JUBILEE HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the eighty-eighth section of *The Public Service Act 1833*, I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation appoint

MONDAY THE 20TH AND TUESDAY THE 21ST DAYS OF JUNE
PROXIMO

to be observed as Public Holidays throughout the Colony, in celebration of the completion by Her Most Gracious Majesty of the Fiftieth Year of Her Reign.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this thirty-first day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and in the fiftieth year of Her Majesty's reign.

PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the eighty-eighth section of *The Public Service Act 1833*, and the fifth section of *The Banks Holidays Act 1873*, I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation appoint

WEDNESDAY THE 1ST DAY OF JUNE NEXT

to be observed as a Public Holiday within the Shires of Dunmunkle, Glenlyon, and Mount Franklin; and as a Bank Holiday at Lubeck, Minyip, Murtosa, Queenscliffe, and Rupanyup.

WEDNESDAY THE 8TH DAY OF JUNE NEXT

to be observed as a Public and Bank Holiday within the Shire of Kowree.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the 29th section of *The Factories and Shops Act 1885* (49 Vict. No. 862), and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of the said section 29 in the

WORKROOMS OF MESSRS. BRIGHT AND HITCHCOCKS, GEELONG, for a period of three months from the date hereof, upon these express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said workrooms more than fifteen females, being dressmakers, for more than fifty-four hours in any one week in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without her consent.
3. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such workrooms for the information of all concerned.

MANTLE-ROOM OF MESSRS. CRAIG, WILLIAMSON, AND THOMAS, OF ELIZABETH STREET, MELBOURNE,

from the date hereof to the 30th June next, upon these express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said mantle-room any female for more than fifty-six hours in any one week in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That no female shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without her consent.
3. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such mantle-room for the information of all concerned.

PETITIONS UNDER "THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT" REFUSED.

THE Petitions under the provisions of *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506) from the subjoined ratepayers having been severally taken into consideration, the Governor in Council, in exercise of the discretionary power given by the 38th section of the said Act, has made Orders refusing the prayers of the said petitions, that is to say:—

From certain ratepayers of the Borough of Essendon, praying that a certain area, as described in their petition, and forming part of the Borough of Essendon, be severed therefrom and constituted a separate municipality, to be named the Borough of Ascot Vale.

From certain ratepayers of the Shire of Moorabbin, praying that a certain area, as described in their petition, and forming the West Riding of the Shire of Moorabbin, be severed therefrom and constituted a separate municipality, to be termed the Shire of Sandringham.

THE BOROUGH OF MARYBOROUGH SUBDIVIDED.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the thirty-first day of May 1887.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might from time to time make Orders, amongst other things, to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition purporting to be signed by more than one-fourth of the persons whose names are for the time being inscribed on the municipal roll of the Borough of Maryborough has been presented to the Governor in Council, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the said Act, and no counter petition has been received: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned doth by this present Order subdivide the Borough of Maryborough into three separate Wards, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follow, that is to say:—

EAST WARD.—Commencing at a point being the intersection of High street and Nolan street; thence northerly along the centre of High street and Park road to the borough boundary; thence by the borough boundary south-easterly and south-westerly to the centre of McCallum's Creek road; thence north-westerly along the centre of McCallum's Creek road, Cambridge street, and Nolan street to the commencing point.

SOUTH WARD.—Commencing at a point being the intersection of High street and Nolan street; thence south-westerly along the centre of High street to the Derby road; thence southerly along the centre of Derby road and Talbot road to the borough boundary; thence south-easterly and north-easterly by the borough boundary to the centre of McCallum's Creek road; thence north-westerly along the centre of McCallum's Creek road, Cambridge street, and Nolan street to the commencing point.

WEST WARD.—Commencing at a point being the intersection of High street and Nolan street; thence south-westerly along the centre of High street to the Derby road; thence southerly along the centre of Derby road and Talbot road to the borough boundary; thence north-westerly, north-easterly, and south-easterly by the borough boundary to the centre of the Park road; thence southerly by the centre of the Park road and High street to the commencing point.

Wherever the line so described as aforesaid runs beside or along any river, creek, or road, whether such is specifically mentioned or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road shall be taken to be the boundary line.

And His Excellency the Governor, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby further Order that a Council consisting of nine members be elected accordingly.

And the Honorable John Nimmo, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

THE CITY OF COLLINGWOOD RE-SUBDIVIDED.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition purporting to be signed by more than one-fourth of the persons whose names are for the time being inscribed on the municipal roll of the City of Collingwood has been presented to the Governor in Council, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the said Act, and no counter petition has been received: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order abolish all previous subdivisions of the City of Collingwood, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned doth hereby re-subdivide the said City of Collingwood into five separate Wards, the names and boundaries of which shall be as follow, that is to say:—

BARKLY WARD.—Commencing at the south-west angle of the city at the intersection of Victoria parade and Smith street; thence easterly along the Victoria parade to the centre of Hoddle street; thence northerly by Hoddle street to Vere street; thence west by Vere street to Wellington street; thence south by Wellington street to Stanley street; thence west by Stanley street to Smith street; and thence south by Smith street to the point of commencement.

DARLING WARD.—Commencing at the intersection of Stanley street with Smith street; thence east by Stanley street to Wellington street; thence northerly by Wellington street to Vere street; thence east by Vere street to Hoddle street; thence north by Hoddle street to Reilly street; thence west by Reilly street to Smith street; and thence south by Smith street to the point of commencement.

LOCH WARD.—Commencing at the intersection of Reilly street with Smith street; thence east by Reilly street to Hoddle street; thence north by Hoddle street to Ramsden street; thence east by Ramsden street to the Merri Creek; thence northerly and westerly by the Merri Creek to the Plenty road; thence south-westerly by the Plenty road and Heidelberg road to Smith street; and thence south by Smith street to the point of commencement.

VICTORIA WARD.—Commencing at the intersection of Victoria and Hoddle streets; thence easterly by Victoria street to the River Yarra; thence northerly and westerly by the River Yarra to Clarke street; thence northerly by Clarke street to Marine parade; thence westerly by Marine parade and Vere street to Hoddle street; and thence south by Hoddle street to the point of commencement.

ABBOTSFORD WARD.—Commencing at the intersection of Vere street with Hoddle street; thence east by Vere street and Marine parade to Clarke street; thence south by Clarke street to the River Yarra; thence following such river easterly and north-westerly to the Merri Creek; thence northerly by the Merri Creek to Ramsden street; thence westerly by Ramsden street to Hoddle street; thence southerly by Hoddle street to the point of commencement.

And His Excellency the Governor, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby further order that a Council consisting of fifteen members be elected accordingly.

And the Honorable John Nimmo, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
