By By Law No. 2.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Avoca, in the Colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in The Public Health Amendment Statute 1833, and every other power enabling the said Local Board in this behalf, 'doth hereby make the following Bye-law No. 2 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered, so as to be water tight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet, and provided with a closely fitted cover, of pattern to be approved by the inspector of nuisances.

2. No. closet-door or trap, 'shall abut or open on a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding ten feet in width.

3. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of one foot: from the top of the sides, walls, or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Pivo a.m. And provided also that the contents of-any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged, therefrom until such 'contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid, sulphate of iron, chloride of lime, or some other, efficient deederizer, sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

as may be appointed by the Local Board from time to time for the final reception of the same. And every person removing any night-soil as hereinbefore mentioned, or in Bye-law No. 1 of the said Local Board, shall at the said place as appointed by the said Local Board deposit the same in a trench dug to a depth of not less than two feet, and shall immediately cover the said night-soil with at least one foot of clean earth, and shall keep the same so covered.

- 5. Any householder may, on payment to the contractor for the removal of night-soil of the charges agreed upon between the Local Board and the said contractor, have his or her earth-closet cleansed by the said contractor once every week, or oftener if necessary.

  6. Extent of Application of Bye-law.—This bye-law shall apply to and have operation only in that portion of the shire of Avoca contained within the following boundaries, and immediately on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health and publication in the Government Gazette, have application in conjunction with the provisions of Bye-law No. 1, that is to say: Commencing at the north-west angle of allotment 3, section 1A, parish of Avoca; thence north by a chain-and-a-half road to the north-west augle of allotment 1, township of Avoca; thence easterly by a chain-and-a-half. road to the Avoca it hence easterly by a chain-and-a-half. road to the north-west angle of allotment 1, township of Avoca; thence asterly by a chain-easterly at thence north-easterly by a one-chain road to the north-easterly to the north-easterly by a line bearing 64° 40′ to the parish of the north-easterly by a line bearing 64° 40′ to the parish boundary of Avoca; thence southerly by the said boundary to the north-east angle of allotment A, section 1A, parish of Avoca; thence westerly by a one-chain road to the starting point.

  7. Penalites.—Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ton pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties—such portion not being less than Five shillings—to be paid. And any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such Local Board has or has not taken advantage of such powers:

### AVOCA RACECOURSE AND RECREATION RESERVE.—REGULATIONS.

W. E., John F. Paten, John McMahon, Edwin Glover, Archibald P. Campbell, and George Downton, the duly appointed trustees of the Avoca Racecourse and Recreation Reserve, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 133 of The Land Act 1834:—

Regulations.

Regulations.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for races, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Five shillings (5s.) may be charged and taken for the admission of overy adult to the reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein without the permission, in writing, of the trustees first obtained.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or damage in any way the fences, seats, buildings, or trees, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, sheep, or horses, without the permission of the trustees first obtained.

6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the trustees person shall except any booth tent or other structure.

by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the trustees.

7. No person shall erect any booth, tent, or other structure in the reserve, without the written authority of the trustees.

8. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve by the trustees, shell enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of trees or shrubs.

9. No person shall be allowed to conduct or carry on any pusiness or game for profit in or upon the reserve without the permission, in writing, of the trustees first obtained.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of The Land Act 1834, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

A Bye-law of the Shire of Bullean, made under the 213th section of "The Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 2, for the suppression of the nuisance occasioned by cattle wandering on the roads of this Shire.

N pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Local Government Act 1883," the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Bullean order as follows:—

Sections 41, 42, and 43 of subdivision 9, part 1, of the 13th schedule of "The Local Government Act 1874," are hereby adopted in and for the Shire of Bullean. They are as follows:—

41. If any cattle shall be found upon any land not being a common and such that there is no fence whether upon the same common any other dividing such first mentioned land from any street or road whether public or private without any person having charge of such cattle the owner of such cattle shall forfeit a sum not exceeding twenty shillings for every head of such cattle and place the same at some neighbouring place of safe custody, and

any justice, if such owner be not known, upon proof of the issue of a summons in the usual form addressed to such owner as "owner" only without otherwise naming or describing him, such cattle and the place of seizure being duly described therein, and of the publication of such summons in some newspaper commonly circulating in the neighbourhood, may, after the expiration of twenty-four hours from such publication, proceed with respect to such owner not appearing as if personal service of a summons stating his name had been effected, or if such owner appear then as in other cases; and the justice may order the cattle to be sold, and the money arising from the sale, after deducting the said penalty and the costs awarded and the reasonable expenses, to be estimated and assessed by the justice, of seizing, keeping, and selling, the said cattle shall be paid, if demanded within one month, to the owner of the cattle and if not so demanded then to the municipal fund; and if the said money shall not be sufficient for all the purposes aforesaid the amount whereby the same falls short, or if no such sale be ordered the whole of the said amount may be recovered from the said owner if and when known in like manner as other penalties and sums adjudged or ordered to be paid by justices are to be recovered.

42. If any cattle be at any time found in any street without any person having the charge thereof the owner of such cattle shall forfeit for every head of such cattle a sum not exceeding twenty shillings, and if such cattle shall by reason of having been so found at large have been impounded by the Council the amount of such penalty and costs if adjudged respectively before the release or sale of such cattle shall be added to the pound fees and charges payable in respect of such cattle and the amount thereof or such lesser amount (if any) as after the sale of the cattle the same or so much thereof as remains unpaid shall and may be recovered from the owner of the cattle in like manner as other penalties and costs adjudged

A BYE-LAW for the regulation of the Public Gardens at the intersection of Nelson and Sandridge roads and Montague street, South Melbourne.

1. Subject to the resolution of the Council, the gardens under the management or control of the Council, and ground appertaining thereto, herein called the gardens, shall be open from sunrise to sunset on each day of the week.

3. No person shall carry firearms through the gardens, or shoot, snare, or destroy any wild fowl either in the gardens or in or on any water adjacent thereto.

4. No cart or other vehicle used for the conveyance of goods shall, without the authority of the proper officer of the Council, be driven through the gardens.

5. Such plants, seeds, or cuttings as are commonly purchaseable at nurseries in Victoria, shall not be supplied from the gardens to any person, unless in exchange, or for public institutions, or for benevolent purposes.

6. No visitor shall interrupt the gardeners or labourers by conversation or otherwise.

7. Children under the age of ten years not under the control of some competent person shall be removed from the gardens shall be destroyed, and the owner shall make compensation, to be recovered before any justice, for any damage done.
