the inner edge of the Barrier, between Holborne Island and the Palm Islands, have been examined, and their positions determined, by Lieutenant-Commander Richards, R.N., in H.M.S. *Paluma*.

1. A coral reef, which partly dries at half-ebb, and which is 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ miles long, N.W. by W. and S.E. by E., and 3 miles broad. Its S.E. end lies N.W. 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ miles from the centre of Holborne Island, and there is an average depth of 25 fathoms close round the reef.

2. A circular patch, about 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ miles in diameter, the centre lying N.N.E. distant 30 miles from Cape Cleveland Lighthouse.

3. A coral patch, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ miles long, east and west, and 1 mile wide, its centre lying N. $\frac{1}{4}$ E. 30 miles from Cape Cleveland Lighthouse.

4. A coral reef, situated to the N.N.W. of the last-mentioned patch, 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ miles long, E. by N. and W. by S., and 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ miles broad. Its west and north-west sides are ragged with off-lying patches. The eastern end lies north 33 $\frac{1}{2}$ miles from Cape Cleveland Lighthouse. The depth between this and the former reef is 25 fathoms.

5. The shoal marked "doubtful," in latitude 18° 41' S., longitude 146° 52' E., does not exist.

6. At a distance of 1 mile from the lighthouse on Cape Bowling Green, when bearing S. 56° W., the depth does not exceed 9 feet at ordinary low-water springs. Vessels are therefore cautioned to attend to the directions not to shoal the water under 11 fathoms when rounding the Cape.

BYE-LAW NO. 47.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred by *The Victorian Railways Commissioners Act 1883*, do hereby make the following Bye-law, and all previous Bye-laws conflicting therewith are hereby repealed:—

FARES FOR CONVEYANCE BY PASSENGER TRAINS ARE FIXED AS FOLLOWS:—

1. Second-class Return Fares between Ballarat and Creswick or North Creswick (daily), 1s. 8d. Tickets issued on Saturday available for return till Monday.
2. Bye-law 42, Clauses 2 and 4, is amended in so far that the journey may be broken *en route* on ordinary Return Tickets, subject to the journey being completed within the time for which Tickets are available. The Suburban Residential Area is excluded from this arrangement.
3. Bye-law 19 is amended in so far that the Fares mentioned therein will be charged from the Stations named from the 1st November until the 30th April, and the following Fares are added:—

CHARGES ON GOODS, ETC., ARE FIXED AS FOLLOWS:—

4. Cannon Shot, to be carried under Miscellaneous Class Rates and Conditions. Shells, not loaded, to be carried under First Class Rates and Conditions. Shells, loaded, to be carried at Fourth Class Rates, and under the Explosive Regulations.
5. Lager Beer, in truck loads, to be carried from Sandhurst to Melbourne under Miscellaneous Class Rates and Conditions.
6. Silver, in bars, to be carried from Melbourne to Williamstown or Port Melbourne, for shipment, at 5s. per 1,000 ounces, on condition of its being in charge of owners or persons bringing the same, and at their risk.
7. Copper Plates, Brass or Copper Tubing or Piping, for use in construction of Railway Locomotives, to be carried under First Class Rates and Conditions.
8. The Storage Charges, fixed by Bye-law No. 28, for Warehousing Goods discharged into the Melbourne Goods Sheds, are amended, so far as the months of January, February, and March in each year are concerned; and during these months all Goods of the First, Second, Third, and Fourth Classes must be removed within forty-eight hours; and of the Grain and Flour, Special, Agricultural Produce, and Miscellaneous Classes, within twelve working hours after arrival. If not removed within the prescribed time, Storage will be charged, at the rate of One shilling per ton for the First day, Ninepence per ton the Second day, and Sixpence per ton for each succeeding day until removed from the Railway premises. Part of a ton to be charged as a ton, and part of a day as a whole day; or the Commissioners may send them to store, when authorized rates will be charged.
9. Out of the through rates for carriage of Fruit between Melbourne and Sydney, the proportion due to the Victorian Railways shall be as follows:—

THE MARRIAGE AND MATRIMONIAL CAUSES
STATUTE 1864.—REGULATIONS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-ninth
day of November 1886.

WHEREAS by section 7 of Part I. of *The Marriage and Matrimonial Causes Act 1864* the Governor in Council is empowered, from time to time, to make, alter, and repeal regulations for more effectually carrying out the provisions of Part I. of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, doth, for the purpose aforesaid, cancel Regulations Nos. 2 and 3, made by Order in Council dated the 6th September 1886, and doth order the following to be read in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

Declaration to be made before registration.

2. Every minister of religion, and every minister of religion being the recognised head of a religious denomination, and every minister of religion holding a registered certificate that he is a duly authorized minister, priest, or deacon, shall, before registration under the last preceding regulation, either make a declaration before the Registrar-General or produce to the Registrar-General a declaration made by such person before a Judge of the Supreme Court or of a County Court, or a justice of the peace, or a Commissioner of the Supreme Court for taking Affidavits, setting out the qualification in respect of which he applies to be registered.

Declaration to be made before death or deprivation of minister is registered.

3. Whenever an application shall be made to the Registrar-General under section 5 of the said Act to register the death, departure from the colony, cessation to exercise the functions of an officiating minister, or of the degradation or deprivation of authority as a minister, or of the cancellation of the certificate of officiating ministers of any minister, priest, or deacon whose name has been registered with the Registrar-General under the said Act or these regulations, the Registrar-General shall require a statutory declaration of the facts to be made by the person applying under such section either before the Registrar-General or before a Judge of the Supreme Court or of a County Court, or a justice of the peace, or a Commissioner of the Supreme Court for taking Affidavits; and upon such declaration being duly made and left with him, the Registrar-General shall cause a statement of such death, departure from the colony, cessation to exercise the functions of an officiating minister, or of the degradation or deprivation of the authority as a minister, or of the cancellation of the certificate of officiating ministers, to be entered in the register opposite to the name of the person to whom it applies; and such person shall thereupon cease to be a minister or person duly registered within the terms of section 24 of the said Act.

And the Honorable Alfred Deakin, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT OF A RESERVE FOR AGRICULTURAL SHOW YARDS IN THE TOWN OF ALEXANDRA.

WHEREAS by the 133rd section of *The Land Act 1834* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make and alter or rescind rules and regulations, or to rescind any rules and regulations heretofore made, for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering in or upon such public parks and reserves: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the Regulation following to be observed and enforced in respect of the land temporarily reserved, by Order of 10th July 1876, as a site for Agricultural Show Yards in the town of Alexandra.

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at any station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Telegrams will not be entertained.

Tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise directed by the police; the straw to be wheaten or oaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (Victorian grown) and bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oaten or wheaten hay.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Botanic and Domain Gardens may be called upon to supply any other Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, and for which no contracts have been taken, at the same rates.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be endorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 5.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of the delay in delivering or replacing it when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

12. It will be competent for the Secretary of the Tender Board, on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the 1st day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th September 1887, and in the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

BYE-LAW No. 2.

BYE-LAW No. 2, AS TO DAIRIES, DAIRY CATTLE, AND MILK. THE Local Board of Health in and for the Borough of Carisbrook, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883" and every other power enabling the said Local Board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 2 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matters and things herein-after provided for are hereby repealed.
2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in and over every portion of the borough.

Registration of Cowkeepers, Dairymen, and Purveyors of Milk.

4. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of January in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the Secretary of the Local Board of Health, in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of Five shillings:—

To the Secretary for the Local Board of Health for Carisbrook. Sir,

I desire to be registered in accordance with the particulars in the said schedule hereunder:—

5. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the Secretary for the Local Board of Health shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said local board or by any person authorized in writing by the chairman or secretary of the said local board; and if, on inspection, such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any of them, are or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said local board may, by an order in writing signed by the secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling-place, or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said local board may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept, and be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances, be fumigated, disinfected, or limewashed, as may be in any such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person, or any member of the family of any person, registered as aforesaid, or not so registered but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous, infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the local board or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said local board or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, until danger, in the opinion of such local board or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until, in either case, all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the local board, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep, or permit or suffer to be kept, any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

13. In the interpretation of this bye-law words imputing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

14. Every person guilty of any breach of this bye-law, or of any of its provisions, shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or, in the like discretion, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.
