"THE PUBLIC SERVICE ACT 1883."—REGULATIONS.

SALARIES—NON-CLERICAL DIVISION.

Act No. 773, Section 41, and Sub-section VIII.

WHEREAS by *The Public Service Act 1883*, section 15, it is enacted that the Non-Clerical Division shall include all persons whose appointment has been determined by priority of registration, in accordance with Regulations to be made as hereinafter provided, and also all persons permanently employed in the Public Service before the passing of this Act, who are not included under the other divisions of the Public Service: And whereas by section 17 of the said Act it is enacted that in the Non-Clerical Division the officers shall be paid such emoluments, salaries, allowances, and wages, in accordance with a fixed amount or a scale to be determined by Regulation, and as may be provided in the annual Appropriation Act: And whereas by section 41 of the said Act it is enacted that the Public Service Board shall make Regulations which shall have full force and effect as soon as approved by the Governor in Council, and may subject to such approval, from time to time repeal, alter, and amend the same:—For determining a scale or amount to be paid to the persons employed in the different Departments included in the Non-Clerical Division, which, in the opinion of the Board, will be a fair equivalent for the work to be performed by such persons: And whereas the Public Service Board did make Regulations for such purposes, which Regulations were, on the 30th January 1885, approved by the Governor in Council: And whereas the said Regulations were from time to time amended by further Regulations made by the said Public Service Board and approved by the Governor in Council: And whereas it is expedient to alter the said Regulations: Now we, the undersigned, being the Members constituting the Public Service Board, in pursuance of the said powers, do make and declare the following alteration of the said Regulations, and declare that the same shall commence and come into operation as soon as approved as aforesaid:—

BYE-LAW No. 54.

WOOL RATES.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred by *The Victorian Railways Commissioners Act 1883*, do hereby make the following Bye-law for fixing the Charges and Regulations for the Carriage of Wool, and all previous Bye-laws conflicting therewith are hereby repealed:—

RATES PER BALE NOT OVER 4 CWT.

20 miles and under 1s.	Over 45 and up to 60 miles 4d.	} per bale for every 5 miles or part of 5 miles cumulative in each instance on preceding rate.

The above mileage rates do not apply to the Williamstown or Port Melbourne lines, or to wool consigned from country stations direct to the Williamstown or Port Melbourne piers, upon which 6d. per bale in addition to the above rates will be charged.

An allowance of 15 per cent. will be made on the above rates for all wool properly dumped.

Wool arriving at Albury by teams will be charged 9d. per bale added to the Wodonga rate for conveyance from Albury to Melbourne, Williamstown, or Port Melbourne.

Wool to the Williamstown or Port Melbourne piers may be consigned direct from country stations, provided that the name of the vessel it is intended for be given on the consignment note. If the vessel is not at the pier or not ready to ship the bales on their arrival, then the trucks may be brought back to Melbourne and unloaded there, all at the cost and risk of the owner.

Wool consigned from country stations to Melbourne, and then re-consigned to Williamstown or Port Melbourne without being removed from the sheds or trucks, will be charged 4d. per bale for warehousing in addition to the storage charges mentioned underneath.

Bags of wool are charged First-class Rates as per Goods Tariff, but will not be entitled to any rebates.

If from delay in this respect, or from any cause not due to the Commissioners, the vessel is not ready to receive wool or general cargo within twelve hours after the arrival of the trucks, demurrage will be strictly enforced at the rate of 10s. per truck per diem until the trucks are unloaded by the consignee, or until the Commissioners, at the cost and risk of the consignee, unload the trucks and send the goods to store. Wool consigned for shipment, and requiring to be dumped, will be deliverable at the Dumping Sheds, where a receipt must be given on behalf of the ship.

GENERAL CONDITIONS.

Bales over 4 cwt. will be charged 25 % additional upon the rate for a 4 cwt. bale for every cwt. or portion of a cwt. in excess.

The above rates are subject to minimum charges, as per Bye-law 28, dated 1st July, 1885.

Twelve hours will be allowed for the removal of wool after arrival of the trucks. From that time storage will be charged, and strictly enforced, at the rate of One penny per bale per diem until the wool is removed by the consignee, or sent to store by the Commissioners at the consignee's cost and risk. All wool is carried at owner's risk as to condition, and will be signed for accordingly. If detailed weight lists are furnished by the Commissioners for the use of consignees, the charge for weighing will be Fourpence per bale; if weighed by the owners, One penny per bale will be charged for the use of the scales. Consignors requiring weight lists must pay for same at sending station. Unless rebate sheets are rendered within two months of date on which wool is consigned no claim will be recognised.

The births of 1,264 children, viz., 617 boys and 647 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of May. In the month of April 1,216 births were registered, or 48 fewer than in the month under review. The births were 397 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but only 179 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in May numbered 666, viz., 345 of males and 321 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 598, or 99 per cent. The deaths were fewer than those in April by 33, but above the average of May during the previous ten years by 178. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded that average by only 54.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 3.40, and of deaths registered 1.79.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 66.0° on the 1st, and the lowest was 36.8° on the 20th. The mean temperature of the month (52.5°) was eight-tenths of a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (22.2°) took place on the 20th, viz., from a maximum of 59.0° to a minimum of 36.8°. The least range (6.3°) was on the 15th, viz., from a maximum of 56.0° to a minimum of 49.7°. The mean daily range was 11.3°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.401 inches on the 15th, and the lowest was 29.717 inches on the 23rd. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.070 inches) was slightly above the average.

Rain fell on 15 days, the amount of rainfall being 1.98 inch. The average rainfall in May during the last ten years was 1.95 inch, or slightly lower than that of the month under review.

Fog occurred on 5 days during the month.

Males contributed 52 per cent., and females 48 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 32 per cent. to that mortality, as against 32 per cent. in May 1886, 33 per cent. in May 1885, 36 per cent. in May 1884, 34 per cent. in May 1883, 30 per cent. in May 1882, 31 per cent. in May 1881 and in May 1880, 39 per cent. in May 1879, 26 per cent. in May 1878, and 34 per cent. in May 1877.

As many as 40 deaths of persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month, viz.:— Those of a gentleman, aged 75, a male inmate of the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum and a female, each aged 80, who died of cancer; a female, aged 75, of valvular disease of the heart; 2 females, aged 75 and 79 respectively, of heart disease; a sugar-boiler, aged 75, and a farmer, aged 78, of stomach disease; a female, aged 78, of dyspepsia; a laborer, aged 76, and a female, aged 84, of apoplexy; a male cook, aged 78, a female housekeeper, aged 82 (both inmates of the Benevolent Asylum), and a gentleman, aged 99, of pneumonia; a pattern-maker, aged 75 (an inmate of the Benevolent Asylum), of congestion of the lungs; a female, aged 76, of gangrene of the foot; a farmer, aged 76, of obstruction of the intestines; a miner, aged 77, of cystitis; a gentleman, aged 78, of cirrhosis of the liver; a wood-cutter, aged 81, of Bright's disease; a male, of no occupation, aged 82, and a female, aged 84, of

bronchitis; a shoemaker, aged 86, of diarrhoea; a male patient in the Kew Lunatic Asylum, aged 87, of brain disease; a fisherman, (an inmate of the Benevolent Asylum), a carter, and 2 females, each aged 75, a gentleman, aged 79, a female, aged 80, a farmer, aged 81, a grazier and a female, each aged 83, a surgeon, aged 84, a fisherman (an inmate of the Benevolent Asylum), a laborer, and a female, each aged 85, a female, aged 90, a merchant, aged 99, and a female, said to be aged 102, of old age.

Twenty-eight deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which 19 were set down to accident, 3 to homicide, and 6 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A carter, aged 20, died of rupture of the kidney, caused whilst playing football; a cutter, aged 20, and a law clerk, aged 32, were killed, the former by a cab, and the latter by a tram-car passing over him; a laborer, aged 45, died of internal injuries received by falling from a locomotive engine, whilst coaling; a bank superintendent, aged 53, succumbed to injuries received in a railway accident; a male patient in the Kew Lunatic Asylum, aged 39, died of fracture of the skull, the result of a fall from a cart; a tailor, aged 51, of effusion of blood on the brain; a female, aged 67, of fracture of the skull, and a female, aged 69 of exhaustion—all due to falls. A boy, aged 7, died of convulsions, caused by falling on a nail, which entered the knee joint; a gentleman, aged 62, of burns; an engineer, aged 54, of lead poisoning; a female infant, aged 1 year, was drowned in a bucket of water; a joiner, aged 48, a female, aged 55, and a carpenter, aged 51, were drowned in the River Yarra; a female infant was suffocated at birth; a female infant, aged 1 day, was overlain; and a male infant died of injuries received at birth. The homicidal deaths were those of a male and a female infant, who were suffocated at birth (verdict of wilful murder being brought in in each case); and a male infant, that died in consequence of criminal neglect at birth. Of the suicidal deaths, a dentist, aged 30, shot himself in the head; a male housekeeper, aged 25, and a stone polisher, aged 56, cut their throats; a female, aged 17, poisoned herself with strychnine; and a boots, aged 21, poisoned himself with "Rough on rats"; and a plumber, aged 47, drowned himself in a quarryhole in Richmond.

One hundred and fifteen deaths, or 17 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—38 in the Melbourne Hospital, 16 in the Alfred Hospital, 2 in the Children's Hospital, 4 in the Women's Hospital, 14 in the Immigrants' Home, 9 in the Benevolent Asylum, 11 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 13 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 4 in the Austin Hospital, 2 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Eye and Ear Hospital, and 1 in the Infant Asylum.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 210, of which 111, or 53 per cent., were of males, and 99, or 47 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 134 were under one year of age, 41 were between one and two, 17 were between two and three, 11 were between three and four, and 7 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 456. Of these, 234, or 51 per cent., were males, and 222, or 49 per cent., were females; 28 were between five and ten, 5 were between ten and fifteen, 30 were between fifteen and twenty, 42 were between twenty and twenty-five, 39 were between twenty-five and thirty, 33 were between thirty and thirty-five, 34 were between thirty-five and forty, 30 were between forty and forty-five, 27 were between forty-five and fifty, 32 were between fifty and fifty-five, 36 were between fifty-five and sixty, 28 were between sixty and sixty-five, 31 were between sixty-five and seventy, 21 were between seventy and seventy-five, 19 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 21 were upwards of eighty.

In May, as compared with the previous month, there was a decrease of 41 in the deaths from specific febrile or zymotic diseases, but an increase of 40 in those from local diseases. Under the former head, deaths from typhoid fever fell from 57 to 40, and those from diarrhoeal diseases from 48 to 21; those from diphtheria, however, increased from 6 to 10. Under the local head, deaths from diseases of the nervous system rose from 71 to 77, those from affections of the heart from 40 to 52, those from complaints of the throat and chest from 59 to 102, and those from diseases of parturition from 3 to 11. On the other hand, deaths from complaints of the bowels and stomach fell from 69 to 52, and those from disorders of the urinary system from 30 to 17. No less than 16 deaths of child-bearing women occurred during the month, as against 9 in April. If these numbers be compared with the births during the same months, it will follow that 1 death of a mother took place to every 79 children born alive in May, and 1 to every 135 such children in the previous month.

2. That a sum of Fifty-eight pounds one shilling and sixpence (£58 1s. 6d.) be paid to the treasurer of the Clunes Borough Council as subsidy for improvements made during the year 1885 in the Creek Reserve Gardens, Clunes.
3. That a sum of Fifty pounds (£50) be paid to the committee of the Ocean Park, Sorrento, to be expended in the formation of a road in the said park.
4. That a sum of Five shillings (5s.) be paid to the treasurer of the managing body of any public park or garden having a claim on the vote under clause 1 of the Regulations of 23rd December 1886, for every One pound expended from local contributions on works specified in the above-mentioned Regulations.

Upon the filling, as specified, being completed to the satisfaction of the Surveyor-General, he shall give a certificate, under his hand, to that effect, and the absence of such certificate shall be evidence that the filling has not been completed. The purchaser shall maintain the filling before mentioned to such levels during the currency of the lease.

4. The lessee of each site shall erect thereon within seven years of the date of the lease a building or buildings of a value equal at

MAGORRA PARK, SHIRE OF TOWONG.

Regulations for the Care, Protection, and Management of the Reserve for a Public Park and for other purposes of Public Recreation in the Parish of Magorra, known as "Magorra Park."

THE Council of the Shire of Towong, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for a Public Park and for other purposes of Public Recreation in the parish of Magorra, known as "Magorra Park," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the 133rd section of *The Land Act 1884*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be parcelled out into the following divisions:—

- (a) The cricket ground.
- (b) The remainder of the reserve.

2. The reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise till sunset, except on days set apart for shows, races, sports, fêtes, and holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a charge for the admission of every adult may be made.

3. The following shall be the scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to either of the divisions of the reserve:—

For admission of every adult to the first division, such sum as the council may determine, not exceeding two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.).

For admission of every adult to the second division, such sum as the council may determine, not exceeding two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.).

4. The council shall be at liberty to allow any duly recognized committee of any shows, races, sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements to use either or both of the divisions of the reserve; and such committee shall abide by any order given by the council in reference to the reserve, or buildings, or other erections for the time being thereon.

5. No person shall remain in the reserve who shall offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

6. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, or light fires therein.

7. No person shall climb upon or jump over the fences or gates, or stick bills or cut names thereon, or in any way damage the trees, seats, or any building whatsoever, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

8. No person shall put in the reserve any horses or cattle or take horses therein without first obtaining the written permission of the council, provided always that the money received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

9. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the council first obtained.

10. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantation of young trees or shrubs.

11. Any person committing in the reserve or in any of the buildings or other erections for the time being thereon any of the following offences shall be liable to be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased and shall or may be in possession of a ticket of admission to the reserve or either of the divisions thereof:—

- 1. Assaulting any person.
- 2. Being drunk.

3. Crossing or trespassing on the cricket or playing ground during the time any cricket match or other amusement is taking place, or when crossing or trespassing on such ground would injuriously affect it for the several purposes for which the same is set apart.
4. Using profane or obscene language.
5. Using abusive or insulting words.
6. Behaving improperly or riotously.
7. Obtaining admission to the reserve or any buildings thereon when not entitled to such admission, or refusing to surrender (if required) to any gatekeeper or other authorized person any ticket duly authorizing admission to that division of the reserve where such person shall be found.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the 133rd section of *The Land Act 1884*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
