Reefs in the S. W. part of the Java Sea.

THE Commander of H. N. M. surveying vessel *Blommendal* gives the following information concerning some reefs in the S. W. part of the Java Sea:—

1°. The Coventry Reef, S. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. 2,100 yards from the west point of West Island, is a circular coral-reef 440 yards in extent.

On the north side, where some patches uncover at low water, the reef is steep-to; towards the south edge the depth gradually increases to 5 fathoms.

From 16 to 18 fathoms, clay with shells, have been sounded about 110 yards around.

The reef is marked by discolored water and by breaks in moderate weather and with slight swell.

The mark: "East side of West Island in line with west side of Western P^o Doea" leads 650 yards westward of the reef, and "P^o Rangat in line with centre of Eastern P^o Doea," 820 yards eastward of the reef.

2°. Jason Rock is a dangerous coral patch, about 50 yards in extent, with 13 feet least water over it, and from 16–19 fathoms close by. It lies on the following bearings:—

Lighthouse of North Watcher ... N. 42° 15' E.
Western of P^o Doea or North Islands ... N. 91° 15' E.
West Island ... N. 120° 15' E.

Ripples were distinctly visible from the deck at a distance of 1,400 yards.

The rock is only discerned when the current runs; no breaks were seen, but only in the very neighbourhood discolored water.

3°. On the position, marked with 11 meters on the chart: "Straat Soenda en Z. W. ged^o der Java zee," south 11 miles of the south point of the "Gebroeders," not less than 12 fathoms have been sounded.

WHEREAS by Section 24 of *The Agricultural Colleges Act 1884*, as amended by Section 2 of *The Agricultural Colleges Act 1885*, the Governor in Council is empowered from time to time to make, alter, and repeal regulations for regulating the election of members of the Council of Agricultural Education by members of Agricultural Societies subscribing not less than "Ten shillings per annum to any such society": And whereas the Governor in Council on thirtieth day of March 1886, made certain orders and regulations under the powers conferred by Section 24 of *The Agricultural Colleges Act 1884*, as amended by Section 2 of *The Agricultural Colleges Act 1885*; and whereas it is expedient to amend such regulations and to make other regulations: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby in exercise of the powers conferred by the above-recited Acts make the following regulation, that is to say, Clause 4 of the regulations made on the thirtieth day of March 1886, wherein it is provided that "The election of members of the Council of Agricultural Education shall take place on the second Wednesday in the month of June 1886, and on the second Wednesday in the month of June in every succeeding third year," is hereby repealed, and the following regulation substituted therefor:—

The election of members of the Council of Agricultural Education shall take place on the twenty-third day of the month of June 1886, and on the second Wednesday in the month of June in every succeeding third year.

And the Honorable John Lamont Dow, Her Majesty's Minister of Agriculture for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The births of 1,176 children, viz., 623 boys and 553 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of March. This number is the highest ever yet registered in the district during one month. In the month of February, 938 births were registered, or 240 less than in the month under review. The births were 366 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but only 193 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in March numbered 658, viz., 338 of males and 320 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 518, or 79 per cent. The deaths were fewer than those in February by 66, but exceeded the average of March during the previous ten years by 11. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been lower than that average by 6.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 3.41, and of deaths registered 1.91.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 98.1° on the 4th, and the lowest was 43.3° on the 1st. The mean temperature of the month (61.2°) was two and three-quarter degrees below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (43.9°) took place on the 28th, viz., from a maximum of 91.2° to a minimum of 47.3°. The least range (7.3°) was on the 21st, viz., from a maximum of 65.3° to a minimum of 58.0°. The mean daily range was 18.7°. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.022 inches) was slightly above the average.

Rain fell on 11 days, the amount of rainfall being 1.716 inch.

Males contributed 51 per cent., and females 49 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 46 per cent. to that mortality, as against 41 per cent. in March 1885, 42 per cent. in March 1884, 37 per cent. in March 1883, 43 per cent. in March 1882 and 1881, 47 per cent. in March 1880 and 1879, 49 per cent. in March 1878 and 1877, and 50 per cent. in March 1876.

Thirty-five deaths of persons who had attained or passed the age of 75 years were recorded during the month, viz.:—Those of a gentleman and a blacksmith, each aged 75, who died of paralysis; a female, aged 75, who died of obstruction of the bowels; a chair-maker, aged 75, who died of nephritis; a female, aged 75, who died of disease of the kidneys; a gardener, aged 75, who died of diarrhoea; a gentleman, aged 77, who died of disease of the liver; a female, aged 78, who was killed by being passed over by a cab; a female, aged 78, who died of burns; a farmer, aged 77, a gentleman, aged 79, a female, aged 81, a farmer, aged 82, and a laborer, aged 87, who died of bronchitis; a laborer, aged 77, a stonemason, aged 80, a laborer, aged 85—inmates of the Benevolent Asylum—and a female, aged 86, who died of pneumonia; a male, of occupation unknown, aged 79, who died of congestion of the lungs; 2 females, each aged 81, who died of apoplexy and disease of the brain respectively; a female, aged 84, who died of disease of the heart; a female, aged 84, who died of enteritis; and a laborer, aged 75, a gentleman, aged 76, a farmer—an inmate of the Melbourne Hospital—aged 77, two females—inmates of the Immigrants' Home—aged 78 and 79, a gentleman, aged 79, a female, aged 80, a female, aged 84, a female, aged 88, a female, aged 93, a female, aged 98, and a female—an inmate of the Benevolent Asylum—aged 100, who died of old age.

The deaths from external causes numbered 20 during the month, of which 17 were ascribed to accidents, 1 to homicide, and 2 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A boy, aged 10, was killed—a tramcar passing over him; a female, aged 43, died of dislocation of the spine, caused by falling down stairs whilst drunk; a seaman, aged 46, was killed by falling into the hold of a vessel; a house painter, aged 58, died of erysipelas, resulting from injuries received by falling from a ladder; a laborer, aged 56, of gangrene of the foot, caused by striking it with a pick whilst working; a female, aged 78, was killed—a cab passing over her; a female, aged 78, was burnt to death; a bricklayer, aged 52, died of sunstroke; a bootmaker, aged 23, was drowned by falling overboard from a yacht in Port Phillip Bay; a male, of occupation unknown, aged 40, was drowned in the Saltwater River; a farmer, aged 55, and a night-watchman, aged 65, were drowned in the Yarra River; a clerk of works, aged 67, was drowned whilst drunk. A male infant, aged 6 hours, and a female infant, aged 2 months, were suffocated—the latter in bed; 2 male infants, aged 4 and 9 days respectively, died of umbilical hemorrhage. The homicidal death was that of a male infant, who was murdered at birth. Of the suicidal deaths:—A master mariner, aged 61, shot himself in the head whilst suffering from insanity, caused by intense pain; a chemist's assistant, aged 27, poisoned himself with morphia, whilst intoxicated.

Eighty-eight deaths, or 14 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—45 in the Melbourne Hospital, 16 in the Alfred Hospital, 3 in the Homeopathic Hospital, 1 in the Lying-in Hospital, 3 in the Immigrants' Home, 9 in the Benevolent Asylum, 1 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 4 in the Austin Hospital, and 4 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 303, of which 146, or 48 per cent., were of males, and 157, or 52 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 217 were under one year of age, 68 were between one and two, 11 were between two and three, 5 were between three and four, and 2 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 355. Of these, 192, or 54 per cent., were males, and 163, or 46 per cent., were females; 12 were between five and ten, 8 were between ten and fifteen, 14 were between fifteen and twenty, 23 were between twenty and twenty-five, 35 were between twenty-five and thirty, 18 were between thirty and thirty-five, 21 were between thirty-five and forty, 31 were between forty and forty-five, 22 were between forty-five and fifty, 34 were between fifty and fifty-five, 37 were between fifty-five and sixty, 21 were between sixty and sixty-five, 21 were between sixty-five and seventy, 23 were between seventy and seventy-five, 19 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 16 were upwards of eighty.

Deaths from zymotic diseases decreased from 191 in February to 146 in the month under notice, and those from local diseases from 261 to 252. Under the zymotic head, deaths from typhoid fever—which has been very prevalent during the past four months—fell from 39 to 35, and those from dysentery and diarrhoea fell from 90 to 64. Under the local head, deaths from brain and nerve complaints fell from 95 to 57, but those from heart affections rose from 26 to 34; those from lung and chest complaints rose from 53 to 59, and those from kidney diseases rose from 16 to 24. Only 1 death of a childbearing woman took place during the month, as against 3 such deaths in February and 6 in January.

THE NAGAMBIE WATERWORKS TRUST.

WHEREAS by *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1831*, No. 716, it was amongst other things enacted that, at the expiration of two months after the notice of any application should have been first advertised in the *Government Gazette*, the Minister, if satisfied that the provisions of the now in part recited Act have been substantially complied with, should submit such application, and the general plan and description therein referred to, and all petitions which have been received in respect of such application to the Governor in Council, together with any recommendations as to the granting of the application or as to any alterations or additions he might think desirable in the proposed waterworks; and the Governor in Council might thereupon approve of the construction of such proposed waterworks, with or without alterations or additions in the general plan and description thereof, or might disapprove of the construction of such waterworks, and should make an Order in Council accordingly; and it was further enacted that, if the Governor in Council should approve of the construction of such waterworks, with or without alterations, or additions, or restrictions of any such general plan and description, a Waterworks Trust should be constituted to construct, maintain, and continue the whole or any part of the waterworks therein described, in accordance with the provisions of such Order and of the now in part recited Act: And every Order approving the construction of any proposed waterworks, and of the constituting of a Waterworks Trust for the purpose, should state:—

(a.) The amount of money which the Governor in Council would grant as a loan for the purpose of carrying out the same, and paying the cost and expense of the plans and application for the same; and also the rate of interest which would be charged for such loan, such rate being at least One-half per centum more than the rate payable by the Government on the Public Loan out of which such loan might be granted.

(b.) Should proclaim the limits of the lands, whether within or without the municipal districts of the council or councils applying for the proposed waterworks, within which such Trust should have authority, to be called a Waterworks District.

(c.) Should state what are the principal works proposed to be constructed; and

(d.) Should contain such provisions (not inconsistent with the now in part recited Act) as, according to the nature of the application and the facts and circumstances of each case, the Governor in Council should think fit:

And whereas it was amongst other things enacted by *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1833*, that the Governor in Council might, where a waterworks district is either wholly or with the exception of the waterworks or proposed waterworks thereof within one or more ridings of any municipal district, appoint the councillors for such riding or ridings, together with any other person or persons, not exceeding three in number, to be the Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust of such district.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Acts, has approved of a general plan and description, as set forth in a certain application of the councillors of the Tabilk Riding of the Shire of Goulburn for a loan of Thirteen hundred pounds sterling to carry out certain waterworks, for the domestic supply of a waterworks district under the said Acts, embracing certain lands within the said riding, as shown on the general plan and description accompanying the said application, deposited in the Department of Water Supply, and doth hereby order and appoint as follows:—

1. The construction of the said waterworks as hereinafter described.

2. That the Councillors of the Tabilk riding of the Shire of Goulburn for the time being, and three other persons to be hereafter appointed, shall be the Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust of and for the waterworks district hereinafter proclaimed.

3. That the amount of the loan hereby granted shall be Thirteen hundred pounds sterling, for the purpose of carrying out approved works (hereinafter described) and paying the cost and expense of the plans and application aforesaid; and that the interest to be charged for such loan shall be at the rate of Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, payment of which interest shall be made half-yearly.

4. That the limits of the land within which the said Waterworks Trust shall have authority shall be the lands within the Tabilk Riding of the Shire of Goulburn hereinafter described, that is to say:—In the county of Moira, parish of Tabilk, and township of Nagambie: Commencing at a point fourteen chains south of the southern boundary of Goulburn street on the western boundary of the Goulburn Valley Railway; thence due west fifty-one chains and a half; thence by a line due north forty-nine chains and a half to its intersection with the south side of Church street; thence along the south side of the said street fifty-one chains and a half to the western boundary of the Goulburn Valley Railway; thence due south forty-nine chains and a half to a point in the said boundary fourteen chains south of the southern boundary of Church street, the point of commencement aforesaid.

5. That the principal works to be constructed shall consist of pumping machinery, tanks, and pipe mains for the reticulation of the township of Nagambie.

6. That the name of the Trust shall be the "Nagambie Waterworks Trust."

BOROUGH OF HORSHAM WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATIONS.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations made by the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1834* (No. 829, Sec. 20).

REGULATIONS.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Victorian Water Conservation Acts 1833-1834, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Victorian Water Conservation Acts 1831-1834, repeal the Regulations numbered 1 and 2 of the Regulations made by the said Waterworks Trust dated the 14th day of July 1835, and approved by the Governor in Council on the 27th day of July 1835, and do hereby make the Regulations following in lieu thereof:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said Urban District, that is so say:—

1. (1.) For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of twenty pounds annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

(2.) For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than twenty pounds annual value, an amount equal to five per cent. on the amount of the municipal valuation.

(3.) For every water trough, not exceeding twelve feet in length, supplied with water by the Trust, the sum of Two pounds per annum, and for every additional five feet, or fractional part thereof in length of such trough, a further sum of One pound per annum.

(4.) Every trough situated in a paddock shall be supplied through a meter affixed by the consumer, according to the directions of the Trust, provided, nevertheless, that the minimum charge for the water supplied to such trough shall not be less than the charge made for troughs supplied under the preceding clause.

(5.) For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, One pound per annum on each inch of the diameter of the cylinder.

(6.) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon); and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purposes of irrigation or for ornamental purposes shall be as follows:—

One-sixteenth of an acre and less, per annum, 8,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-sixteenth of an acre, but not exceeding one-eighth of an acre, per annum, 12,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-eighth of an acre, but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, per annum, 16,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half an acre, per annum, 28,000 gallons.

Exceeding half an acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons.

And at the rate of 40,000 gallons per acre for every additional acre, and proportionately according to the foregoing scale for every fractional part of an acre.

In livery and carriers' stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be two thousand gallons per stall used for stabling horses. In open sheds used for the above purposes, each space of five feet shall be charged for as a stall.

2. That each syphon pump must have a meter affixed, and that Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons be charged for all water registered at such meter.

3. The before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the first day of January One thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, and ending on the thirty-first day of December One thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, and shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st January and the 1st July 1886. Such persons as the Commissioners of the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, and receive, and collect, and recover the said rate.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and such land should thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Borough of Hawthorn has requested that the land in the said borough hereinafter described be so declared a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice declare the land acquired or used for the street hereinafter named and described, and situate in the Borough of Hawthorn, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz. :-

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

- 1st. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the grave or vault is opened.
- 2nd. Orders must be given for interment to the Secretary between the hours of ten a.m. and five p.m. the previous day.
- 3rd. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased must be stated at the time of giving the order.
- 4th. The procession to arrive at the cemetery punctually at the hour appointed for the funeral.
- 5th. The usual hours for interment will be from ten a.m. to six p.m. from the 1st of September to the 30th of April, and from ten a.m. to four p.m. in the other four months of the year.
- 6th. The charges will be remitted for the burial of any person on evidence being produced to the trustees that the relations or friends of such persons are unable to pay the costs and charge.
- 7th. By the 19th section of *The Cemeteries Statute 1864* any person making a vault, or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery by and with the permission of the trustees under their rules, and upon payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons, and his or their representatives for ever.
- 8th. Applications for such permission to be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to the party applying for such permission on payment of the proper charges.
- 9th. As to ground in which the right of constructing any vault or place of burial has been purchased, the trustees will require the vault or burial to be dug to the depth of not less than six feet, and such digging is to be done, and all mason's or bricklayer's work is to be performed, under the direction of the trustees, or some person duly appointed by them, by and at the cost of the person possessing the right of constructing such vault or place of burial.
- 10th. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.
- 11th. The right to erect monuments, tombstones, gravestones, or railings on purchased land to be left to the discretion of the trustees, and every monument, tombstone, gravestone, or railing as to its design, and every inscription, must be first approved of by the trustees.
- 12th. For the erection of tablets, copper cramps must be used.
- 13th. Wooden fences allowed, but if not kept in proper repair must be removed by order of the trustees without notice to the owners.
- 14th. A plan of the cemetery will be kept, also a registry, and may be inspected.
- 15th. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.
- 16th. Any person wantonly or wilfully destroying or doing or causing to be done any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the cemetery thereof is liable to be punished as prescribed.
- 17th. No dogs will be allowed to enter the cemetery.
- 18th. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in their charges and regulations.

THE Commissioners of the Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 20 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1884*, do make the following Regulation:—

No. 3.

Regulation for making a rate on all the rateable property in the Urban Districts of Kerang and Castle Donnington.

(1.) A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling on the annual value of all the rateable property in the Urban Districts of Kerang and Castle Donnington, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements comprised within the said Urban Districts for the municipal rates of the Shire of Swan Hill, is hereby made for the year commencing on the 1st day of January 1886 and ending on the 31st day of December 1886.

BOROUGH OF KOROI.

BYE-LAW No. 1.

A Bye-law of the Local Board of Health in and for the Borough of Koroi, for regulating the times of cleansing and managing of earth-closets, privies, and places for the deposit of night-soil or other refuse matter, and for regulating the disinfecting or deodorizing of the night-soil, blood, offal, or other refuse matter contained therein or removed therefrom; and for the prevention of nuisance or injury to health from the transport, deposit, or use as a manure of night-soil, offal, blood, or other offensive matter.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Borough of Koroi, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in the Public Health Amendment Statute and every other power enabling the said Local Board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board, doth make the following Bye-law No. 1 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say :—

The occupier of any house, building, or premises within the said borough shall cause the yard and ground adjacent or belonging thereto, or occupied in connexion therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all rubbish and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such rubbish or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the local board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

Stables, cowsheds, and pigsties.—The occupier of any land in the said borough on which there shall be erected any stable, cowyard, cattleshed, or pigsty, shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state, in respect of cleanliness, as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health; and shall cause all dung, soil, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of any such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure so removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the local board of health at the expense of such occupier.

Cleansing of cesspools.—The occupier of every house, building, or tenement within the Borough of Koroi shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have accumulated therein as to be within a distance of six inches from the top of the sides, walls, or linings of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except by some nightman duly authorized or licensed as such by the local authority for the said Borough of Koroi, and that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of 11 p.m. and 5 a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

Emptying receptacles for night-soil.—Every occupier and every person having the arrangement or control of any premises once at least in every week shall empty and cleanse, or shall cause to be emptied or cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, or place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

Night-soil to be removed by licensed nightmen only.—No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, or place for the reception of night-soil except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed, and furnished with a sufficient covering, so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof or of effluvia therefrom, duly licensed by the municipality.

Places for the disposal of night-soil.—All night-soil, offal, blood, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and deposited in such place or places only as may be appointed by the local board of health from time to time for the final reception of same; and every person so placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited, or assisting in placing or depositing on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place, shall, immediately on the deposit thereof, cover the same, or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered, with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness.

Noxious and offensive trades.—The occupier of any premises within the said borough used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause all rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquids, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon, to be removed therefrom at least once in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance, or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia; and if the occupier of any such premises shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any such offensive matter, it may be removed by the local board of health or their officers at the expense of such occupier.

Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered so as to be watertight, with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet.

No closet-door or trap shall abut or open upon a street or lane exceeding sixteen feet in width.

Penalties.—Every person committing a breach of any one of the provisions contained in this bye-law shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty or sum not exceeding Ten pounds, and not less than Five shillings; or, if such breach be a continuing act or default, shall forfeit and pay a penalty or sum for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued not exceeding Five pounds, and not less than Five shillings. And any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the local board may be empowered to remedy such breach, and whether such local board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

This bye-law shall be in force and have effect within the whole of the said Borough of Kororoit.

SHIRE OF RIPON.—LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH.
BYE-LAW No. 2.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Public Health Amendment Statute 1883, and of every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Local Board of Health for the Shire of Ripon, being the Municipal Council thereof, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within its jurisdiction, do hereby make the Bye-laws following, that is to say:—

The former bye-law on the matter and things hereinafter provided for is hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of the bye-law coming into operation.

1. Interpretation of terms.—In the construction and for the purposes of this bye-law the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them:—

“House” shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public-houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging-houses, or other buildings or premises.

“Cesspool” shall mean any receptacle for night-soil, or for noxious or offensive matter below or above the ground.

“Street” shall mean and include any highway, and any public bridge, and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

2. Premises to be kept so as not to be a nuisance.—Every occupier or person having the management or control of any house or premises shall cause the same to be kept in such a state as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

3. Removal of refuse from houses.—Every occupier of a house or premises shall remove therefrom all dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, or such other refuse matter produced or accumulated thereon once every week, and in case of the default of such occupier the Local Board of Health may remove the same.

4. Receptacles for house refuse.—Every occupier of a house or premises shall provide and keep thereon a box or some other covered receptacle for the temporary deposit of house refuse,

which box or receptacle shall be of such dimensions as that the same may, with the contents thereof when full, be readily and conveniently movable by one man, or so many such boxes or receptacles as may be necessary to contain all the house refuse produced or accumulated on such premises during one week, and shall cause all house refuse to be deposited as soon as conveniently may be in some such box or receptacle.

5. Removal of refuse from places where animals are kept.—Every occupier of land on which is erected any stable, shed, sty, yard, or other place for the keeping of animals, shall from time to time remove from such premises all dung, soil, or other manure produced or accumulated thereon once at least every week, and, in case of the default of such occupier the Local Board may remove the same.

6. Power to use refuse as manure.—Nothing hereinbefore contained shall be taken to prevent the occupier of any premises from causing any dung, soil, not being night-soil, or other refuse matter produced or accumulated on any premises to be at any time removed, or to be used as manure on any garden or land contiguous to such premises as manure, so that the same be not so removed, kept, or used as to contravene any bye-law of the Local Board of Health, or so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

7. Removal of refuse from places where noxious or offensive trades are carried on.—Every occupier and every person having the management or control of premises used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, or manufacture whatsoever, shall cause all rubbish, filth, offal, soil, or other offensive matters, and all waste products of such manufacture from which effluvia may arise, to be removed from such premises once at least in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and so that no noxious or offensive effluvia arise therefrom; and if any such occupier or person shall neglect or fail to have removed any such offensive matter or waste products as aforesaid, the same may be removed by the Local Board of Health.

8. Removal of blood from places where animals are slaughtered.—Every occupier, licensee, or person having the management or control of an abattoir, slaughter-house, or place where any cattle or other animals are killed, shall cause all the blood from the animals killed therein, as soon as conveniently may be, to be collected in a fit receptacle to be provided for that purpose, and to be effectually deodorized by mixing therewith commercial sulphate of iron or chloride of lime in the proportion of one pound to the gallon, or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient to effectually deodorize the same, and to be removed from the premises within twelve hours after such blood is shed.

9. Removal of offal.—Every occupier of any premises on which may be any offal shall forthwith effectually deodorize the same, and remove the same from the premises within twenty-four hours.

10. Construction of privies.—No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan or other movable receptacle for night-soil, the contents whereof does not exceed two cubic feet, and with the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and the contents thereof, and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public house, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house, and every public privy, shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half an inch to the foot.

11. Supply of deodorizing material to earth-closets.—Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

12. Emptying receptacles for night-soil.—Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises once at least in every week shall empty or cleanse, or cause to be emptied or cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

13. Removal of night-soil to be by properly constructed conveyances.—No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed, and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents or of any portion thereof, or of effluvia therefrom.

14. Hours within which night-soil may be removed.—No person shall empty, assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Five a.m., or until the contents thereof have been properly deodorized; and every person emptying, or causing to be emptied, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, shall cause the night-soil taken therefrom to be removed so soon as the same is emptied.

15. Construction of cesspools.—Every cesspool shall be furnished with a water-tight cover or roof, and every cesspool below the surface of the ground shall be provided with water-tight walls, or sides which project on all sides at least six (6) inches above the surface of the ground.

16. Emptying of cesspools.—Every occupier of premises and every person having the management or control of premises on which there shall be any cesspool shall cause the same to be emptied once at least in every week.

17. *Times within which cesspools may be emptied.*—No person shall empty, or assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied, any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse and offensive matter except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Five a.m., or until such contents have been properly deodorized; and every person emptying or causing to be emptied any cesspool shall remove, or cause to be removed, the contents thereof as soon as the same is emptied.

18. *Conveyances by which cesspools may be emptied.*—No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any cesspool, or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse and offensive matter except by means of a cart, carriage, or other conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents, or of any portion thereof, or of any effluvia therefrom.

19. *Disposal of refuse and offensive matter.*—No person shall place or deposit any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil, or any night-soil or other offensive matter, in any place so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

20. *Night-soil, &c., removed from any earth-closet, &c., and deposited anywhere, to be covered with earth.*—Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited, or assisting in placing or depositing, on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place of deposit, shall, immediately on the deposit thereof, cover the same, or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered with a layer of earth not less than twelve (12) inches in thickness.

21. *Earth-closets, &c., not to be emptied into drains or sewers.*—No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter into any drain or sewer, or so that the contents thereof may find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any drain or sewer.

22. *Prevention of pollution of water.*—No person shall place, assist in placing, or cause or permit to be placed, in or so that the same may or may be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used, or likely to be used, in any dairy, any matter or thing likely to endanger the health of any persons using such water or drinks or milk or other produce of such dairy.

23. *Cesspools not to be emptied into water used for drinking or domestic purposes.*—No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse matter into any water supplied, used, or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, or so that the contents or any portion of the contents thereof may find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any such water.

24. Every accumulation or deposit of offensive matter so situated as to find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any water used, or likely to be used, by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or likely to be used in any dairy, shall be deodorized and removed by the owner of the property upon which such accumulation or deposit is situated within one week of notice given by the Local Board or by one of its officers.

25. *Keeping of animals.*—No person shall keep any animal of any kind so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

26. *Animals not to be so kept as to pollute water.*—No person shall keep any animal in such a manner as to pollute any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, so as to endanger the health of any person using such water or drinks or milk or other produce of such dairy.

27. *Supply of water to slaughter-houses.*—Every occupier or licensee or person having the management or control of a slaughter-house or abattoir shall cause the same to be supplied with a sufficient quantity of water for all purposes.

28. *Drainage of new buildings.*—Every person erecting, or causing to be erected, any new buildings, shall cause the foundations thereof, and the ground over which such building is to be placed, to be rendered dry, sound, and well drained, so that no water soakage or damp shall lodge there.

29. *Drainage of existing buildings.*—Every owner of a building shall cause the same to be provided with proper and sufficient drains, so constructed as to prevent any nuisance arising therefrom, and to secure the healthfulness of the inmates of such building; and every tenant of a building under a lease of which fourteen years or upwards is unexpired shall be deemed an owner within the meaning of this section.

REGISTRATION OF COWKEEPERS, DAIRYMEN, AND PURVEYORS OF MILK.

30. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of June in every year, register himself or herself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say:—By signing and forwarding to the Secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of 2s. 6d. (Two shillings and Sixpence).

31. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the secretary for the Local Board of Health shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

32. *Milk stores and shops to be kept clean.*—Every person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman shall cause every milk store or milk shop in his occupation, or under his management or control, and every milk vessel used by him for containing milk for sale, to be kept thoroughly clean.

33. *Dairymen, &c., to report disease to the Health Officer.*—Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, and every person having the management of any such trade, shall forthwith report in writing to the Health Officer the occurrence of any disease in any of his milk cows, or of any contagious or infectious disease in man or animal upon the premises upon which such trade is carried on.

34. *Extent of application of bye-law.*—This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Shire of Ripon, and shall come into force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health and publication in the *Government Gazette*.

35. *Penalties.*—If any person commit a breach of any of the foregoing provisions of this bye-law, he shall, for every such breach, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10, or to a penalty not exceeding £5 for each day during which such breach be committed or continued; provided the justices before whom any penalty imposed hereby is sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid. And every person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the foregoing penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such Local Board of Health have or have not taken the advantage of such powers.

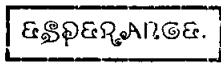

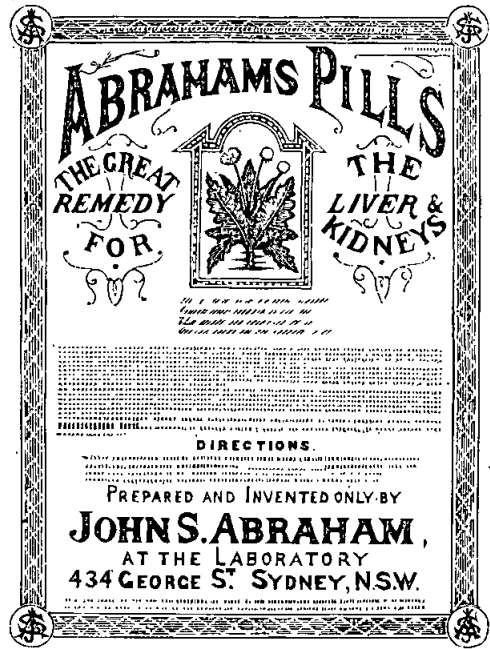
