PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir Henry Brougham Loch, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the eighty-eighth section of The Public Service Act 1883, and the fifth section of The Bank Holidays Act 1873, I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation appoint

WEDNESDAY THE 22ND DAY OF JUNE INSTANT

to be observed as a Public and Bank Holiday within the Shire of Kilmore;

MONDAY THE 27TH DAY OF JUNE INSTANT

to be observed as a Public and Bank Holiday within the Shire of Bacchus Marsh.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-first day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and in the fifty-first year of Her Majesty's reign.
