## "FISHERIES ACT AMENDMENT ACT 1878."

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Fisheries Act Amendment Act 1878* it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might from time to time, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, fix the times and places or the manner at and in which any trammel, trawl, or other net or engine, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing should be used: And whereas it is expedient to prohibit the use of any trammel, trawl, or other net or engine, whether fixed or unfixed, in fishing over the ground described below: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby prohibit the use of any trammel, trawl, or other net or engine, whether fixed or unfixed, within the following limits, viz:—

One-quarter of a mile on each side of the St. Kilda Pier, and one-half mile to seaward.

(Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-fifth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and in the fiftieth year of Her Majesty's reign.

WHEREAS by *The Discipline Act 1870* it is provided that the Governor in Council may make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government of persons engaged by virtue of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise for carrying out the said Act, and from time to time annul, alter, or amend the same or substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following addition to the Regulations for the Victorian Naval Forces, that is to say:—

#### CONDITIONS OF LICENSE.

1. The term shall be one (1) year commencing at the expiry of one (1) calendar month from the date of sale, and shall be renewable for a term not exceeding seven (7) years.
2. The rent shall be payable quarterly in advance.
3. The license shall be produced by the licensee upon the request of any bailiff of Crown lands or police constable.
4. When the holder of the license does any act which if it were done without license would be punishable as trespass, if he fail to produce his license when asked so to do by any bailiff of Crown lands or any police constable, he shall be conclusively deemed to be a person not licensed or otherwise authorized to do such act within the meaning of the 110th section of *Land Act 1884*.
5. The non-compliance with, or the non-performance of, any of the obligations specified in the license shall render the license null and void, and the Minister may thereupon cause the land to be re-entered upon in respect to which the license has been granted, and deal therewith as unoccupied Crown land.
6. If during the period for which the license is issued the Governor shall deem the resumption of the whole or any part of the land described in the license necessary for public purposes, the Governor shall have power to resume possession of the land, or of part thereof, without giving compensation to the licensee for so doing, after the licensee shall have been served with a notice under the seal of the Board of Land and Works of the intention to resume possession of the land, or of part thereof, three months after date of such notice.
7. In all proceedings for any alleged breach of the conditions of the license, or of the regulations under which it is issued, the burden of proof of compliance therewith shall rest with the licensee.
8. No compensation or valuation for improvements will be allowed at the expiration or during the term of license.
9. The license will be voidable if the licensee fail at any time to use the land *bond fide* for the purposes for which it has been licensed, but the licensee may use the site for any of the purposes before-mentioned.
10. The licensee shall not assign or sub-let the allotment, or any portion thereof, without the consent of the Governor in Council.
11. If the site is used as an inn, fermented or spirituous liquors can only be sold thereat under the usual publican's license, authorized by the Licensing Bench of Magistrates.

- Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

5. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, or stick bills thereon, or in any way damage any of the buildings, gates, fences, or other property in the reserve, nor leave, throw, or roll stones therein, nor pollute any of the waterholes, nor remove any soil, sand, or manure from the reserve.
6. No person shall erect within the reserve any dwelling, booth, or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
7. No person shall put or bring into the reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, dogs, or other animals, or poultry, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management; provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
8. No persons, except laborers or workmen employed by the Committee of Management, shall enter any plots in the reserve which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
9. Any person being drunk or disorderly, or assaulting any other person, shall be liable to removal from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased a ticket of admission.
10. The maximum scale of charges for admission to the reserve on days set apart for fêtes or sports shall be as follows:—

## REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS.

INTENDING candidates must give notice of their intention in writing, and must forward to the Board documentary evidence that they have complied with the following preliminary conditions; and, upon their applications being approved by the Board,

shall pay the prescribed fee of £4 4s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or any Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board.

All candidates presenting themselves for examination must be provided with a book of logarithms, a 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and all necessary appliances (except paper) for plan drawing.

## PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

I. A candidate must have passed the matriculation examination at the University of Melbourne, including English, Geography, Arithmetic, Geometry, Algebra, and Physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and must have served with some recognized surveyor for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than four years some recognized surveyor, two years at least of such service to have been in the field; and must give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

III. Or he must have completed the first and second year's course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, and must have served in the field for two years with some recognized surveyor.

IV. Or he must have completed the third year in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, and have served one year in the field as above.

NOTE.—By service in the field is to be understood the survey and subdivision of land.

A candidate whose application shall have been approved as showing that he has complied with either of the above conditions will be eligible for examination.

Having passed some examination (equivalent in the opinion of the Board to that prescribed in Victoria) in Great Britain, the United States of America, India, or some British colony, and producing evidence of having successfully practised as a surveyor for not less than twelve months in some of the Australian colonies.

II. Or producing evidence satisfactory to the Board of the possession of sufficient professional qualifications and experience, and of having successfully practised as a surveyor for not less than twelve months in some of the Australian colonies.

## RULES AND REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the 8th section of *The Cemeteries Statute 1864*, whereby it is enacted that the trustees of any such cemetery shall have power and authority to make such rules and regulations and to do and perform and cause to be done and performed all such acts, matters, and things as may be necessary and proper for any of the purposes aforesaid, and for directing the positions of all graves and vaults to be made in the said cemetery, the depths of the graves and construction of coffins to be admitted into vaults, and the covering of vaults so as to prevent the escape of any noxious exhalation or evaporation in the said cemetery, and for protecting the buildings and monuments, shrubberies, plantations, and enclosures therein and thereof from destruction or damage. The trustees of the above-named cemetery make and promulgate the following rules and regulations:—

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.

2. By the 19th section of the statute, any person making a vault, or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery by and with the permission of the trustees under these rules, and upon payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons and his or their representatives for ever.

3. Application for such permission to be made at the office of the secretary. A certificate of permission, in the form set out in the schedule, will be granted to the party applying for such permission on payment of the proper charges.

4. Orders for interment to be given to the secretary of the cemetery; only such order to be given between the hours of 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. the previous day.

5. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug; parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the surveyor; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent in writing of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.

6. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased must be stated at the time of giving the order.

7. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

8. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. in the other four months, except on Sundays, when the only hours for funerals will be from 2 to 5 o'clock throughout the year.

9. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

10. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.

11. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet, proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who are required by the 7th section of the Act to determine and fix the position of any unobjectionable monument according to description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets copper clamps must be used.

12. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

13. The ground will be open daily from sunrise to sunset.

14. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office, and may be inspected, and registers of all parties are kept by the secretary.

15. The secretary or keeper has orders to turn out or take into custody, as the case may require, any person who shall behave indecorously, or commit any trespass, injury to trees, flowers, or erections, or otherwise infringe the said statute or the regulations

for protection of the cemetery, and such person will be proceeded against according to the provisions of the said statute.

16. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.

## TENDERS FOR IRRIGATION SETTLEMENT IN THE MALLEE.

**T**ENDERS will be received by the Minister of Water Supply up to Noon of Thursday, 3rd March 1887, from persons prepared to accept and perform the agreement made between the Honorable Alfred Deakin, Chief Secretary and Commissioner of Water Supply in the Colony of Victoria, for and on behalf of Her Majesty's Government of Victoria of the one part, and George Chaffey and William Benjamin Chaffey, of Toronto, in Canada, of the other part, and which has been laid before both Houses of Parliament, under the provisions of Section 7 of the *Act to encourage private enterprise in the construction of works for the Supply of Water for Irrigation and other purposes*, which states that "any person or persons may within two months from the date of the advertising for tenders tender to accept and perform the said agreement, and shall deposit with their tender such sum of money as they may be willing to pay into the Consolidated Revenue by way of premium under this agreement, and that tender shall be accepted upon which the highest amount of premium shall be tendered and paid, whether such tender be made by the said George and William Benjamin Chaffey or by any other person or persons."

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at any station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

#### CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise directed by the police; the straw to be wheat or oat, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (Victorian grown) and bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oat hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oat or wheat hay.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. 3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Botanic and Domain Gardens may be called upon to supply any other Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, and for which no contracts have been taken, at the same rates.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be endorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of the delay in delivering or replacing it when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

12. 


