The births of 1,192 children, viz., 614 boys and 578 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of July. In the month of June 1,250 births were registered, or 58 more than in the month under review. The births were 358 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but only 148 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in July numbered 563, viz., 301 of males and 262 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 629, or 112 per cent. The deaths were fewer than those in June by 8, but exceeded the average of July during the previous ten years by 87. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been lower than that average by 33.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 3.21, and of deaths registered 1.52.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 59.9° on the 25th, and the lowest was 34.9° on the 11th. The mean temperature of the month (49.6°) was more than two degrees above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (23.4°) took place on the 13th, viz., from a maximum of 58.5° to a minimum of 35.1°. The least range (2.9°) was on the 30th, viz., from a maximum of 54.0° to a minimum of 51.1°. The mean daily range was 11.2°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.495 inches on the 11th, and the lowest was 29.441 inches on the 22nd. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.918 inches) was slightly lower than the average.

Rain fell on 17 days, the amount of rainfall being 2.68 inches. The average rainfall in July during the previous ten years was 1.27 inch, or nearly 1½ inch below that in the month under notice.

Fog occurred on 4 days during the month.

Males contributed 53 per cent., and females 47 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 30 per cent. to that mortality, as against 30 per cent. in July 1886, 26 per cent. in July 1885, 39 per cent. in July 1884, 32 per cent. in July 1883, 34 per cent. in July 1882, 33 per cent. in July 1881, 36 per cent. in July 1880, 29 per cent. in July 1879 and July 1878, and 33 per cent. in July 1877.

The number of deaths of persons of 65 years of age or upwards was 34. Of these, a female, aged 75, a farmer and a female, each aged 77, an artist, aged 82, a gentleman, aged 84, a gardener, a sailor, and a weaver (inmates of the Benevolent Asylum), each aged 84, died of bronchitis; a bootmaker, aged 75, and a female, aged 78, of pneumonia; a gentleman, aged 75, of stone in the bladder; a laborer, aged 76, of asthma; a vocalist, aged 76, a female, aged 77, and a gentleman, aged 79, of paralysis; a gentleman, aged 76, of softening of the brain; a gardener, aged 76, of Bright's disease; a female, aged 78, and a female, aged 85, of diarrhoea; a female, aged 76, a female, aged 77, a female, aged 87, and a female, aged 89, of disease of the heart; a gardener, aged 84, of

valvular disease of the heart; a laborer, aged 89, of pericarditis; a master mariner, aged 76, and a mason, aged 79 (both inmates of the Immigrants' Home), a female, aged 76, a gentleman and a laborer, each aged 80, a female, aged 85, a gentleman and a shepherd, each aged 86, and a male servant, aged 90, of old age.

Twenty-five deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which 19 were set down to accident, 1 to homicide, and 5 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A boy, aged 10, died of pyæmia, consequent on injuries occasioned by a kick in the stomach whilst playing football; a cabdriver, aged 38, of injuries received by the upsetting of his cab; a carter, aged 41, was killed by a kick from a horse; a female, aged 49, and a male, of occupation unknown, aged 50, were passed over by railway trains; a laborer, aged 49, died of compound fracture of the leg and other injuries, caused by a girder which he was hoisting falling on him; and a matmaker, aged 54, of injury to the brain, the result of an accident, the nature of which was not given. A laborer, aged 35, was killed by an explosion of dynamite; and a female, aged 37, died of burns, her clothes catching fire. A female, aged 64, and a baker, aged 68, were drowned; a female, aged 24, was found drowned in Hobson's Bay; a shopman, aged 50, and a surveyor, aged 55, were found drowned in the River Yarra; and a laborer, aged 65, was found drowned in the Port Melbourne Lagoon. A male infant, aged 7 weeks, and a female infant, aged 2 months, were suffocated, the former through a shawl becoming fixed over his face; a female, aged 32, was suffocated, through falling on her face whilst in a fit; and a builder, aged 50, was suffocated in mud. The homicidal death was that of an accountant, aged 24, who died of a wound in the head, caused by another, against whom a verdict of manslaughter was brought in. Of the suicidal deaths, a laborer, aged 22, and a house and land agent, aged 64, shot themselves in the head; a female, aged 67, poisoned herself; a clerk, aged 57, drowned himself; and a bricklayer, aged 58, hanged himself.

One hundred and six deaths, or 19 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—48 in the Melbourne Hospital, 11 in the Alfred Hospital, 4 in the Homœopathic Hospital, 3 in the Women's Hospital, 11 in the Immigrants' Home, 11 in the Benevolent Asylum, 3 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 4 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 5 in the Austin Hospital, 5 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 1 in the Industrial Schools.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 167, of which 86, or 51 per cent., were of males, and 81, or 49 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 169 were under one year of age, 26 were between one and two, 13 were between two and three, 11 were between three and four, and 8 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 336. Of these, 215, or 54 per cent., were males, and 121, or 46 per cent., were females; 13 were between five and ten, 8 were between ten and fifteen, 16 were between fifteen and twenty, 24 were between twenty and twenty-five, 27 were between twenty-five and thirty, 29 were between thirty and thirty-five, 28 were between thirty-five and forty, 33 were between forty and forty-five, 26 were between forty-five and fifty, 34 were between fifty and fifty-five, 26 were between fifty-five and sixty, 34 were between sixty and sixty-five, 46 were between sixty-five and seventy, 18 were between seventy and seventy-five, 17 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 17 were upwards of eighty.

In July, as compared with the previous month, under the head of specific febrile or zymotic diseases, deaths from whooping-cough rose from 4 to 8, and those from diphtheria from 6 to 9. Measles, which had not proved fatal during the previous 3 months, again made its appearance and caused 2 deaths. The mortality amongst child-bearing women was very low during the month, only 4 having died, as against 5 in June, which was also very low. If these numbers be compared with the births registered during the same months, it will follow that 1 death of a mother took place to every 298 children born alive in July, as against 1 to every 250 such children in June.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

BYE-LAW No. 56.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred by *The Victorian Railways Commissioners Act 1883*, do hereby make the following Bye-law, and all previous Bye-laws conflicting therewith are hereby repealed :—

CHARGES BY PASSENGER TRAINS ARE FIXED AS FOLLOWS :—

1. Out of the Through Return Fares for Jubilee Excursion Trains between Sydney and Melbourne and Melbourne and Adelaide the proportion due to the Victorian Railways shall be as follows :—

2. Out of the Through Rate of 10s. each for Dogs between Melbourne and Adelaide, the proportion due to the Victorian Railways shall be 7s.

3. Commercial Travellers holding 2nd Class Annual Tickets for all lines will be allowed 1 cwt. samples free, under the regulations in Clause 34 of the *Parcels Rates*.

4. Clause 5, relating to Race Horses, in Bye-law 17 is repealed, and Race Horses may break the journey on any line, either going or returning to races, provided a certificate is produced from the Secretary of the various Racing Clubs showing that they have raced at each station *en route*.

CHARGES ON GOODS ARE FIXED AS FOLLOWS :—

5. Coke Ashes, Flock Dust, and Tan, spent, to be charged and carried under Firewood Rates and Conditions.

6. Malt, and Pigs' Feed the product of any grain except Rice, to be charged and carried under Agricultural Produce Rates and Conditions.

7. Grass and Rushes, for brickmaking, to be charged and carried under Special A. Class Rates and Conditions.

8. Pile Driving Machines to be charged and carried under Sawn Timber Rates and Conditions.

9. Sugar Baskets, empty, and Extract of Myrabolams, for tanning, to be charged and carried under Miscellaneous Class Rates and Conditions.

10. Bullock Yokes, Cannon on Carriages or otherwise, Footlights, glass, in Cases, Golden Syrup in Casks and in Tins packed in Cases, to be charged 1st Class Rates.

11. Water Boring and Diamond Drill Machines, Slate Pencils in Cases, and Kapok in Hydraulic Pressed Bales, to be charged 2nd Class Rates.

12. Air Bricks, metal, and Golden Syrup in Jars or Tins, loose, to be charged 3rd Class Rates.

13. Pianos and Organs in Cases, Swing Boats, and Kapok in Bales not Hydraulic Pressed, to be charged 4th Class Rates.

14. The Special Rate for Firewood from Beaufort, Trawalla, and Meredith, to Ballarat, as fixed by the Bye-laws of 31st January 1884, and Bye-law 18 of 25th October 1884, is hereby repealed, and the ordinary Tariff Rate, as per Bye-law 28, will in future be charged.

15. Greasy Wool, in bales not exceeding 3 cwt., to be charged the 250 lbs. rate shown in Bye-law 54, from all Stations, Marooona to Portland inclusive, and all Stations on the Casterton Line, to Melbourne, Williamstown, Port Melbourne, Geelong, or Portland.

16. Grain and Flour consigned to Melbourne, and reconsigned to Williamstown or Port Melbourne without being unloaded or Trucks detained, to be charged 1s. per ton carriage to either of these Stations. Grain and Flour transferred from the Williamstown to the Port Melbourne Pier, or *vice versa*, to be charged 2s. per ton.

17. Grain and Flour consigned to, and unloaded in, the Melbourne Sheds, to be charged 1s. per ton for reloading and conveyance to the Australian Wharf for shipment.

18. Goods *ex ships* at the Williamstown or Port Melbourne Pier, consigned to any station within the suburban residential area beyond Melbourne, to be charged the Tariff Rates in Bye-law 28, with the rates from the Piers to Melbourne in Bye-law 31, as a minimum.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

BYE-LAW No. 57.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred by *The Victorian Railways Commissioners Act 1883*, do hereby make the following Bye-law for fixing the conditions on which Exhibits, Judges, and Attendants for Agricultural Shows shall be conveyed; and all previous Bye-laws conflicting therewith are hereby repealed:—

AGRICULTURAL MACHINES AND IMPLEMENTS, LIVE STOCK AND PRODUCE.

1. On consigning to the Show, the consignor must declare on consignment note that they are for exhibition, naming the Show, and they must be way-billed accordingly. They will then be charged full rates to the place of exhibition, but will be conveyed back to the station whence they were sent *free*, and, in addition, the exhibitor will be entitled to a refund of one-half the amount paid if a certificate from the secretary of the society that they have been exhibited and not sold is handed in on consigning. Certificate to be attached to the "free" way-bill. If part of a consignment is sold the balance will be returned free, but no portion of the freight to the Show will be refunded.
2. The foregoing applies to exhibits conveyed in cattle or goods waggons and by goods trains; valuable animals may, however, be conveyed in horse-boxes by passenger trains under these conditions, at goods rates, provided there is rolling-stock available.
3. For all exhibits which may have been sold, full rates will be charged for the return journey.
4. Exhibits may be sent from one Show to another on the same line or branch of same line, provided a "Not Sold" certificate is presented and freight prepaid at each station. When final destination is reached they will be returned to starting station and refund granted, as per clause 1.
5. Judges to be carried at single fare for the return journey when on official duty.
6. Poultry and dogs will be charged full rates both ways.
7. Attendants on stock before starting to a Show must furnish themselves with a certificate, duly filled up and signed as per clause 12, and pay full fare to and from the place of exhibition; but after returning with their exhibits, if a full truck has been paid for, and if provided with a certificate that the stock exhibited has not been sold, and also with the second part of certificate as per clause 12 duly filled up, and

signed, a refund of both fares will be made. This applies only to attendants who travel in the trucks or in vans of goods trains with the stock. Only one attendant to be allowed to each truck. The certificate must be receipted by the attendant, and sent by the station-master to the Traffic Audit Office as a voucher.

8. All exhibits to be loaded and unloaded by consignors and consignees, and to be carried and signed for at owner's risk.

9. Exhibits unaccompanied by a certificate from the secretary of the Show will be charged full rates both ways.

10. To insure despatch, forty-eight hours' notice should be given to the station-master of the number and description of vehicles required.

11. All freight to be "Prepaid" in first instance, and made "To Pay" (if charged) on return journey; and original sending station only to make refunds.

PUBLIC HIGHWAYS IN THE TOWNSHIP OF NHILL, SHIRE OF LOWAN.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and such land should thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Lowan has requested that the streets hereinafter mentioned, within the Township of Nhill in the said shire, be so declared public highways: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice declare the lands acquired or used for the streets hereinafter named and described, and situate in the Township of Nhill, in the Shire of Lowan, to be Public Highways within the meaning of the said Act, viz. :—

WHEREAS by an Act passed by the Parliament of Victoria in the forty-seventh year of Her Majesty's reign, intituled *An Act to remove Doubts as to the power of the Governor in Council to change the names of Shires, Boroughs, Towns, or Cities, and of the Corporations thereof*, it was enacted that the Governor in Council might at any time, on the request of the council of any shire, borough, town, or city, alter, by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, the name of any such shire, borough, town, or city, and of the corporation thereof: And whereas the council of the town of Hotham has requested that the name of that municipality be altered to North Melbourne: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this proclamation alter the name of the said town of "Hotham" to

and do direct that henceforth the corporation thereof shall be designated as The Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of North Melbourne.

REGULATIONS FOR A COMMON.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations for a Common.

REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE BROADFORD COMMON.
In pursuance of the regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the 17th March 1885, the managers of the Broadford Common, having drafted the following regulations for the management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works, and approval by the Governor in Council.

Regulations.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers residing within five (5) miles of the common may respectively depasture thereon four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole, or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of land occupied by him may depasture on the common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten of such land cultivated by him.

2. Sheep or goats shall be depastured on such portions only of the common as the managers may set apart for the purpose; provided always that the owners of goats shall provide a triangle not less than three feet long, and keep it fastened to each goat's neck whilst depasturing on the common.

3. No bull or he-goat shall be depastured on the common without the authority, in writing, of the managers.

4. All young cattle, the progeny of stock legally depasturing on the common, may, while under six months old, run thereon free of charge.

5. All persons desirous of depasturing stock on the common shall be in attendance therewith at the Broadford yards on the first Monday in January and July in every year for the purpose of giving a full and correct description of such stock, and assisting to brand the same, and shall pay the prescribed fees for such stock.

6. The following shall be the scale of fees for depasturing stock on the common, viz.:—

For every horse and mare, Six shillings per annum. For every head of horned cattle, Four shillings per annum. For every sheep or goat, Two shillings per annum. The fees for stock depasturing on the common shall be paid by the owners of such stock half-yearly in advance, and the half-year shall commence respectively on the first Monday in January and July in every year, and the fee for the half-year then next ensuing shall be deemed to be due on the first Monday aforesaid.

7. All cattle, horses, pigs, and goats found on the common without the common brand shall be deemed to be trespassing thereon, and shall be liable to be forthwith impounded by the herdsman.

8. No person shall be permitted to remove any stock from the common without having given notice to and obtained permission from the managers or herdsman in charge of the common.

9. The managers shall not be held responsible for loss of or injury to stock depasturing on the common, but shall, by their herdsman, take every possible care of such stock, and in the event of loss or injury shall give to the owners every information and assistance.

10. The managers shall cause to be removed from the common all diseased stock which may by a competent person be declared to be diseased and dangerous to the health of the other stock on the common, and may require the owner thereof to keep such stock off the common; and should such owner refuse or neglect so to do, the managers may cause such diseased stock to be forthwith destroyed and buried, and the owner thereof shall be liable for any necessary expenses incurred in their destruction and interment.

11. The managers may destroy any goats found upon the common, unless such goats are branded with the common brand,

and have a triangle on their necks as provided for in clause 2 of these regulations.

12. No person shall wilfully injure, or destroy, or unnecessarily disturb any stock depasturing upon the common.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

BYE-LAW No. 10.

REGULATION of Proceedings of Council Officers, &c.

1. *General conduct of business.*—In all cases not herein provided for resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the council.

2. At every meeting of the council the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any committee presented at any such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed as by this Act required; and the rough minutes of the proceedings of the council at any meeting shall be read at the close of such meeting.

3. After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follow, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the council at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect:

- (i.) Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the council.
- (ii.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (iii.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (iv.) Presentation of reports of committees.
- (v.) Payments.
- (vi.) Ordinary business.
- (vii.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- (viii.) Extraordinary business and new rules and regulations.
- (ix.) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (x.) Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

4. Whenever a division shall be demanded by any councillor, the councillors voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the chairman.

5. All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the president and the shire secretary, unless otherwise ordered by the council.

6. *Motions.*—All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered and given by the intending mover to the shire secretary at the close of the meeting of council, or if not required by law to be given at a meeting, then three clear days prior to the next meeting of council; and the shire secretary shall enter the same in the notice of motion book, in the order in which they may be received.

7. No member shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion but in pursuance of notice given as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

8. No motion except that for receiving the same shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition memorial or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of council after that at which it has been presented.

9. Except by leave of the council, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the shire secretary in the notice of motion book, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.

10. No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the councillor who gave notice of the same, unless by some other councillor producing written authority from him to that effect.

11. No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall at some previous meeting have submitted a draft of the same.

12. *Order, &c., of debate.*—Any councillor desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the councillor (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the councillor in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

13. Any councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the council thereon.

14. No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the council.

15. No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the council unless it be seconded, but a councillor may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the council by directing the president's or chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

16. A councillor moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a councillor merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

17. The councillors in meeting of council shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of president, chairman, or councillor, as the case may require.

18. If two or more councillors rise to speak at the same time, the president or chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

19. The president or chairman shall rise in addressing the council to discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions.

20. No councillor shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

21. The president or chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case without discussing or commenting on the same, and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

22. No councillor shall digress from the subject matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other councillor in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on councillors shall be deemed highly disorderly.

23. Whenever any councillor shall make use of any expression disorderly, or capable of being applied offensively to any other councillor, the councillor so offending shall be required by the president or chairman to withdraw the expression, and to make a satisfactory apology to the council.

24. A councillor called to order shall sit down, unless permitted to explain.

25. Any councillor using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order, or to withdraw and to apologise for such conduct, and refusing so to do, shall be guilty of an offence.

26. Any person not being a councillor who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the council, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when lawfully requested by the president or chairman so to do, may be forthwith removed by him, and shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

27. Any councillor not attending in compliance with an order for a call of the whole council, without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof, shall be guilty of an offence.

28. Any councillor may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the council applying to the question under discussion.

29. The council shall vote by show of hands, and any councillor present and not voting not being disabled by law from so doing shall be guilty of an offence.

30. The president or chairman shall, in taking the sense of the council, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

31. At every meeting of the council all motions whether original motions or amendments shall be reduced into writing signed by the mover, and delivered to the president or chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.

32. No second or subsequent amendment whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

33. If any words of an original question be rejected, the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.

34. If an amendment be negatived, then a second may be moved to the question to which the first mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted to the council for discussion at a time.

35. The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no councillor shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question unless permission be given to explain or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

36. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the council; but if on the question being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

37. Any councillor may protest against any resolution of the council, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered, three days at least, before the next ordinary meeting of the council by the protesting councillor in a book to be kept for that purpose in the shire secretary's office, and signed by such councillor, and shall be also entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the council to be not in accordance with truth or in its terms disrespectful to the council.

38. *Lapsed questions.*—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of the councillors present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted on motion upon notice.

39. If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice book for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

40. *Committees.*—Minutes of all proceedings of committees as well as of their reports, numbered in consecutive order, shall be entered in the committee's minute-book, and being signed by the chairman of the committee shall be presented to the council; and the shire secretary when practicable shall attend all meetings of committees.

41. The shire secretary shall convene every committee within ten days of its first appointment or at any other time thereafter by order of the council, or on the written order of the chairman of the committee or of any two members of the committee.

42. *Petitions.*—No petition shall be presented after the council shall have proceeded to the orders of the day.

43. It shall be incumbent on every councillor presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the council, and that the contents do not violate any bye-law or any provision hereof.

44. Every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall write his name at the beginning thereof.

45. Every petition shall be in writing and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioners at the end thereof, and be signed by at least one person on every skin or sheet on which it is written.

46. Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto, by their names or marks, and by no one else, except in cases of incapacity by sickness.

47. No letters, affidavits, or other documents shall be attached to any petition.

48. Every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

49. *Appointments, &c., of officers.*—No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the council shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the shire, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same.

50. The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the council shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same, before the advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

51. No councillor or officer of the council and no assessor or auditor of the shire shall be received as a surety for any officer appointed by the council or for any work to be done for the council.

52. In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any duty or contract, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the person providing the same.

53. *Miscellaneous.*—All the plans and specifications for any public work shall be laid before the council at least six days prior to the same being considered and ordered upon, and be open for inspection by any ratepayer during that time.

54. It shall be lawful for the treasurer of the shire from time to time, on the written order of the shire secretary, to disburse such moneys as shall have been appropriated by the council for the purposes of this clause, and as shall be required for any necessary occasion, not exceeding in the whole in any interval between two ordinary meetings of the council the sum of five pounds.

55. The common seal of the shire shall be kept in a box having two locks, of one of which locks the president and each councillor shall have a key, and of the other of which locks the key shall be kept by the shire secretary; and the corporate seal shall not be affixed to any document unless the president and one other member of the council, or, in the absence of the president, or unless two councillors be present.

56. Any one or more of the rules or regulations contained in this sub-division may be suspended for a special purpose on motion upon notice duly given, and shall not otherwise be suspended except by a unanimous vote of the council.

57. If any person shall be guilty of any wilful offence or misfeasance or wilful or negligent act of commission or omission contrary to any provision contained in this sub-division, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding five pounds.

BOROUGH OF KEW.

Bye-law No. 19 as to carriage of meat to or from abattoirs, or butchers' shops, or premises.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Borough of Kew, in the Colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in the Public Health Amendment Act 1883, and every other power enabling the said Local Board of Health in this behalf and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board, do hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 19 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the Borough of Kew.

From and after the date of this bye-law coming into operation no person shall bring or cause to be brought into the Borough of Kew, or carry or cause to be carried through any street in the said borough, in any cart or other vehicle, any butcher's meat or carcase of meat, unless such cart or other vehicle be so constructed as that the rays of the sun and the rain and the dust are not allowed to fall on or be capable of reaching such meat or carcase of meat, and that proper sitting accommodation be provided for the driver thereof.

Every person guilty of any breach of this bye-law, or of any of its provisions, shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds or less than Five shillings.

The foregoing bye-law was duly made, ordered, and passed by the Local Board of Health, being the Municipal Council thereof in and for the Borough of Kew, this fifteenth day of February 1887.
