"THE PUBLIC SERVICE ACT 1883."—REGULATIONS.
SALARIES—NON-CLERICAL DIVISION.

Act No. 773, Section 41, and Sub-section VIII.

WHEREAS by *The Public Service Act 1883*, section 15, it is enacted that the Non-Clerical Division shall include all persons whose appointment has been determined by priority of registration, in accordance with Regulations to be made as hereinafter provided, and also all persons permanently employed in the Public Service before the passing of this Act, who are not included under the other divisions of the Public Service; And whereas by section 17 of the said Act it is enacted that in the Non-Clerical Division the officers shall be paid such emoluments, salaries, allowances, and wages, in accordance with a fixed amount or a scale to be determined by Regulation, and as may be provided in the annual Appropriation Act: And whereas by section 41 of the said Act it is enacted that the Public Service Board shall make Regulations which shall have full force and effect as soon as approved by the Governor in Council, and may, subject to such approval, from time to time repeal, alter, and amend the same:—For determining a scale or amount to be paid to the persons employed in the different Departments included in the Non-Clerical Division, which, in the opinion of the Board, will be a fair equivalent for the work to be performed by such persons: And whereas the Public Service Board did make Regulations for such purposes, which Regulations were, on the 30th January 1885, approved by the Governor in Council: And whereas the said Regulations were from time to time amended by further Regulations made by the said Public Service Board and approved by the Governor in Council: And whereas it is expedient to alter the said Regulations: Now we, the undersigned, being the Members constituting the Public Service Board, in pursuance of the said powers, do make and declare the following alteration of the said Regulations, and declare that the same shall commence and come into operation as soon as approved as aforesaid:—

SHIRE OF BACCHUS MARSH.

BYE-LAW No. 1, AS TO DAIRIES, DAIRY CATTLE, AND MILK.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Bacchus Marsh, in the Colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in *The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883*, and every other power enabling the said Local Board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 1 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.
2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said shire.

Registration of Cowkeepers, Dairymen, and Purveyors of Milk.

4. Every person carrying on the trade of cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of September in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of One shilling.

Sir,—I desire to be registered in accordance with the particulars in the schedule hereunder:—

5. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the secretary for the Local Board of Health shall endorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected

by any member or officer of the said Local Board, or by any person authorized in writing by the chairman or secretary of the said Local Board; and if, on inspection, such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them, are or is likely in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said Local Board may, by an order in writing signed by the secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or in the case of an unregistered person served personally or left at his dwelling-place, or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said Local Board may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated; and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept, and be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person, or any member of the family of any person, registered as aforesaid, or not so registered, but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the Local Board or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said Local Board or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, until danger, in the opinion of such Local Board or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until, in either case, all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy, or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the Local Board, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force; and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep or permit or suffer to be kept any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

13. In the interpretation of this bye-law words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

14. Every person guilty of any breach of this bye-law or of any of its provisions shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings, for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

The foregoing bye-law was duly made, ordered, and passed by the Local Board of Health (being the Municipal Council) in and for the Shire of Bacchus Marsh this ninth day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

PANNOOBAMAWM PUBLIC CEMETERY.

Rules and Regulations.

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened up.
2. Any person making a vault, or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees, under these rules, and upon payment of the proper charges, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep up a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person and persons and his or their representatives for ever.
3. Orders for interment must be given to the person in charge of the cemetery at least eight working hours prior to the hour fixed for the funeral; if not, an extra charge will be made (see Miscellaneous Charges). No free interment will be allowed without the above notice.
4. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but when a brick or other grave or vault is required, it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees or some person duly appointed by them; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to another person, the consent in writing of such person must be left with the order.
5. No grave to be of less depth than six feet.
6. When giving the order for interment a form of application for burial, containing the name, age, and late place of residence of the deceased, will be provided, and must be filled up when practicable, and entered in the interment-book.
7. The time fixed for the funeral to be at the cemetery must be punctually observed.
8. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.
9. The hours fixed for interments will be from Ten a.m. to Six o'clock p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. in the other four months of the year.
10. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and a plan of every monument must be submitted to the trustees for their approval.
11. Wooden fences allowed, but if not kept in proper repair they may be removed by order of the trustees without notice to the owner.
12. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, and registers of all grants, will be kept by the secretary for inspection.
13. Any person wilfully or wantonly destroying or doing or causing to be done any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the cemetery will be prosecuted in accordance with the Cemeteries Statute.
14. No funeral will be allowed to take place in the cemetery without a certificate from a duly authorized person, such certificate to be delivered to the person in charge at the cemetery before the funeral enters the gates.
15. The trustees reserve the right to add to and make alterations from time to time in the regulations.

RUPANTUP PUBLIC CEMETERY.

Rules and Regulations.

1. All charges must be paid to the secretary when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.
2. Order for interment must be given to the person in charge of the cemetery before Five o'clock p.m. on the day previous to the interment.
3. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of deceased must be stated at the time of giving the order.
4. The procession to arrive at the cemetery punctually at the hour appointed for the funeral.
5. The usual hours of interment will be from Ten o'clock a.m. to Five o'clock p.m., except on Sundays, when the hours will be from Two o'clock p.m. to Five o'clock p.m.
6. The charge will be remitted for the burial of any person on evidence being produced before the trustees that the relatives or friends of such person are unable to pay the costs and charges.
7. Application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery to be made to the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to persons applying.
8. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug; but when a brick grave or vault is required, it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees or some person duly appointed by them; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to another person, the consent in writing of such person must be left with the order.
9. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

10. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, or covered with a slab of freestone, granite, slate, or iron.

11. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and a plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription, to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who may withhold permission and prevent the erection of any monument which shall appear to them inappropriate or unbecoming, and shall determine and fix the position of any monument which may be preferred to be erected, according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.

12. Wooden fences allowed, but if not kept in proper repair may be removed by order of the trustees without notice to the owner.

13. A plan of the cemetery and a registry will be kept, and may be inspected at the office of the secretary or sexton.

14. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

15. It is notified that any person wantonly or wilfully destroying or doing or causing to be done any damage to any monument, tombstone, or vault, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the cemetery is guilty of a misdemeanor, and, being convicted thereof, is liable to be punished as prescribed by the Act in that case made and provided.

16. No dogs will be allowed to enter the cemetery.

17. The cemetery will be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

18. Three of the trustees to form a quorum.

19. No grave to be of a less depth than six (6) feet. The trustees reserve the right to make any alteration from time to time in these regulations.

20. No vehicles except the hearse and mourning coaches will be permitted to enter the cemetery unless by special permission of the trustees.

SHIRE OF ARARAT.

BYE-LAW No. 2.

A Bye-law of the Shire of Ararat, made under the 213th section of the Local Government Act 1874, numbered two, for the regulation of waterworks, drains, &c.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1874, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Ararat order as follows:—

That sections one to six, part two, both inclusive, of the Thirtieth Schedule of the Local Government Act 1874 are hereby adopted in and for the Shire of Ararat:—

1. Whosoever shall bathe in any stream, reservoir, conduit, aqueduct, or other waterworks belonging to or under the management or control of the council, or shall wash, cleanse, throw, or cause to enter therein any animal, whether alive or dead, or any rubbish, filth, stuff, or thing of any kind whatsoever, or shall cause or permit or suffer to run or be brought therein the water of any sink, sewer, drain, engine, or boiler, or other filthy unwholesome or impure water, or shall do anything whatsoever whereby any water or waterworks belonging to the council, or under their management or control, shall be fouled obstructed or damaged shall for every such offence forfeit on conviction a sum not exceeding Five pounds, and a further sum not exceeding Twenty shillings for each day while such offence is continued after written notice in that behalf.

2. Whosoever being supplied with water by the council from any waterworks of or belonging to or under the control or management of the council, or having access to any such waterworks for the taking of water therefrom, shall wilfully or negligently suffer any water to run to waste from any pipe or conduit from or by which he shall be so supplied or to which he shall have such

access, shall on conviction forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

3. Whosoever shall, without the consent in writing of the council, construct or place any dam or embankment in or across any river creek or natural watercourse, or permanently obstruct the same in any way, shall on conviction forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds, and a further sum not exceeding Five pounds for every day after such conviction during which such dam or embankment or any part thereof shall continue.

4. In any case in which the council has the exclusive right of collecting for the supply of any reservoir or waterworks belonging to the council or under their management or control the storm-water having fallen on any gathering-ground, whosoever shall by any means whatsoever divert any such water from the course of its natural flow so that the same shall tend to flow elsewhere than to such reservoir or waterworks or some watercourse leading thereto, or shall flow to the same respectively in a foul state, shall forfeit on conviction a sum not exceeding Fifty pounds, and a further sum not exceeding Ten pounds for every day after such conviction during which such water so tends to flow or flows as the case may be.

5. It shall be lawful for the council from time to time to make regulations for prohibiting or regulating the shooting of water-fowl and the taking of fish upon or in or within one quarter of a mile of any stream reservoir or other waterworks belonging to or under the management or control of the council; and every person who shall offend contrary to any such regulation shall on conviction forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

6. Whosoever shall obstruct or damage any culvert, sewer, or drain belonging to or under the control of the council shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds, and shall pay to the council, by way of compensation for any such damage, such further sum not exceeding Ten pounds as the convicting justice shall order.

SHIRE OF COBURG.

BYE-LAW No. 4.

Definition of area for compulsory removal of night-soil.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Coburg, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883" and every other power enabling the said Local Board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board, doth hereby make the following Bye-law No. 4, in the place of Bye-law No. 3 of the said Local Board of Health which is hereby repealed:—

Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises within the undermentioned area shall have all nightsoil removed from their premises, at least once a week, by any nightman or person contracting with the Local Board of Health to remove nightsoil, and they shall pay to any person authorized to receive payment for such removal any sum the Local Board of Health may determine, such area to be on the east side of the Sydney road from Moreland road to Bridge road, a distance of thirty chains from the Sydney road eastward, and on the west side of the Sydney road from Moreland road to Gaffney's road, a distance of thirty chains westward.

This bye-law to come into operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

Every person guilty of any breach of this bye-law or any of its provisions shall be liable in the discretion of the convicting justices to a penalty not exceeding £10 nor less than 5s., or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding £5 nor less than 5s. for each day during which such breach shall have been committed or continued.

The foregoing bye-law was duly made, ordered, and passed by the Local Board of Health, being the Municipal Council in and for the Shire of Coburg, this eighteenth day of April in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

A Bye-law of the Shire of Broadmeadows, made under Section 213 of Part 10 of "The Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 1, and for the adoption of such of the provisions of the 13th Schedule of "The Local Government Act 1874," as are contained in Part I, Subdivision 3, under the heading "Obstructions, &c., to Streets, &c., by Cattle, &c."

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Local Government Act 1874," the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Broadmeadows order as follows:—

That such of the provisions of the Thirtieth Schedule of "The Local Government Act 1874" as are contained in part one, subdivision nine, under the heading "Obstructions, &c., to streets, &c., by cattle, &c.," and hereinafter set out, be and the same are hereby adopted in and for the Shire of Broadmeadows:—

"THIRTIETH SCHEDULE.—PART ONE, SUBDIVISION NINE.

"Obstructions, &c., to Streets, &c., by Cattle, &c."
"If any cattle shall be found upon any land not being a common, and such that there is no fence, whether upon the same

land or any other dividing such first-mentioned land from any street or road, whether public or private, without any person having charge of such cattle, the owner of such cattle shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings for every head of such cattle, and the proper officer of the council may seize such cattle and place the same at some neighbouring place of safe custody; and any justice, if such owner be not known, upon proof of the issue of a summons in the usual form, addressed to such owner as 'owner' only, without otherwise naming or describing him, such cattle and the place of seizure being duly described therein, and of the publication of such summons in some newspaper commonly circulating in the neighbourhood, may, after the expiration of twenty-four hours from such publication, proceed with respect to such owner not appearing as if personal service of a summons stating his name had been effected, or if such owner appear then as in other cases; and the justice may order the cattle to be sold, and the money arising from the sale, after deducting the said penalty and the costs awarded and the reasonable expenses, to be estimated and assessed by the justice, of seizing, keeping, and selling the said cattle, shall be paid, if demanded, within one month to the owner of the cattle, and if not so demanded, then to the municipal fund; and if the said money shall not be sufficient for all the purposes aforesaid, the amount whereby the same falls short, or if no such sale be ordered the whole of the said amount may be recovered from the said owner, if and when known, in like manner as other penalties and sums adjudged or ordered to be paid by justices are to be recovered.

"If any cattle be at any time found in any street without any person having the charge thereof, the owner of such cattle shall forfeit, for every head of such cattle, a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings, and if such cattle shall, by reason of having been so found at large, have been impounded by the council, the amount of such penalty and costs, if adjudged respectively before the release or sale of such cattle, shall be added to the pound fees and charges payable in respect of such cattle, and the amount thereof, or such lesser amount (if any) as after the sale of the cattle may remain in the hands of the poundkeeper, shall be paid over by him accordingly; and if the proceeds of any sale of such cattle shall not be sufficient, after paying the lawful fees and charges aforesaid, to satisfy such penalty and costs, or if such penalty and costs shall have been adjudged after the release or sale of the cattle, the same or so much thereof as remains unpaid shall and may be recovered from the owner of the cattle in like manner as other penalties and costs adjudged by justices are by law to be recovered; and if in the case of any information under this section the owner be not known, then the provisions of the last preceding section, so far as necessary to give the adjudicating justice jurisdiction, shall apply.

"If any goat shall have been impounded under the provisions of either of the two last preceding sections or under the provisions of this bye-law relating to the impounding of cattle for trespass in the streets, and shall not after the expiration of twenty-four hours be released and the penalty, costs, fees, and charges be paid by the owner thereof, any justice may by warrant under his hand, directed to any constable, authorize the destruction of such goat, and the same may be destroyed accordingly.

"It shall be lawful for the council to make regulations from time to time for appointing the hours during which it shall not be lawful to drive into or through the municipal district or such parts thereof, as shall by boundaries be set forth in such regulation, any cattle intended for sale, slaughter, or shipment, or travelling from one part of Victoria or of any other colony to any other part, and to provide, if they shall see fit, in such regulation separately with respect to Sundays and week days; and if any person shall drive any such cattle contrary to such regulation he shall forfeit for every head of cattle so driven a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings. Provided that nothing herein contained shall apply to horses driven in harness or to oxen in yoke.

"It shall not be lawful to break in any horse or other animal in any street, whether public or private, or in any public place, save such public places as from time to time may be appointed by some regulation of the council in that behalf, which regulation the council are hereby authorized to make, or by locking the wheels of any cart or other vehicle or otherwise to test or try any horse or other animal so as to obstruct or injure any street or public place; and any person offending against this section shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds."

Passed this twenty-fourth day of June One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

The resolution for passing the foregoing bye-law was agreed to by the Council of the Shire of Broadmeadows, at a meeting thereof held on the twenty-ninth day of April One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and confirmed in a subsequent meeting of the council of the said shire, held on the twenty-fourth day of June One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and sealed with the common seal of the said shire, and passed on the said twenty-fourth day of June One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.
