PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the fifth section of *The Bank Holidays Act 1873*, I, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation appoint

WEDNESDAY THE 22ND DAY OF JUNE INSTANT

a special day to be observed as a Bank Half-Holiday at Maldon, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon ;

THURSDAY THE 23RD DAY OF JUNE INSTANT

a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday at Queenscliff.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-second day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and in the fifty-first year of Her Majesty's reign.
