"THE PUBLIC SERVICE ACT 1883."—REGULATIONS.
SALARIES—NON-CLERICAL DIVISION.

Act No. 773, Section 41, Sub-section VIII.

WHEREAS by *The Public Service Act 1883*, section 15, it is enacted that the Non-Clerical Division shall include all persons whose appointment has been determined by priority of registration, in accordance with Regulations to be made as hereinafter provided, and also all persons permanently employed in the Public Service before the passing of this Act who are not included under the other divisions of the Public Service: And whereas by section 17 of the said Act it is enacted that in the Non-Clerical Division the officers shall be paid such emoluments, salaries, allowances, and wages in accordance with a fixed amount or a scale to be determined by Regulation, and as may be provided in the annual Appropriation Act: And whereas by section 41 of the said Act it is enacted that the Public Service Board shall make Regulations which shall have full force and effect as soon as approved by the Governor in Council, and may, subject to such approval, from time to time repeal, alter, and amend the same:—For determining a scale or amount to be paid to the persons employed in the different Departments included in the Non-Clerical Division which, in the opinion of the Board, will be a fair equivalent for the work to be performed by such persons: And whereas the Public Service Board did make Regulations for such purposes, which Regulations were on the 30th January 1885 approved by the Governor in Council: And whereas the said Regulations were from time to time amended by further Regulations made by the Public Service Board, and approved by the Governor in Council: And whereas it is expedient to alter the said Regulations: Now we, the undersigned, being the Members constituting the Public Service Board, in pursuance of the said powers, do make and declare the following alteration of the said Regulations, and declare that the same shall commence and come into operation as soon as approved as aforesaid:—

WHARFAGE ON SUGAR.

"From and after the 1st day of August 1887 there shall be paid to the Commissioners, in lieu of the wharfage rate on sugar prescribed by *The Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1876*, the sum of

3d. per cwt. on all raw sugar landed in the port; provided that should the importer, within six months from the time of such landing, make declaration in the form to be approved of by the Commissioners, and to their satisfaction, that the sugar has been kept in some refinery subject to the supervision of Her Majesty's Customs and authorities, and has been exported from the colony as refined sugar, the Commissioners may allow to the importer a rebate at the rate of 4s. per ton on so much thereof as has been so refined and exported."

NAVAL CADETSHIPS.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING NAVAL CADETS.

For the information of Candidates.

1. Appointments to naval cadetships will be made by limited competition, with the undermentioned exceptions:—

Four cadetships given annually to sons of gentlemen in the Colonies, on the recommendation of the Secretary of State for the Colonies.

Service cadetships, the total number of which is not to exceed five in any one year. Service cadets will be selected by the Board of Admiralty from (a) sons of officers of the army, navy, or marines who have been killed in action, or who have been lost at sea on active service, or killed on duty, or who have died of wounds received in action or injuries received on duty within six months from the date of such action or injury, (b) sons of officers of the navy who have performed long or distinguished service, and who hold or have held rank or relative rank on the active list not lower than that of commander. Not more than two such latter service cadets will be nominated annually.

Applications for service cadetships should be addressed to the Military Secretary, Horse Guards, if the candidate is the son of an officer of the army; to the secretary of the Admiralty, if the candidate is the son of an officer of the navy or marines; and to the Military Secretary, India Office, if the candidate is the son of an officer of the Indian Army.

Colonial and service cadets will be entered on passing the test examination as specified in paragraphs 9 and 10, and will in all other respects be subject to these regulations.

The educational examination of all candidates will be conducted by the Civil Service Commissioners (address Cannon Row, Westminster), who will deal with all questions connected with such examination and will announce the results. A fee of ten shillings will be required from each candidate.

2. Except in special circumstances, not more than one-third of the number of candidates actually presenting themselves before the Civil Service Commissioners will be entered.

3. The nomination of candidates for naval cadetships will be made by the First Lord, by individual members of the Board, and by the Secretaries to the Board of Admiralty.

A flag officer or a commodore 1st class appointed to the chief command of a station, or to a separate command, and a captain, on first appointment as such to the command of a ship, will be allowed to nominate one candidate, provided the privilege is exercised within six months of appointment.

No captain will be entitled to nominate more than one candidate during the time he holds the rank of captain, but a flag officer or a commodore 1st class may claim the privilege each time he is appointed to a command as above.

In the event of a candidate's nomination being cancelled before he has commenced the examination, the officer who nominated him will be allowed to select another candidate for the same or following examination.

4. The nominations will be made half-yearly, as soon as convenient after the report of the last examination has been received from the Civil Service Commissioners.

5. The examinations will be held in London and at Portsmouth, and will commence on the second Wednesday in June and the last Wednesday in November in each year, and the appointments will date from the 15th July and 15th January following respectively.

6. No candidate will be eligible for examination whose age will not be within the following limits on the 15th January following the November examination, and on the 15th July following the June examination, viz., for the examinations in November 1887 to June 1888, not less than 12½ nor more than 14 years of age, and at subsequent examinations not less than 13 nor more than 14½ years of age.

7. Every candidate must be in good health, and free from any physical defect of body, impediment of speech, defect of sight or hearing, and also from any predisposition to constitutional or hereditary disease or weakness of any kind, and in all respects well developed and active in proportion to his age. Before being examined by the Civil Service Commissioners he will be required to pass the medical examination according to the prescribed regulations, and must have been found physically fit for the navy; rejection at such examination will finally exclude him from the navy.

8. The candidate will be required to produce (1) a certificate of the date of his birth,* or a declaration thereof made before a

* A certificate of baptism will not be accepted.

magistrate; (2) a certificate of good conduct from the masters of the school or schools at which he may have been educated during the two previous years, or, if educated at home, from his tutor or the clergyman of the parish in which he resides; and (3) proofs of good health.

9. Candidates will be tested by examination in the following subjects:—

The final order of merit will be determined by the sum of the marks obtained in the test and in the further examination.

10. Colonial and service cadets will be appointed on passing the test examination; they must, however, obtain 660 marks in the aggregate, as well as the proportion of marks in arithmetic and other subjects required from the candidates who compete.

11. A candidate who passes the test examination, but does not succeed in the competition, will be entitled to compete at the next examination, provided he is within the limits of age at that time. No candidate will be allowed to compete more than twice. A candidate who fails to pass the test will not be entitled to another trial, but he will be allowed to compete at the next examination if he receives a fresh nomination and is still within the limits of age.

12. A candidate who, owing to illness, fails to appear at the examination for which he has obtained his nomination may receive a second nomination, provided he is still within the limits of age.

13. For all cadets entered under these regulations the payment will be at the rate of £70 per annum for the period in the *Britannia*, to be paid half-yearly in advance to the accountant-general of the navy. But the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty reserve the power of selecting, from among the cadets entered at each half-yearly examination, a number, not to exceed 10, being sons of officers of the navy, army, or marines, or of civil officers under the Board of Admiralty, with respect to whom the annual payment will be £40 only. In this selection their lordships will have regard solely to the pecuniary circumstances of the cadet.

14. The period of training on board the *Britannia* will be four terms; there will be two terms in each year. The first term of each year will be from February to July, the second from September to December.

The vacations will be five weeks at Christmas, two weeks at Easter, and six weeks at Midsummer.

15. There will be examinations in seamanship and study at the end of each term.

Cadets who pass unsatisfactory examinations, or who are reported for unsatisfactory conduct, will be "warned," and they will be liable to be discharged at the end of the following or any subsequent term, should they again be reported as failing to attain the proper number of marks at the examinations, or for unsatisfactory conduct.

If a cadet is reported for unsatisfactory conduct, during his final term, he will be discharged without being allowed to present himself at the examination for passing out of the *Britannia*.

Any cadet who shall at any time appear to their lordships to be unfit for the naval service, for any reason whatever, will be removed from the *Britannia*, and it must be understood that this rule will apply to those who are considered unfit from insufficient physical development or weakness of constitution, although no actual organic disease may have been developed.

16. It is to be distinctly understood that the period of training on board the *Britannia* is a time of probation, and the parent or guardian of every cadet will be required to sign a declaration (on the admission of the cadet to the *Britannia*), to the effect that he shall be immediately withdrawn on the receipt of an official intimation of his being considered unfit for the navy.

17. Cadets will, on passing out of the *Britannia*, rank according to the amount of sea time they obtain at their final examination, and those who obtain equal amounts of sea time will rank in the order of merit in which they pass out of the *Britannia*.

18. The parent or guardian of every cadet will be required to provide outfit under the regulations in force.

19. No pay or pocket money will be allowed by Government to cadets in the *Britannia*.

COMMISSIONS IN THE BRITISH ARMY TO OFFICERS OF COLONIAL LOCAL MILITARY FORCES.

With reference to the telegraphic correspondence which has passed on the subject, I have the honor to acquaint you for the information of your Government that a letter has been received in this Department from the War Office, stating that the month of July in each year has been fixed for the qualifying Literary Examination of Colonial candidates for Commissions in the Imperial Army.

All the colonies concerned, except New Zealand, had expressed a preference for that month.

REGULATIONS UNDER WHICH COMMISSIONS IN THE BRITISH ARMY MAY BE OBTAINED BY OFFICERS OF COLONIAL LOCAL MILITARY FORCES.

1. Commissions in the Cavalry or Infantry of the Line will be granted to officers of the Local Military Forces of certain colonies, to be specified from time to time, under the conditions hereinafter prescribed as to age, physical and moral fitness, length of service in the Colonial Forces, literary and military qualifications, and general eligibility for the position of an officer in Her Majesty's Regular Forces.

2. A candidate will be required to have served at least 15 months as an officer in the Local Military Force of the colony from which he is nominated, and must have attended two annual trainings, or have seen active service in the field. A certificate to this effect from his Commanding Officer must be attached to the candidate's papers.

3. The candidate must be within the ages of 19 and 22 on the 1st January of the year in which he is allowed to present himself for the examination hereafter specified. A certificate of birth, or a declaration of his exact age, made by the candidate's parents or guardian before a magistrate, must be attached to his papers when forwarded to the War Office.

4. He will be required to undergo an inspection by a Medical Board, to be convened by the Governor of the colony, or other proper authority, and will not be allowed to proceed further with his candidature unless certified by such Board to be physically qualified, in all respects, for a commission in the Army.

5. An intending candidate must apply for a nomination to the Governor, through his Commanding Officer, or such other channel as the Governor may prescribe, in sufficient time to allow of arrangements being made for his undergoing the military examination before he has exceeded the limit of age specified in para. 3.

6. A candidate will not be allowed to enter upon his examination until he has satisfied the Governor of the colony in which he is serving that he is of good moral character, and in all other respects a fit and proper person to hold a commission in Her Majesty's Army. A certificate from the Governor to this effect must be attached to the candidate's papers when they are forwarded to the War Office.

7. The candidate will be required to undergo a qualifying literary examination in the following subjects:—

- (1.) Mathematics, viz.:—(a) Arithmetic, including vulgar and decimal fractions, proportion, and simple interest; (b) Euclid, Book I.; (c) Algebra, up to and including simple equations.
- (2.) French, German, or some other modern language; the examination being limited to translation from the language and grammatical questions.
- (3.) Writing English correctly, and in a good legible hand, from dictation.
English composition, tested by the power of writing an essay, letter, or précis.
- (4.) The elements of geometrical drawing; including the construction of scales and the use of simple mathematical instruments.
- (5.) Geography.

In addition to the foregoing, the candidate will be required to select and qualify in two, and not more than two, of the following subjects:—

- (a.) Mathematics, viz.:—Algebra, up to and including the binomial theorem; the theory and use of logarithms; Euclid, Books I. to IV. and VI.; plane trigonometry, up to and including the solution of triangles; and mensuration.

- (b.) Classics (Latin or Greek).
- (c.) English history:—General.
- (d.) Freehand drawing.

8. The candidate will be exempted from the above examination, except in geometrical drawing, if he can produce a certificate from the proper University authority that he has taken his degree in Arts, or has passed the examination for the degree of B.A. or M.A., at one of the following Universities, viz.:—

Oxford,	Edinburgh,
Cambridge,	St. Andrews,
Durham,	Glasgow,
London,	Aberdeen,
Dublin,	The Royal University, Ireland,

or from one of the chartered Colonial Universities; or if he has passed one of the University Examinations specified below, viz.:—

- Oxford, "Moderations."
Cambridge, "the Previous Examination."
Dublin, "the Final Examination of the Senior Freshman year," or "the Final Examination of the School of Engineering."
Durham, "the First Year's Examination."
The Royal University, Ireland, "the Second University Examination in Arts or the second professional Examination in Engineering."
Scotch Universities, "the Examination for candidates for the Army."
London University, the "First Examination" for the degrees of B.A., LL.B., Sc., or M.B.; or if he has passed some other test which is accepted by the University as exempting from the above examinations.

An equivalent examination at one of the chartered colonial Universities will likewise be accepted as a sufficient ground for exemption.

9. The subjects of the Military examination, and the maximum marks obtainable in each subject, will be as follows:—

In order to qualify for a commission, a candidate will be required to obtain 25 of the marks in each subject, and 5 of the aggregate.

The scope will be that embraced by the Synopsis of the Course of Instruction (in the subjects specified in paragraph 9) at the Royal Military College.* There will, however, be no practical out-of-door examination in any subject. The text books will be those in use at the time at the Royal Military College, Sandhurst, which, for the present, are as follows:—

10. Sets of papers for the examination in both the literary and military subjects will be forwarded in due course, in sealed envelopes, to the Governors of the respective colonies, who will convene Boards, the duty of which will be to see that the papers are fairly worked by the candidates. The papers will then be returned without delay to the Director-General of Military Education, War Office, London, for adjudication.

The Governor of the colony will notify to the War Office, through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, as early as possible in each year, whether he has any duly qualified candidates to nominate, and will, at the same time, state how many sets of papers he will be likely to require for their examination.

11. Until further notice, two Army commissions will be allotted to each of the undermentioned colonies annually:—

New South Wales,
South Australia,
Victoria,
Queensland,
New Zealand,
Cape of Good Hope.

12. In the event of the number of candidates nominated by the Governor in a colony at any time exceeding the allotted number of commissions, the selection will be decided by competition in the military portion of the prescribed examination.

The Regulations for these corps made by the Governor in Council on the 10th day of February 1885, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 13th February 1885, are hereby cancelled.

REGULATIONS.

1. Cadet companies may be established in schools, in detachments of not less than 20 at any one school. For the purpose of these regulations, the word "school" shall mean any place or establishment in which young persons are instructed, or any association of young persons for the purpose of promoting the study of arts, sciences, languages, or any species of learning, or the cultivation of the mind, and which is determined by the Council of Defence to be a school.

2. Detachments or companies shall only be formed in schools where a teacher is qualified to instruct (the qualification to be a certificate from the military school of instruction or the commanding officer), or where the services of a warrant or non-commissioned officer of the permanent staff of militia are available at least twice a week.

3. No boy shall be enrolled under the age of 12 years in State schools, and 13 years in grammar schools, except with the approval of the commandant, and he must have the consent of his parents or guardian.

4. The detachments or companies shall be drilled twice each week, each drill to be not less than half-an-hour, or once each week of one hour's duration, with arms.

5. The various detachments shall be formed into companies, and battalions shall be formed in suitable localities, to consist of not less than four companies.

6. The various companies shall assemble for battalion drill not less than six times a year, two of which shall be half-yearly general inspections by the commanding officer or staff officer.

7. Arms and accoutrements shall be kept in the school, and be used only for drill purposes. The head master shall be held responsible for the preservation of all Government property issued to the cadet corps in his school, reasonable wear and tear excepted.

8. No cadet shall use the carbine or rifle issued to him for any other purpose than parades, drills, or target practices, in each case under command of an officer.

9. The cadet companies shall be under the command of the military commandant, and shall be inspected at least once every six months by an officer detailed from head quarters.

10. The course of training shall be as prescribed by orders issued from head quarters.

11. Cadets must appear (on all occasions) either in the authorized uniform of the company or in purely civilian dress.

12. The various companies shall be under the general command of an officer duly appointed, who is designated the commanding officer.

13. Officers may be appointed by the Governor in Council on the nomination of the military commandant. The commanding officer may, subject to the approval of the military commandant, also appoint acting subalterns. Officers of cadet corps (acting officers excepted) will rank with officers of militia, as junior in their grades; but such rank will not entitle any officer of cadet corps to assume command over any officer of another branch of the service. The commanding officer shall appoint non-commissioned officers.

14. All applications for the formation of companies or detachments must be forwarded by the commanding officer through the military commandant to the Minister for the approval of the Governor in Council.

15. Applications for enrolment must be sent for approval to the commanding officer, stating name and age of each boy. The commanding officer will be held responsible that the provisions of sec. 3 are complied with.

16. Members of any cadet company may, after leaving school, still remain members of the company until they are 19 years of age; or, if above the age of 17 years, may be enrolled in any corps of militia or mounted rifles, provided they fulfil the regulations as regards height and physique, and have served in a cadet corps for not less than two years. Boys who have left school may be allowed to join the cadet corps of any school, provided they are below the age of 19 years. They are, however, on no account to remain members of the corps after that age.

17. Arms and stores issued by the Government shall be inspected by order of the military commandant at least every three months; and, where there is any evidence of neglect or wilful damage, the stores may be at once called in, and the person responsible for such damage be called upon to defray the cost of all repairs.

18. Every member shall deliver up to the appointed officer, in good order and condition, fair wear and tear alone excepted, any Government property which may have been issued to him.

19. The non-commissioned officers of the cadet companies shall be appointed from the ranks of the force, and shall have distinguishing badges to designate their rank.

20. In the case of any company being unfavorably reported on at the half-yearly inspection, the military commandant may

debar such company from taking part in any rifle or other military competition till the next inspection.

21. Any company which is unfavorably reported on at two successive half-yearly inspections will be disbanded.

22. An officer must be present with the boys at target practice, and must exercise the utmost vigilance to prevent accidents, observing that each boy handles his rifle with the care necessary to prevent the possibility of danger to himself or others. (Where no officer is competent to undertake the work, it will be necessary to secure the services of a warrant or non-commissioned officer of the permanent staff of the militia.) The ammunition must be retained in the officer's own possession, only the requisite number of rounds necessary for the practice being handed to each cadet, and at the conclusion of the practice every precaution must be taken that none remains in their hands. Arms and pouches must be examined before leaving the range.

23. The power in regard to ordinary promotions of non-commissioned officers, and to reductions to a lower grade or to the ranks, will be exercised by the commanding officer. The power of dismissal from the company for misconduct, &c., will also be exercised by this officer, subject to the approval of the military commandant.

24. All correspondence relative to cadet companies shall invariably be addressed to the commanding officer.

25. Uniform—

According to that approved by the Council of Defence for the several battalions. In the case of unattached corps, the commanding officer to decide the uniform to be worn, subject to approval by Council of Defence.

26. Accoutrements—

Officers.—Swords (steel scabbards) and black or brown sword-belt.

Cadets.—Black or brown waist-belt and pouch.

27. Minimum establishment of company—

3 Lieutenants.

1 Colour-sergeant.

3 Sergeants.

4 Corporals.

1 Bugler.

60 Privates, of whom 4 may be lance corporals, if required.

Total, 72 All ranks.

Proportionate numbers in detachments or companies allowed officers and non-commissioned officers *pro rata*.

28. Cadets on leaving the companies, provided they have also left school, may obtain from the commanding officer a certificate of discharge, specifying length of service and general conduct.

29. The officer in charge or (where there is no officer) head master of each school in which a detachment or company is formed will keep the muster roll book of the prescribed form, and be responsible that such returns as are required by head quarters be forwarded to the commanding officer.

30. When battalions are established in accordance with sec. 5, the battalion staff shall consist of—

1 Battalion commander with rank of captain.

PUBLIC HEALTH.—SPECIAL DISTRICT INCLUDING
HEALESVILLE, MARYSVILLE, AND FERNSHAW.

BYE-LAW No. 1.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the place or district hereinafter described, that is to say: Commencing at the junction of Watts River with the Yarra Yarra River; thence by the latter river upwards to a point opposite the south boundary of the parish of Gruyere; thence west to and by that boundary to the Woori Yaloak Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the junction of Sheppard's Creek; thence south-easterly by the latter creek, following its eastern branch, to a point near the north-east angle of Thomas James' late selection, in the parish of Tonimbuk; thence to the southern boundary of the county of Evelyn in a south-easterly direction; thence easterly by that boundary to the 146th meridian of east longitude; thence north by that meridian to a point due west of the Bald Hill; thence westerly by a direct line to Mount Arnold; thence north-westerly by a direct line to the north-east angle of the parish of Buxton; thence south-westerly by the boundary of that parish to the Acheron River; thence by that river upwards to a point due west of the north-west angle of allotment 1, parish of Granton; thence S. 60° W. by a line to a point on the crest of the Dividing Range, at Mount Saint Leonard; thence southerly by that range to Mount Monda; thence south magnetic by a line to the Watts River aforesaid; and thence by that river downwards to the point of commencement, in the colony of Victoria, duly appointed by the Governor in Council by virtue of the powers contained in *The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883*, and every other power enabling the said Local Board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 1 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the place or district hereinbefore described, excepting clauses 8, 9, 10, 27, and 28, which shall apply to and have operation in the townships of Healesville, Marysville, and Fernshaw only.

Definitions.

3. In the construction and for the purposes of this bye-law, the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them, that is to say—

"House" shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public-houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging-houses, or other buildings or premises.

"Cesspool" shall mean any receptacle for night-soil or for noxious or offensive matter below or above the ground; and "earth-closet" shall include a pan closet of any description.

"Street" shall mean and include any highway, and any public bridge, and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

"Slaughter-yard" or "slaughter-house" shall include an abattoir or any place whatever where slaughtering takes place.

Words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

Part I.—General Cleanliness.

4. The occupier of every house and premises shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto or occupied in connexion therewith to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all dust, filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be, once at least in every week, removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the Local Board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

5. The occupier of any premises used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, occupation, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be effectually deodorized, and to be removed therefrom once in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia; and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said Local Board at the expense of such occupier.

6. No person shall place or deposit any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil, or any night-soil or other offensive matter in any street, road, lane, right-of-way, or place so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to health or in any way contrary to the directions of the Local Board or officer of health.

7. No person shall keep any animal in such a manner as to pollute any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, so as to endanger the health of any person using such water or drinks or milk or other produce of such dairy.

Part II.—Disposal of House Refuse, and Cleanliness in Towns, &c.

8. The occupier of any land on which is erected any stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, or pigsty, or on which land is any building wherein any horse or other beast of draught or burden or any cattle or swine are kept shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other

manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard, or once at least in every week should the quantity not amount in that time to one cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said Local Board at the expense of such occupier.

9. Every occupier of a building or premises wherein or whereon any horse or other beast of draught or burden or any cattle or swine may be kept shall provide, in connection with such building or premises, whenever required by the Local Board or officer of health, a suitable receptacle for dung, manure, soil, filth, or other offensive or noxious matter which may from time to time be produced in the keeping of any such animal in such building or upon such premises, and cause such receptacle to be constructed so that the bottom or floor thereof shall not in any case be lower than the surface of the ground adjoining such receptacle, and in such a manner and of such materials, and to be maintained at all times in such a condition, as to prevent any effluvia therefrom or any escape of the contents thereof, or any soilage therefrom, into the ground or into the wall of any building, and to be furnished with a suitable cover, and, when not required to be open, to be kept properly covered.

10. He shall likewise provide, in connection with such building or premises, if required by the Local Board or officer of health, a sufficient drain, constructed in such a manner and of such materials, and maintained at all times in such a condition, as effectually to convey all urine or liquid filth or refuse therefrom into a proper receptacle.

Part III.—As to Manure.

11. Nothing herein contained shall be taken to prevent the occupier of any premises from causing any dung, soil (not being night-soil), or other refuse matter produced or accumulated on any premises to be at any time removed, or to be used as manure on any garden or land, or to be kept for the purpose of being used on any garden or land contiguous to such premises as manure, so that the same be not so removed, kept, or used as to contravene any bye-law of the Local Board of Health, or so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or contrary to any directions of the Local Board or officer of health.

12. Every person placing, depositing, or spreading, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited or spread, or assisting in placing or depositing or spreading on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any liquid manure of which night-soil, urine, or any similar offensive matters form a part, night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place, shall immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof cover the same or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered, with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness, and shall keep and use the same in such a way only as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health. And before doing so such person shall obtain the written permission of the Local Board or officer of health, subject however to any general regulation or directions which the Central Board by publication in the *Government Gazette* may make or give. But such permission shall be no defence in any complaint or prosecution for having kept or used such liquid manure, night-soil, offal, blood, or other matter in such a way as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

Part IV.—As to Earth-closets, &c.

13. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground; and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan or other movable receptacle for night-soil, the content whereof does not exceed three cubic feet, and with the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and the contents thereof, and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house, and every public privy, shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material, having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half-an-inch to the foot.

14. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately, on the deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

15. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered so as to be watertight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet, and provided with a closely-fitted cover of pattern to be approved by the inspector of nuisances.

16. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of one foot from the top of the sides, walls, or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Five a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed

or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid, sulphate of iron, chloride of lime, or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

17. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall, once at least in every week, empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

18. All night-soil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and finally placed in such place or places only as may be appointed by the Local Board from time to time for the final reception of the same.

19. No person shall empty, assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Five a.m., unless otherwise permitted by the Local Board (of which the proof shall lie on such person), or until the contents thereof have been properly deodorized; and every person emptying or causing to be emptied any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil shall cause the night-soil taken therefrom to be removed so soon as the same is emptied.

20. No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter into any drain or sewer, or so that the contents thereof may find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any drain or sewer.

Part V.—Special Provisions for Encampments.

21. Whenever public works are being carried out, causing a number of persons to form any temporary encampment, the contractor for the construction of the works shall immediately cause latrines—such as are used in military camps—to be erected, in such a manner, and in such a position, and in such numbers as the Health Officer or the Government Medical Officer may direct; and the said latrines shall be filled in with earth from time to time, so as not to become a nuisance or injurious to health. And if at any time such latrines or a sufficient number are not erected, or the necessary filling is not done, or the said latrines are not kept in such a state as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, the Local Board may erect suitable latrines, and may remove any that have been erected and have become a nuisance or injurious to health, at the expense of the said contractor. And if at any time women or children are living in any such encampment, suitable earth-closets or pan-closets, supplied with some efficient deodorant, shall be erected and provided by such contractor, and the excreta shall be properly removed from such closets as often as may be necessary.

22. No act of defecation or micturition by any person living in such encampment shall take place within three hundred yards from the banks of any river, creek, lagoon, or watercourse near such encampment; nor shall any such act take place, or any night-soil be deposited, or any urine, manure, offal, offensive matter, or refuse of any kind whatever be emptied, deposited, laid, placed, or discharged in such a way or in such a manner that it may be likely to find its way into any such river, creek, lagoon, or watercourse, or so that such river, creek, lagoon, or watercourse be in any manner polluted or contaminated.

23. The person in charge of any house, hut, tent, or building in such encampment in which any other person may be ill from typhoid fever, or the attendant on such patient, shall destroy, or cause to be destroyed, all fecal discharges from the said patient by fire, with as little delay as possible; and in no case whatever shall any such fecal discharges be put, placed, or deposited (whether with the intention of burning or otherwise) on any ground or in such a manner that it may be likely to find its way into any such river, creek, lagoon, or watercourse.

Part VI.—Prevention of Pollution of Water.

24. No person shall place, assist in placing, or cause or permit to be placed in or so that the same may or may be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, any matter or thing likely to endanger the health of any persons using such water or drinks, or milk, or other produce of such dairy.

25. No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse matter into any water supplied, used, or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, or so that the contents or any portion of the contents thereof may find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any such water.

26. Every accumulation or deposit of offensive matter so situated as to find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or likely to be used in any dairy, shall be deodorized and removed by the owner of the property upon which such accumulation or deposit is situated within twenty-four hours of notice given by the Local Board or by one of its officers.

Part VII.—Drainage of Buildings.

27. Every person erecting or causing to be erected any new building shall cause the foundations thereof, and the ground over which such building is to be placed, to be rendered dry, sound, and well drained, so that no water soilage or damp shall lodge there.

28. Every owner of a building shall cause the same to be provided with proper and sufficient drains, so constructed as to prevent any nuisance arising therefrom, and to secure the healthfulness of the inmates of such building; and every tenant of a

building under a lease of which fourteen years or upwards is unexpired shall be deemed an owner within the meaning of this section.

Part VIII.—Registration of Cowkeepers, Dairymen, and Purveyors of Milk.

29. Every person carrying on the trade of cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of October in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form hereunder written; and every such person shall, with every such application, pay a fee of Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.).

30. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the secretary of the Local Board of Health shall endorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

31. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said Local Board, or by any person authorized in writing by the chairman or secretary of the said Local Board; and if, on inspection, such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them, are or is likely in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said Local Board may, by an order in writing signed by the secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or in the case of an unregistered person served personally or left at his dwelling-place, or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said Local Board may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

32. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

33. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept, and be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

34. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

35. If any person or any member of the family of any person registered as aforesaid, or not so registered, but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the Local Board or officer of health or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said Local Board or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any

premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk until danger, in the opinion of such Local Board or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until in either case all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk, or of its contamination, has ceased.

36. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the Local Board, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

37. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep or permit or suffer to be kept any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

Part IX.—Penalties.

38. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties—such portion not being less than Five shillings—to be paid; and any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such Local Board has, or has not taken advantage of such powers.

The foregoing bye-law was duly made, ordered, and passed by the Local Board of Health in and for the place or district aforesaid this eighteenth day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

“IMPORTED STOCK ACT OF 1871.” AND THE “IMPORTED STOCK ACT AMENDMENT ACT OF 1884.”

THE following Regulation, made by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the above-named Act, is hereby published for general information, in lieu of Regulation of 6th August 1886, which is hereby cancelled.

How Imported Australian Sheep are to be admitted overland from other Colonies.—Sheep imported from any clean Australian colony into any other clean colony, and intended to be introduced overland into this colony, may be admitted, if their owner produce to the inspector for this colony at the border a certificate, under the hand of the chief inspector for the colony from which they are intended to be introduced, that when such sheep were introduced into that colony they were certified to be free from infection by the chief inspector for the colony from which they were imported, and that such sheep have been once dipped with proper preparations of tobacco and sulphur, or of sulphur and lime, in a bath given at the temperature and of the duration and in the manner prescribed by number 8 of the Regulations of 1st July 1886. But all such sheep, unless they shall have been imported, quarantined, and dressed as herein prescribed, shall on crossing the border be placed in quarantine, and kept and dipped in the same manner in every respect as prescribed with regard to Australian imported sheep landed at Sydney.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act Amendment Act 1883*, section 32, it was enacted that the Governor in Council, at the request of the council of any municipality, might, by Order to be published in the *Government Gazette*, direct that any portion of a street or road in the municipal district should be a Tree Reserve, so that the portion of such street or road remaining available for traffic upon both sides of such Tree Reserve, including footpaths, should in no place be reduced by any such Tree Reserve to less than forty-six feet, and so that no such Reserve be a greater length than ten chains, and the Governor in Council might revoke any such Order: And whereas on the thirtieth day of June One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven the Council of the Borough of Creswick requested that certain portions of Victoria street, in the township of Creswick, be declared Tree Reserves: Now therefore the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the said in part recited Act, and in compliance with the request made as aforesaid, doth by this Order declare the portions of the street hereinafter mentioned to be Tree Reserves within the meaning of the 32nd section of the said Act, that is to say:—

Certain portions of Victoria street, in the township of Creswick, shown on a plan marked "A" deposited at the Office of Public Works, Melbourne.

And the Honorable John Nimmo, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

GRANT OF ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY POUNDS (£150) FOR INVENTION OF MACHINERY FOR THRASHING PEASE.

A SUM not exceeding One hundred and fifty pounds may be paid to any person or company who shall, in the opinion of the Minister of Agriculture, produce a machine capable of thrashing within twelve hours eight hundred bushels of pease without injury thereto.

2. The reward shall be paid only to the inventor, or his agent, of such machine as shall most cheaply, efficiently, and rapidly perform the work required, and within the time aforesaid.

3. Persons intending to compete for the reward must give notice in writing of their intention to the Secretary for Agriculture, Melbourne, not later than the 24th November next.

4. One or more trials of the machines shall be made at such place or places and at such times as the Minister may direct.

5. All costs and expenses of forwarding, attendance, and working the machines at the times to be appointed, shall be paid by the persons entering the machines for competition.

6. The Minister may appoint three or more judges to report upon the merits of the competing machines, and a decision of a majority of such judges shall be final.

7. The judges may recommend payment of an amount or amounts the total of which shall not exceed One hundred and fifty pounds (£150) to the inventor or inventors, or his or their agent or agents, of the successful machine or machines, such amounts to be apportioned to the value to the colony of the said invention or inventions.
