WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition purporting to be signed by more than one-fourth of the ratepayers whose names are for the time being inscribed on the municipal roll of the City of Prahran has been presented to the Governor in Council, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the said Act, and no counter petition has been received: Now, therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned doth by this present Order subdivide the City of Prahran into four separate Wards, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follow, that is to say:—

**TOORAK WARD.**—Commencing at a point at the junction of the River Yarra and Hoddle street; thence easterly by River Yarra to Kooyong road; thence south to Malvern road; thence west to Orrong road; thence north to Toorak road; thence west to Hoddle street; and thence north to starting point.

**SOUTH YARRA WARD.**—Commencing at a point at the junction of Toorak road and Hoddle street; thence east by Toorak road to Orrong road; thence south by Orrong road to Malvern road; thence west by Malvern road and Commercial road to Hoddle street; and thence north by Hoddle street to starting point.

**PRAHRAN WARD.**—Commencing at a point at the junction of Commercial road and Hoddle street; thence east by Commercial and Malvern roads to Kooyong road; thence south by Kooyong road to High street; thence west by High street to Hoddle street; and thence north by Hoddle street to starting point.

**WINDSOR WARD.**—Commencing at a point at the junction of Hoddle and High streets; thence east by High street to Kooyong road; thence south by Kooyong road to Dandenong road; thence west by Dandenong road and Wellington street to Hoddle street; and thence north by Hoddle street to starting point.

Wherever the line so described as aforesaid runs beside or along any river, creek, or road, whether such is specifically mentioned or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road shall be taken to be the boundary line.

And His Excellency the Governor, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby further order that a Council consisting of twelve members be elected accordingly.

And the Honorable John Nimmo, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

**SWANHILL SHIRE WATERWORKS TRUST.—EXTENT OF WATERWORKS DISTRICT FURTHER DIMINISHED.**

WHEREAS by section 90 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883*, No. 778, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, after any Trust has by Order in Council been duly constituted, make additional Orders relating to such Waterworks or Irrigation Trust not inconsistent with the provisions of the now in part recited Act, and that the Governor in Council may in such additional Orders in Council (among other things) increase or diminish the extent of the waterworks district of such Waterworks Trust. And whereas by section 19 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1884*, No. 829, it is enacted that when the waterworks district of any Waterworks Trust has been or is about to be increased or diminished, the Governor in Council may make such Order as appears just for (among other things) determining what persons shall cease or continue to be commissioners of the Waterworks Trust thereof, and for how long the same shall so continue, and for determining all other matters or things which it appears desirable or proper so to determine. And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the third day of July 1882, a certain Waterworks Trust known as the Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust was duly constituted, having authority as such Waterworks Trust within certain lands, the limits whereof were in and by the said Order in Council, bearing date as aforesaid, duly proclaimed and defined. And whereas by certain additional Orders in Council, bearing date respectively the seventh day of June 1886, the twenty-first day of June 1886, the twenty-eighth day of June 1886, and the second day of August 1886, the extent of the waterworks district of the Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust (as proclaimed limited and defined by the said Order in Council, bearing date the third day of July 1882) was diminished by the excision therefrom of certain lands in and by such additional Orders in Council specified.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the now in part recited Acts, doth order as follows, that is to say:—

1. That the extent of the waterworks district of the said Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust shall be further diminished by the excision therefrom of the irrigation and water supply district of the Benjeroop and Murrabit Irrigation and Water Supply Trust (such said irrigation and water supply district being limited and defined by an Order in Council bearing date the eighteenth day of July 1887, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-second day of July 1887, page 2166) heretofore included within the said waterworks district.

2. That notwithstanding the excision from the said waterworks district of the said irrigation and water supply district of the said Benjeroop and Murrabit Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, the said Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust shall continue to consist of the municipal council of the shire of Swan Hill for the time being and John William Stranger.

**PUBLIC HEALTH.—SHIRE OF AVOCA.**

**BYE-LAW No. 2.**

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Avoca, in the Colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in *The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883*, and every other power enabling the said Local Board in this behalf, doth hereby make the following Bye-law No. 2 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered, so as to be water-tight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet, and provided with a closely-fitted cover, of pattern to be approved by the inspector of nuisances.

2. No closet-door or trap shall abut or open on a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding ten feet in width.

3. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of one foot from the top of the sides, walls, or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Five a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid, sulphate of iron, chloride of lime, or some other efficient deodorizer, sufficient in quality and quantity, to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

4. All night-soil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and finally placed in such place or places only

as may be appointed by the Local Board from time to time for the final reception of the same. And every person removing any night-soil as hereinbefore mentioned, or in By-law No. 1 of the said Local Board, shall at the said place as appointed by the said Local Board deposit the same in a trench dug to a depth of not less than two feet, and shall immediately cover the said night-soil with at least one foot of clean earth, and shall keep the same so covered.

5. Any householder may, on payment to the contractor for the removal of night-soil of the charges agreed upon between the Local Board and the said contractor, have his or her earth-closet cleansed by the said contractor once every week, or oftener if necessary.

6. *Extent of Application of By-law.*—This by-law shall apply to and have operation only in that portion of the shire of Avoca contained within the following boundaries, and immediately on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health and publication in the *Government Gazette*, have application in conjunction with the provisions of By-law No. 1, that is to say: Commencing at the north-west angle of allotment 3, section 1A, parish of Avoca; thence north by a chain-and-a-half road to the north-west angle of allotment 1, township of Avoca; thence easterly by a chain-and-a-half road to the Avoca River; thence north-westerly by the said river to the north-west angle of allotment 5, parish of Avoca; thence north-easterly by a one-chain road to the north-eastern angle of allotment 5, parish of Avoca; thence south-easterly to the north-west angle of allotment 6F, section A; thence north-easterly by a line bearing 64° 40' to the parish boundary of Avoca; thence southerly by the said boundary to the north-east angle of allotment A, section 1A, parish of Avoca; thence westerly by a one-chain road to the starting point.

7. *Penalties.*—Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties—such portion not being less than Five shillings—to be paid. And any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such Local Board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

The foregoing by-law was adopted at a meeting of the Local Board of Health for the Shire of Avoca, held at the Council Chambers, Moonambel, on the fifth day of October 1887.

**AVOCA RACECOURSE AND RECREATION RESERVE.—REGULATIONS.**

W. E. John F. Paten, John McMahon, Edwin Glover, Archibald P. Campbell, and George Downton, the duly appointed trustees of the Avoca Racecourse and Recreation Reserve, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*—

*Regulations.*

1. The reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for races, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Five shillings (5s.) may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the reserve.
  2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
  3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein without the permission, in writing, of the trustees first obtained.
  4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or damage in any way the fences, seats, buildings, or trees, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
  5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, sheep, or horses, without the permission of the trustees first obtained.
  6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the trustees.
  7. No person shall erect any booth, tent, or other structure in the reserve, without the written authority of the trustees.
  8. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve by the trustees, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of trees or shrubs.
  9. No person shall be allowed to conduct or carry on any business or game for profit in or upon the reserve without the permission, in writing, of the trustees first obtained.
- Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at any station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Oaten hay will be preferred. Telegrams will not be entertained.

Tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained. The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender. The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise directed by the police; the straw to be wheat or oat, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (Victorian grown) and bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oat hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oat or wheat hay.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Botanic and Domain Gardens may be called upon to supply any other Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, and for which no contracts have been taken, at the same rates.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be endorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of the delay in delivering or replacing it when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

12. **SHIRE OF BULLEEN.**

BYE-LAW No. 2.

A Bye-law of the Shire of Bulleen, made under the 213th section of "The Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 2, for the suppression of the nuisance occasioned by cattle wandering on the roads of this Shire.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Local Government Act 1874," and "The Local Government Act Amendment Act 1883," the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Bulleen order as follows:—

Sections 41, 42, and 43 of subdivision 9, part 1, of the 13th schedule of "The Local Government Act 1874," are hereby adopted in and for the Shire of Bulleen. They are as follows:—

41. If any cattle shall be found upon any land not being a common and such that there is no fence whether upon the same land or any other dividing such first mentioned land from any street or road whether public or private without any person having charge of such cattle the owner of such cattle shall forfeit a sum not exceeding twenty shillings for every head of such cattle, and the proper officer of the Council may seize such cattle and place the same at some neighbouring place of safe custody, and



any justice, if such owner be not known, upon proof of the issue of a summons in the usual form addressed to such owner as "owner" only without otherwise naming or describing him, such cattle and the place of seizure being duly described therein, and of the publication of such summons in some newspaper commonly circulating in the neighbourhood, may, after the expiration of twenty-four hours from such publication, proceed with respect to such owner not appearing as if personal service of a summons stating his name had been effected, or if such owner appear then as in other cases; and the justice may order the cattle to be sold, and the money arising from the sale, after deducting the said penalty and the costs awarded and the reasonable expenses, to be estimated and assessed by the justice, of seizing, keeping, and selling, the said cattle shall be paid, if demanded within one month, to the owner of the cattle and if not so demanded then to the municipal fund; and if the said money shall not be sufficient for all the purposes aforesaid the amount whereby the same falls short, or if no such sale be ordered the whole of the said amount may be recovered from the said owner if and when known in like manner as other penalties and sums adjudged or ordered to be paid by justices are to be recovered.

42. If any cattle be at any time found in any street without any person having the charge thereof the owner of such cattle shall forfeit for every head of such cattle a sum not exceeding twenty shillings, and if such cattle shall by reason of having been so found at large have been impounded by the Council the amount of such penalty and costs if adjudged respectively before the release or sale of such cattle shall be added to the pound fees and charges payable in respect of such cattle and the amount thereof or such lesser amount (if any) as after the sale of the cattle may remain in the hands of the poundkeeper shall be paid over by him accordingly; and if the proceeds of any sale of such cattle shall not be sufficient after paying the lawful fees and charges aforesaid to satisfy such penalty and costs or if such penalty and costs shall have been adjudged after the release or sale of the cattle the same or so much thereof as remains unpaid shall and may be recovered from the owner of the cattle in like manner as other penalties and costs adjudged by justices are by law to be recovered; and if in the case of any information under this section the owner be not known then the provisions of the last preceding section so far as necessary to give the adjudicating justice jurisdiction shall apply.

43. If any goat shall have been impounded under the provisions of either of the two last preceding sections or under the provisions of this Bye-law relating to the impounding of cattle for trespass in the streets, and shall not, after the expiration of twenty-four hours be released, and the penalty, costs, fees, and charges be paid by the owner thereof, any justice may by warrant under his hand directed to any constable authorize the destruction of such goat, and the same may be destroyed accordingly.

The above Bye-law was made on the 3rd day of October 1887, and confirmed on the 28th day of November 1887.

##### BYE-LAW No. 33.

**A** BYE-LAW for the regulation of the Public Gardens at the intersection of Nelson and Saurdridge roads and Montague street, South Melbourne.

1. Subject to the resolution of the Council, the gardens under the management or control of the Council, and ground appertaining thereto, herein called the gardens, shall be open from sunrise to sunset on each day of the week.

2. No person shall pluck any of the flowers or walk on the beds or borders, or climb upon or get over the fences, or remove any of the tallies, or disturb, damage, or destroy any property or thing in the gardens.

3. No person shall carry firearms through the gardens, or shoot, snare, or destroy any wild fowl either in the gardens or in or on any water adjacent thereto.

4. No cart or other vehicle used for the conveyance of goods shall, without the authority of the proper officer of the Council, be driven through the gardens.

5. Such plants, seeds, or cuttings as are commonly purchasable at nurseries in Victoria, shall not be supplied from the gardens to any person, unless in exchange, or for public institutions, or for benevolent purposes.

6. No visitor shall interrupt the gardeners or labourers by conversation or otherwise.

7. Children under the age of ten years not under the control of some competent person shall be removed from the gardens.

8. All dogs and goats, and all poultry found within the gardens shall be destroyed, and the owner shall make compensation, to be recovered before any justice, for any damage done.

9. In addition to the provisions herein contained, it shall be lawful for the Council from time to time to make such regulations for the proper maintenance and management of the gardens as shall seem to them fit.

10. Any person offending against this sub-division, or any such regulation, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds.
