CONVENTION FOR PROLONGING THE TREATY OF FRIENDSHIP, COMMERCE, AND NAVIGATION BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND THE REPUBLIC OF SALVADOR.

THE following despatch from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies to His Excellency the Governor, and its enclosure, are published for general information.

SIR,—I have the honor to transmit to you, for publication in the Colony under your Government, a copy of a Convention between Great Britain and the Republic of Salvador, signed on the 23rd of June 1886, for prolonging the Treaty of Friendship, Commerce, and Navigation of the 24th of October 1862.

The Ratifications of the Convention were exchanged on the 8th of July last.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND THE REPUBLIC OF SALVADOR FOR PROLONGING THE TREATY OF FRIENDSHIP, COMMERCE, AND NAVIGATION, OF THE 24TH OCTOBER 1862, BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND SALVADOR.

Signed at San Salvador, June 23, 1886.

[Ratifications exchanged, July 8, 1887.]

WHEREAS in Article XXI. of the Treaty of Friendship, Commerce, and Navigation between Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and the Republic of Salvador, signed on the 24th October 1862, it is stipulated as follows:—

"The present Treaty shall remain in force for the term of twenty years from the date of exchange of ratifications, and if neither Party shall notify to the other its intention of terminating the same twelve months before the expiration of the twenty years stipulated above, the said Treaty shall continue binding on both Parties beyond the said twenty years until twelve months from the time that one of the Parties may notify to the other its intention of terminating it."

And whereas the aforesaid High Contracting Parties are mutually desirous of prolonging the duration of the said Treaty for a further term of years, the Undersigned, duly authorized by their respective Governments, have agreed as follows:—

1. The Treaty of Friendship, Commerce, and Navigation between Her Majesty the Queen of Great Britain and Ireland and the Republic of Salvador, signed at Guatemala on the 24th day of October 1862, shall remain in force for a period of twenty years from the date of the exchange of the ratifications of the present Agreement.

On the expiration of the said period of twenty years either Party may give twelve months' notice of their desire to terminate the said Treaty, and the Treaty shall then terminate accordingly, but otherwise the Treaty shall remain in force until terminated by notice as aforesaid.

2. It is, nevertheless, agreed that any or all of the following Colonies and foreign possessions of Her Britannic Majesty, that is to say:—

Por cuanto en el Artículo XXI. del Tratado de Amistad, Comercio y Navegación, celebrado entre la República del Salvador y el Reino Unido de la Gran Bretaña é Irlanda, firmado el 24 de Octubre de 1862, se estipula siguiente:—

"El presente Tratado permanecerá en vigor por el término de veinte años desde el día del canje de las ratificaciones, y si ni una ni otra Parte notificare á la otra su intención de terminar la doce meses antes de la espiración de los veinte años estipulados arriba, dicho Tratado continuará obligatorio para ambas Partes más allá de los dichos veinte años hasta doce meses después del día en que una de las Partes notifique á la otra su intención de terminarle."

I por cuanto dichas Altas Partes Contratantes están mutuamente deseadas de prolongar la duración de dicho Tratado, los Infrascritos, debidamente autorizados por sus respectivos Gobiernos, han convenido en lo siguiente:—

1. El Tratado de Amistad, Comercio y Navegación celebrado entre la República del Salvador y Su Magestad la Reina de la Gran Bretaña é Irlanda, firmado en Guatemala el 24 de Octubre de 1862, permanecerá en vigor por un periodo de veinte años contados desde el día del canje de las ratificaciones del presente Convenio.

A la espiración de dicho periodo de veinte años, una ó otra Parte puede anunciar con doce meses de anticipación su deseo de terminar dicho Tratado y terminará éste en consecuencia; pero de lo contrario el Tratado permanecerá en vigor hasta que termine por medio de la notificación antes expresada.

2. Es convenido, sin embargo, que todas ó cualquiera de las siguientes Colonias y posesiones extranjeras de Su Magestad Británica, á saber:—

India,
Canadá,
Terranova,
El Cabo de Buena Esperanza,
Nueva Gales del Sur,
Nueva Zelandia,
Queensland,
Australia del Sur,

Australia Occidental,

may at any time within the period of two years from the date of the exchange of the ratifications of the present agreement give notice, through Her Majesty's Representative accredited to the Republic of Salvador, of their desire to be excepted from the operation of the Treaty aforesaid, and the said Treaty shall not thenceforward apply to any of the said Colonies or foreign possessions of Her Britannic Majesty which shall have given such notice. But except as above provided, the said Treaty shall apply to all the Colonies and foreign possessions of Her Britannic Majesty until the Treaty be terminated by notice given in pursuance of the terms of Article I. of the present Agreement.

3. The present Agreement shall be ratified, and the ratifications exchanged at Guatemala or San Salvador as soon as possible.

In witness whereof the undersigned have signed the present Agreement, and have affixed thereto their seals.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony bearing date the fourth day of October One thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, and issued in pursuance of *The Public Health Statute 1885*, it was notified that the island of Sumatra, a portion of the colony known as Netherlands-India, was infected with Small-pox, and that it was probable that such disease might be brought from the said island to Victoria: And whereas the circumstances which led to the issue of such Proclamation have ceased to exist: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this fourteenth day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and in the fifty-first year of Her Majesty's reign.

REGULATIONS.—INSURANCE.

WE, the undersigned, being the members constituting the Public Service Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in us, do make and declare the following alterations and amendments of the regulations made by us, and approved by His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, on the 30th day of January 1885; and declare that the same shall commence and come into operation as soon as approved by the Governor in Council.

Clauses 1 and 2 are hereby repealed, and the following are substituted therefor:—

Clause 1. Every person entering the public service of Victoria, or reinstated therein, under the provisions of section 80 of the Act, shall, as a condition precedent to the confirmation of his appointment, lodge in the office of the Board a policy or policies on his life effected with some life assurance company carrying on business in Victoria. Such policy or policies shall provide for the payment to the person assured on his attaining the age of sixty years, or to his personal representatives within three (3) months after his death, if the person assured should die under the age of sixty years, of a sum or sums of money at least equal in the aggregate to the amount of the maximum annual salary as set forth in the Act No. 773, or any regulations framed thereunder, for the class or grade in the public service to which the person assured has been appointed, provided that in lieu of the payment of the sum or sums of money on his attaining the age of sixty years such policy or policies may provide for an annuity or annuities payable to the person assured quarterly during the remainder of his life after he attains the age of sixty years, but

the annual amount of such annuity or annuities must be in the aggregate at least equal to one-tenth of the maximum annual salary as set forth in the Act No. 773, or any regulations framed thereunder for the class or grade in the public service to which the person assured has been appointed.

Clause 2. Upon the promotion of any officer to a higher class or grade in the public service (except in the case of an officer who entered the public service before the passing of the Act 45 Victoria No. 710) such officer shall, as a condition precedent to the confirmation of his promotion, and before he enters upon the enjoyment of the salary of such higher class or grade, lodge with the Board a policy or policies on his life effected with some life assurance company carrying on business in Victoria. Such policy or policies shall provide for the payment to the person assured, on his attaining the age of sixty years, or to his personal representatives within three (3) months after his death, if the person assured should die under the age of sixty years, of a sum or sums of money at least equal in the aggregate (including the sums payable under policies on the same life, if any, previously lodged in the office of the Board) to the amount of the maximum annual salary as set forth in the Act No. 773, or any regulations framed thereunder, for the class or grade in the Public Service to which the person assured has been promoted, provided that, in lieu of the payment of the sum or sums of money on his attaining the age of sixty years, such policy or policies may provide for an annuity or annuities payable to the person assured quarterly during the remainder of his life after he attains the age of sixty years, but the annual amount of such annuity or annuities must be at least equal in the aggregate (including the annuity or annuities payable under policies on the same life, if any, previously lodged in the office of the Board) to one-tenth of the maximum annual salary, as set forth in the Act No. 773, or any regulations framed thereunder, for the class or grade to which the person assured has been promoted. Provided always that, if the officer promoted shall have at any time previous to his promotion lodged with the Board a policy or policies on his life the amount of which is, in the opinion of the Board, sufficient to comply with these Regulations, it shall not be necessary for such officer to lodge with the Board any further policy on his life.

The following new clause is added:—

8. From and after the passing of these regulations any officer who had lodged in the office of the Board a policy of insurance on his life, in accordance with the regulations previously in force, may agree with the company which issued such policy to reduce the sum assured under the same to an amount at least equal to the maximum annual salary of the class or grade in which such officer is classified, and such policy may be endorsed with a condition setting forth the terms of the agreement entered into between the company and the officer upon whose life such policy was issued.

REGULATIONS UNDER THE "LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1874."

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fourteenth day of November 1887.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor in Council.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506) the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the subjoined Regulations for the issue of licenses for Unlocked Swing-gates under section 399 of the Act aforesaid, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS.

1. Any owner, lessee, licensee of land from the Crown, or pastoral tenant of the Crown desiring the temporary erection upon any road, street, or highway of unlocked swing-gates shall make application to the council of the municipality in which such road, street, or highway is situated.
2. If the council of a municipality approve of the temporary erection upon any road, street, or highway of unlocked swing-gates it shall make application to the Honorable the Minister of Lands, in the form prescribed in Schedule A hereto, for the issue of a license for the erection of such unlocked swing-gates.
3. Notice of each application for the issue of a license for placing upon any road, street, or highway unlocked swing-gates shall be published in the *Government Gazette* and in a newspaper circulating in the district, once in each week for four (4) consecutive weeks prior to the application being made to the Minister of Lands, and such notice shall state the reasons for making such application, the situation of the road, street, or highway, and the period for which it is proposed to maintain the gate.
4. Each application for the issue of a license for unlocked swing-gates shall be referred to a Local Land Board for consideration and report.
5. Each license for an unlocked swing-gate shall be in the form and subject to the conditions prescribed in Schedule B hereto, and shall be for a period of not more than one (1) year, and each such period shall expire on the 31st day of December in each year: Provided that the license may be renewed from year to year without further notice or application for the period specified in the first notice of application and in the approval thereof if such approval shall not have been revoked or varied.
6. The Governor in Council may from time to time, and at any time, revoke any license for the erection of unlocked swing-gates upon a road, street, or highway, and immediately upon the publication in the *Government Gazette* of a notice of such revocation the licensee shall remove every gate specified in such notice.
7. The fees payable annually upon a license for unlocked swing-gates shall be calculated at the rate of Five pounds per centum (5%) upon the capital value of the total area of road or roads enclosed by the gates specified in such license. The fee for the preparation of a license shall be Five shillings (5s.).

1. That this license may at any time be revoked by the Governor of the Colony of Victoria for the time being, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and the licensee shall not be entitled to any money or compensation for or in respect of such revocation. And the licensee shall, immediately upon the publication in the *Government Gazette* of a notice of the revocation of this license, remove every gate erected under the authority hereof.
2. That the licensee will, at his own expense, during the currency of this license well and distinctly paint the said gates, and keep them so painted with red paint.
3. That the licensee will, at his own expense, during the currency of this license keep the said gates and approaches thereto in good order, condition, and repair, and maintain the same.
4. That the licensee will, at his own expense, during the currency of this license firmly erect, place, or fix at or on the said gates, in a conspicuous position, a good and substantial notice board, on which shall be well and distinctly painted a notice setting forth that the gates are erected on a public road leading to and from the places to and from which the road does lead, and giving the names of such places, and indicating the directions and stating the approximate distances each way to the next gates (if any).

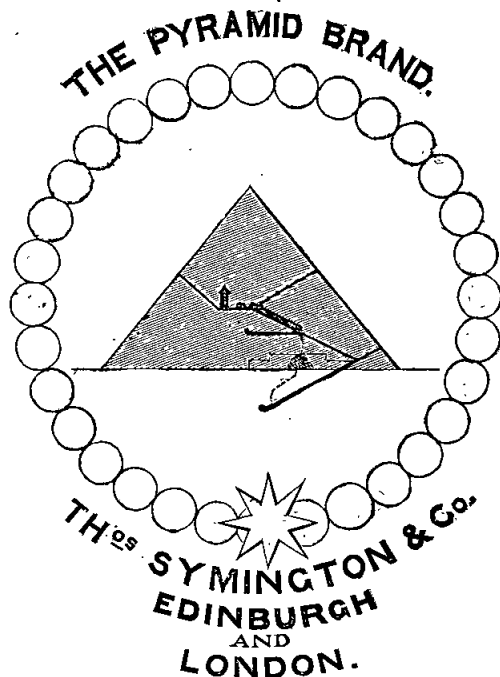

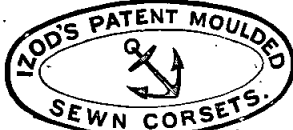
