NOTICE is hereby given that a reef is reported as having been found lying 40 miles E.N.E. from Anchor Cay.

It is described as consisting of three small patches, awash at low water, forming a triangle, and not exceeding a quarter of a mile in extent.

Mr. Goldie states that this danger was seen at night, some eight years before, but had been since searched for by the Mission schooner without success.

On this occasion the reef was distinctly made out, the sea breaking heavily over it.

**WHEREAS** by section 90 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883*, No. 778, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, after any Trust has by Order in Council been duly constituted, make additional orders relating to such Waterworks or Irrigation Trust not inconsistent with the provisions of the now in part recited Act, and that the Governor in Council may in such additional Orders in Council, among other things, increase or diminish the extent of the Waterworks District of such Waterworks Trust :

1. That the extent of the Waterworks District of the said Loddon United Water Trust shall be diminished by the excision therefrom of all that portion of the irrigation area of the Tragowel Plains Irrigation Trust (such said irrigation area being limited and defined by an Order in Council, bearing date the fourteenth day of June 1886) included within the said Waterworks District.
2. That notwithstanding the excision from the said Waterworks District of such portion of the said irrigation area of the said Tragowel Plains Irrigation Trust, the Waterworks Trust for the said Waterworks District as hereby diminished in extent shall continue to consist of two members from each of the councils of the municipal districts of East Loddon and Gordon, and one member from each of the councils of the municipal districts of Korong, Marong, and Swan Hill, and of one other commissioner.

THE WIMMERA UNITED WATERWORKS DISTRICT.  
REGULATION.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulation, made by the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881* (No. 716, sec. 44).

THE Commissioners of the Wimmera United Waterworks District, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 44 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881*, do make the following:—

REGULATION No. 6.

Regulation for the making of a Rate for the year 1886 on all the ratable property in that portion of the Wimmera United Waterworks District, of which notice has been given that the same has been supplied with water under the provisions of the Victorian Water Conservation Acts 1881-1885, and which notice was published in the *Government Gazette* of March 12th 1886, wherein the portion of the district so described as supplied with water is as follows, that is to say, the whole of the area of the Wimmera United Waterworks District, except the parishes of Hindmarsh, Joop, Jeparit, Batyik, Tarranyurk, Willenabrina, Yellangip, Katylil, and Dimboola.

Whereas the Governor in Council has, by an Order made the thirteenth day of April 1886, under the provisions of section 93 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883*, divided the Wimmera United Waterworks District into divisions, and directed that the necessary rates for paying interest on all moneys borrowed by the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust for the construction and maintenance of their waterworks, or to meet any other expenses in connection therewith, shall be levied in the following only of such divisions, viz.:—The Shire of St. Arnaud Division, the Shire of Kara Kara Division, the Shire of Dunnunkle Division, the Shire of Stawell Division, the Shire of Wimmera Division, and the Shire of Dimboola Division: and has further directed that such rates be levied differentially as between such said several divisions, and that the proportion in which such several divisions shall be rated respectively one to another shall be as follows, that is to say, that the respective ratings in the pound sterling on the annual value of ratable property rated for municipal purposes in the said several divisions shall be—Shire of St. Arnaud Division, seven pence; Shire of Kara Kara Division, fifteen pence; Shire of Dunnunkle Division, fourteen pence; Shire of Stawell Division, nine pence; Shire of Wimmera Division, thirteen pence; Shire of Dimboola Division, twenty-four pence.

The following rate is made on the annual value of all the ratable property in the said several divisions of the Wimmera United Waterworks District, according to the valuation for the time being on all such lands and tenements for the municipal rates of the Shires of St. Arnaud, Kara Kara, Dunnunkle, Stawell, Wimmera, and Dimboola, respectively, that is to say, on ratable property within the Shire of St. Arnaud Division, a rate of seven pence in the pound sterling of such valuation on ratable property; in the Shire of Kara Kara Division, a rate of fifteen pence in the pound sterling of such valuation; in the Shire of Dunnunkle Division, a rate of fourteen pence in the pound sterling of such valuation; in the Shire of Stawell Division, a rate of nine pence in the pound sterling of such valuation; in the Shire of Wimmera Division, a rate of thirteen pence in the pound sterling of such valuation; and in the Shire of Dimboola Division, a rate of twenty-four pence in the pound sterling of such valuation.

Such rate is hereby made payable on the first day of June 1886.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

The foregoing resolution, No. 6, was made by the Commissioners of the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of section 44 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881*, this eighteenth day of May 1886.

REGULATION No. 3.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shire of Yarrawonga Waterworks Trust, that portion of whose waterworks district contained and described in a Proclamation dated the twelfth day of January One thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, as the "Town of Yarrawonga," has been proclaimed an "Urban District," for the purposes of the Water Conservation Acts 1881-1885, make the Regulations following:—

1. A water rate for the urban district of Yarrawonga shall be made by the Trust for each year, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July in each year.

2. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of land and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the urban district, that is to say:—

(1.) For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twenty pounds annual value or under, the amount which at the rate levied for the year would be payable in respect of a tenement of Twenty pounds annual value.

(2.) For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Twenty pounds annual value, the amount payable in respect of such at the rate levied for the year.

(3.) For every water-trough, supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the sum of Two pounds per annum.

(4.) For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Thirty shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam-boiler.

(5.) For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the works of the Trust, Two shillings and sixpence for every one thousand gallons.

3. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case when the water is supplied by measure shall be—

1. If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

2. If for other than domestic purposes only thirty thousand gallons per half-year, excepting as follows:—

Gardens and lawns, $\frac{1}{2}$ acre and less,	8,000 gals. per annum.
" " $\frac{1}{4}$ " "	12,000 " "
" " $\frac{1}{8}$ " "	16,000 " "
" " $\frac{1}{16}$ " "	28,000 " "
" " $\frac{1}{32}$ " "	40,000 " "

Livery and carriers' stables, for each stall or space of five feet 3,000 " "

Stand-pipe or hydrant water, for each load of 100 gallons or under ... One shilling.

And for each additional 100 gallons, or fraction of 100 gallons, after the first or any one load, to be paid for at the time of taking ... Sixpence.

3. All charges for water supplied by measure to be paid quarterly.

4. Every person who is supplied by the Trust with water by measure shall, at his own expense, provide a meter (which meter shall be submitted to and examined by the proper officer of the Trust, who, if he shall find the same correct and in proper working order, shall give his certificate to that effect), which when fixed shall be maintained and kept in proper working order by such person. The meter must be so placed as to be open for inspection and so as to be protected from injury, and with means of access thereto; the keys of the meter shall be in the possession of the Trust. No meter shall be connected with more than one separate and distinct inlet-pipe leading from the service-pipe, unless otherwise permitted by order of the Trust.

5. All service-pipes with the necessary stop-cocks shall be supplied and fixed at the cost of the person or persons requiring the same, under the direction and supervision of such officer or servant as the Trust may appoint.

6. All delivery-cocks to be of high pressure and of strong hard brass, and in all exposed places to be open and shut by a moveable key or handle.

7. Plumbers or other persons employed to lay on service-pipes and to fix meters, or to refix or relay the same, must satisfy the proper officer of the Trust that they are competent to perform the same in a workmanlike manner.

8. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial of the same capable of registering one million (1,000,000) gallons.

9. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of premises or of any lands or tenements, who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying on of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundaries of such land, premises, or tenement abutting on the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

10. If any person shall waste water of the Trust by neglecting to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.

11. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

12. No person shall connect any service-pipe, or branch service-pipe with any steam-boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

13. No pipes shall be affixed to the main pipe, nor to any service-pipe or apparatus connected therewith, nor shall any alteration be made in any existing pipes or apparatus, without notice in writing of the intention so to do being given to the Trust, and the consent of the Trust thereto first had and obtained.

14. Overflow-pipes to private baths will not be permitted, the inlet-pipes to which must be visible and accessible, and attached to the bath above the bottom thereof, and the bath provided with a proper well-fitted and watertight ground outlet, plug, or cock.

15. All water-troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps to prevent overflow.

16. Water closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.

17. No hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground, or trees, or plants, or washing houses or walls, carriages or horses, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by measure.

18. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

19. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust, who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

20. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

21. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers, shall each have a stop-cock at the main, and shall in no case exceed the following diameters:—For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding Twenty pounds annual value,  $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch diameter; for the domestic supply of premises exceeding Twenty pounds annual value,  $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch diameter; for the supply of water for other than domestic purposes, and for all supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.

22. The water supplied in the urban district of the Trust shall be received and used under and in accordance with these regulations, and the Victorian Water Conservation Acts 1881-1885, and such parts of the Public Works Statute 1865 as are incorporated therewith.

23. If any person, whether supplied with water by the Trust or otherwise, shall commit a breach of these regulations, such person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each such offence, and such person, if supplied with water by the Trust, shall be liable to have the supply of water cut off from his premises, either by cutting the pipes by or through which such water is supplied, or otherwise, as the Trust may think fit, and such supply shall cease so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

24. In the foregoing regulations, wherever the words "officer" or "servant" appears, the same shall be deemed to be taken and mean an officer or servant of the Trust duly authorized in that behalf.

The foregoing regulation, numbered (3) three, was made by the Commissioners of the Shire of Yarrawonga Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of Section 44 of the Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881, this third day of May 1886.

WHEREAS by The Legislative Council Act 1881, No. 702, it was amongst other things enacted, that where any accidental or unavoidable impediment, misfeasance, or omission should have happened in the preparation or transmission or printing of any roll of ratepaying electors, the Governor in Council might, by Order in Council, take all such measures as might be necessary for removing such impediment or rectifying such misfeasance or omission, or might declare any such roll valid as to, and notwithstanding such impediment, misfeasance, or omission, and every such Order in Council should state specifically the nature of the impediment, misfeasance, or omission, and should be forthwith published in the Government Gazette: And whereas in the preparation in November last of the Roll of Ratepaying Electors for the Echuca Shire division of the Northern Province the Electoral Registrar did accidentally omit from the said roll the names of the electors within the Shire of Numurkah set forth in Schedule A hereto: And whereas in the preparation of the Roll of Ratepaying Electors for the Shepparton division of the North-Eastern Province the Electoral Registrar did improperly include in the roll for the said division the names of the electors within the said Shire of Numurkah specified in Schedule B hereto: And it is expedient to rectify the said Rolls of Ratepaying Electors: Now therefore the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power in him vested by the 31st section of the said Act, doth by this present Order direct that the Rolls of Ratepaying Electors for the said divisions be rectified by including in the Roll of Ratepaying Electors for the Echuca Shire division the names of the electors as set forth in the subjoined schedule marked A, and by expunging from the Roll of Ratepaying Electors for the Shepparton division the names of the electors as named and described in the schedule marked B hereto, notwithstanding such accidental misfeasance as aforesaid.

The births of 1,101 children, viz., 551 boys and 550 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of May. In the month of April, 975 births were registered, or 126 fewer than in the month under review. The births were 268 above the average of the previous ten years, but only 90 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in May numbered 631, viz., 336 of males and 295 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 470. The deaths outnumbered those in April by 31, and were above the average of May during the previous ten years by 158. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded that average by only 57.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 3.19, and of deaths registered 1.83.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 76.6° on the 8th, and the lowest was 32.7° on the 29th. The mean temperature of the month (52.7°) was six-tenths of a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (28.1°) took place on the 15th, viz., from a maximum of 67.2° to a minimum of 39.1°. The least range (6.2°) was on the 20th, viz., from a maximum of 56.8° to a minimum of 50.6°. The mean daily range was 16.0°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.354 inches on the 20th, and the lowest was 29.511 inches on the 18th. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.038 inches) was a fraction above the average.

Rain fell on 10 days, the amount of rainfall being .80 inch. Fog occurred on one day.

Males contributed 53 per cent., and females 47 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 32 per cent. to that mortality, as against 33 per cent. in May 1885, 36 per cent. in May 1884, 34 per cent. in May 1883, 30 per cent. in May 1882, 31 per cent. in May 1881 and 1880, 39 per cent. in May 1879, 26 per cent. in May 1878, 34 per cent. in May 1877, and 38 per cent. in May 1876.

As many as 39 deaths of persons who had attained or passed the age of 75 years were recorded during the month, viz.:—Those of a female, aged 75, who died of exhaustion from shock to the system, the result of a fractured thigh; a gentleman, aged 75, a female, aged 77, and a female, aged 81, of diarrhoea; a boatbuilder, aged 75, and a male, of no occupation, aged 77, of paralysis; a female, aged 75, and a miller, aged 84, of apoplexy; a laborer, aged 76, a female, aged 76, and a female, aged 80, of bronchitis; a female, aged 73, and a female, aged 78, of asthma; a female, aged 73, a female, aged 83, and a laborer, aged 85, of pneumonia; a gentleman, aged 77, of osteo sarcoma; a laborer, aged 78, a female, aged 79, and a seaman, aged 85, of heart disease; a gentleman, aged 79, of gangrene; two laborers, each aged 80, of rheumatism and liver disease respectively; a laborer, aged 83, and a female, aged 88, of brain disease; a gentleman, aged 73, an estate agent and a widow, each aged 79, a laborer, aged 81, a wheelwright, aged 82, a female, aged 83, a farmer, a surveyor, and a female, each aged 86, two laborers and a steward, each aged 87, and a female, aged 88, of old age.

Twenty-five deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which 23 were set down to accident, 1 to homicide, and 1 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A jockey, aged 18, was killed by being thrown from a horse; a lady, aged 21, died of injuries to the head, caused by being thrown from a carriage; a carpenter, aged 51, of injury to the spine, caused by his being knocked down by a horse; a cabman, aged 56, was killed through being knocked down by a lorry; and a carrier, aged 23, died of pyæmia, consequent on compound fracture of the leg, occasioned by a kick from a horse. A nightman, aged 28, died of rupture of the liver, and a female, aged 69, of fracture of the skull—caused by being passed over by

drays; a female, aged 48, and a laborer, aged 58, were killed by railway trains; a lighterman, aged 24, was killed by being crushed between two logs; and a marble mason, aged 54, by becoming entangled in machinery. A boy, aged 11, died of hemorrhage resulting from severe concussion of the brain; a clerk, aged 22, of rupture of the bladder—both caused by falls; a laborer, aged 23, was killed by falling into the hold of a ship; a builder, aged 60, died of fracture of the skull, caused by falling from the roof of a house; a female, aged 75, of a fractured thigh, caused by her having been knocked down by the slamming of a door. A female, aged 23, died of hemorrhage resulting from cuts received whilst breaking a window; a saddler, aged 37, of punctured wound of the arm, occasioned by the prongs of a table-fork against which the limb was struck; a laborer, aged 61, of scalds, resulting from falling into a vat of boiling fat; a female boot-trimmer, aged 18, and a quarryman, aged 57, were found drowned, the former in Hobson's Bay, the latter in the Yarra; a male infant, aged 4½ months, was overlain, and a bank-teller, aged 33, was suffocated during an epileptic fit. The homicidal death was that of a female infant, who was murdered by some person or persons unknown. The suicidal death was that of a sawyer, aged 69, who hanged himself whilst laboring under temporary insanity.

One hundred and nineteen deaths, or 19 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—56 in the Melbourne Hospital, 26 in the Alfred Hospital, 2 in the Children's Hospital, 6 in the Lying-in Hospital, 9 in the Immigrants' Home, 7 in the Benevolent Asylum, 2 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 6 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Austin Hospital, 2 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 1 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 203, of which 105, or 51 per cent., were of males, and 100, or 49 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 141 were under one year of age, 31 were between one and two, 15 were between two and three, 8 were between three and four, and 10 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 426. Of these, 231, or 54 per cent., were males, and 195, or 46 per cent., were females; 14 were between five and ten, 10 were between ten and fifteen, 12 were between fifteen and twenty, 46 were between twenty and twenty-five, 49 were between twenty-five and thirty, 35 were between thirty and thirty-five, 27 were between thirty-five and forty, 20 were between forty and forty-five, 18 were between forty-five and fifty, 41 were between fifty and fifty-five, 30 were between fifty-five and sixty, 29 were between sixty and sixty-five, 34 were between sixty-five and seventy, 22 were between seventy and seventy-five, 18 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 21 were upwards of eighty.

Comparing the experience of May with that of the previous month, it is noticed that deaths from typhoid fever fell from 52 to 40, those from dysentery and diarrhoea from 34 to 27, those from tabes mesenterica from 14 to 5, those from heart affections from 41 to 33, those from bowel and stomach disorders from 56 to 49, and those from atrophy and debility from 58 to 38. On the other hand, deaths from cancer rose from 20 to 27, those from phthisis from 60 to 77, those from brain and nerve affections from 58 to 78, those from lung and chest complaints from 55 to 89, those from kidney diseases from 19 to 28, and those from old age from 9 to 20. Eight deaths of parturient women, or 1 death of a mother to every 138 births registered, occurred during the month.

## DEPARTMENT OF LANDS AND SURVEY.

### REGULATIONS FOR PUPIL DRAUGHTSMEN.

#### Conditions.

**A**N applicant for appointment must be not more than 20 years or less than 16 years of age. He will be required to produce a medical certificate that he is of sound constitution and not affected with any physical infirmity which could interfere with the proper discharge of his profession.

#### Qualifications.

1. The candidate must have passed in algebra, euclid, and arithmetic in a matriculation examination in the Melbourne or other recognised University; or
2. Passed such other recognised examination, or produce such certificates from the Education Department or other authority, as shall satisfy the Board of Examiners for Surveyors as to his competency in those three subjects and as to his general educational proficiency.
3. He shall also, with such certificates, submit satisfactory proof of his aptitude for drawing.

#### Probation.

Each candidate approved by the Minister shall enter the office as a probationer for a period of one month without pay; and, at the end of that time, if reported by the Surveyor-General to have displayed aptitude for the work, he shall be enrolled as a pupil, and shall be subject to the General Regulations for the Public Service, so far as they can fairly apply.

No more pupils will be received than are needed for the requirements of the department.

#### Term of Service.

The term of service shall be two years, and at the end of each year the pupil will be required to pass an examination on the subjects mentioned in the attached schedule.

The Minister reserves the power to dispense at any time with the services of any pupil who may, in the opinion of the Surveyor-General, be wanting in application or in the careful performance of his work, or whose conduct may be considered by him to be unsatisfactory.

#### Remuneration.

The salary for the first year shall be £40, and, subject to the passing of the required examinations, the salary for the second year shall be £50. On successfully passing the prescribed departmental examinations a pupil will, at the end of the term of two years, receive a certificate of competency as a draughtsman; and on his further passing the examination under the Regulations of the Public Service Board for appointment to the Clerical Division, such pupil will be eligible for appointment as junior draughtsman of the 5th Class in the Lands Department, in the order of his merit, and in accordance with the provisions of the regulations aforesaid.

### SCHEDULE OF SUBJECTS FOR EXAMINATION.

#### First Year.

Tracing, coloring, drawing to scale, neat lettering, mensuration, and elementary freehand drawing.

#### Second Year.

Simple geometrical drawing, plotting from field notes, computation of areas, ornamental writing and printing, construction of maps, and simple practical trigonometry.

Tracings and drawings connected with the subjects for examination for each year, and duly certified as being the work of the pupil, will be considered in connexion with each examination.

# RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF TRENTHAM.—REGULATIONS.

WE, David Watson, junior, William Kelly, William Dashwood, Donald Macpherson, Jeremiah Benjamin Enders, William Pepper Wright, Edward Newton, and John Rosekilly, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Recreation in the Parish of Trentham, hereinafter designated the "Trentham Recreation Reserve," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*.—

## REGULATIONS.

1. The Trentham Recreation Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on days set apart for shows, sports, fêtes or other holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a charge not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence may be made for admission thereto of every adult.

2. The committee of management may allow any duly recognised committee of any shows, sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements to use the Trentham Recreation Reserve, and the latter committee shall abide by any order given by the committee of management in reference thereto, or to the buildings or other erections for the time being thereon.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, tree-guards, shrubs, or flowers in the Trentham Recreation Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall enter or remain in the Trentham Recreation Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

5. No person shall climb upon or jump over the fences or gates, or stick bills or cut names thereon, or in any way damage the buildings, or roll or throw stones, or leave bottles or broken glass in the Trentham Recreation Reserve.

6. No person shall put any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals in the Trentham Recreation Reserve, or take horses therein, without first obtaining the written permission of the committee of management.

7. No person, except laborers and working men employed in the Trentham Recreation Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

8. No person shall discharge any firearms in the Trentham Recreation Reserve.

9. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Trentham Recreation Reserve, nor any booth or any structure for the sale or exhibition of any article or animal, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management.

10. Any person committing in the Trentham Recreation Reserve, or in any of the buildings or other structures for the time being thereon, any of the following offences shall be liable to be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased and shall or may be in possession of a ticket of admission thereto:—

(a.) Assaulting any person.

(b.) Being drunk.

(c.) Using profane or obscene language.

(d.) Using abusive or insulting words.

(e.) Behaving improperly or riotously.

(f.) Obtaining admission to the reserve or any buildings thereon when not entitled to such admission, or refusing to surrender, if required, to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the committee of management to demand production of the same, any ticket authorizing admission to the reserve.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in such portion of the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.

8. No person, except laborers or workmen employed in such portion of the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Shire of Berwick.

REGISTRATION OF COWKEEPERS, DAIRYMEN, AND PURVEYORS OF MILK.

4. Every person carrying on the trade of cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of August in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of Five shillings (5s.).

5. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the secretary for the Local Board of Health shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said local board or by any person authorized, in writing, by the chairman or secretary of the said local board; and if on inspection such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them, are or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said local board may, by an order in writing signed by the secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or in the case of an unregistered person, served personally or left at his dwelling-place or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle, either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such

order as aforesaid the said local board may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health; and shall be thoroughly and effectually lighted and ventilated; and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept, and be kept perfectly clean, and shall within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances be fumigated, disinfected, or limewashed, as may be in any such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person, or any member of the family of any person, registered as aforesaid, or not so registered but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family or any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the local board or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said local board or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, until danger, in the opinion of such local board or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until, in either case, all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the local board, officer of health, or nearest member of police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep, or permit or suffer to be kept, any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

13. In the interpretation of this bye-law, words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

14. Every person guilty of any breach of this bye-law, or of any of its provisions, shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings, for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

The foregoing bye-law was duly made, ordered, and passed by the Local Board of Health (being the Municipal Council) in and for the Shire of Berwick this 13th day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

# SHIRE OF KYNETON—LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH. BYE-LAW No. 1.

Under "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883."

IN pursuance of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and of every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Local Board of Health for Shire of Kyneton, being the Municipal Council thereof, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within its jurisdiction, doth hereby make the bye-law following, that is to say:—

1. *Interpretation of terms.*—In the construction and for the purpose of this bye-law the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them:—

"House" shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public-houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging-houses, or other buildings or premises.

"Cesspool" shall mean any receptacle for night-soil, or for noxious or offensive matter below or above the ground.

"Street" shall mean and include any highway, and any public bridge, and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

2. *Premises to be kept so as not to be a nuisance.*—Every occupier or person having the management or control of any house or premises shall cause the same to be kept in such a state as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

3. *Removal of house refuse.*—The occupier of any house, building, or other tenement or premises within the Shire of Kyneton, shall cause the yard and ground adjacent or belonging thereto to be kept in a cleanly condition, and so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, or other such refuse matter produced or accumulated on such premises, to be collected in one place upon such yard or ground, and to be there kept in an inoffensive condition, and so as that the same shall not be productive of any nuisance, and shall cause all such refuse matter so collected to be from time to time removed from such yard, ground, or premises as, often as such refuse matter shall amount to a quantity equal to one cubic yard, and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such rubbish or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the Local Board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier. Nothing contained in this bye-law shall be construed or taken to prevent the occupier of any premises from causing any manure, ashes, or other refuse matter as aforesaid produced or accumulated thereon to be kept for the purpose of being used for manure on any garden, or on any land contiguous to such premises, provided such manure, ashes, or other refuse matter shall not, when so used or previous to the removal thereof for use as manure on any garden or land as aforesaid, be kept or used so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

4. *Removal of offal.*—Every occupier of any premises on which may be any offal shall forthwith effectually deodorize the same, and remove the same from the premises within twenty-four hours.

5. *Stables, cowsheds, and pigsties.*—The occupier of any land within the Shire of Kyneton on which there shall be erected any stable, cowyard, cattleshed, or pigsty, shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state, in respect of cleanliness, as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health; and shall cause all dung, soil, or other manure produced or accumulated thereon, to be collected in one place in the yard of such premises, and to be there kept in an inoffensive condition and so as not to be productive of any nuisance; and shall cause such dung, soil, or other manure, to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so collected or accumulated shall amount to two cubic yards; and if at any time the occupier of any such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the Local Board of Health at the expense of such occupier. Nothing in this bye-law shall be construed or taken to prevent the occupier of any such premises as aforesaid from causing the dung, soil, or other manure produced or accumulated thereon to be used as manure on any garden or on any land contiguous to such premises, provided that such dung, soil, or other manure shall not, when so used or previous to removal thereof for use as manure on any garden or land as aforesaid, be kept or used so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

6. *Abattoirs and slaughter-houses.*—The occupier of every abattoir, slaughter-house, or place used for the purpose of having cattle or other animals killed therein, shall cause such abattoir, slaughter-house, or place to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause the blood accumulated therein to be collected in a fit receptacle to be provided for that purpose, which receptacle shall be emptied of its contents at least once in every twenty-four hours. Before any blood shall be removed from any premises as hereinbefore mentioned, the occupier of such premises shall cause to be mixed therewith a quantity of chloride of zinc, perchloride of iron, Condy's fluid, chloride of lime, or some other efficient deodorizer, sufficient to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

7. *Offensive trades.*—The occupier of any premises within the Shire of Kyneton used for the purpose of any trade, business, process, or manufacture whatsoever causing effluvia shall cause all rubbish, filth, offal, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be removed therefrom at least once in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health; and if the occupier of any such premises shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any such offensive matter as aforesaid, such refuse matter may be removed by the Local Board of Health or its officers at the expense of such occupier.

8. *Construction of privies.*—No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan or other movable receptacle for night-soil, the contents whereof does not exceed ten gallons, and with the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and the contents thereof, and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house, and every public privy, shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half an inch to the foot.

9. *Supply of deodorizing material to earth-closets.*—Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material

sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

10. *Emptying receptacles for night-soil.*—Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises once at least in every fortnight shall empty or cleanse, or cause to be emptied or cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil on or belonging to such premises, or as soon as any portion of the contents of such earth-closet, privy, or cesspool, shall have accumulated therein so as to be within a distance of three inches from the top in the case of an earth-pan, and six inches from the top in the case of a cesspool. No privy cesspool shall have connected therewith or attached thereto any pipe or other appliance capable of being used for the purpose of discharging or removing the contents of such cesspool upon or under the surface of any adjoining ground or into any drain or sewer.

11. *Night-soil to be removed by licensed nightmen only.*—No person, except a nightman duly licensed by the municipality, shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil.

12. *Removal of night-soil to be by properly constructed conveyances.*—No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, except by means of a night-cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed, and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents or of any portion thereof, or of effluvia therefrom.

13. *Hours within which night-soil may be removed.*—No person shall empty, assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, except between the hours of 11 p.m. and 5 a.m., and every person emptying, or causing to be emptied, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, shall cause the night-soil taken therefrom to be removed as soon as the same is emptied.

14. No person shall deposit, or cause or suffer to be deposited, on any land, field, farm, or garden within the Kyneton Riding any nightsoil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing without the written consent of the Local Board of Health for the said shire; and any such offensive matter as aforesaid which shall with such consent of the said Local Board of Health be so deposited shall be, immediately on the deposit thereof, covered over by the persons depositing the same with six inches of earth so as at once to prevent the escape of any noxious or offensive effluvia from any such manure, soil, or other offensive matter before mentioned.

15. *Construction of cesspool.*—Every cesspool shall be furnished with a water-tight cover or roof, and every cesspool which shall have been formed or made below the surface of the ground shall have water-tight walls or sides which project on all sides at least six inches above the surface of the ground.

16. *Disposal of refuse and offensive matter.*—No person shall place or deposit any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil, or any night-soil or other offensive matter, in any place so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to health.

17. *Deposit of rubbish, manure, &c.*—No person shall deposit, or cause or suffer to be deposited, in or on any street, road, right-of-way, lane, passage, or water-channel, or in any creek, river, or reservoir, or in any other public place (not being a manure depot duly appointed by the Local Board of Health as a place for the deposit of such manure, rubbish, or other such refuse matter) any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, offal, manure, dung, or soil; and for the purposes of this bye-law any unsold or reserved public lands, other than any manure depot as aforesaid, shall be deemed and taken to be a public place as before mentioned.

18. *Earth-closets, &c., not to be emptied into drains or sewers.*—No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter into any drain or sewer, or so that the contents thereof may find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any drain or sewer.

19. *Prevention of pollution of water.*—No person shall place, assist in placing, or cause or permit to be placed, in or so that the same may or may be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, any matter or thing likely to endanger the health of any persons using such water or drinks or milk or other produce of such dairy.

20. *Keeping of animals.*—No person shall keep any animal of any kind so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or in such a manner as to pollute any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, so as to endanger the health of any person using such water or drinks, or milk or other produce of such dairy.

21. *Supply of water to slaughter-houses.*—Every occupier or licensee or person having the management or control of a slaughter-house or abattoir shall cause the same to be supplied with a sufficient quantity of water for all purposes.

22. *Drainage of new buildings.*—Every person erecting, or causing to be erected, any new buildings shall cause the foundations thereof, and the ground over which such building is to be placed, to be rendered dry, sound, and well drained, so that no water soakage or damp shall lodge there.

23. *Drainage of existing buildings.*—Every owner of a building shall cause the same to be provided with proper and sufficient drains, so constructed as to prevent any nuisance arising therefrom, and to secure the healthfulness of the inmates of such building; and every tenant of a building under a lease of which fourteen years or upwards is expired shall be deemed an owner within the meaning of this section.

24. *Registration of cowkeepers, dairymen, and purveyors of milk.*—Every person carrying on the trade of a dairyman or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of July in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the

secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of Five shillings.

25. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the Secretary for the Local Board of Health shall endorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

26. *Milk stores and shops to be kept clean.*—Every person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman shall cause every milk store or milk shop in his occupation, or under his management or control, and every milk vessel used by him for containing milk for sale, to be kept thoroughly clean.

27. *Dairymen, &c., to report disease to the health officer.*—Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, and every person having the management of any such trade, shall forthwith report in writing to the health officer the occurrence of any disease in any of his milch cows, or of any contagious or infectious disease in man or animal upon the premises upon which such trade is carried on.

28. No person shall use, cause to be used, or assist in using any steam-whistle at any factory or other establishment so as to be a nuisance to any person; and no person who occupies or has the management or control of any factory or other establishment shall suffer or permit any steam-whistle to be used thereat so as to be a nuisance to any person.

29. The following sections of this bye-law, that is to say, sections numbered 1 to 10 inclusive, and 15 to 28 inclusive, shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Shire of Kyneton, and sections numbered 11, 12, 13, and 14 shall apply to and have operation only in the Kyneton Riding of the said shire.

30. That the bye-laws made under the "Amending Public Health Statute 1867," be and the same are hereby repealed.

31. *Penalties.*—If any person commit a breach of any of the provisions of this bye-law, he shall, for every such breach, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10, or to a penalty not exceeding £5 for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued. Provided the justices before whom any penalty imposed hereby is sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid. And every person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the foregoing penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such Local Board of Health have or have not taken advantage of such powers.

*A Bye-law for the registration of cowkeepers, dairymen, and purveyors of milk, and for cleansing milk stores and shops, and for the suppression of any nuisances connected therewith.*

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and of every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Local Board of Health for the United Shire of Mount Alexander, being the municipal council thereof, doth hereby make the bye-law following, that is to say:—

1. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of July in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the Secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form contained in the schedule hereto; and every such person shall, with every such application, pay a fee of Two shillings and sixpence.

2. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the Secretary of the Local Board of Health shall endorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and shall cause the same to be properly indexed.

3. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, shall cause every milk store or milk shop in his occupation, or under his management or control, and every milk vessel used by him for containing milk for sale, to be kept thoroughly clean.

4. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, and every person having the management of any such trade, shall forthwith report, in writing, to the health officer the occurrence of any disease in any of his milch cows, or of any contagious or infectious disease in any person or animal upon the premises upon which such trade is carried on.

5. Every person who shall commit a breach of this bye-law shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings.

6. This bye-law shall apply to, and be in force, in the whole of the United Shire of Mount Alexander, and shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

BYE-LAW No. 16.—AS TO DAIRIES, DAIRY CATTLE, AND MILK.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Borough of Kew, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and every other power enabling the said Local Board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 16 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to, and have operation in, the whole of the Borough of Kew.

REGISTRATION OF COWKEEPERS, DAIRYMEN, AND PURVEYORS OF MILK.

4. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, shall, on or before the first day of July in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the Secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall, with every application, pay a fee of Two shillings and sixpence.

Upon receipt of every such application and fee the Secretary for the Local Board of Health shall endorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said Local Board, or by any person authorized, in writing, by the chairman or secretary of the said Local Board; and if, on inspection, such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any of them, are, or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said Local Board may, by an order, in writing, signed by the secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or in the case of an unregistered person, served personally or left at his dwelling-place or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle, either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said Local Board may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any manner whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept and be kept perfectly clean, and shall within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person or any member of the family of any person registered as aforesaid, or not so registered, but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge shall immediately give notice thereof to the Local Board or Officer of Health or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said Local Board or the Officer of Health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk until danger, in the opinion of such Local Board or Officer of Health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until in either case all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk, or of its contamination, has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the Local Board, Officer of Health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep or permit or suffer to be kept any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

13. In the interpretation of this bye-law, words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

14. Every person guilty of any breach of this bye-law or of any of its provisions shall be liable in the discretion of the convicting justices to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

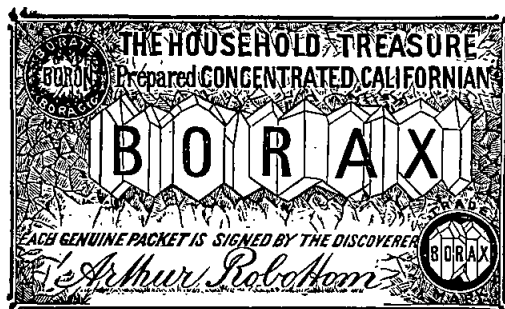

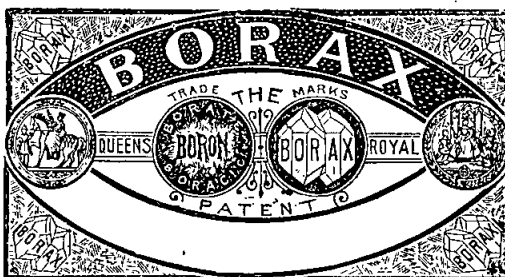
