Downing street, 8th July 1887.

Sir,—I have the honor to acquaint you, for the information of the colony under your Government, that a note was received by the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs on the 11th of June, from the Minister of Foreign Affairs of Nicaragua, announcing the decision of his Government to terminate the provisions of the Treaty of Friendship, Commerce, and Navigation between Great Britain and Nicaragua, of the 11th of February 1860, in virtue of the terms of Article XXVII. thereof.

Her Majesty's Government, in taking note of this announcement, have stated that they understand that the said treaty will accordingly terminate on the 11th of June 1888, being twelve months from the date on which the note was received.

- with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

  5. Before any license shall be granted by the trust, the person applying for same shall satisfy the trust that he is a competent plumber.

Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall wilfully offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the trust, without giving 24 hours' notice to the trust of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the trust, without the permission in writing of the trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the trust without giving 24 hours' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the trust, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the trust, or who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipe of the trust of a strength and material not sanctioned by the trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.   8. Three-quarter-inch diameter or bore galvanized service-pipe, of approved quality, will only be allowed for external services. Ordinary connections with sub-mains must be made with proper ferrules, to which a length of not less than three feet of pipe must be attached. One service-pipe only to each tenement, &c., will be permitted; and for houses rated at Twenty pounds per annun and under, the bore of such service-pipe must not exceed finch, provided that in all cases, when water charges exceed Twenty shillings per annum, the premises shall be entitled to use a \( \frac{2}{3} \) inch service-pipe and tap.

  9. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the trust into the permises of such person, after having received notice from the secretary of the trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the trust, by its officers or servants, may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe, or otherwise as to the said trust officers or servants may seem fit, until the neces-

sary repairs have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupiers (if any), and if none, the owner, shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky, or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five

- pounds.

  10. Any person supplied with water by the trust, who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of not exceeding Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the trust, and the trust, by its officers or servants, may stop the water flowing into the premises.

  11. No meter shall be allowed to be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering (1,000,000) one million gallons, and except by special permission of the trust.

  12. If any meter should cease registering, or be reported by
- and except by special permission of the trust.

  12. If any meter should cease registering, or be reported by any officer or servant of the trust as out of repair or registering inaccurately, the trust shall estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order, and until it is repaired and refixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the previous year, or the trust may insert a check meter on the service-pipe.
  - 13. Overflow pipes to any vessel will not be permitted.

  14. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first fixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
  15. In the construction of this bye-law the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation whether aggregate or sole.

- 16. If the charge for water be not paid when due and demanded, the trust, by its secretary or servants, may discontinue the supply of water by disconnecting the service-pipe, the occupier or owner to be nevertheless liable for the charges.
- 17. All notices signed by the secretary to be taken as issued by the trust.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulation made by the Chairman and Commissioners of the Bet Bet Shire Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by The Victorian Water Conservation Acts, Nos. 716 and 829.

The Chairman and Commissioners of the Bet Bet Shire Water works Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by The Victorian Water Conscrvation Acts 1881-1884, make the Regulation following:—

#### RECULATION No. 1.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water

supplied by the Trust within the part of the Waterworks District supplied with water as described in the Government Gazette of 24th December 1886, viz., the township of Bealiba, that is to

- 1. For every house or tenement, the sum of Five pounds per centum per annum on the annual value of such property.
- 2. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based upon the municiual valuation.

Such rate to be for domestic purposes only. All water supplied for other than domestic purposes shall be by measure, to be charged for at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per one thousand gallons.

The before-mentioned rate is made for the year commencing on the first day of January 1887 and ending on the thirty-first day of December 1887, and shall be payable on the first day of September 1887. Such persons as the Commissioners of the Bet Bet Shire Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate.

BYE-LAW NO. 4, AS TO DAIRIES, DAIRY CATTLE, AND MILK.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Caulfield, in the Colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in *The Public Health Amendment Statute 1893*, and every other power enabling the said Local Board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 4 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to

- All former bye-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.
- 2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the Government Gazette.
- 3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said shire.

Registration of Cowkeepers, Dairymen, and Purreyors of Milk.

Registration of Cowkeepers, Dairymen, and Purveyors of Milk.

4. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of January in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the Secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of Twenty shillings.

Application for Registration as

To the Secretary of the Local Board of Health for the Shire of Caulfield.

Sir,-I desire to be registered in accordance with the particulars in the schedule hereunder :-

Schedule Name in full Trade in respect of which registration is desired .... Style or firm under which trade is to be carried on ... Every place within the jurisdiction of the Local Board of Health at which such trade or any part of it is to be carried on, including a full description of all paddocks, grass lands, grounds, and enclosues occupied or used or intended to be used by the applicant Year commencing the 1st day of January 18 Period of time for which registration is desired ... ...

5. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the Secretary for the Local Board of Health shall endorso the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said Local Board, or by any person authorized in writing by the Chairman or Secretary of the said Local Board; and if, on inspection, such paddocks, grounds,

or enclosures, or any one of them, are or is likely in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said Local Board may, by an order in writing signed by the Secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or in the case of an unregistered person served personally or left at his dwelling-lace, or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle oither absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said Local Board may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or

- 7. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a muisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated; and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.
- 8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy clows shall be regularly swept, and be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances, be funigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order collinated.
- 9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.
- 9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

  10. If any person, or any member of the family of any person, registered as aforesaid, or not so registered, but employed as a cowkeeper, dairynan, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the be the person attacked) his wife or other person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the Local Board or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said Local Board or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, until danger, in the opinion of such Local Board or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until, in either case, all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.
- of infection to the finix or of the contamination has ceased.

  11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy, or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the Local Board, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force; and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.
- 12. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep or permit or suffer to be kept any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.
- 13. In the interpretation of this bye-law words imputing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.
- 14. Every person guilty of any breach of this bye-law or of any of its provisions shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings, for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

The foregoing bye-law was duly made, ordered, and passed by the Local Board of Health (being the Municipal Council) in and for the Shire of Caulfield this twenty-eighth day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

We have Duncan, John Henry Dyer, John Cronie, Hugh McLean, and Charles McDonald, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved, by Order of 15th March 1887, as a Site for Public Park, Racecourse, and Recreation purposes in the parish of Lallat, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 33 of The Land Act 1884.

The committee of management may allow any duly recognized committee of any shows, sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements to use the reserve; and such latter committee shall abide by any order given by the committee of management in reference thereto, or to the buildings or other erections for the time being thereon.

  3. No person shall remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

  4. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor light fires therein.

  5. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, or stick bills or cut names thereon, or in any way damage the trees, seats, or buildings whatsoever, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

No person shall put in the reserve any horses, cattle, or sheep, or take horses therein, without first obtaining the written permission of the committee of management; provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
- 7. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantation of young trees or shrubs.
- 8. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, or any booth or other structure for the sale or exhibition of any article or animal, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.

  9. No person shall dig any holes or remove or destroy any surface grass or turf in the reserve, without the consent in writing of the committee of management first obtained.

Any person committing in the reserve or in any of the buildings or other structures for the time being thereon any of the following offences shall be liable to be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased and shall or may be in possession of a ticket of admission thereto:

    2. Being drunk.
    3. Using profane or obscene language.
    4. Using abusive or insulting words.
    5. Behaving improperly or riotously.
    6. Obtaining admission to the reserve or any buildings thereon when not entitled to such admission, or refusing to surrender (if required) to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the committee of management any ticket duly authorizing admission to the reserve.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of The Land Act 1884, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith a prepriended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

6. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor

The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery on the certificate of a minister of religion, or such evidence as will fully meet with the approval of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relations or friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.

The Title (£5 Reward, Dissolution of Partnership, &c.) forms one or more lines, as a heading.

On an average, ten words make a line, but for the description of a brand consisting of more than one letter, d.c., placed perpendicularly, thus, B, each additional letter under the first is charged B

Every Signature must likewise be counted as a line.

The final words of a paragraph, though only a portion of a line, must be counted as one line.

Signatures (in particular) and Proper names must be written very plainly in the text; ONE SIDE ONLY of each slip of paper should be WRITTEN UPON.

ALL DOCUMENTS illegibly written will be returned unpublished, and where brands occur unprovided for by the ordinary letters of the alphabet, a worded explanatory description must be furnished.

POSTAGE STAMPS cannot in any case be received in payment unless One Shilling extra in the Pound is added, as commission, without which the Post Office will not cash them.
