## AGRICULTURAL DEPARTMENT.

## PUPIL TO THE AGRICULTURAL CHEMIST.

APPLICATIONS will be received, addressed to the "Secretary for Agriculture, Melbourne," up to the 27th instant, from candidates desirous of being appointed Pupil to the Agricultural Chemist.

## CONDITIONS.

An applicant for the appointment must be not more than twenty years of age, and not less than sixteen. He will be required to produce a medical certificate to the effect that he is of sound constitution, and not affected with any bodily infirmity which would interfere with the proper exercise of his profession. He will be required to produce testimony as to his moral character, industry, and trustworthiness. He will also be required to show that he has had a good general education, that he possesses an elementary knowledge of general natural science, and that he has some aptitude for the use of tools and for ordinary constructive work.

## Examination.

Having duly complied with the foregoing conditions, he will be required, on a date to be subsequently fixed, to undergo an examination in elementary inorganic chemistry, including chemical physics, and the chemistry of the following elements:—hydrogen, chlorine, oxygen, carbon, silicon, nitrogen, phosphorus, sulphur, potassium, sodium, calcium, magnesium, iron, aluminium; also a practical examination in the quantitative analysis of a mixture containing any or all of the following substances:—potassium, sodium, ammonium, calcium, iron, and hydrochloric, carbonic, phosphoric, and sulphuric acids. He will be examined also in the use of common logarithms. The examination will be held about the end of February 1887, the exact date being fixed hereafter.

## Term of Service.

The pupil's service in the department shall be for a term of four years, providing that during the first year his progress be sufficiently satisfactory.

## Remuneration.

He will receive the following remuneration during the term of his pupilage:—1st year, £40; 2nd year, £50; 3rd year, £60; 4th year, £70.

## Subject to Regulations.

During the whole term of his pupilage and service in the department he shall be subject to the Regulations for the Public Service of Victoria, dated 31st December 1884, or any subsequent, substituted, or additional regulations.

## Bonds required.

The successful candidate for the appointment will be required to find two approved sureties, who shall enter into bonds for £150 each for the faithful performance of his duties.

## "THE FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACT 1885."

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the 29th section of *The Factories and Shops Act 1885* (49 Vict. 1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factories any female or any male under the age of sixteen for more than fifty-six hours in any one week, or more than ten hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That no such female or male under the age of sixteen shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without her or his consent.
3. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in each such factory for the information of all concerned.

**GRANT TO AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES.**

**T**HE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations in connection with the above-named Grant-in-aid, 1886-7, viz. —

**AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES.**

*Regulations for the distribution of the sum of Twenty thousand pounds (£20,000) granted by Parliament to Agricultural Societies, 1886-7.*

1. That a sum of Sixteen hundred and seventy-nine pounds seven shillings be paid to agricultural societies, in accordance with the provisions of Clause 2 of Regulations gazetted 31st December 1885.

2. Each society shall furnish to the Secretary for Agriculture, on or before the 1st February 1887, a statement in the form marked A, which must be verified by statutory declaration in the form marked E.

3. On receipt of the above-mentioned statement so verified, the Minister of Agriculture may cause to be paid to the treasurer of each society a sum equal to two-thirds of the amount shown to have been awarded and paid away in prizes not exceeding £25 each (except for the exhibits mentioned in the statement above referred to, and such other exhibits the Minister may consider unsuitable), on condition that this sum do not exceed the amount raised by members' subscriptions and private donations; and if it do exceed the same, that it be in that case reduced to a sum equal to the amount so raised.

4. Of the whole grant (£20,000), a sum not exceeding Seventeen thousand eight hundred and twenty pounds thirteen shillings shall be so divided; and if the sums claimable be in excess of this amount they shall be reduced *pro rata*.

5. A sum not to exceed Five hundred pounds shall be paid to the Shepparton Amalgamated Agricultural Society towards the expenses of its spring show, held on the 26th, 27th, and 28th October 1886, under the patronage of the Department of Agriculture.

6. No society located within twenty miles of any other society shall be entitled to participate in the vote unless the sum awarded and paid away in prizes by such society as hereinbefore specified amounts in the total to One hundred pounds at least.

*Instructions.*

1. The blank spaces in the declaration, form E, for the sums awarded and paid in prizes and raised by members' subscriptions and private donations, between the 1st January 1886 and the 31st December 1886, must be filled up in words as well as in figures, and the declaration must be made before a justice of the peace by the treasurer of the society.

2. The account, when received, must be signed by the treasurer and be countersigned by the president, or the vice-president, or by two members of the committee of management. It should then be returned to the Secretary for Agriculture, Melbourne.

3. Challenge cups must not be included in the return of prize moneys paid unless such cups have been finally awarded.

**NOTE.**—The forms B, C, and D are forwarded herewith by way of guidance, but can be made use of at the option of the society. If, however, extra forms be required, the same must be furnished by the applicant, and be of uniform size and pattern.

THE OMOO GOLDFIELD COMMON, proclaimed by Order of the 1st May 1871, increased by Orders dated respectively the 5th January 1880, the 12th April 1882, and the 27th July 1885, and diminished by Order of the 8th February 1886, is hereby further diminished by deducting therefrom four hundred and twenty acres, more or less, of land, being the blocks in the parish of Bingo-Munjie North applied for under the 67th section of *The Land Act 1884* by William Mesley.—(86.M.40318.)

THE TALLYGAROPNA COMMON, proclaimed by Order of the 18th January 1877, is hereby abolished.—(86.B.39159 & H.29952.)

THE ULUPNA COMMON, proclaimed by Order of the 6th February 1883, is hereby abolished.

And also excepting and reserving to Her Majesty her heirs and successors and each and every other lessee of any grazing area and her his and their agents and servants tenants and workmen liberty and right of ingress egress and regress at all times through over and across the premises hereby demised with or without horses cattle and other animals carts wagons and carriages to or from such grazing area or part thereof from and to any public road or track subject to such regulation to be made by the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council as may for the time being be in force. And also excepting and reserving unto Her Majesty her heirs and successors and all persons duly licensed under Section 93 of *The Land Act 1884* to cut and take away any live or dead timber on Crown lands and all persons specially licensed in that behalf by the Governor in Council full and free liberty to enter upon the said demised lands and therefrom to cut and take away live or dead timber. To have and to hold the premises hereinbefore expressed to be hereby demised unto the lessee his executors administrators and assigns for the term of \_\_\_\_\_ years and \_\_\_\_\_ calendar months less three days from the day of the date hereof. And also will not during the continuance of the term hereby granted ring or destroy or except for the purpose of fencing or building or domestic use on the land hereby demised cut down any timber in or upon the land hereby demised unless with the sanction of the Board of Land and Works signified in writing and then only under the supervision of an officer appointed in that behalf by the said Board. And also that these presents shall become absolutely void on any assignment thereof save under the provisions of *The Land Act 1884*. Provided always and it is hereby agreed and declared that Her Majesty her heirs and successors may at any time and from time to time during the said term resume possession of any part or parts of the land hereby demised which may in the opinion of the Governor with the advice aforesaid be required for the purposes of water supply irrigation works races dams and ditches or for public railways roads canals or for tramways or other internal communication through such lands or for mining purposes or for the purpose of obtaining or removing therefrom guano or other manure stone or earth or for sites of inns stores smithies bakeries or similar buildings or of bathing-houses bathing-places fishermen's residences drying grounds fellmongering establishments slaughter-houses lime-kilns bridges ferries toll or punt houses tanneries factories saw or paper mills quays docks landing places or the deposit of materials ship-building and repairing boat-building and repairing or for the working of mineral springs or for the manufacture of salt or for the purpose of erecting pumps or for the purpose of cutting digging and taking away any live or dead timber gravel stone ballast limestone coal salt shell seaweed and loam brick or other earth upon payment to the lessee his executors administrators or assigns for his interest in such lease together with the value of houses fences (within the meaning aforesaid) wells reservoirs tanks dams and of all substantial and permanent improvements made erected or constructed by the lessee his executors administrators or assigns during the currency of this lease on the land resumed. Provided always that the sum paid in respect of such improvements by the Board of Land and Works shall not exceed the sum expended thereon by the lessee his executors administrators or assigns. And that such sum shall be determined in accordance with Regulations in that behalf made by the Governor with the advice aforesaid. And that the compensation to be paid to the lessee his executors administrators or assigns in respect of his interest in this lease shall be determined in manner provided by *The Lands Compensation Statute 1869* or any Act amending the same. Provided always and it is hereby also agreed and declared that Her Majesty her heirs and successors may at any time and from time to time during the term hereby granted in accordance with the Regulations to be made by the Governor with the advice aforesaid in that behalf resume as sites for townships or villages or for mining purposes and re-enter upon any lands forming part of the land hereby demised upon payment to the lessee his executors administrators or assigns of the full value of all houses fences (within the meaning aforesaid) wells reservoirs tanks dams and of all substantial and permanent improvements made erected or constructed by the lessee his executors administrators or assigns on the lands so resumed but nothing in this lease contained shall be construed to give a better tenure to the lessee his executors administrators or assigns in regard to the right of miners authorized by the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering *The Land Act 1884* or Part III. thereof subject to any conditions he may think fit to impose to enter upon any portion specified by the said Minister of the land hereby demised in search of gold than was possessed by pastoral tenants under *The Land Act 1869* with regard to the right of miners to enter upon the lands occupied by such pastoral tenants. Provided always and it is hereby expressly agreed and declared that neither of the preceding provisions shall prejudice or be construed as restricting the generality of the covenant on the part of the lessee hereinbefore contained conferring on the holder of a miner's right or of a mining lease the right to enter upon the demised land and exercise the other rights in such covenant mentioned. Provided always and it is hereby also agreed and declared that the term hereby granted may be determined by Her Majesty her heirs or successors at any time by not less than three years' previous notice in writing of such intention addressed to the lessee his executors administrators or assigns being served upon him or them or left upon any part of the lands comprised in this lease and published in three consecutive ordinary numbers of the *Government Gazette* and upon payment to the lessee his executors administrators or assigns for his interest in this lease together with the value of houses fences (within the meaning aforesaid) wells reservoirs tanks dams and of all substantial and permanent improvements made erected or constructed by the lessee his executors administrators or assigns prior to the date of such notice and during the currency of this lease on the land so resumed provided that the sum paid in respect of such improvements by the Board of Land and Works shall not exceed the sum expended thereon by the lessee his executors administrators or assigns and that such sum shall be determined in accordance with the Regulations aforesaid and that the compensation to be paid to the lessee his executors administrators or assigns in respect of his or their interest in the lease shall be determined in manner provided by *The Lands Compensation Statute 1869* or any Act amending the same. Provided always and it is hereby agreed and declared and these presents are upon this condition that in the event of the lessee his executors administrators or assigns becoming the licensee or licensees



of any portion of the land hereby demised as an agricultural allotment and his or their license thereafter being annulled for any breach of the provisions of *The Land Act 1884* or of the condition of such license or if and whenever there shall be a breach of or non-compliance with any of the covenants by the lessee herein contained and the Governor with the advice aforesaid shall determine that this lease shall in consequence be avoided (and the production of the minute of the proceedings of the Executive Council whereat such determination was arrived at shall be conclusive evidence thereof) or if the land hereby demised or any part thereof is assigned whether by operation of law or otherwise except as hereinbefore mentioned or as in *The Land Act 1884* otherwise expressly provided then these presents and the term hereby created shall be void of no effect. the satisfaction of the said Board during the currency of this license To enclose within six years from the issue of this license if not sooner called upon under the provisions of *The Fences Statute 1874* the land herein comprised with a fence of such kind as shall come within the meaning assigned to the word "fence" by *The Land Act 1884* and keep the same in repair during the continuance of this license To make and erect on the said allotment before the end of the third year from the commencement of this license substantial and permanent improvements of the value of One pound for every acre and fractional part of an acre of the allotment and before the end of the sixth year from the said commencement of this license substantial and permanent improvement of the value of One additional pound for every acre or fractional part of an acre of the allotment At all times during the continuance of this license *bona fide* to comply with all and not to violate any of the And as ancillary and without prejudice to the provisions of the 45th and 121st sections of the said Act it is hereby agreed that immediately upon this license so becoming void and of no effect it shall be lawful for any bailiff of Crown lands or for any other agents or officers authorized in that behalf without any demand whatever to enter upon the said allotment and the licensee and all persons claiming under him for ever to expel and remove therefrom without any legal process whatsoever and so effectually as any sheriff might do in case Her Majesty had obtained judgment in ejectment or in an action for the recovery of land and a writ of *habere facias possessionem* or writ of possession or other process had issued on such judgment directed to such sheriff in due form of law and that in case of such entry and any action being brought or other proceedings taken for or on account of the same by any person whatsoever the defendants or defendant to such action may plead leave and license thereto and these presents shall be conclusive evidence of the leave and license of the licensee and all persons claiming under him to any bailiff of Crown lands and all persons acting in the matters complained of in such action or other proceedings. It is hereby declared that if the licensee fence and make the improvements of the nature and value hereinbefore mentioned on the said allotment during the said respective periods of three and six years and prove to the satisfaction of the Board of Land and Works (to be certified under its seal) by such evidence as the said Board may require that he has complied with the said conditions and with all other conditions hereof he shall be entitled at any time after the period of the currency of the license or during the term of the lease hereinafter mentioned to demand and obtain from the Governor in Council a Crown grant upon payment of Two pounds for each acre or fractional part of an acre or otherwise he may obtain a lease of the said allotment and such lease shall be for a term of fourteen years at a rent of Two shillings per annum for each acre or fractional part of an acre so demised payable in equal parts half-yearly in advance and will contain the usual covenants for the payment of rent and a condition for re-entry on non-payment thereof. And upon payment of the last sum due on account of the rent so reserved or at any time during the term upon payment of the difference between the amount of rent actually paid and the entire sum of Two pounds for each acre or fractional part of an acre the lessee or his representatives shall be entitled to a grant in fee of the lands leased and every such grant shall be subject to such covenants conditions exceptions and reservations as the Governor in Council may direct. Provided also that in the case of the insolvency or death of the licensee during the currency of this license it shall be lawful for the assignee or trustee in insolvency or for the executors or administrators of such licensee to assign such license to any person who is qualified for becoming a licensee under Part III. of the said Act and such person shall thereupon be with respect to such license in the same position as though he had been the original licensee. Except as herein otherwise expressly provided the word "licensee" shall include his executors and administrators and any person or persons in whom this license may under the provisions of the said Act become vested. And the licensee for himself his executors and administrators further covenants and agrees with Her Majesty her heirs and successors in the manner following that is to say In the event of any portion of the land hereby demised being at any time or times required by the Commissioners of Railways for the construction of railways railway stations or railway works already or hereafter authorized to be constructed or by the Governor or Administrator of the Government of Victoria by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof (hereinafter designated the Governor in Council) for any public road or highway to be hereafter set out by the Governor in Council he the said licensee his executors and administrators will upon being allowed by the Commissioners of Railways or Governor in Council one month after receiving notice in writing from the Commissioners of Railways or Governor in Council that the land is so required for the removal by him or them of any buildings erections or fences upon the land so required remove such buildings erections and fences and relinquish possession of the land so required and that neither he nor they will make any claim for compensation whatsoever for the said buildings erections or fences or for any improvements or for any moneys expended upon the said lands or for the cost which he or they may incur in such removal nor will he or they make any claim for compensation for any right or interest which he or they may possess in such land beyond a proportionate reduction in the license fee which shall in all cases be fixed by an officer appointed by the Governor in Council nor in respect of the severance from the other lands occupied by him or them under this license. And it is expressly agreed between the parties hereto that this covenant is to be construed as a release by the said licensee his executors and administrators to Her Majesty her heirs and successors from all or any payment to him or them and for all claims thereto which might otherwise have been made in respect of resumption of any portion of the land hereby demised for railway purposes or for the purposes of a public road or highway under the before contained conditions for resumption by or on behalf of Her Majesty her heirs and successors. #### MINYIP RACECOURSE.

*Regulations for the Care, Protection, and Management of a Reserve for a Racecourse in the Parish of Nullan.*

WE, Michael Morris, J.P., Andrew Selkirk, and William Ernest Watts, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land in the parish of Nullan, temporarily reserved by Order of the 5th April 1886 as a site for a Racecourse, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*—

#### REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.
6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
9. No person shall remove any earth from or deposit any manure or rubbish on the reserve.
10. The Committee of Management may allow any part of the reserve to be depastured by quiet stock, the proceeds of such agistment to be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve.
11. The following shall be the scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the reserve and special enclosures therein, on such days as may be set apart for race meetings:—

For admission at the gates of every person on foot, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding One shilling.

For admission at the gates of every person on horseback, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence.

For admission of every vehicle, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Five shillings.

For admission to the special enclosures in the reserve, such as saddling-paddock, including grand stand, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Ten shillings.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and willfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

- All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.
- By the 19th section of *The Cemeteries Statute 1864*, any person making a vault, or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery by and with the permission of the trustees under these rules, and upon the payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the terms of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons and his or their representatives for ever.
- Application for such permission must be made at the office of the secretary. A certificate of permission in the form set out in the Schedule A, will be granted to the party applying for such permission on payment of the proper charges.
- The charges on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery will be remitted on a certificate of a minister of religion or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relatives and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.
- Orders for interment must be given at the office of the secretary. Such notice to be given between the hours of 8 a.m. and 4 p.m. the day previous to the proposed interment, if not so given, an extra charge will be made. No free interment will be allowed without the above notice.
- The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be requested to construct them under the direction of the trustees; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent in writing of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.
- The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased must be stated at the time of giving the order.
- The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.
- Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for interment will be from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. in the months from September to April inclusive, and from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. in the other four months, except on Sundays, when the usual and only hours for funerals will be from 1 to 5 o'clock p.m. throughout the year.
- All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones must be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.
- Every coffin in a vault or brick grave shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, iron, or red-gum planking 2½ inches in thickness.
- A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet, proposed to be erected in the cemetery shall be submitted to the trustees for approval, who are empowered by the 18th section of the said Statute to determine and fix the position of any objectionable monument according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.
- No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.
- A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, will be kept at the office, and may be inspected, and a register of all graves shall be kept by the secretary.

15. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these regulations and in the scale of fees and charges.

No children allowed in the cemetery unless accompanied by responsible guardians.

No dogs allowed in the cemetery.

Any person or persons climbing fences, destroying flowers, or damaging graves or monuments will be prosecuted as the law directs.

BOROUGH OF ESSENDON.—LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH.

BYE-LAW No. 15.

*For keeping free from noisome matter private premises and yards, stables, and places used for noxious trades, slaughteryards, &c.; and for regulating the management of earth-closets, privies, &c., disinfecting and deodorizing night-soil and other offensive matter, and for regulating its removal and final deposit.*

**T**HE Local Board of Health in and for the Borough of Essendon, in the Colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and every other power enabling the said Local Board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. Fifteen of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matter and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this bye-law coming into operation.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said borough.

4. The occupier of every house and premises within the said borough shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto, or occupied in connection therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all refuse matter, filth, and rubbish to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground. And if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the local board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

5. The occupier of any land in the said borough on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, or pigsty shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state, in respect of cleanliness, as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard. And if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

6. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement within the said borough shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of one foot from the top of the sides, walls, or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Five a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid or some other efficient deodorizer, sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

7. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall, once at least in every week, empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

8. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of night-soil except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering, so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof, or of effluvia therefrom.

9. The occupier of every house, building, or other tenement on or in which the privy or closet belonging thereto shall not be provided with a "cesspool," constructed before the passing of the Public Health Amendment Statute 1883, and in accordance with the provisions of the 16th clause hereof, shall at all times cause to be kept in such privy or closet a supply of such dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any box, pan, bucket, or other receptacle in such privy or closet to be, immediately on the deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of dry powdered earth, or other deodorizing material as aforesaid, sufficiently to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such bucket, pan, or other receptacle.

10. All night-soil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and deposited in such place or places as may be appointed by the local board from time to time for the final reception of the same.

11. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited or spread, or assisting in placing or depositing or spreading, on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place, shall, immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof, cover the same or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered, with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness.

12. The occupier of any premises within the borough used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect to cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health; and any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be removed therefrom once in every 24 hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia. And if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier. Before any of the offensive matters hereinbefore mentioned are removed as aforesaid, the same shall have mixed therewith a quantity of chloride of zinc, perchloride of iron, Condy's fluid, chloride of lime, or some other efficient deodorizer, sufficient to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

13. No person shall deposit, or cause or suffer to be deposited, on any land, field, farm, or garden within the said borough, any night-soil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing without the written consent of the Local Board of Health for the said borough; and any such offensive matter as aforesaid which shall, with such consent of the said Local Board of Health, be so deposited, shall be, immediately on the deposit thereof, covered by the person depositing the same with such a quantity of earth as will at once prevent the escape of any noxious or offensive effluvia from any such manure, soil, or other offensive matter before mentioned. Provided that nothing contained in this bye-law shall be construed or taken to prevent the use as manure for any garden or land of the contents of any earth-closet, or any other privy or closet, where such contents are deposited on any such field, farm, or garden in a perfectly deodorized state, and so as not to cause nuisance or offence, either at the time of deposit of such contents or afterwards.

14. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered so as to be watertight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet.

15. No closet-door or trap shall abut or open on a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding ten feet in width.

16. All drains whatsoever, and the water-closets, earth-closets, privies, cesspools, and ashpits within the said borough shall be constructed and kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and so that there shall be no overflow, or seepage, or leakage therefrom; and every cesspool within the said borough which has been formed or made below the surface of the ground shall be also constructed so that the watertight walls or sides thereof shall project on all sides at least six inches above the surface of the ground in which such cesspools have been formed or made.

17. No person shall cart, carry, or convey, or cause or suffer to be carted, carried, or conveyed in or through the Borough of Essendon night-soil, offal, blood, or other offensive matter, except between the hours of Eleven o'clock p.m. and Five o'clock a.m. Provided that this provision shall not apply to night-soil produced upon the premises where any such night-soil shall be used.

18. No person shall deposit, or cause or suffer to be deposited, in or by the side of any street, or so as to be a nuisance to any person within the said borough, any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil, or other offensive matter.

19. No person shall deposit, or cause or suffer to be deposited, in or on any street, road, right-of-way, lane, passage, or water-channel, or in any creek, river, or reservoir, or in any other public place (not being a manure depot duly appointed by the Local Board of Health as a place for the deposit of such manure, rubbish, or other such refuse matter) any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, offal, manure, dung, or soil; and for the purposes of this bye-law, any unsold or reserved public lands, other than any manure depot as aforesaid, shall be deemed and taken to be a public place as before mentioned.

20. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty of

Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties (such portion not being less than 5s.) to be paid. And any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such local board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

The foregoing bye-law was, by special order, adopted and agreed to by the Local Board of Health for the Borough of Essendon, being the Municipal Council thereof, at an ordinary meeting held the 11th day of October 1886, and was duly confirmed by the said board at a special meeting held the 15th day of November 1886.

##### BYE-LAW 94.

*A Bye-law of the City of Prahran, made under the provisions of section 45 of "The Factories and Shops Act 1885," and numbered 94, for the licensing of certain shopkeepers, to wit, keepers of shops of the class of watchmakers, jewellers, and silversmiths, to keep open their shops after the statutory hours of closing, within the city of Prahran.*

WHEREAS a Petition has been presented to the Municipal Council of the City of Prahran by a majority of the shopkeepers keeping shops of the class of watchmakers, jewellers, and silversmiths seeking permission, on obtaining a license so to do, to keep open their shops after the statutory hours, within the city of Prahran.

And whereas such petition has been duly certified to by the municipal clerk as being signed by a majority of the shopkeepers keeping shops of the class as aforesaid: Now the Council of the City of Prahran doth hereby order and direct as follows, that is to say—Shopkeepers of the class of watchmakers, jewellers, and silversmiths, on obtaining a license so to do from the municipal clerk, may keep open their shops on each and every evening of the week (except Saturdays and Sundays) until the hour of nine of the clock, and on Saturdays until the hour of half-past ten of the clock in the evening.

Any shopkeeper keeping a shop of the class above specified failing or neglecting to close his shop in accordance with the provisions of this bye-law shall forfeit and pay for every such offence, being a first offence, a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings, and shall on conviction of any second or subsequent offence forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

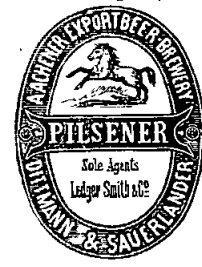

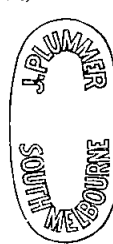
