## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir Henry Brougham Loch, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Fisheries Act Amendment Act 1878 it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might from time to time, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, fix the times and places or the manner at and in which any tranmel, trawl, or other net or engine, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing should be used: And whereas it is expedient to prohibit the use of any trammel, trawl, or other net or engine, whether fixed or unfixed, in fishing over the ground described below: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby prohibit the use of any trammel, trawl, or other net or engine, whether fixed or unfixed, within the following limits, viz.:—

One-quarter of a mile on each side of the St. Kilda Pier, and one-half mile to seaward.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-fifth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and in the fiftieth year of Her Majesty's reign. (L.S.)

INTENDING candidates must give notice of their intention in writing, and must forward to the Board documentary evidence that they have complied with the following preliminary conditions; and, upon their applications being approved by the Board,

shall pay the prescribed fee of £4 4s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or any Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board.

All candidates presenting themselves for examination must be provided with a book of logarithms, a 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and all necessary appliances (except paper) for plan drawing.

#### PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

I. A candidate must have passed the matriculation examination at the University of Melbourne, including English, Geography, Arithmetic, Geometry, Algebra, and Physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and must have served with some recognized surveyor for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than four years some recognized surveyor, two years at least of such service to have been in the field; and must give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

III. Or he must have completed the first and second year's course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, and must have served in the field for two years with some recognized surveyor.

IV. Or he must have completed the third year in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, and have served one year in the field as above.

Note.—By service in the field is to be understood the survey and subdivision of land.

A candidate whose application shall have been approved as showing that he has complied with either of the above conditions will be eligible for examination.

## RULES AND REGULATIONS.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

In pursuance of the 8th section of The Cometerics Statute 1864, whereby it is enacted that the trustees of any such cemetery shall have power and authority to make such rules and regulations and to do and performed all such acts, matters, and things as may be necessary and proper for any of the purposes aforesaid, and for directing the positions of all graves and vaults to be made in the said cemetery, the depths of the graves and construction of coffins to be admitted into vaults, and the covering of vaults so as to prevent the escape of any noxious exhalation or evaporation in the said cemetery, and for protecting the buildings and monuments, shrubberies, plantations, and enclosures therein and thereof from destruction or damage. The trustees of the above-named cemetery make and promulgate the following rules and regulations:—

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before

- 1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.
- the ground or vault is opened.

  2. By the 19th section of the statute, any person making a vault, or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery by and with the permission of the trustees under these rules, and upon payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons and his or their representatives for ever.
- 3. Application for such permission to be made at the office of the secretary. A certificate of permission, in the form set out in the schedule, will be granted to the party applying for such permission on payment of the proper charges.
- 4. Orders for interment to be given to the secretary of the cemetery; only such order to be given between the hours of 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. the previous day.

- 5. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug; parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the surveyor; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent in writing of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.
- 6. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased must be stated at the time of giving the
- 7. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.
- 8. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. in the other four months, except on Sundays, when the only hours for funerals will be from 2 to 5 o'clock throughout the year.
- 9. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

  10. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.
- 11. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet, proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who are required by the 7th section of the Act to determine and fix the position of any unobjectionable monument according to description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets copper clamps must be used.
- 12. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.
- 13. The ground will be open daily from sunrise to sunset.
- 14. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office, and may be inspected, and registers of all parties are kept by the secretary.
- 15. The secretary or keeper has orders to turn out or take into custody, as the case may require, any person who shall behave indecorously, or commit any trespass, injury to trees, flowers, or erections, or otherwise infringe the said statute or the regulations

for protection of the cemetery, and such person will be proceeded against according to the provisions of the said statute. 16. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations. THOMAS WATSON,
