WORKROOMS OF THE MELBOURNE STEAM LAUNDRY COMPANY,

from the date hereof to the 7th January 1888, upon these express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said workrooms any female for more than fifty-six hours in any one week in laundry work.

A PLACE WHEREIN THE DISTILLATION OF SPIRITS MAY BE CARRIED ON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed by the Parliament of Victoria, in the twenty-fifth year of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "*An Act to consolidate and amend the law relating to the distillation, rectifying, and compounding of spirits, to the granting a duty on spirits distilled in Victoria, and to regulate the brewing of beer and the sale of fermented and spirituous liquors in certain cases*," it was amongst other things enacted that any person, except as hereinafter excepted, who should carry on the business of a distiller or rectifier and compounder of spirits, or who should have in his possession or who should make use of any still or other utensil for distilling or rectifying and compounding spirits, excepting in such place as the Governor in Council should by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* direct, should be liable to a penalty of not less than One hundred pounds nor more than Five hundred pounds: Now therefore, I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby proclaim the undermentioned place in the city of South Melbourne as a place wherein the distillation of spirits may be carried on, that is to say:—

Premises situated on the west side of St. Kilda road, being part of Crown allotment 6, section 59, city of South Melbourne, colony of Victoria: Commencing at a point 427 feet 8 inches north from the corner of Park street and St. Kilda road; thence north 27 feet; thence west 140 feet 10½ inches; thence north 33 feet 1 inch; thence west 98 feet; thence south 27 feet 10 inches; thence west 112 feet 3 inches to Palmerston crescent; thence south 38 feet 3 inches; thence east to starting point 351 feet 1½ inches.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twentieth day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and in the fifty-first year of Her Majesty's reign.

"THE LICENSING ACT 1885."—TIME FOR HOLDING THE LICENSING COURT FOR THE METROPOLITAN GROUP OF LICENSING DISTRICTS EXTENDED.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1885* (No. 857, s. 64) it was enacted that the Licensing Court for each Licensing District should, in the month of December in every year, hold an annual sitting of the Court at the place appointed, of which annual sitting one month's previous notice should be given in the *Government Gazette*: Provided that the Governor in Council might, by an Order in Council, extend the time for the holding of such Court by a period not exceeding two months from the thirty-first day of December: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order extend the time for the holding the Annual Sitting of the Licensing Court for the Metropolitan Group of Licensing Districts appointed to be held on the sixth day of December One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven by a period not exceeding two months from the thirty-first day of December One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven inclusive.

PUPIL SURVEYORS.

APPLICATIONS will be received, addressed to the Secretary to the Board of Examiners, up to Friday the 20th January next, from Candidates desirous of being appointed as Pupil Surveyors and Draughtsmen in connection with this department. Two vacancies.

Conditions.

An applicant for appointment must be not more than twenty years or less than sixteen years of age. He will be required to produce a medical certificate to the effect that he is of sound constitution, and not affected with any physical infirmity which would interfere with the proper exercise of his profession. He will also be required to produce satisfactory evidence of having received a good general education, including a competent knowledge of euclid, algebra, and arithmetic, also a specimen of his plan drawing.

Competitive Examination.

Having duly complied with the foregoing requirements, he will undergo a competitive examination on a date of which he will be duly notified—subjects, plane trigonometrical computation, plotting, and plan drawing—when the competitors to whom shall be awarded a sufficient number of points by the Board of Examiners will be recommended for appointment in the order of merit, subject to the regulations of the department as to probation.

Term of Service.

The pupil's service in the department shall be for a term of four years, the first two of which will be served in the office, where he will be engaged in drawing and computing. He will then (if thought necessary) be examined in trigonometry, including computation of areas and reduction of traverse surveys, also plotting from field-book and plan drawing. If his progress up to this time is not deemed satisfactory he will be liable to be dispensed with, but, if satisfactory, he will be placed under a departmental surveyor for two years for field practice.

Afterwards he will have the privilege of attending for two months at the Melbourne Observatory, where he will be instructed in such branches of practical astronomy as are necessary for the duties he may be called on to perform as a qualified surveyor.

He will be allowed to present himself at the next ensuing examination for land surveyors (without payment of fees), for the purpose of obtaining the formal certificate of the Board of Examiners as to his qualifications.

Remuneration.

He will receive the following remuneration during the term of his pupilage:—1st year, £52; 2nd year, £58; 3rd year, £66; 4th year, £72.

Subject to Regulations.

During the whole term of his pupilage and service in the department he shall be subject to the Regulations for the Public Service of Victoria dated 31st December 1884, or any subsequent substituted or additional regulations.

Bonds required.

Each successful candidate for appointment as pupil surveyor and draughtsman will be required to find two approved sureties, who shall enter into bonds for £150 each for the faithful performance of his duties.

FOUR SHETLAND PONIES MALICIOUSLY KILLED ON PHILLIP ISLAND.—FORTY POUNDS REWARD.

The births of 1,219 children, viz., 623 boys and 596 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of November. In the month of October 1,959 births were registered, or 160 less than in the month under review. The births were 429 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, or 230 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in November numbered 584, viz., 318 of males and 266 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 635, or 109 per cent. The deaths were more numerous than those in October by 77, and exceeded the average of November during the previous ten years by 90. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to be below that average by 24.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 3.28, and of deaths registered 1.57.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 89.3° on the 25th, and the lowest was 41.5° on the 17th. The mean temperature of the month (58.8°) was nearly a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (38.1°) took place on the 23rd, viz., from a maximum of 84.1° to a minimum of 46.0°. The least range (7.4°) was on the 5th, viz., from a maximum of 61.0° to a minimum of 53.6°. The mean daily range was 17.2°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.240 inches on the 22nd, and the lowest was 29.532 inches on the 30th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.952 inches) was much above the average, being nearly as high as the autumn level.

Rain fell on 14 days, the amount of rainfall being 3.66 inches. The average rainfall in November during the previous ten years was 2.70 inches, or nearly an inch (.96) less than in the month under notice.

The total rainfall from the beginning of the year to the end of November was 27.26 inches, which had increased by the 29th December to 31.90 inches, or about 6½ inches above the average. A slightly larger rainfall occurred in 1870, 1872, and 1875, but with these exceptions the rainfall in 1887 was the greatest during the last 27 years.

Males contributed 54 per cent., and females 46 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed only 41 per cent. to that mortality, as against 54 per cent. in November 1886, 48 per cent. in November 1885, 53 per cent. in November 1884, 45 per cent. in November 1883, 49 per cent. in November 1882, 38 per cent. in November 1881, 41 per cent. in November 1880, 39 per cent. in November 1879, 35 per cent. in November 1878, and 42 per cent. in November 1877.

Twenty-five of the deaths were of persons who had attained the age of 75 years or upwards, viz.:—Those of a laborer and a female, aged respectively 75, of senile decay; a cabdriver, aged 76, of cancer of the stomach; a gentleman, aged 76, of epithelioma; a female, aged 76, of senile decay; a minor (patient in a lunatic asylum), aged 76, of disease of the brain; a gentleman, aged 76, of fatty degeneration of the heart; a shipping clerk, aged 77, of phthisis; a gardener and a female, each aged 77, of old age; a female, aged 77, of valvular disease of the heart; a female, aged 77, of heart disease; one, aged 78, of diarrhoea; another, aged 78, of old age; and another, aged 78, of bronchitis; two gentlemen, both aged 79, of old age and disease of the heart respectively; a laborer, and a female, both aged 80, of old age; a female, aged 80, of chronic bronchitis; a gentleman, aged 81, of disease of the prostate; a female, aged 82, of apoplexy; a stonebreaker, aged 86, of old age; a female, aged 86, who was killed by a railway engine; and one, aged 87, of diarrhoea.

Thirty-seven deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which 32 were set down to accidents, 1 to homicide, and 4 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A farmer, aged 58, was killed during a collision between two steam vessels; a farmer, aged 70, died of fracture of the spine, caused by being thrown from a buggy; a dealer, aged 63, whilst suffering from *delirium tremens*, died of fracture of the ribs, caused by falling on a heap of stones; a laborer, aged 53, of injuries to the head through a fall; a laborer, aged 53, succumbed to a compound fracture of the leg, caused by a tram-car passing over him; a seaman, aged 31, died of concussion of the brain, resulting from a fall down a hatchway; the master of a lighter, aged 24, died of fracture of the skull, caused by a piece of timber falling on him; a youth, aged 19, was killed by a train passing over him; a male child, aged 9, died of rupture of the loin, through running against the pole of a lorry whilst at play; a male infant, aged 16 months, of internal injuries, through the upsetting of a perambulator; a female, aged 86, was killed through being knocked down by a railway engine; a female child, aged 8, succumbed to lockjaw, resulting from an injury to the toe; a gentleman, aged 43, a carpenter, aged 30, and a gentleman, aged 20, died of sunstroke; a female child, aged 11 years, died of scalds, caused by falling into a pot of boiling water; a male child, of 5 years, died of the effects of a "vermin bite"; an engineer, aged 36, a fireman, aged 21, 2 seamen, aged 24 and 28 respectively, a female child, aged 2 years, and a female, aged 56, were drowned in the s.s. *Chacriot*, which ran ashore outside Port Phillip Heads, owing to the loss of the propeller (deaths registered in West Melbourne); a youth, aged 13, and a carter, aged 39, were accidentally drowned, the latter in the River Yarra; a gardener and a laborer, each aged 55, and 2 females, aged 50 respectively, were found drowned in the River Yarra; a female child, a day old, and a male child, a month old, were suffocated; and a male, of occupation undescribed, aged 60, was choked whilst eating a piece of meat. The homicidal death was that of a female, aged 42, who was willfully murdered by her husband, who fractured her skull. The deaths from suicide were those of a commercial traveller, aged 29, and a laborer, aged 35, who cut their throats; and of a contractor, aged 52, and a person of unstated occupation, aged 55, who died from self-inflicted gunshot wounds.

Ninety-six deaths, or 16 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.—46 in the Melbourne Hospital, 16 in the Alfred Hospital, 2 in the Homœopathic Hospital, 1 in the Children's Hospital, 2 in the Women's Hospital, 5 in the Immigrants' Home, 8 in the Benevolent Asylum, 2 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 8 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 4 in the Infant Asylum.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 241, of which 133, or 55 per cent., were of males, and 108, or 45 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 181 were under one year of age, 35 were between one and two, 10 were between two and three, 8 were between three and four, and 7 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 343. Of these, 185, or 54 per cent., were males, and 158, or 46 per cent., were females; 10 were between five and ten, 11 were between ten and fifteen, 15 were between fifteen and twenty, 15 were between twenty and twenty-five, 23 were between twenty-five and thirty, 30 were between thirty and thirty-five, 23 were between thirty-five and forty, 23 were between forty and forty-five, 26 were between forty-five and fifty, 26 were between fifty and fifty-five, 26 were between fifty-five and sixty, 26 were between sixty and sixty-five, 21 were between sixty-five and seventy, 16 were between seventy and seventy-five, 17 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 8 were upwards of eighty.

As compared with the previous month, the number of deaths from specific febrile or zymotic diseases increased from 56 to 76, from constitutional diseases from 111 to 130, and from local diseases from 252 to 262. Deaths from violence and from ill-defined causes also rose—the former from 26 to 37, and the latter from 28 to 40. Under the zymotic head, deaths from diarrhoeal diseases rose from 15 to 52, but on the other hand deaths from measles fell from 19 to 6. In the constitutional class, deaths from phthisis rose from 58 to 80. Among local diseases, deaths from pneumonia and congestion of the lungs fell from 45 to 17. The mortality from stomach diseases showed an increase of 19 over the preceding month. Four deaths of child-bearing women were registered as against 10 in October. If these numbers be compared with the births registered during the same months, it will be found that only one death of a mother took place to every 304 children born alive in the month under review, as against 1 to every 106 of such children in the previous month.

THE Commissioners of the Wimmera United Waterworks District, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 20 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1884*, do make the following Regulations:—

No. 12.—URBAN DISTRICT OF MURTOA.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust within the urban district of Murtoa—that is to say, in regard to houses or tenements fronting any streets in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which houses or tenements if not on such streets are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes:—

(1.) For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

(2.) For every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds and not exceeding the annual value of Eighty pounds, the sum of Ten pounds per centum per annum on the annual value of such property.

No. 13.—URBAN DISTRICT OF WARRACKNABEAL.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust within the urban district of Warracknabeal—that is to say, in regard to houses or tenements fronting any streets in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which houses or tenements if not on such streets are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes:—

CHRISTMAS AND NEW YEAR'S EXCURSIONS.

Holiday Excursion tickets will be issued to and from all stations (Suburban lines excepted) from the 19th December to the 4th January, both dates inclusive (Sundays excepted), available by all ordinary and extra trains, and for return for one calendar month from date of issue. Example.—An Excursion ticket issued on the 22nd December will be available till the 22nd January. When the last day falls on a Sunday, the ticket will be available till next day. The journey must be commenced on the date the ticket is issued, but after a distance of fifteen miles has been travelled, the journey may be broken at the discretion of the passengers.

Sydney Excursion Tickets.—From the 19th December to the 4th January, both dates inclusive, Excursion tickets will be issued at Melbourne to Sydney at the following return fares:—1st class, £5 6s. 6d.; 2nd class, £4 1s. Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at any station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Oaten hay will be preferred. Telegrams will not be entertained.

Tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise directed by the police; the straw to be wheat or oaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (Victorian grown) and bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oaten or wheat hay.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Botanic and Domain Gardens may be called upon to supply any other Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, and for which no contracts have been taken, at the same rates.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be endorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would occur either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of the delay in delivering or replacing it when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

12. It will be competent for the Secretary of the Tender Board, on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the 1st day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th September 1888, and in the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

Schedules as above, giving an estimate of the articles required, and printed forms of tender, may be obtained from the Secretary to the Tender Board, by whom also the samples will be shown and any information or explanation afforded to persons tendering.

Separate tenders will be received for each schedule, but they must include the whole of the articles therein mentioned, and a separate price must be stated for each article.

The total amount of the tender where indicated must be expressed in words as well as in figures.

Tenders having alterations or erasures therein will not be entertained.

Tenders must be accompanied by the preliminary deposit as shown above in bank notes, or a bank draft in favor of the Secretary of the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

Security will be required either in Government debentures, bank deposit-receipt in favor of the Secretary of the Tender Board, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

The security is calculated at Ten per cent. upon contracts not exceeding £1,000, and at Five per cent. over that sum; but no deviation will be allowed from the amount above stated.

The security must be completed and contract signed within ten days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Persons failing to take up their contracts will be disqualified from tendering for Government supplies for a period of twelve months.

Tenders, enclosed in a separate envelope, and having the words "Tender for ——" (as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box, at the Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all or any of the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be according to sample (where so stated), and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. In other cases the supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. A preference will, however, be given to goods of Victorian manufacture, provided the quality is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. All orders for supplies will emanate from the Government Printer, and be transmitted through the Stores and Transport Department. All orders must accompany the goods on delivery, otherwise the goods will not be received. Delivery, as a rule, is to be of the full quantity ordered.

4. Supplies ordered must be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.). The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for.

Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labor may be required in the packing of stores.

5. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the Government Printer.

6. Orders must receive prompt execution; and, in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the Government Printer, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account.

7. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form simultaneously with delivery of the full quantities of goods ordered, the account being rendered with the order to which it relates. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

8. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the Government Printer, whose decision shall be final.

9. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. All articles rejected must be immediately replaced by the contractor, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in condition 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Treasurer of the colony may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in condition 6, or from the contractor's security. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited, and in addition the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

12. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

13. It will be competent either for the contractor on his own behalf, or for the Secretary of the Tender Board on behalf of the Government, to terminate the contract, by giving notice, in writing, of three full calendar months to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made, and under no other circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract.

14. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government Printing Office; or by any article being made at any Government establishment, and supplied for use in the Government Printing Office; or by the consumption of the surplus stock of any Government establishment.

15. In the event of any alteration in the tariff affecting any of the items included in these contracts, the Government, or the contractor, as may be the case, will make a proportionate allowance by way of deduction from or increase of the price of the item so affected.
