Having duly compiled with the foregoing conditions, he will be required, on a date to be subsequently fixed, to undergo an examination in elementary inorganic chemistry, including chemical physics, and the chemistry of the following elements:—hydrogen, chlorine, oxygen, carbon, silicon, nutrogen, phosphorus, sulphur, potassium, sodium, calcium, magnesium, iron, aluminum; also a practical examination in the quantitative analysis of a mixture containing any or all of the following substances:—potassium, sodium, animonium, calcium, iron, and hydrochloric, carbonic, phosphoric, and sulphuric acids. He will be examined also in the use of common logarithms. The examination will be held about the end of February 1887, the exact date being fixed hereafter.

#### Term of Service.

The pupil's service in the department shall be for a term of four years, providing that during the first year his progress be sufficiently satisfactory.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations in connection with the above-named Grantin-aid, 1886-7, viz. :

#### AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES.

regulations for the distribution of the sum of Twenty thousand pounds(£20,000) granted by Parliament to Agricultural Societies, 1886-7. Regulations

- 1. That a sum of Sixteen hundred and seventy-nine pounds seven shillings be paid to agricultural societies, in accordance with the provisions of Clause 2 of Regulations gazetted 31st December 1885.
- 2. Each society shall furnish to the Secretary for Agriculture, on or before the 1st February 1887, a statement in the form marked A, which must be verified by statutory declaration in the form marked E.
- form marked E.

  3. On receipt of the above-mentioned statement so verified, the Minister of Agriculture may cause to be paid to the treasurer of each society a sum equal to two-thirds of the amount shown to have been awarded and paid away in prizes not exceeding £25 each (except for the exhibits mentioned in the statement above referred to, and such other exhibits the Minister may consider unsuitable), on condition that this sum do not exceed the amount raised by members' subscriptions and private donations; and if it do exceed the same, that it be in that case reduced to a sum equal to the amount so raised.

  4. Of the whole grant (£20,000), a sum not exceeding Seventeen thousand eight hundred and twenty pounds thirteen shillings shall be so divided; and if the sums claimable be in excess of this amount they shall be reduced pro ratá.
- 5. A sum not to exceed Five hundred pounds shall be paid to the Shepparton Amalgamated Agricultural Society towards the expenses of its spring show, held on the 26th, 27th, and 28th October 1886, under the patronage of the Department of Agri-
- 6. No society located within twenty miles of any other society shall be entitled to participate in the vote unless the sum awarded and paid away in prizes by such society as hereinbefore specified amounts in the total to One hundred pounds at least.

#### Instructions.

- 1. The blank spaces in the declaration, form E, for the sums awarded and paid in prizes and raised by members' subscriptions and private donations, between the 1st January 1886 and the 31st December 1886, must be filled up in words as well as in figures, and the declaration must be made before a justice of the peace by the treasurer of the society.
- 2. The account, when received, must be signed by the treasurer and be countersigned by the president, or the vice-president, or by two members of the committee of management. It should then be returned to the Secretary for Agriculture, Melbourne.

  3. Challenge cups must not be included in the return of prize moneys paid unless such cups have been finally awarded.

Note.—The forms B, C, and D are forwarded herewith by way of guidance, but can be made use of at the option of the society. If, however, extra forms be required, the same must be furnished by the applicant, and be of uniform size and pattern.

Regulations for the Care, Protection, and Management for a Raccourse in the Parish of Nullan. ent of a Reserve

WE, Michael Morris, J.P., Andrew Selkirk, and William Ernest Watts, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land in the parish of Nullan, temporarily reserved by Order of the 5th April 1886 as a site for a Racecourse, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 133 of The Land Act 1884:—

#### REGULATIONS.

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

5. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the suthority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the

Management first obtained.

8. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

9. No person shall remove any earth from or deposit any manure or rubbish on the reserve.

10. The Committee of Management may allow any part of the reserve to be depastured by quiet stock, the proceeds of such agistment to be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve.

11. The following shall be the scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the reserve and special enclosures therein, on such days as may be set apart for race

For admission at the gates of every person on foot, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding One shilling.

For admission at the gates of every person on horseback, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Two shillings and stypence.

For admission of every vehicle, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Five shillings.

For admission to the special enclosures in the reserve, such as saddling-paddock, including grand stand, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not ex-

ceeding Ten shillings.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of The Land Act 1834, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

- 2. By the 19th section of The Cemeteries Statute 1864, any pe 2. By the 1st section of the Centerres statute 2003, any person making a vault, or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery by and with the permission of the trustees under these rules, and upon the payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the terms of such permission, to and for the sole and separato use of such person or persons and his or their representatives for ever.

BYE-LAW No. 15.

ByE-LAW No. 15.

For keeping free from noisome matter private premises and yards, stables, and places used for noxious trades, staughteryards, dc.; and for regulating the management of earth-closets, privies, dc., disinfecting and deadorizing night-soil and other offensive matter, and for regulating its removal and final deposit.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Borough of Escentistical theorem of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and every other power enabling the said Local Board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. Fifteen of the said Local Board of Health, that is to 883;"—

Local Board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. Fifteen of the said Local Board of Health, that ist or say:

1. All former bye-laws on the matter and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this bye-law coming into operation.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the Government Gazette.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said borough.

4. The occupier of every house and premises within the said borough shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto, or occupied in connection therewith, to be kept so as not to be a muisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all refuse matter, filth, and rubbish to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground. And if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the local board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

5. The occupier of any land in the said borough on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, or pigsty shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard. And if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure produced to accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard. And if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

6. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement within

shall be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

6. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement within the said borough shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of one foot from the top of the sides, walls, or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Five a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mived therewith carbolic acid or some other efficient deodorizer, sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

7. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall, once at least in every week, empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

8. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of night-soil except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering, so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof, or of effluvia therefrom.

9. The occupier of every house, building, or other tenement on or in which the privy or closet belonging thereto shall not be provided with a "cesspool," constructed before the passing of the Public Health Amendment Statute 1883, and in accordance with the provisions of the 16th clause hereof, shall at all times cause to be kept in such privy or closet a supply of such dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any box, pan, bucket, or other receptacle in such privy or closet to be, immediately on the deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of dry powdered earth, or other deodorizing material as aforesaid, sufficiently to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such bucket, pan, or other receptacle.

10. All night-soil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and deposited in such place or places only as may be appointed by the local board from time to time for the final reception of the same.

11. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited or spread, or assisting in placing or depositing or spreading, on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place, shall, immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof, cover the same or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same ocovered, with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness.

the same covered, with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness.

12. The occupier of any premises within the borough used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtoring, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect to cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health; and any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be removed therefrom once in every 24 hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia. And if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier. Before any of the offensive matters hereinbefore mentioned arcremoved asaforesaid, the same shall have mixed therewith a quantity of chloride of zinc, perchloride of iron, Condy's fluid, chloride of lime, or some other efficient deadorizer, sufficient to effectually deadorize and disinfect the same.

13. No person shall deposit, or cause or suffer to be deposited, on any land, field, farm, or garden within the said borough, any night-soil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter as aforesaid which shall, with such consent of the Local Board of Health for the said borough; and any such offensive matter as aforesaid which shall, with such consent of the said Local Board of Health be so deposited, shall be, immediately on the deposit thereof, covered by the person depositing the same with such a quantity of earth as will at once prevent the escape of any noxious or offensive effluvium from any such mediately on the deposit thereof, covered by the person depositing the same with such a quantity of earth as will at once prevent the escape of any noxious or offensive before mentioned. Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties (such portion not being less than 5s.) to be paid. And any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such local board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.
