REGULATIONS UNDER "THE TRANSFER OF LAND STATUTE."

THE Governor in Council has, in accordance with the provisions contained in the 127th section of *The Transfer of Land Statute*, consented to the Regulations hereinafter set forth respecting the description and delineation of land in a certificate of title.

By virtue and in pursuance of *The Transfer of Land Statute*, I, Edward de Verdon, Esquire, the Commissioner of Titles, with the consent of the Governor in Council, do hereby make the Regulations hereinafter set forth, respecting the description and delineation of land in a certificate of title.

REGULATIONS.

1. That on an application to bring land under *The Transfer of Land Statute* or for an amended certificate—
 - (a) The land included in the certificate to be issued shall, unless the Commissioner of Titles otherwise direct, be described in the map thereon by its abutments in addition to dimensions.
 - (b) Where the land consists of a subdivisional allotment or allotments of land subdivided under the 134th section of the Statute, and of which subdivision a map or plan has been deposited with the Registrar under that section, the adjoining subdivisional allotments with their subdivisional numbers shall, unless the Commissioner of Titles otherwise direct, be shown on the map in the margin of the certificate, as abutments of the land comprised therein; and the allotment or allotments constituting the said land shall be described in the body of the certificate by their subdivisional number or numbers, together with a reference to the deposited plan by its registered number.
 - (c) No tie-line or connection distance between the land comprised in any such certificate and any point outside such land shall, unless the Commissioner of Titles so direct, be shown on the map on such certificate, notwithstanding that, in the case of an amending certificate, such tie-line or connection distance is shown on the certificate before amendment.
2. That upon any tie-line or connection distance shown on any certificate already or hereafter issued being proved to the satisfaction of the Commissioner of Titles to be erroneous, he shall order the same to be struck out; and no tie-line or connection distance shall be substituted therefor unless the Commissioner of Titles so direct.
3. That any tie-line or connection distance shown on any certificate hereafter issued or amended shall be from and to such points as the Commissioner of Titles shall direct or approve of.
4. That upon any tie-line or connection distance being struck out by order of the Commissioner of Titles, the same shall be initialed by the Registrar of Titles, and the number of the order written in the margin.
5. All alterations (if any) necessary to be made in the form of certificate given in the Third schedule to the Statute, to give effect to the above Regulations or any of them, are hereby authorised to be made for that purpose.

Transfer of Land Statute.

NOTICE TO APPLICANTS AND CERTIFICATE HOLDERS.

THE Commissioner of Titles has made the following regulation for observance in the Office of Titles.

R. GIBBS,

I, EDWARD DE VERDON, Esquire, Commissioner of Titles, in exercise of the powers vested in me by the *Transfer of Land Statute*, do hereby make the regulation hereinafter set forth:—

REGULATION.

From and after the date hereof, until further order of the Commissioner of Titles, no land shall be brought under the operation of the *Transfer of Land Statute*, or Certificate of Title be amended as to the description of land therein, except on the basis of a survey and plan made for the purpose, to be furnished at the cost of the applicant or registered proprietor, unless the Commissioner of Titles expressly otherwise direct; and such plan shall, in addition to dimensions, show particulars of the actual boundaries, as defined on the ground by bound-marks or improvements (if any), together with the abutments and adjoining properties, with the names of the owners and occupiers thereof when ascertainable with reasonable diligence.

CIRCULAR.

THE attention of Land-owners, and of Surveyors practising under the *Transfer of Land Statute*, is directed to the following rules and instructions with regard to surveys and plans required by the Office of Titles:—

APPLICATIONS.

1. Every application to bring land under the Act must be accompanied by a plan of the land made from an actual survey made for the purpose of the application, showing the nature of

the boundaries as marked on the ground or defined by buildings, fences, or other improvements at the date of the application. Improvements of whatever nature on the boundaries, or abutting or adjacent on either side, by which the position of the recognised boundaries are indicated on the ground, must be accurately shown on the plan. The names and addresses of owners, and the names of occupiers of adjoining lands, must also be given in all cases where obtainable; and, in the absence of the original survey marks or buildings or other improvements defining the boundaries, such plan will not be considered complete unless and until it shows, whenever practicable, that there is or is not sufficient land left to supply the quantity belonging to the adjoining owners under the most liberal interpretation of their rights.

2. If the application refers to part of an original grant, the survey shall embrace, in addition to the part being dealt with, so much of the boundaries of the original grant as may be necessary to define the position of such part in reference to such boundaries.

3. If several adjoining grants or certificates are to be consolidated in one certificate of title, the survey may be limited to the external boundaries of the property included.

4. If, on the contrary, a large property is to be brought under the Act in more than one certificate of title, the plan must show the nature of the external boundaries of the land to be comprised in each certificate.

TRANSFERS.

5. Subdivision plans to be lodged under the 134th section of the *Transfer of Land Statute* must be prepared in accordance with the Regulations and Instructions for the guidance of Surveyors, issued by the Department of Lands and Survey, 1st January 1886, or any subsequent modification thereof, and—

- a. Should be plotted to scales of tens, viz., 10, 20, 30, 40, &c.; the scale may be feet and inches or links, but both are not to be used on the same plan.
- b. No land outside of the existing certificate, grant, or document of title is to be included in any subdivision thereof. Surveyors, when employed to make a subdivision of any land, are particularly requested to make themselves acquainted with the certificates or grants of the owners, and to adhere strictly to this rule. If the documents of title do not accord with the boundaries as found on the ground, and the case is one where such boundaries should prevail, the documents of title should be brought into harmony therewith before the subdivision is proceeded with.
- c. The widths of all roads, lanes, or rights-of-way are to be inserted in figures.
- d. The bearings, lengths of lines, and area of each allotment to be given.
- e. The allotments are to be numbered consecutively, and, if in sections, the numbers of the sections must also be given. There must be no two allotments in any one section of the same number.
- f. All buildings, fences, or other improvements abutting on or immediately adjacent to the land subdivided must be shown.
- g. If a part only of the land in a certificate or grant is subdivided, then such part must be connected by measurement with the nearest corner of the land contained in such certificate.
- h. The title of the plan must be in accordance with clause 16.

AMENDMENT OF TITLES.

6. Every application to amend the definition of a parcel in a certificate of title, either as regards its position or dimensions, must be accompanied by a plan similar to that required for bringing land under the Act.

7. Attention is directed generally to the Regulations and Instructions for the guidance of Surveyors under the *Transfer of Land Statute*, issued by the Lands and Survey Department, 1st January 1886, and especially to clauses 2 and 25.

8. The above instructions are in all cases subject to any special regulations made by the Commissioner of Titles under the provisions of the *Transfer of Land Statute Amendment Act No. 372* in respect of any particular survey.

"TRANSFER OF LAND STATUTE."—NOTICE TO INTENDING PURCHASERS OF SUBDIVISIONAL ALLOTMENTS OF LAND UNDER THE STATUTE.

THE Commissioner of Titles recommends every person intending to purchase subdivisional allotments from a proprietor of land under the *Transfer of Land Statute* who has subdivided such land for the purpose of selling it in allotments to first satisfy himself, by inquiry at the Office of Titles, that the vendor has previously deposited with the Registrar of Titles a map of such land and subdivision, in compliance with section 134 of the Statute, and that the same has been accepted by the Office of Titles as correct and sufficient. This information can be obtained from the Chief Draughtsman.

The adoption of this recommendation will in many cases save the purchaser much vexatious delay and expense in obtaining registration of his transfer.

To assist vendors, the Registrar will, whenever such correct and sufficient map shall have been so deposited, upon request, and free of cost, give to the vendor a certificate in writing, signed by the Chief Draughtsman, certifying that the requirements of the said section have been complied with.

REGULATIONS, ETC., RELATING TO PACKETS
SENT BY POST.

POST OFFICE ACT 1883, SEC. 10.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has approved of the articles mentioned in the attached list being transmitted through the Post as Inland or Foreign Packets, under the terms and conditions hereunto annexed.

REGULATIONS FOR THE TRANSMISSION OF PACKETS THROUGH
THE POST.*Preparation for Post.*

Packets may be sent through the post without a cover (but not fastened with anything adhesive, such as gum, postage stamp, sealing-wax, &c.).

In a cover entirely open at one end or side (if the cover be slit the opening must be of the full extent of the end or side, and the contents must be easy of withdrawal).

The cover may bear the sender's name and address, and the words "packet," "sample," "pattern," &c. (as the case may be), "only."

Samples of seeds, drugs, &c., which cannot be sent as open packets, may be enclosed in bags or boxes fastened so as to be easily undone and refastened. If addressed to places in the Colony or the United Kingdom, they may be sent in closed transparent bags.

Weight and Dimensions.

Weight.—For places in Victoria, not to exceed 3 lbs.

For other places—According to special notices published in the "Postal and Telegraph Guide."

Dimensions.—Not to exceed 2 feet in length, or 1 foot in breadth or depth, or to be of inconvenient form.

(The rule regarding dimensions—A packet not to apply to packets bearing a frank stamp and marked "On Her Majesty's Service.")

Articles that may be sent as packets:—

Acceptances.

Accounts—receipted or unreceipted. (Remarks such as "with thanks," "a cheque will oblige," or printed communications in the nature of a letter render them chargeable as letters.)

Affidavits.

Bankers' packets, containing bank notes, cheques, cheque-books, drafts, pass-books, or orders sent by or to any bank.

Bills of exchange.

Bills of lading and ships' manifest.

Bottles containing fluid, &c., addressed to places within Victoria, very securely corked so that their contents cannot escape, and packed in boxes sufficiently strong so as to prevent breakage of the bottles and damage to the mails.

Briefs.

Cards, either plain or bearing printed matter, or pictures, or both (the name only of the addressee may be written on the face of such cards).

Catalogues, printed (prices in figures may be written).

Circulars, i.e. letters wholly printed, engraved, lithographed, chronographed, or produced by other mechanical process intended for transmission in identical terms to several persons (the name of the addressee may, however, be added in writing).

Deeds, or copies thereof.

Depositions.

Drafts.

Drawings.

Engravings.

Insurance documents, not being in the nature of a letter.

Invoices or bills of parcels (an invoice may be receipted and may advise when or how goods are forwarded, but may contain no other written matter).

Legal documents, not being in the nature of a letter.

Manuscript of books.

Merchandise.

Maps.

Music, sheets, printed or written.

Notices of meetings, of subscriptions or premiums due, printed, engraved, lithographed, or produced by other mechanical process; names, dates, and amounts only to be inserted in writing).

Paintings.

Paper.

Parchment or vellum.

Pass-books or cards connected with any society.

Patterns (manufacturers' or trade mark and prices may accompany them).

Pay-sheets.

Photographs (not on glass except in cases of leather or other strong material).

Pictures.

Plans.

Policies of insurance.

Powers of attorney.

Prices current, printed (prices of articles included therein may be filled in in writing).

Printed matter.

Printers' proofs.

Prints.

Prospectuses, printed.

Queen bees and live but harmless entomological specimens to certain places within the colony, under special regulations.

Receipts (see Accounts).

Recognizances.

Returns or periodical statements on Government Service, if so endorsed on the cover.

Samples (manufacturers' or trade mark and price may accompany them).

Scrip.

Seeds.

Specifications.

Stock sheets.

Valentines, printed.

Waybills.

Other articles similar to the above can also be forwarded as packets.

All packets containing jewellery, or articles of high value, must be registered, or they will be officially registered, and charged double registration fee on delivery.

None of the articles mentioned in above list will be forwarded as packets beyond the limits of the colony, if the law or postal regulations of the colony or country to which they may be addressed prohibit their reception into such colony or country as packets.

If any articles which can be sent by post only, if paid as letters, are posted, bear the packet rate of postage, they will be treated as insufficiently paid letters.

Officers of the Post-office may examine the contents of any packet, for the purposes of ascertaining whether they are in accordance with these regulations; but such officers must securely refasten any packet so opened.

Articles not allowed to be sent as packets:—

Articles of merchandise, or having a value of their own, addressed to New South Wales or Queensland.

Gold or silver, money, jewels, or precious articles, or anything liable to Customs duty, addressed to any country in the Universal Postal Union (such articles may, however, be forwarded to the United Kingdom, if paid letter rate and registered).

Bottles containing fluid, addressed to places beyond the colony.

Glass and perishable substances, such as fish, game, flesh, vegetables, or anything liable to injure the person of any officer of the Post-office, or the contents of a mail.

Photographs on glass, when not in strong cases.

WHEREAS by *The Discipline Act 1870* it was provided that the Governor in Council might make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government of persons engaged by virtue of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Act, and from time to time amend, alter, or amend the same and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order make the following additions and alterations to Part II, sections 2 and 10, of the Regulations for the Victorian Military Forces, that is to say:—

Titles, Badges, and Distinctions.

3rd Battalion, Ballarat.—Under headings "colour of uniform," "facings," and "pattern of lace," strike out "scarlet," "blue," "ditto," and insert in lieu thereof "green," "red," "black."

4th Battalion, Mount Alexander.—Under heading "pattern of lace," strike out "ditto," and insert in lieu thereof "gold, R.A. pattern."

PART II., SECTION X.—PAGE 23.

Badges of Rank.—Clause 2, add at end of clause, "The 3rd Battalion Victorian Rifles will wear shoulder-straps and badges, as in the Imperial Rifle Regiments."

Lace.—Add to end of clause, "The 3rd Battalion Victorian Rifles will wear black lace, as in the Imperial Rifle Regiments."

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS.

IN TENDING candidates must give notice of their intention in writing, and must forward to the Board documentary evidence that they have complied with the following preliminary conditions; and, upon their applications being approved by the Board, shall pay the prescribed fee of £4 4s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or any Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board.

All candidates presenting themselves for examination must be provided with a book of logarithms, a 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and all necessary appliances (except paper) for plan drawing.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

I. A candidate must have passed the matriculation examination at the University of Melbourne, including English, Geography, Arithmetic, Geometry, Algebra, and Physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and must have served with some recognized surveyor for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than four years some recognized surveyor, two years at least of such service to have been in the field; and must give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

III. Or he must have completed the first and second year's course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, and must have served in the field for two years with some recognized surveyor.

IV. Or he must have completed the third year in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, and have served one year in the field as above.

NOTE.—By service in the field is to be understood the survey and subdivision of land.

A candidate whose application shall have been approved as showing that he has complied with either of the above conditions will be eligible for examination.

Having passed some examination (equivalent in the opinion of the Board to that prescribed in Victoria) in Great Britain, the United States of America, India, or some British colony, and producing evidence of having successfully practised as a surveyor for not less than twelve months in some of the Australian colonies.

II. Or producing evidence satisfactory to the Board of the possession of sufficient professional qualifications and experience, and of having successfully practised as a surveyor for not less than twelve months in some of the Australian colonies.

COURSE IN THE PARISH OF WONNANGATTA.**

WE, William Bryce, John Connolly, Henry Harrison, Constantine Shiras Holme, and William Henry Morgan, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for a Racecourse in the parish of Wonnangatta, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
 2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein, without the permission, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.
 4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
 5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, without the permission, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
 6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management.
 7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.
 8. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
- Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

BOROUGH OF QUEENSLIFFE.

BYE-LAW No. 5.

For keeping free from noisome matter yards, stables, and places used for noxious trades, slaughter-yards, &c., and for regulating management of earth-closets, privies, &c., disinfecting and deodorizing nightsoil and other offensive matter, and for regulating its removal and final deposit.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Borough of Queenscliffe, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and every other power enabling the board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said local board, doth hereby make the following bye-law of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matter and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this bye-law coming into operation.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately on its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Borough of Queenscliffe.

4. The occupier of every house and premises within the said Borough of Queenscliffe shall cause the yard and grounds belonging thereto, or occupied in connexion therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the Local Board of Health may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

5. The occupier of any land in the said Borough of Queenscliffe, on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-shed, cattle-shed, or pigstye shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state, in respect of cleanliness, as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of same so produced or accumulated shall amount to cubic yard. And if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

6. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement within the said Borough of Queenscliffe shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time, as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of one foot from the top of the walls, sides, or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Five a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid, or some other efficient deodorizer, sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

7. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall, once at least in every week, empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of nightsoil on or belonging to such premises.

8. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of nightsoil, except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance, properly constructed, and furnished with a sufficient covering, so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof or of effluvia therefrom. In the said Borough of Queenscliffe a nightman, licensed by the municipal authorities, shall be employed by the occupier of the premises for such removal of nightsoil.

9. All nightsoil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and deposited in such place or places only as may be appointed by the local board from time to time for the final reception of the same.

10. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited or spread, or assisting in placing or depositing or placing on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any nightsoil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place, shall immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof cover the same, or cause to be covered, and shall keep the same covered with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness.

11. The occupier of any premises within the Borough of Queenscliffe used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause all rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be removed therefrom once in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia; and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

12. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered, so as to be water-tight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet.

13. No closet-door or trap shall abut or open upon a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding ten feet in width.

14. Any person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of these penalties, such portion being not less than Five shillings, to be paid. And any person committing such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such local board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

BYE-LAW No. 6, AS TO DAIRIES, DAIRY CATTLE, AND MILK.

THIS Local Board of Health in and for the Borough of Queenscliffe, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and every other power enabling the said local board in this behalf; and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said local board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 6 of the said local board, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Borough of Queenscliffe.

Registration of Cowkeepers, Dairymen, and Purveyors of Milk.

4. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of September in each year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the Secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of Ten shillings:—

5. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the Secretary for the Local Board of Health shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said local board or any person authorized, in writing, by the chairman or secretary of the said local board; and if on inspection such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them, are or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said local board may, by an order in writing signed by the secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or in the case of an unregistered person, served personally or left at his dwelling-house or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle, either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said local board may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated; and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept, and be kept perfectly clean, and shall within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances be fumigated, disinfected, or linewashed, as may be in any such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scoured and scalded daily.

10. If any person, or any member of the family of any person, registered as aforesaid, or not so registered but employed

as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the local board or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said local board or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, until danger, in the opinion of such local board or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until, in either case, all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the local board, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force; and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep, or permit or suffer to be kept, any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking-yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

13. In the interpretation of this bye-law words imputing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

14. Every person guilty of any breach of this bye-law, or of any of its provisions, shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings, for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

The foregoing bye-law was duly made, ordered, and passed by the Local Board of Health, being the Municipal Council in and for the Borough of Queenscliffe this seventh day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

SHIRE OF MARONG.—LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH. BYE-LAW No. 1.

For keeping free from noisome matter yards, stables, and places used for noxious trades, slaughter-yards, &c.; and for regulating management of earth-closets, privies, &c., disinfecting and deodorizing nightsoil and other offensive matter, and for regulating its removal and final deposit.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Marong, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and every other power enabling the said local board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said local board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being bye-law No. 1 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matter and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this bye-law coming into operation.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said shire.

4. The occupier of every house and premises within the said shire shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto or occupied in connexion therewith to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the local board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

5. The occupier of any land in the said shire on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, or pigsty shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state, in respect of cleanliness, as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard. And if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

6. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement within the said shire shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of one foot from the top of the sides, walls, or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of 11 p.m. and 5 a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

7. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall, once at least in every week, empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of nightsoil on or belonging to such premises.

8. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of nightsoil except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof or of effluvia therefrom.

9. All nightsoil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and deposited in such place or places only as may be appointed by the local board from time to time for the final reception of the same.

10. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed, or deposited, or spread, or assisting in placing, or depositing, or spreading, on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any nightsoil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place, shall, immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof, cover the same or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered, with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness.

11. The occupier of any premises within the shire used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be removed therefrom once in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia; and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

12. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered so as to be watertight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet.

13. No closet-door or trap shall abut or open upon a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding twenty feet in width.

14. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such portion not being less than Five shillings, to be paid. And any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such local board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Marong, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and every other power enabling the said Local Board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 2 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to, and have operation in, the whole of the Shire of Marong.

REGISTRATION OF COWKEEPERS, DAIRYMEN, AND PURVEYORS OF MILK.

4. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, shall, on or before the first day of September in every year, register himself with the Local Board

of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the Secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall, with every such application, pay a fee of Two shillings and sixpence.

Upon receipt of every such application and fee the Secretary for the Local Board of Health shall endorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said Local Board, or by any person authorized, in writing, by the chairman or secretary of the said Local Board; and if, on inspection, such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them, are, or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said Local Board may, by an order, in writing, signed by the secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or in the case of an unregistered person, served personally or left at his dwelling-place or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle, either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said Local Board may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept and be kept perfectly clean, and shall within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person or any member of the family of any person registered as aforesaid, or not so registered, but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge shall immediately give notice thereof to the Local Board or Officer of Health or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said Local Board or the Officer of Health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk until danger, in the opinion of such Local Board or Officer of Health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until in either case all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk, or of its contamination, has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the Local Board, Officer of Health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

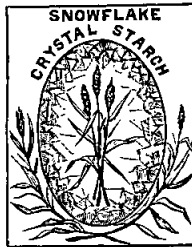
