PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir Henry Brougham Loch, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the eighty-eighth section of The Public Service Act 1883, and in the fifth section of The Bank Holidays Act 1873, I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation appoint

WEDNESDAY THE 7TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER INSTANT

to be observed as a Public and Bank Half-Holiday at Sale, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon;

FRIDAY THE 9TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER INSTANT

to be observed as a Public and Bank Holiday within the Borough of St. Arnaud, the Shire of Ballarat, the West Riding of the Shire of Gordon, and the North and South Ridings of the Shire of St. Arnaud; and as a Bank Holiday within the Borough of Creswick;

Wednesday the 14th day of September instant to be observed as a Public and Bank Holiday at Cashel; and as a Public and Bank Half-Holiday at Ararat, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon;

THURSDAY THE 15TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER INSTANT

to be observed as a Public and Bank Holiday within the United Shire of Beechworth;

FRIDAY THE 16TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER INSTANT

to be observed as a Public and Bank Holiday at Macarthur, and within the East Riding of the Shire of Gordon; and as a Bank Holiday at Dunkeld and Penshurst;

TUESDAY THE 20TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER INSTANT

to be observed as a Public and Bank Holiday within the Shire of Chiltern;

TUESDAY THE 27TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER INSTANT

to be observed as a Public and Bank Holiday within the North Riding of the Shire of Benalla; and as a Bank Holiday at Rochester;

Wednesday the 28th-day of September instant

to be observed as a Public and Bank Holiday within the West and Central Ridings of the Shire of Gordon;

THURSDAY THE 29TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER INSTANT

to be observed as a Public and Bank Holiday within the Shires of Lowan and Wimmera; FRIDAY THE 30TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER INSTANT

to be observed as a Public and Bank Holiday within the Shires of Benalla, Lowan, and Wimmera; Wednesday the 5th day of October next

to be observed as a Public and Bank Holiday at Dimboola, Nhill, Warracknabeal, and within the Shire of Lowan; and as a Bank Holiday at Rochester.

PROCLAMATION

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir Henar Brougham Looh, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander in Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Public Service Act 1883 it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, appoint, in addition to certain specified days, any other day or days to be kept as Public Holidays: And whereas by The Bank Holidays Act 1873 it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor might from time to time, as he might think fit by Proclamation, appoint a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday either throughout Victoria or in any part thereof: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-second day of August One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and made in pursuance of the said Acts, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, did proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation bearing date the twenty-second day of August One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, so far only as the same relates to Saturday the seventeenth day of September instant being observed as a Bank Holiday at Dunkeld and Penshurst.

Given under my hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this fifth day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and in the fifty-first year of Her Majesty's reign.
