PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the eighty-eighth section of *The Public Service Act 1883*, and in the fifth section of *The Bank Holidays Act 1873*, I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation appoint

TUESDAY THE 25TH DAY OF OCTOBER INSTANT to be observed as a Public and Bank Holiday within the Shire of Bairnsdale;

WEDNESDAY THE 26TH DAY OF OCTOBER INSTANT to be observed as a Public and Bank Holiday at Mornington, and within the West Riding of the Shire of Gordon;*

THURSDAY THE 10TH DAY OF NOVEMBER NEXT to be observed as a Public Holiday within the Shire of Benalla;

FRIDAY THE 11TH DAY OF NOVEMBER NEXT to be observed as a Public and Bank Holiday within the Shire of Creswick;

WEDNESDAY THE 16TH DAY OF NOVEMBER NEXT to be observed as a Public and Bank Holiday within the Shire of Goulburn,* and as a Bank Holiday at Woodend;

WEDNESDAY THE 23RD AND THURSDAY THE 24TH DAYS OF NOVEMBER NEXT to be observed as Public Half-Holidays and Bank Half-Holidays at Sandhurst, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon on each day;*

WEDNESDAY THE 30TH DAY OF NOVEMBER NEXT to be observed as a Public and Bank Holiday within the Borough of St. Arnaud.

BANK HOLIDAYS.—PROCLAMATION PARTLY
REVOKED.—SHIRE OF KYNETON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Bank Holidays Act 1873* it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor might from time to time, as he might think fit by Proclamation, appoint a special

day to be observed as a Bank Holiday either throughout Victoria or in any part thereof: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and seal of the colony, bearing date the seventeenth day of October One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and made in pursuance of the said Act, the Governor did proclaim certain days to be kept as Bank Holidays: And whereas it is expedient to revoke in part the said Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation bearing date the seventeenth day of October One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, so far only as the same relates to Wednesday the sixteenth and Thursday the seventeenth days of November next being observed as Bank Holidays within the Shire of Kyneton, and in lieu thereof do hereby appoint

WEDNESDAY THE 16TH AND THURSDAY THE 17TH DAYS OF NOVEMBER NEXT

to be observed as Bank Half-Holidays from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon on each day within the Shire of Kyneton.

"THE FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACT 1885."

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the 29th section of *The Factories and Shops Act 1885* (49 Vict. No. 862), and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of the said section 29 in the

WORKROOMS OF MR. C. BROWNE, RYRIE STREET, GEELONG, from the date hereof to the 31st December 1887, upon these express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said workrooms more than ten females being dressmakers, for

more than fifty-six hours in any one week in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.

2. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without her consent.

3. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such workrooms for the information of all concerned.

"THE FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACT 1885."

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the 29th section of *The Factories and Shops Act 1885* (49 Vict. No. 862), and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of the said section 29 in the

FACTORY OF MESSRS. SWALLOW AND ARIELL, PORT MELBOURNE, from the date hereof to the 31st December 1887 inclusive, upon these express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no female and no male under sixteen years of age shall be employed in the said factory for more than sixty-three hours in any one week in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.

2. That no female and no male under sixteen years of age shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without his or her consent.

3. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory for the information of all concerned.
