T is hereby notified that holders of electors' rights issued on or before the 1st December 1886 must obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names placed upon the General Lists to be made up on and after the 1st December

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from the new Lists to be made up as aforesaid.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the Registrar, but the renewed right will be equally available for any election that may take place before the completion of the new Rolls in January next.

Intending applicants for electors' rights are cautioned to carefully ascertain whether they are fully qualified under the law; inasmuch as a penalty on conviction is imposed upon persons knowingly and wilfully obtaining electors' rights when not qualified.

II S Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in exercise of the powers conferred by The Discipline Act 1870, doth hereby make the following addition to the Regulations for the Victorian Military Forces, that is to say:—

PART III.—REGULATIONS FOR THE PERMANENT FORCES.— SECTION I.

Page 29, Paragraph 2.—Under the heading Victorian Artillery, the following new paragraph to be inserted at the beginning of the paragraph:—

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby in exercise of the powers conferred by the above recited Act, and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, order as follows (that is to say):—No Inspector of Stock shall authorize the introduction into Victoria of any cattle in railway trucks unless they shall be accompanied by a certificate given by an Inspector of Stock of the colony from which it is proposed to introduce such cattle that he has inspected the said cattle immediately prior to trucking them, and pronounces them, to the best of his belief, free from the several diseases of cattle set out in the second schedule to the regulations of the nineteenth March 1880, under the Diseases in Stock Act of Victoria, and that he has seen them placed in the railway trucks.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred by The Victorian Railways Commissioners Act 1883, do hereby make the following Bye-law, and all previous Bye-laws conflicting therewith are hereby repealed:—

PASSENGER TRAINS.

Bye-law 42, Clause 2. Return Tickets for any distance will be available for 14 days, including Sundays, but exclusive of the days of issue and return.

TRAMWAY IN THE SHIRE OF FLINDERS AND KANGERONG.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the thirty-first day of October 1887.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor in Council.

WHEREAS by The Local Government Act Amendment Act 1883 it is provided that transways may be constructed in any municipal district (except the municipal districts of Fitzroy, Collingwood, Prahran, Richmond, South Melbourne, Hotham, St. Kilda, Brunswick, Kew, Hawthorn, and Sandridge) when authorized by an Order of the Governor in Council made in that behalf, upon the application of the council of the municipality in compliance with the provisions of the said Act and of the rules and regulations to be from time to time made by the Governor in Council. And whereas the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Flinders and Kangerong has made an application under the common seal of the said municipality, in accordance with the said Act and of the rules and regulations made by the Governor in Council authorizing the construction of a transway in the Municipal District of the Municipality of the said Shire of Flinders and Kangerong: And whereas the Governor in Council being satisfied that the requirements of the said Act and of the rules and regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder have been duly compiled with by the said council of the said municipality, and that notice of the intention of the said council to make the said application in which notice the routes proposed to be followed were described, and persons objecting to the same were called on to lodge their objections within the time required by the regulations has been duly published as required by the

rules and regulations made by the Governor in Council in pursuance of the said Act in that behalf; and that no objections to the said application have been lodged within the time provided in the said rules, and being satisfied also that it is expedient and proper that the said application should be granted, has determined to grant the same subject to the restrictions and conditions hereinafter contained. Now, therefore, His Excellency the Govenor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, doth, for the purpose aforesaid, make the Order following, that is to say:—That the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Flinders and Kangerong shall be, and is hereby authorized to construct a tranway in the Municipal District of the Shire of Flinders and Kangerong. a tran. Kangerong.

Routes.—That the routes of such tramway shall be as follows:—Commencing at or about the Sorrento Jetty; thence in a southwesterly direction through section 2 at Sorrento, in the parish of Nepean; thence across the Portsea road to a point opposite the Continental Hotel; thence south-westerly along the Back Beach road to the Ocean Park; thence to a point at or near the refreshment stall within the said park.

Gauge.—That the gauge of such tramway shall be three feet six inches (3° 6°), and that the said tramway shall be constructed in the manner set out and described in the working plans and specification numbered from one (1) to three (3) inclusive, now deposited in the Public Works Department, and which plans and specifications are endorsed with a memorandum of the Minister of Public Works, indentifying the said plans and specifications so deposited as the plans and specifications referred to in this Order, and which plans and specifications are to be deemed to be incorporated in this Order, and to be deemed as much part of the same as if they were set out in detail in this Order.

Motive power.—That the motive power to be used upon the said tramway shall be steam or horses.

Maximum speed.—That the maximum speed of the progression of the cars upon the said tramway shall be ten (10) miles in the

Time of completion.—That the said tramway shall be completed and open for traffic throughout its entire length within the period of fifteen (15) months from the date of this Order.

Passenger traffic only.—That such trainway shall be used for passenger traffic only.

Necessary precautions for sufety.—That every precaution necessary to secure the safety of the passengers upon the said tramway, and also to secure the safety of passengers passing along the streets or roads upon the routes of such tranway, shall be taken and ordered by the said council of the said municipality.

Stoppages.—That, for the convenience of the public, the cars shall stop for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers at the roads and streets, and at such other points upon the route as may be convenient, and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic on such roads or streets or the safety of the passengers on the cars.

Tolls and charges.—That the charges to be made for every passenger on the said tramway may be, but shall not exceed, the following, that is to say:—

From Sorrento Jetty to Ocean Park, or any lesser distance

For every adult passenger, Sixpence. For every child under twelve (12) years of age, Three-

And vice versá over said route.

Governor in Council to be sole judge of breach of Order.—That the Governor in Council shall be the sole judge of the compliance with or of the breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order; and for the purpose of enabling the Governor in Council to arrive at a just decision, an enquiry into the facts of each case shall be conducted in the manner provided in clause 26 of the Regulations contained in the Second Schedule to the said Act, before an officer to be appointed in that behalf by the Governor in Council, as provided in the Regulations in the said Schedule.

If upon the report to the Governor in Council by the referee made under the said clause 26 of the Regulations in the Second Schedule of the said Act, the Governor in Council shall, as such sole judge, determine that there has been any failure of or compliance with or that any breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order has occurred, by way either of commission or omission, then the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall cease and determine, or shall be suspended, as the Governor in Council shall direct; and in the case of the Governor in Council ordering a suspension only of such powers, then the Governor in Council shall, in his adjudication, state for what period such suspension shall take effect.

If in such adjudication the Governor in Council shall determine that the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall wholly cease and determine, then the Council of the said Municipality of the Shire of Flinders and Kangerong shall forthwith proceed to restore the streets or roads along which the said route is laid out to their condition previous to the construction of such tramway, unless the Governor in Council otherwise order.

And the Honorable John Nimmo, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The Commissioners of the Borough Echuca Water Trust in pursuance of the powers conferred by sections 44, 54, and 56 of The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881, No. 716, and also section 12 of The Victorian Water Conservation Acts 1881-1883, No. 829, do make the following regulation:—

Regulation No. 1.

Regulations for imposing, levying, and rec iving water rates and charges within the Borough Echuca Water Trust district.

That the following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements within the district of the Borough Echuca Water Trust for the year 1887, namely, a rate of Five pounds per centum per annum on the annual valuation of lands and tenements respectively, the same to be payable in advance on the first day of every calendar month: provided always that the amount of rates payable in respect of any lands or tenements shall not be less than the minimum fixed in that behalf by the Governor in Council.

Meters.

The rate or charge for water supplied by meter shall be Three shillings per thousand gallons (1,000).

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations made by the Moonoopna Waterworks Trust, in accordance with the provisions of The Victorian Water Conscription Acts (Nos. 778 and 829).

REGULATIONS.

REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by Order of His Excellency the Governor in Council bearing date the thirteenth day of August 1886, the Councillors of the Shire of Rodney for the time being, and one other person named in such Order in Council, to wit, Samuel A. Edmonds, were appointed under the provisions and within the meaning of the Acts of the Parliament of Victoria, numbered 716 and 778, to be the Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust for the Waterworks District within the said shire.

Now the said Commissioners do hereby, pursuant to and in the exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon them by The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883 and 1884, do order and make the Regulations following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by this Trust:—

- (1.) For every house or tenement under Ten pounds sterling annual value, the sum of One pound sterling per
 - annum.

 (2.) For every house or tenement of Ten pounds sterling annual value or over, an amount equal to Ten pounds per centum on the amount of the annual valuation.
- (1.) That water may be supplied by the Trust by measurement, at the rate of Three shillings per one thousand gallons (or at such prices as may be specially agreed upon).
- (2.) That the charge for supplying one thousand gallons or any less quantity, at the standpipe at the water tower, be at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence for one thousand gallons.
- (3.) That water may be sold by meter for irrigation purposes, at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per one thousand gallons; but water shall not be supplied in such cases except by special permission granted on application to the Trust.
- (4.) For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, One pound per annum on each inch diameter of the cylinder.
- (5.) That the Trust may cause a meter or meters to be affixed in any case where they may consider it necessary, and such meter or meters may be provided and affixed at the expense of the consumer, and the water supplied to be charged for at the aforesaid rate.

 (6.) That the before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the first day of January 1887, and ending on the thirty-first day of December 1887, and shall be payable quarterly, in advance, on demand, on the first day of January, first day of April, first day of July, and first day of

- October; and the Secretary to the Trust for the time being shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate.
- (7.) Any person or persons receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his or her premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or who shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds for every such offence.
- (8.) Any person who shall take or carry away water from any drinking-tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such offence.

 (9.) Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter or repair, uncover, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or fittings connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a license in that behalf to execute such work. Any unlicensed person uncovering, affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fittings as afore-said shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such offence. for every such offence.
- (10.) Before any license shall be granted by the Trust, the person applying for the same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber.

 (11.) Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall wilfully offend by opening any ground, so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Trust, without giving twenty-four hours' notice to the Trust in writing, of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without the persistion in writing being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, valve, pipework, or engine, the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

 (12) Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, without giving twenty-four hours notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, or who shall make such communicate with the pipes of the Trust, or who shall make such as the pipe to the directions of some officer of the Trust, or who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

 (13.) Iron piping of the following dimensions, namely:—
 Three-quarter inch diameter, or bore, galvanized, of approved
 quality, will only be allowed for external or internal services.
 Ordinary connections with submains must be made with
 proper ferrules, to which a length of not less than three feet
 of pipe must be attached. One service-pipe only to each
 tenement, &c., will be permitted. A service-pipe of greater
 diameter may be allowed by the express approval of the
 Trust on special application thereto.
- (14.) If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe, or otherwise as-the Trust may deem fit, until the necessary repairs have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupiers (if any), and if none, the owners, shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky, or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

 (15.) Any person supplied with water by the Trust who
- (15.) Any person supplied with water by the Trust, who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, hall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
- (16.) No meter shall be allowed to be affixed unless the dial of the same register two hundred thousand gallons, except by special permission of the Trust.
- except by special permission of the Trust.

 (17.) If any meter should cease registering, or be reported by the inspector as out of repair, or registering inaccurately, the Trust shall estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order, and until the same is repaired and re-fixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or the Trust may insert a check-meter on the service-pipe, such repairs may be executed by the Trust at the expense of the occupier or owner of such tenement; and all persons supplied with water by the Trust are required in the event of any breakage occurring in the pipes or meter, whereby any water may be wasted, to give notice to the Trust's officer within twelve hours of such occurrence; and, in the event of such notice not being given, such person or persons shall be liable for each such offence, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, or the supply may be discontinued by the Trust.

 (18.) Overflow-pipes to private baths or any other vessel
- (18.) Overflow-pipes to private baths or any other vessel will not be permitted.
- (19.) Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first fixing thereto a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

(20.) Any person or persons guilty of a breach of any of the regulations or conditions herein mentioned, shall be liable to have his or her supply of water discontinued, by a resolution carried at a meeting of said Trust.

(21.) All communications signed by the Secretary to be taken as issued by the Trust.

(22.) In the construction of this bye-law the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation whether aggregate or sole.

TRAGOWEL PLAINS IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulation, made by the Tragowel Plains Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, under the provisions of The Irrigation Act

REGULATION.

The Commissioners of the Tragowel Plains Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 95 of *The Irrigation Act 1836*, do make the following Regulation :-

No. 4.

That regulation No. 2 be, and the same is hereby repealed, and the following adopted in lieu thereof:—

- 1. All water supplied from the works of the Trust for the irrigation of land shall be paid for by measure. All measurements of water shall be by gauges of such form and pattern as may be adopted and fixed by the Trust. The registration of the quantities of water delivered shall be made by the Trust's officers.
- 2. All irrigation or other outlets required from any of the channels or works of the Trust shall be constructed by the Trust upon the application only of owners of the land to be supplied from such outlet or outlets, or of occupiers of the said land endorsed or appropried the such owners. approved by such owners.
- 3. All applications for the construction of irrigation outlets shall be dealt with by the duly appointed Committee of the Trust to manage and regulate the distribution of the available water, and known as the Water Committee, except when otherwise directed by the Trust.
- 4. Only one outlet shall be allowed to each owner or occupier of land up to three hundred and twenty acres, and one for every additional three hundred and twenty acres or fraction thereof, except in such cases where the Trust may order otherwise, or the full cost of construction of the said outlet is paid by the applicant.
- 5. Outlets may be fixed at any suitable spot most convenient to the applicant subject to the approval of the Engineer to the Trust.
- 6. All outlets, whether their cost of construction or only a portion thereof has been paid by the owner or occupier of the land to be supplied from such outlet, shall remain absolutely under the control of the Trust, and shall not be interfered with either by such owner or occupier or any other person in any way whatsoever, except with the express sanction of the Trust in writing and under the supervision of its engineer or other responsible officer.
- 7. The rate or price to be paid for water delivered from the works of the Trust for irrigation purposes shall be Sixpence per inch per acre for all land, including gardens, payment in all cases to be read in education.
- 8. All persons agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall take delivery thereof through their respective outlets at such times, in such order, and in such manner as the Committee or the Trust shall direct. No person shall be supplied with a less quantity of water than is equal to the value of Twelve shillings and sixpence. And the delivery of water may be continued on Sundays and holidays as well as on ordinary working days.

 9. Form water the control of the control o
- 9. Every person agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall receive notification of the dates and quantities in which it will be delivered to him.
- 10. The outlets for the delivery of water shall be opened only by the authorized officers of the Trust, and no person other than such officers shall, under any circumstances (unless by the express written sanction of the Trust), open any such outlet, or otherwise do any act that may permit of the escape of water from the channels or works of the Trust.
- 11. No person shall trespass along the works or upon the lands of the Trust to the hindrance of Trust servants, annoyance of adjacent landowners, damage to works or adjacent property or crops, and to stock depasturing on adjacent lands.
- 12. Any person who shall be guilty of an offence against this regulation shall be liable, for any such offence, to a penalty not exceeding the sum of Fifty pounds, which may be recovered in accordance with the provisions of section 247 of The Irrigation Act 1886.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION PURPOSES IN THE PARISH OF COBUNGRA.

PARISH OF COBUNGRA.

THE Council of the Shire of Onco, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the reserve for public recreation purposes in the parish of Cobungra, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the 133rd section of The Land Act 1884:—

Regulations.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from suurise to sunset, except on such days as the reserve may be set apart for shows, races, sports, fetes, and holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) may be charged and taken for the admission of every person to the reserve.

every person to the reserve.

2. The council shall be at liberty to allow any duly recognized committee of any shows, races, sports, fetes, or holiday amusements to use the reserve; and such committee shall abide by any order given by the council in reference to the reserve, or buildings, or other erections for the time being thereon.

3. No person shall remain in the reserve who shall offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

4. No person shall decease in any way the trees shapped.

4. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, or light fires therein.

5. No person shall climb upon or jump over the fences or gates, or stick bills, or cut names thereon, or in any way damage the trees, seats, or any building whatsoever, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

6. No person shall put in the reserve any horses or cattle, or take horses therein, without first obtaining the written permission of the council: Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent in writing of the council first obtained.

8. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantation of young trees or shrubs.

9. Any person committing in the reserve, or in any of the buildings or other erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offonces shall be liable to be removed from the reserve notwithstanding such person may have purchased and shall or may be in possession of a ticket of admission to the reserve:—

Assaulting any person.

Being drunk.

Crossing or trespassing on the cricket or playing ground during the time any cricket match or other amusement is taking place, or when crossing or trespassing on such

ground would injuriously affect it for the several purposes for which the same is set apart.

4. Using profane or obscene language.
5. Using abusive or insulting words.
6. Behaving improperly or riotously.
7. Obtaining admission to the reserve or any buildings thereon, when not entitled to such admission, or refusing to surrender, if required, to any gatekeeper or other authorized person any ticket duly authorizing admission to the reserve.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with the 133rd section of The Land Act 1884, on conviction before any justice forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence. And every person who knowingly and wilfully dfends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

SHIRE OF MARONG.

REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE GLEN GRANT AND TARNAGULLA UNITED FARMERS' COMMON WITHIN THE SHIRE OF MARONG.

In pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the 17th March 1885, the Council of the Shire of Marong, as Managers of the Common hereafter named, having drafted the following regulations for management of the Glen Grant and Tarnagulla United Farmers' Common within the said shire, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council, in

lieu of the regulations heretofore in force in respect of such

Regulations

- 1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers residing within five (5) miles of the common may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole, or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one (1) head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on the common one (1) additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten (10) acres of such land cultivated by him.
- 2. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July in every year:

 For every head of horned cattle
 For every head of other large cattle
 For every head of small cattle
 Is 4d. per annum.

- 3. No person shall depasture on the common stock of which he is not the bond fide owner.
- 4. No bull or entire horse above the age of twelve (12) months shall be allowed to depasture on the common without the special permission, in writing, of the managers.
- 5. Sheep shall be depastured on such portion only of the common as the managers may set apart for the purpose.
- 6. All pigs found on the common shall be liable to be impounded.
- 7. All registered stock shall be mustered by the owners thereof on such days and at such places as the managers shall appoint, for the purpose of branding such stock with the common brand,
- 8. Stock shall be registered at any time on payment of the full fee for the current half-year; but, if not mustered for branding on the days duly appointed for the purpose, the owners of such stock shall pay the herdsman at the rate of Ten shillings (10s.) per diem for his extra attendance.
- 9. Persons legally depasturing stock on the common shall, on removal of any of them therefrom during the period for which payment has been made, be at liberty to substitute a like number of other stock; but the common brand on the removed stock shall be defaced, and the substituted stock shall be branded by the herdsman with the common brand.
- 10. No animal affected with any contagious disease shall be allowed to depasture on the common; and should any stock thereon become so affected they shall be removed therefrom by the owner within twelve (12) hours after notice thereof, in writing, from the managers or herdsman, and in default of removal within the time specified, such stock shall be removed at the owner's expense.
- 11. No person shall wilfully disturb any of the stock legally depasturing on the common.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regula-tions shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for each offence.






