GRANT OF ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY POUNDS (£150) FOR INVENTION OF MACHINERY FOR THRASHING PEASE.

A SUM not exceeding One hundred and fifty pounds may be paid to any person or company who shall, in the opinion of the Minister of Agriculture, produce a machine capable of thrashing within twelve hours eight hundred bushels of pease without injury thereto.

2. The reward shall be paid only to the inventor, or his agent, of such machine as shall most cheaply, efficiently, and rapidly perform the work required, and within the time aforesaid.

3. Persons intending to compete for the reward must give notice in writing of their intention to the Secretary for Agriculture, Melbourne, not later than the 24th November next.

4. One or more trials of the machines shall be made at such place or places and at such times as the Minister may direct.

5. All costs and expenses of forwarding, attendance, and working the machines at the times to be appointed shall be paid by the persons entering the machines for competition.

6. The Minister may appoint three or more judges to report upon the merits of the competing machines, and a decision of a majority of such judges shall be final.

7. The judges may recommend payment of an amount or amounts the total of which shall not exceed One hundred and fifty pounds (£150) to the inventor or inventors, or his or their agent or agents, of the successful machine or machines, such amounts to be apportioned to the value to the colony of the said invention or inventions.

"THE FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACT 1885."

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the 23rd section of *The Factories and Shops Act 1885* (49 Vict. No. 862), and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of the said section 29 in the

FACTORY OF MR. WILLIAM DETMOLD, 44 COLLINS STREET EAST, from the date hereof to the 31st July 1887, upon these express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory any male under the age of sixteen for more than fifty-four hours in any one week, or more than ten hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That no male under the age of sixteen shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without his consent.
3. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory for the information of all concerned.

WHEREAS by *The Discipline Act 1870* it was provided that the Governor in Council might make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government of persons engaged by virtue of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Act, and from time to time amend, alter, or amend the same and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following alterations in the Regulations for the Victorian Military Forces, that is to say:—

PART II.—SECTION X.—DRESS REGULATIONS.

Page 29—

In the first line strike out "musketry and gunnery," and in the second line strike out "musketry," and add at the end of the section—

*Certified Signallers.*

A badge of cross flags worked in gold with S in blue on each flag.

*Ambulance Corps.*

White linen badge with Geneva cross in red.

*Ordnance, Transport, and Commissariat Corps.*

The letters O.C.T. worked in gold for non-commissioned officers; in yellow worsted for privates or gunners.

"THE PUBLIC SERVICE ACT 1883."—REGULATIONS.

CLASSIFICATION OF PROFESSIONAL DIVISION.

Act No. 773, Section 41, Sub-section 1.

WHEREAS by *The Public Service Act 1883*, section 12, it is enacted that the Professional Division of the Public Service shall include all persons holding those offices, whether now existing or hereafter to be created, which require for their exercise some skill usually acquired only in some profession or other pursuit different from that required in the Clerical or Non-Clerical Division; and also the persons holding the offices of Inspector-General, Assistant Inspector-General, and Inspectors in the Education Department, as existing at the time of the passing of the said Act, or thereafter to be created: And whereas by section 17 of the said Act it is enacted that the officers in the Professional Division shall be paid such salaries, in accordance with a fixed amount or scale to be determined by Regulation, and as may be provided in the annual Appropriation Act: And whereas by section 22 of the said Act it is enacted that the Public Service Board shall classify the work performed by all persons employed in offices doing professional work in accordance with Regulations to be made by them in that behalf, and that such persons shall thereupon be placed in the Professional Division in the respective classes assigned to the work performed by them: And whereas by section 41 of the said Act it is enacted that the Public Service Board shall make Regulations which shall have full force and effect as soon as approved by the Governor in Council, and may, subject to such approval, from time to time repeal, alter, and amend the same:—For the arrangement of the Professional Division into as many classes as the Public Service Board consider expedient or desirable, and for the determination of the order of promotion therein, and of the amount to be paid to each of the persons in each of such classes which, in the opinion of the Public Service Board, will be a fair equivalent for the work to be performed by such persons: And whereas the Public Service Board did make Regulations for such purposes, which Regulations were, on the 12th January 1885, approved by the Governor in Council: And whereas the said Regulations were amended by further Regulations made by the said Public Service Board, and approved by the Governor in Council on the 19th January 1886: And whereas it is expedient to alter and amend the said Regulations: Now we, the undersigned, being the Members constituting the said Public Service Board, in pursuance of the said powers, do make and declare the following alterations and amendments of the said Regulations, and declare that the same shall commence and come into operation as soon as approved by the Governor in Council as aforesaid:—

In pursuance of the powers conferred by *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881*, the Chairman and Commissioners of the

Avoca Water Trust make the Regulation following, that is to say:—

1. All waters supplied from the works of the Trust for the irrigation of land shall be paid for by measure. All measurements of water shall be by gauges of form and pattern approved by the Trust, and fixed under the direction and to the satisfaction of the officer appointed by the Trust for that purpose. The registration of the quantities of water delivered shall be made by the Trust's officers.

2. No irrigation outlet or other outlet from any of the Trust's channels or works shall be constructed until the occupier of the land to be supplied from such outlet has entered into an agreement with the Trust for the purchase of water, and has received authority in writing from the Trust to construct such outlet.

3. Every outlet for the supply of water for irrigation shall be constructed under the supervision and to the satisfaction of the Trust, or of its duly authorized officer, and shall have a proper gauge fixed therein to indicate the quantity of water passing through such outlet.

4. One outlet only will be allowed for each property having a frontage not exceeding a mile, measured in a straight line to any channel, and one additional outlet for each additional mile or fraction thereof. Before constructing any outlet, the owner of the land to be supplied therefrom shall give notice to the Trust's superintending officer, and receive his authority in writing to construct such outlet.

5. No person shall construct any outlet from the works of the Trust without its written authority, or otherwise than under the supervision and to the satisfaction of its authorized officer. And any person who shall construct any such outlet without the authority of the Trust, or without the supervision of its authorized officer, or in any manner other than that authorized by such officer, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this regulation, and shall be liable to a penalty of Five pounds for every such breach.

6. The rate or price to be paid for water delivered from the works of the Trust shall be Fourpence (4d.) per 1,000 cubic feet if taken by pumping or other machinery, and Sixpence (6d.) per 1,000 cubic feet when taken by gravitation; one inch on an acre shall be deemed to be 4,000 cubic feet of water measured by the gauge.

7. The Trust may cause a meter or gauge to be affixed in any case where they may consider it necessary. Such meter or gauge to be provided and fixed at the expense of the consumer, and the water supplied to be charged for by measurement at the aforesaid rate.

8. All persons agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall take delivery thereof through their respective outlets at such times, in such order, and in such manner as the Trust shall direct. No person shall be supplied with a lesser quantity of water than is equal to the value of Four pounds (£4). And the delivery of water shall be continued on Sundays as well as on ordinary working days.

9. Every person agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall receive notification of the dates and quantities in which it will be delivered to him.

10. The outlets for the delivery of water shall be opened only by the authorized officers of the Trust, and no person other than such officers shall, under any circumstances, open any such outlet, or otherwise do any act that may permit of the escape of water from the channels or works.

11. Any person who, not being a duly authorized officer of the Trust, shall open any irrigation outlets, or do any act that may cause the escape of water from the Trust's channels or works, shall be guilty of a breach of this regulation, and shall be liable to a penalty of Five pounds for every such breach.

12. No person shall injure or damage any of the works of the Trust, or shall defile the water contained therein. And any person who shall injure or damage such works, or any part thereof, or waste or defile the water contained therein, shall be deemed to be guilty of a breach of this regulation, and shall be liable to a penalty of Five pounds for every such breach.

13. In the event of the Trust being unable, from failure of the works or from any other cause, to deliver or supply water to persons whom it shall have agreed to supply, such persons shall be entitled to a rebate of the price agreed to be paid for such water. But the Trust shall not be answerable for any damage which has been sustained by any person by reason of such non-delivery.

14. The foregoing regulations shall not apply to gardens of less than five acres in extent.

Positions of Phillips Rock, Lorne Reef, and Paluma Shoals.

NOTICE is hereby given that Phillips Rock lies S. 55° W. 1½ miles from the eastern summit of Acheron Island, and has on it a depth of 6 feet at low-water springs. The rock is of small extent, and has 8 fathoms close to. The shoal ground marked on the chart as extending from it does not exist.

Lorne Reef consists of two small rocky patches—the westernmost, which dries 1 foot at low-water springs, bearing from the summit of Rattlesnake Island S. 75° W., distant 1½ miles; the easternmost patch, with less than 6 feet upon it, lying E. ¼ S. from the former, distant ¼ of a mile.

Paluma Shoals—the outermost of which bears from Rattlesnake Island summit S. 38° W., distant 5 miles—consist of a chain of sand and coral patches extending in an easterly and southerly direction to the coast.

The foregoing information has been obtained by Lieutenant G. E. Richards, R.N., commanding H.M. surveying vessel *Paluma*.

The shores of Halifax Bay not having yet been thoroughly examined, vessels are recommended not to approach them within 3 miles.

SHIRE OF MELTON.

BYE-LAW NO. 1.

For keeping free from noisome matter yards, stables, and places used for noxious trades, slaughter-yards, &c.; and for regulating management of earth-closets, privies, &c., disinfecting and deodorizing night-soil and other offensive matter, and for regulating its removal and final deposit.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Melton, in the Colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in *The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883*, and every other power enabling the said Local Board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 1 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matter and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this bye-law coming into operation.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said shire, excepting section 9, which shall apply to and have operation only within the Township of Melton and that portion of the Township of Sunbury which is within the said shire.

4. The occupier of every house and premises within the said shire shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto, or occupied in connection therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the Local Board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

5. The occupier of any land in the said shire on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, or pig-sty shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to two cubic yards; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said Local Board at the expense of such occupier.

6. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement within the said shire shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of one foot from the top of the sides, walls, or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of

Eleven p.m. and Five a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid, or some other efficient deodorizer, sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

7. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall, once at least in every week, empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

8. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of night-soil except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof or of effluvia therefrom.

9. All night-soil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and deposited in such place or places only as may be appointed by the Local Board from time to time for the final reception of the same, unless with the special approval in writing of the secretary or health officer of the said shire.

10. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited or spread, or assisting in placing or depositing or spreading, on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place, shall, immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof, cover the same or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered, with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness.

11. The occupier of any premises within the said shire used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be removed therefrom once in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia; and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said Local Board at the expense of such occupier.

12. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered, so as to be water-tight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet.

13. No closet-door or trap shall abut or open on a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding ten feet in width.

14. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties—such portion not being less than Five shillings—to be paid. And any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such Local Board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

BYE-LAW No. 2, AS TO DAIRIES, DAIRY CATTLE, AND MILK.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Melton, in the Colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in *The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883*, and every other power enabling the said Local Board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 2 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say—

1. All former bye-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Shire of Melton.

Registration of Cowkeepers, Dairymen, and Purveyors of Milk.

4. Every person carrying on the trade of cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of September in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of One shilling.

Application for Registration as—

To the Secretary of the Local Board of Health for the Shire of Melton.

Sir,—I desire to be registered in accordance with the particulars in the schedule hereunder:—

5. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the secretary for the Local Board of Health shall endorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said Local Board, or by any person authorized in writing by the chairman or secretary of the said Local Board; and if, on inspection, such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them, are or is likely in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said Local Board may, by an order in writing signed by the secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or in the case of an unregistered person served personally or left at his dwelling-place, or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said Local Board may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated; and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept, and be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person, or any member of the family of any person, registered as aforesaid, or not so registered, but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the Local Board or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said Local Board or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, until danger, in the opinion of such Local Board or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until, in either case, all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy, or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any

cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the Local Board, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force; and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep or permit or suffer to be kept any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

13. In the interpretation of this bye-law words imputing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

14. Every person guilty of any breach of this bye-law or of any of its provisions shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings, for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

The foregoing bye-law was duly made, ordered, and passed by the Local Board of Health (being the Municipal Council) in and for the Shire of Melton this twenty-fourth day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Yea, in the Colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in *The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883*, and every other power enabling the said Local Board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Statute into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board, doth hereby make the following Bye-law No. 1 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matter and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this bye-law coming into operation.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation within three-quarters of a mile in every direction of the Yea Shire Hall.

4. The occupier of every house and premises within the said distance of the Yea Shire Hall shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto, or occupied in connection therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth and rubbish and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground. And if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the Local Board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

5. The occupier of any land within one mile of the Yea Shire Hall, on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-yard, or cattle-shed, shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state, in respect of cleanliness, as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to five cubic yards. And if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said Local Board at the expense of such occupier.

6. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement within one mile of the Yea Shire Hall shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of one foot from the top of the sides, wall, or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of Nine p.m. and Six a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid or some other efficient deodorizer in quality and quantity sufficient to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

7. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall, once at least in every fourteen (14) days, empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

8. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of night-soil except by means of a cart,

carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof, or of effluvia therefrom.

9. All night-soil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and deposited in such place or places only as may be appointed by the Local Board from time to time for the final reception of the same.

10. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited or spread, or assisting in placing or depositing or spreading on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place, shall immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof cover the same, or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered, with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness.

11. The occupier of any premises within the above-named distance of the Yea Shire Hall used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be any abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be removed therefrom once in every seven days, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia. And if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said Local Board at the expense of such occupier.

12. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered so as to be water-tight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet.

13. No closet door or trap shall abut or open upon a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding ten feet in width.

14. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds (£10) sterling for every such breach, or of Five pounds (£5) sterling for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalty, such portion not being less than Five shillings (5s.), to be paid. And any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by the bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such Local Board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

##### BYE-LAW No. 2.

*For the registration of cowkeepers, dairymen, and purveyors of milk, and for cleansing milk stores and shops, and the suppression of any nuisance connected therewith.*

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Yea, in the Colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in *The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883*, and every other power enabling the said Local Board in their behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 2 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matter and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this bye-law coming into operation.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Shire of Yea.

4. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of September in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form contained in the schedule hereto, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of Two shillings and sixpence.

5. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the Secretary of the Local Board of Health shall endorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

6. Every person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman shall cause every milk store or milk shop in his occupation, or under his management or control, and every milk vessel used by him for containing milk for sale, to be kept thoroughly clean.

7. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper or purveyor of milk, and every person having the management of any such trade, shall forthwith report, in writing, to the health officer the occurrence of any disease in any of his milch cows, or of any contagious or infectious disease in any person or animal upon the premises upon which such trade is carried on.

8. Every person who shall commit a breach of this bye-law, or any of its provisions, shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Ballan, in the Colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in the *The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883*, and every other power enabling the said Local Board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 2 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.
2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Shire of Ballan.

Registration of Cowkeepers, Dairy-men, and Purveyors of Milk.

4. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of May in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the Secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of Two shillings and sixpence sterling.

5. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the Secretary of the Local Board of Health shall endorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the

particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing grounds for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said Local Board, or by any person authorized in writing by the Chairman or Secretary of the said Local Board; and if, on inspection, such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them, are or is likely in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said Local Board may, by an order in writing signed by the Secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or in the case of an unregistered person served personally or left at his dwelling-place, or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said Local Board may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated; and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept, and be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person, or any member of the family of any person, registered as aforesaid, or not so registered, but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the Local Board or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said Local Board or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, until danger, in the opinion of such Local Board or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until, in either case, all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy, or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the Local Board, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force; and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep or permit or suffer to be kept any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

13. In the interpretation of this bye-law words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

14. Every person guilty of any breach of this bye-law or of any of its provisions shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings, for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

Every such person, whether registered or not, shall in the case of any disease appearing on his premises, or among his cattle, give immediate notice of the same to the inspector of the Local Board. Any person committing a breach of this bye-law shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10, or to a penalty not exceeding £5 for each day during which such breach shall be continued, provided the justices before whom any penalty imposed hereby is sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only, not less than Five shillings to be paid.

**REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS.**

**T**HE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to approve of the following Regulations for the examination of Land Surveyors, viz:—

Intending candidates must give notice of their intention in writing, and must forward to the Board documentary evidence that they have complied with the following preliminary conditions; and, upon their applications being approved by the Board, shall pay the prescribed fee of £4 4s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or any Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board.

All candidates presenting themselves for examination must be provided with a book of logarithms, a 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and all necessary appliances (except paper) for plan drawing.

**PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.**

I. A candidate must have passed the matriculation examination at the University of Melbourne, including English, Geography, Arithmetic, Geometry, Algebra, and Physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and must have served with some recognized surveyor for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than four years some recognized surveyor, two years at least of such service to have been in the field; and must give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

III. Or he must have completed the third year's course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, and must have served in the field for two years with some recognized surveyor.

IV. Or he must have completed the full course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, and have served one year in the field as above.

NOTE.—By service in the field is to be understood the survey and subdivision of land.

A candidate whose application shall have been approved as showing that he has complied with either of the above conditions will be eligible for examination.

**SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.**

1. Construction, adjustment, and use of instruments: Principles of construction, manipulation, adjustment, and use of following instruments, viz:—  
Theodolite,  
Level,  
Box sextant,  
Prismatic compass,  
Chain.
2. Principles and practice of land surveying: Details of field practice, including the keeping of field-notes; Topographical surveying; Setting out block surveys; Laying out roads; Setting out of curves; Plotting; Plotting from field-notes by protractor and by ordinates.
3. Plane trigonometry (practical).
4. Computations connected with land surveying: Reduction of traverses; Computations connected with the setting out of roads and curves; Elimination of discrepancies in measurements and observations in the field; Computation of areas, including irregular and curved boundaries.
5. Determination of latitude, true meridian, and azimuth; Barometric measurement of heights.
6. Levelling and mensuration of earthwork.
7. Charting: Construction of maps and charts; Compilation of charts from detached plans and notes; Reduction of bearings to common datum.
8. Drawing: Mechanical work of map drawing; Hill shading; Writing.

The Board of Examiners shall affix a numerical value to each subject, and shall determine the numerical or other standard for Passes in the several subjects. In the event of a candidate failing to pass on first presenting himself for examination, the Board shall have the option of admitting him a second time without charge, or at a reduced fee, if he shall have obtained a certain standard in such examination.

**CERTIFICATES WITHOUT EXAMINATION.**

Certificates will be granted by the Board without examination to gentlemen who shall produce evidence satisfactory to the examiners that they have complied with the following conditions, and shall have paid the prescribed fee. But such certificates shall state on the face of them that they have been granted without examination:—

I. Having passed some examination (equivalent in the opinion of the Board to that prescribed in Victoria) in Great Britain, the United States of America, India, or some British colony, and producing evidence of having successfully practised as a surveyor for not less than twelve months in some of the Australian colonies.

II. Or producing evidence satisfactory to the Board of the possession of sufficient professional qualifications and experience, and of having successfully practised as a surveyor for not less than twelve months in some of the Australian colonies.

Examinations shall be held from time to time, as the interests of the Public Service may require; and notice thereof shall be published in the *Government Gazette* of the intention to hold an examination at least one month before the date fixed upon.

5. The site and all improvements thereon shall absolutely revert to the Crown at the expiry of the term of lease, or on any previous determination of the same, without any compensation therefor being paid by the Crown to the lessee, his assigns, or legal representatives.
