FURTHER PROROGUING THE PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Constitution Act* it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor to fix such places within Victoria and, subject to the limitation therein contained, such times for holding the first and every other Session of the Council and Assembly, and to vary and alter the same respectively in such manner as he might think fit; and also from time to time to prorogue the said Council and Assembly, and to dissolve the said Assembly, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he should deem it expedient: And whereas the said Council and Assembly, called "The Parliament of Victoria," did stand prorogued until Thursday the third day of March next, and it is expedient to prorogue the same further: Now therefore I, the Governor of the Colony of Victoria, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria from Thursday the third day of March next until Thursday the fourteenth day of April now next ensuing.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-third day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and in the fiftieth year of Her Majesty's reign.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

BYE-LAW No. 51.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred by *The Victorian Railways Commissioners Act 1883*, do hereby make the following Bye-law, and all previous Bye-laws conflicting therewith are hereby repealed :—

FARES FOR CONVEYANCE BY PASSENGER TRAINS ARE FIXED AS FOLLOWS :—

1. Out of the through fare of £75 for Annual Tickets, First Class, between Melbourne and Sydney, the proportion due to the Victorian Railways shall be £25.
2. Bye-law 20, fixing the fares known as Seaside Fares on the Mordialloc Line, is hereby repealed.
3. The item in Clause 1 of Bye-law 41, fixing the proportion due to the Victorian Railways out of the through fare between Melbourne and Adelaide, *via* Dimboola, is hereby repealed.

CHARGES ON GOODS ARE FIXED AS FOLLOWS :—

4. New Casks, empty, to be charged Miscellaneous Class Rates, with First Class minimums.
5. Hose Reels to be charged Second Class Rates.
6. Fruit and Jams, canned, whether direct from the factory or not, to be carried under Special "B" Class Rates and Conditions.
7. Fruit, fresh, by Passenger Trains, to be carried at Second Class Goods Rates, in quantities of not less than 5 cwt. or more than 10 cwt.
8. The charge of $\frac{1}{2}$ d. per bag, in Bye-law 31, for carriage of Grain from Sheds not the property of the Department at the Piers to the Ship's side, is hereby repealed.
9. Rifle Cartridges for the Government of Victoria, and Sporting Cartridges and Sporting Powder in flasks, securely packed, may now be sent in ordinary Goods Trucks by ordinary Goods or Mixed Trains.
10. The Commissioners may, at their discretion, allow Contractors' Trains to be run over their lines, and, in the event of permission being granted, the following will be the Rates and Conditions :—

RAILWAY CONTRACTORS' TRAINS.

- (a) An engine, light, 1s. 6d. per mile, under steam.
- (b) A train of 10 waggons, ballast or material—contractors' own engine, trucks, and men—or haulage of a dead engine, 2s. 6d. per mile; minimum, 50s. per train. Ballast or material trains are not charged for the return journey empty.
- (c) A train of contractors' empty waggons, Department finding engine and men, 5s. per mile; minimum, 50s. per train.
- (d) A train of 10 contractors' waggons loaded with material for their own contract, Department finding engine and men, 7s. 6d. per mile; minimum, 50s.
- (e) Contractors' empty waggons attached to ordinary goods trains, 3d. per truck per mile; minimum, 15s. each.
- (f) Contractors' waggons cannot be sent by ordinary goods trains unless provided with spring buffers.
- (g) All contractors' waggons and engines must be examined and passed by the Locomotive Superintendent before being allowed to run.
- (h) Contractors' men in charge of engines or trains must also give satisfactory proof of their knowledge of the line, and general fitness, before being permitted to run.
- (i) The Department finds pilot in all cases, whose wages and expenses are to be paid by contractors.

REGULATION NO. V.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an urban district, for the purposes of the *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by *The Victorian Water Conservation Acts 1881, 1883, and 1884*, make the regulation following:—

A rate of One shilling in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all the rateable property in the waterworks district of the Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust liable in respect of rates levied by the said Trust according to the valuation for the time being of such rateable property for the municipal rate of the municipal district in which such rateable property is situate, for one year commencing on the first day of January One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and ending on the thirty-first day of December One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven. Such rate shall be payable and collected in two equal portions or instalments, and the first instalment shall be due and payable on the first day of January One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and the second instalment on the first day of July One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven. Such persons as the Commissioners of the Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rate.

TRAGOWEL PLAINS IRRIGATION TRUST.—REGULATION.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulation made in pursuance of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881* (No. 716, sec. 44).

THE Commissioners of the Tragowel Plains Irrigation Trust, in pursuance of powers conferred by Section 44 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881*, do make the following regulation:—

REGULATION NO. 2.

1. All water supplied from the works of the Trust for the irrigation of land shall be paid for by measure. All measurements of water shall be by gauges of form and pattern approved by the Trust, and fixed under the direction and to the satisfaction of the officer appointed by the Trust for that purpose.

2. No irrigation outlet or other outlet from any of the channels or works of the Trust shall be constructed until the occupier of the land to be supplied from such outlet has entered into an agreement with the Trust for the purchase of water and has received the authority, in writing, from the Trust to construct such outlet.

3. Every outlet for the supply of water for irrigation shall be constructed under the supervision and to the satisfaction of the Trust, or of its duly authorized officer.

4. Before constructing any outlet the owner or occupier (as the case may be) of the land supplied therefrom shall give notice to the superintending officer of the Trust, and receive his authority, in writing, to construct such outlet.

5. No person shall construct any outlet from the works of the Trust without the written authority of the committee having charge of the water distribution, or otherwise than under the supervision and to the satisfaction of the authorized officer of the Trust, and any person who shall construct any such outlet without the authority of the said Committee of the Trust, or without the supervision of the authorized officer of the Trust, or in any manner other than that authorized by such officer shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this regulation, and shall be liable to a penalty of Five pounds for every such breach.

6. The rate or price to be paid for water delivered from the works of the Trust for irrigation purposes shall be (except for gardens) at least One penny per inch per acre to the end of the month of February 1887; Three pence per inch per acre from the first day of March to the end of the month of April 1887; and Six pence per inch per acre for all land for the remainder of the present season only; and for gardens an uniform rate of at least Six pence per inch per acre, payments in all cases to be made in advance.

7. All persons agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall take delivery thereof through their respective outlets, at such times, in such order, and in such manner as the Trust shall direct. No person shall be supplied with a less quantity of water than is equal to the value of Twelve shillings and six pence; and the delivery of water may be continued on Sundays as well as on ordinary working days.

8. Every person agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall receive notification of the dates and the quantities in which it will be delivered to him.

9. The outlets for the delivery of water shall be opened only by the authorized officers of the Trust, and no person other than such officers shall, under any circumstances, open such outlet or otherwise do any act that may permit of the escape of water from the channels or works.

10. Any person, not being a duly authorized officer of the Trust, who shall open any irrigation outlets or do any act that may cause the escape of water from the channels or works of the Trust shall be guilty of a breach of this regulation, and shall be liable to a penalty of Five pounds for every such breach.

11. No person shall injure or damage any of the works of the Trust, or waste or pollute the water therein; and any person who shall injure or damage such works or any part thereof, or waste or pollute the water contained therein, shall be deemed to be

guilty of a breach of this regulation, and shall be liable to a penalty of five pounds for every such breach.

12. In the event of the Trust being unable, through failure of the works or from any other cause, to deliver or supply water to persons who through its committee aforesaid it shall have agreed to supply, such persons shall be entitled to a rebate of the price agreed to be paid for such water. But the Trust shall not be answerable for any damage that may have been sustained by any person by reason of such failure or non-delivery.

13. The Chairman of the Trust and the Commissioners of No. 4 Riding of the Trust are hereby appointed a Committee of the Trust to manage and regulate the distribution of the available water, according to its best judgment and in agreement with this regulation.

The foregoing Regulation was made by the Commissioners of the Tragowell Plains Irrigation Trust, under and by virtue of section 44 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881*, this twelfth day of January 1887.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act Amendment Act 1883* (47 Vict. No. 786, sec. 3) it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might make orders altering, for the purpose of adjustment, the boundaries of continuous municipal districts or subdivisions without any petition: And whereas it has been deemed expedient to adjust the continuous boundaries of the Shires of Alexandra, Benalla, and Mansfield: Now therefore the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby adjust the boundaries of the said Shires of Alexandra, Benalla, and Mansfield, and doth declare the boundaries of the said Shires as hereunder described and set forth to be in lieu of those previously proclaimed, which are hereby cancelled, that is to say:—

THE SHIRE OF ALEXANDRA RE-DEFINED.

Tenderers are informed that from the 1st of July this year the Department will, in addition to the carriage of English and Indian parcels as at present, institute a Victorian parcel post system, and undertake to carry parcels up to 7 lbs. in weight by all services for which tenders may be accepted for conveyance of mails by vehicle.

Packets up to 3 lbs. in weight will be conveyed by horseback services as at present.

12. Tenderers for services to and from Post Offices and Railway Stations are required to name a lump sum per annum for the number of trips specified in the call for tenders, and also state a rate per trip as a basis of payment for additional trips, or for reduction in the payment, should the number of trips be increased or lessened during the currency of the contract.

A "trip" to mean a journey from the Post Office to the Railway Station, and from the Railway Station to the Post Office, carrying mails each way.

The carriage of mails one way, viz., either from a Post Office to a Railway Station or from a Railway Station to a Post Office, shall be regarded as half a trip, and payment made accordingly. Where tenders are invited for a service to and from a Post Office and Railway Station "as often as required," tenderers are required to name a lump sum per annum for the work, and such sum shall not be liable to alteration either through increase or diminution in the number of trips. Contracts for services to and from Post Offices and Railway Stations are liable to be discontinued at one month's notice from the department.

1. Tenders are required to be written on a form, printed copies of which may be had gratuitously on application at any post office in the colony, and are to be forwarded (if by post, PREPAID AND REGISTERED) for receipt at the General Post Office by the hour and date first above mentioned, addressed to the Honorable the Postmaster-General, with the words "Tender for Mail Service No. " endorsed on the cover, or placed in the tender-box at the General Post Office.

2. Tenders are requested to describe by their numbers, as below, the mail services for which they tender.

3. The amount of the tender must be stated AT RATE PER ANNUM in words as well as figures.

4. Every tender must bear the *bona fide* signature and address of the tenderer, and bear the names of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the contract in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by cash, marked cheque, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy-Postmaster General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount named in the tender; this deposit to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being duly signed.

7. The money or other security deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts.

8. In the event of a new line of railway, or a new railway station on an existing line being opened for traffic, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the Postmaster-General shall have the power of cancelling the contract for any mail service running in the vicinity of the railway without compensation to the contractor, or shall have power to alter the points of arrival and departure of the mails; and in the event of the travelling distance on any mail line being in such manner increased or diminished, all payments for the service subsequent to the alteration shall be computed on the basis of the average mileage-rate of the contract.

9. In the event of it being found necessary, from any cause, to absolutely cancel a contract, the Postmaster-General shall have full power to do so, provided that, unless the contract be cancelled on account of any fault on the part of the contractor, or on account of the opening of a railway line or a new railway station, payment shall be made to the contractor as compensation of a sum equal to ten per cent. of the moneys which would have become due on the unexpired period of the contract if the latter had been continued for the full term of three years.

10. Tenderers are requested to state the mode by which they propose to convey mails, whether by vehicle, on horseback, or by man on foot. If by vehicle, the description of vehicle and number of horses by which it is to be drawn to be given.

11. Tenderers are informed that from the 1st of July this year the Department will, in addition to the carriage of English and Indian parcels as at present, institute a Victorian parcel post system, and undertake to carry parcels up to 7 lbs. in weight by all services for which tenders may be accepted for conveyance of mails by vehicle.

Packets up to 3 lbs. in weight will be conveyed by horseback services as at present.

12. For keeping free from noisome matter yards, stables, and places used for noxious trades, slaughter-yards, &c.; and for regulating management of earth-closets, privies, &c., disinfecting and deodorizing nightsoil and other offensive matters, and for regulating its removal and final deposit.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Borough of Flemington and Kensington, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and every other power enabling the said local board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said local board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 4 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matter and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this bye-law coming into operation.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said borough.

4. The occupier of every house and premises within the said borough shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto, or occupied in connection therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the local board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

5. The occupier of any land in the said borough on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, or pig-sty shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be removed from such premises once in each week; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

6. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement within the said borough shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of two feet from the top of the sides, walls, or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of eleven p.m. and five a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

7. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall, once at least in every week, cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of nightsoil on or belonging to such premises by the nightman licensed by municipal authorities.

8. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of night-soil, except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents of any portion thereof or of effluvia therefrom.

9. All nightsoil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and deposited in such place or places only as may be appointed by the local board from time to time for the final reception of the same.

10. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited or spread, or assisting in placing or depositing or spreading on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any nightsoil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place, shall immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof cover the same, or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered, with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness.

11. The occupier of any premises within the borough used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter

produced or accumulated thereon to be removed therefrom once in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia; and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

12. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered, so as to be water-tight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet.

13. No closet door or trap shall abut or open on a street, lane, or right of way exceeding twelve feet in width.

14. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties—such portion not being less than Five shillings—to be paid. And any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such local board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

BYE-LAW No. 13.

For keeping free from noisome matter yards, stables, and places used for noxious trades, slaughter-yards, &c., and for regulating management of earth-closets, privies, &c., disinfecting and deodorizing night-soil and other offensive matter, and for regulating its removal and final deposit.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Borough of Saint Kilda, in the colony of Victoria (being the Municipal Council thereof), by virtue of the powers contained in the "Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and every other power enabling the said Local Board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board, doth make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 13 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matter and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this bye-law coming into operation.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said borough.

4. The owner or occupier of every house and premises within the said borough shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto or occupied in connection therewith to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground, and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the Local Board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such owner or occupier.

5. The owner or occupier of any land in the said borough on which there shall be erected any stable, cowyard, cattle shed, or pig-sty shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard, and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said Local Board at the expense of such owner or occupier.

6. The owner or occupier of every house, building, or tenement within the said borough shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of one foot from the top of the sides, walls, or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Five a.m., and provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid or some other efficient deodoriser sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorise and disinfect the same.

7. The owner or occupier of any house or tenement built after the coming into force of this bye-law shall make such provision for the emptying of the cess or privy pans or earth-closets of every house or tenement as shall ensure such emptying being done without any nuisance to the inhabitants of the Borough of Saint Kilda, and no privy or earth-closet shall have any opening for the putting in or taking out of any pan or earth-closet which

shall be flush with the building line of any street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding ten feet in width within the Borough of Saint Kilda, nor within the view of any person in any such street, lane, or right-of-way.

8. That from and after the coming into operation of this bye-law no privy, earth-closet, or cesspan, and no urinal shall be placed or built or shall be erected on premises within the Borough of Saint Kilda at a less distance than three feet from any public highway, or any lane or street of a width at any part thereof of eleven feet or upwards, or from any street channel, nor at a less distance than six feet from the door or window of any dwelling or tenement, nor to be situated in any position on any premises where in the opinion of the Local Board of Health the erection of such privy, earth-closet, cesspan, or urinal would be a nuisance either to the owner or occupier of the adjoining premises or to the public. Every privy or earth-closet shall be constructed of the dimensions and materials mentioned and specified in one or other of the specifications in the schedule set forth. Every cesspan shall be constructed of galvanized iron properly riveted and soldered so as to be watertight, with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding two cubic feet.

9. That if after the coming into force of this bye-law any owner or occupier of premises within the Borough of Saint Kilda complains to the Local Board that the privy, earth-closet, cesspan, or urinal of any adjoining or neighbouring premises is a nuisance to such owner or occupier, the Local Board of Health may, by order given to, served, or left with the owner or occupier of such adjoining or neighbouring premises, direct the removal of the said privy, earth-closet, cesspan, or urinal to such other place on the adjoining or neighbouring premises complained of as the Local Board of Health may determine or direct.

10. If the pan of any privy or any premises within the Borough of Saint Kilda is at any time found to be leaky or overflowing, the occupier of the premises on which such leaky or overflowing pan is found shall give notice to the Inspector of Nuisances for the said borough within twenty-four hours of the leaky or overflowing condition of the pan having become known to him.

11. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall once at least in every week empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for reception of nightsoil on or belonging to such premises.

12. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of nightsoil except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed, and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents of any portion thereof or of effluvia therefrom.

13. All nightsoil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and deposited in such place or places only as may be appointed by the Local Board from time to time for the final reception of the same.

14. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited or spread, or assisting in placing or depositing or spreading on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any nightsoil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place, shall, immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof, cover the same, or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness.

15. The owner or occupier of any premises within the borough used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be removed therefrom once in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia; and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said Local Board at the expense of such owner or occupier.

16. No closet door or trap shall abut or open upon a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding ten feet in width.

17. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties—such portion not being less than five shillings—to be paid. And any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such Local Board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

The Schedule above referred to.—The First Schedule.—Specifications of Privies.

No. 1.—Privy of Wood.

The inside dimensions in clear shall be 5 ft. by 4 ft.; the framing to be of clean hardwood; the studs 7 ft. long, 3 in. by 2 in., all tenoned into the top and bottom plates, except the corner ones, which are to be 3 in. by 3 in. in section; the bottom and top plates to be 3 in. by 3 in. and 3 in. by 2 in. in section respectively, notched for the studs; secure the framing to No. 4 redgum blocks, 4 in. by 4 in. in section, set solid on the clay, the tops of which shall be 3 in. above the surface of the land. Form an opening in the back framing to receive a full size portable cesspool, 2 ft. long and 1 ft. 6 in. deep, clear dimensions. Cover the walls with 1 in. weatherboards, securely nailed to the studs, to lap at least 1 in., and butt against proper angle staffs 2½ in. wide and 1½ in. thick, all wrought. The floor-joists to be hardwood, 4 in. by 2 in. in section, secured to the plate; the floor-boards to be 1 in. clean Scotch deal, grooved and tongued, laid with close joints and nailed to the joists. The rafters to be Oregon, 4 ft. by 1½ ft. ridge-piece, 7 in. deep and 1½ in. thick. The barge boards for the gable ends to be ½ in. deep and 1½ in. thick, chamfered on

lower edges; cap the same, with 1 in. deal, 4½ in. wide, so as to seal the joints of the iron or slate covering. Make and hang with 18 in. T hinges a common 1 in. deal ledge-door, 5 ft. 9 in. long, 2 ft. 6 in. wide; fitted with a common size Norfolk latch, and a 4-in. Tower bolt on the inside. Make and hang at the back of the privy to enclose the cesspan a common ledge-door out of 1 in. deal, 2 ft. by 1 ft. 6 in., hung with 18 in. T hinges, and fitted with bolt, as before stated. Fix a deal ground around the said opening out of 1½ in. by 2½ in. deal, on which to hang the door; and stop the weatherboarding cover in the roof with corrugated iron or slates, secured with screws or nails to 1½ in. by 2½ in. deal battens. The ridge-capping to be galvanized iron, 14 in. wide. Fix a common seat in privy, with full sized hole, and cover 20 in. wide on proper bearers out of 2½ in. by 1½ in. deal and 1 in. deal riser 20 in. deep.

No. 2.—Privy of Brick.

Inside dimensions 5 ft. by 4 ft., walls of clean, hard burnt brick, 9 in. thick, 7 feet in height above the stone foundations, which is to be common rubble work, one foot in thickness, set or built upon the solid clay; in all cases the stonework to be not less than 4 inches above the level of the surface of the land. The masonry and brickwork to be built in mortar made from Geelong or Waratah Bay lime and clean sharp sand, made up in proportion of two parts sand and one lime. Before building the brickwork, lay all round the walls of stone foundations a damp course compound of tar and clean sharp sand, half inch in thickness, strike the joints of the brickwork on both sides, and twice lime-white the walls on the inside. The particulars of the roof covering, flooring, and joists, the ledged door, seats, and riser is to be of the same kind of material, also the same in dimensions, as those of Class 1. in every respect, except the floor plates, which are to be of redgum, 3 in. by 1½ in., bedded in mortar. The door frame is to be 5 in. by 3 in. scantling secured to a stone sill, out of clean bluestone, 3 ft. 3 in. long, 9 in. wide, 6 in. deep, clean hammer-faced, the head to form a lintel out of deal 3 ft. 3 in. long, 9 in., wrought. Fix ½ in. deal stops all round the frame, 6½ in. wide, beaded on outer edges; make and fix a solid frame at back of closet opening for portable cesspool, out of 4½ in. by 3 in. deal, 3 ft. by 1 ft. 6 in. clear dimensions, on which hang a ledged door before described.

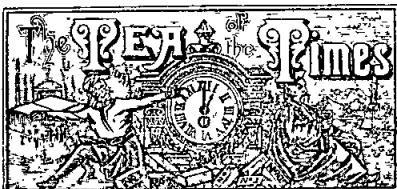
