ACT OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

I THE Governor of Victoria, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to make better provision for the holding of a Public International Exhibition in Melbourne in the year One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, and for other purposes."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twelfth day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and in the fifty-first year of Her Majesty's reign.

TERMINATION OF TREATY OF FRIENDSHIP, COMMERCE, AND NAVIGATION BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND NICARAGUA.

Downing street, 8th July 1887.

SIR,—I have the honor to acquaint you, for the information of the colony under your Government, that a note was received by the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs on the 11th of June, from the Minister of Foreign Affairs of Nicaragua, announcing the decision of his Government to terminate the provisions of the Treaty of Friendship, Commerce, and Navigation between Great Britain and Nicaragua, of the 11th of February 1860, in virtue of the terms of Article XXVII. thereof.

Her Majesty's Government, in taking note of this announcement, have stated that they understand that the said treaty will accordingly terminate on the 11th of June 1888, being twelve months from the date on which the note was received.

LEADING LIGHTS AND BEACONS AT BOAT CHANNEL, BRISBANE RIVER.

BOROUGH ECHUCA WATER TRUST.—REGULATION.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulation, made by the Borough Echuca Water Trust in accordance with the powers conferred by sections 44, 54, and 56 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881* (No. 716), and also section 12 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Acts 1881-1883* (No. 829):—

The Commissioners of the Borough Echuca Water Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by sections 44, 54, and 56 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881* (No. 716), and also section 12 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Acts 1881-1883* (No. 829), do make the following Regulation:—

REGULATION NO. 2.—REGULATION FOR THE PROPER CONTROL AND MANAGEMENT OF THE WATERWORKS OF THE BOROUGH ECHUCA WATER TRUST.

General Conditions.

1. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be—

- (1.) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at Three shillings per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure; and
- (2.) If for other than domestic purposes, not exceeding 25,000 gallons per quarter. "Syphon pumps" will not be allowed unless the water is supplied by measure.

2. Any person receiving water from the trust who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

3. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the trust who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

4. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the trust, or alter, or repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the trust, he shall obtain from the trust a license in that behalf to execute such work; any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering

with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

5. Before any license shall be granted by the trust, the person applying for same shall satisfy the trust that he is a competent plumber.

6. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall wilfully offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the trust, without giving 24 hours' notice to the trust of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the trust, without the permission in writing of the trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

7. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the trust without giving 24 hours' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the trust, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the trust, or who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipe of the trust of a strength and material not sanctioned by the trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds. Iron piping of the following dimensions, namely:—

8. Three-quarter-inch diameter or bore galvanized service-pipe, of approved quality, will only be allowed for external services. Ordinary connections with sub-mains must be made with proper ferrules, to which a length of not less than three feet of pipe must be attached. One service-pipe only to each tenement, &c., will be permitted; and for houses rated at Twenty pounds per annum and under, the bore of such service-pipe must not exceed ½-inch, provided that in all cases, when water charges exceed Twenty shillings per annum, the premises shall be entitled to use a ¾-inch service-pipe and tap.

9. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from the secretary of the trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the trust, by its officers or servants, may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe, or otherwise as to the said trust officers or servants may seem fit, until the neces-

sary repairs have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupiers (if any), and if none, the owner, shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky, or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

10. Any person supplied with water by the trust, who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of not exceeding Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the trust, and the trust, by its officers or servants, may stop the water flowing into the premises.

11. No meter shall be allowed to be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering (1,000,000) one million gallons, and except by special permission of the trust.

12. If any meter should cease registering, or be reported by any officer or servant of the trust as out of repair or registering inaccurately, the trust shall estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order, and until it is repaired and refixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the previous year, or the trust may insert a check meter on the service-pipe.

13. Overflow pipes to any vessel will not be permitted.

14. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first fixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

15. In the construction of this bye-law the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation whether aggregate or sole.

16. If the charge for water be not paid when due and demanded, the trust, by its secretary or servants, may discontinue the supply of water by disconnecting the service-pipe, the occupier or owner to be nevertheless liable for the charges.

17. All notices signed by the secretary to be taken as issued by the trust.

The foregoing regulation was duly made and adopted by the Commissioners of the Borough Echuca Water Trust at their office, Echuca, on the first day of June; and the Seal of the Trust was affixed thereto this seventeenth day of June One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven (1887).

WHEREAS by section 95 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883* (No. 778) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time fix a sum which shall be the minimum amount of rates to be paid annually by any owner or occupier of property liable to be rated by any waterworks or irrigation trust: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth order and direct that the sum of One pound sterling shall be the minimum amount of rates to be paid annually by every owner or occupier of property liable to be rated by "The Chairman and Commissioners of the Bet Bet Shire Waterworks Trust."

And the Honorable Alfred Deakin, Her Majesty's Minister of Water Supply for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

BET BET SHIRE WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATION.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulation made by the Chairman and Commissioners of the Bet Bet Shire Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by *The Victorian Water Conservation Acts, Nos. 716 and 829*.

The Chairman and Commissioners of the Bet Bet Shire Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by *The Victorian Water Conservation Acts 1881-1884*, make the Regulation following:—

REGULATION No. 1.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water

supplied by the Trust within the part of the Waterworks District supplied with water as described in the *Government Gazette* of 24th December 1886, viz., the township of Bealiba, that is to say:—

1. For every house or tenement, the sum of Five pounds per centum per annum on the annual value of such property.

2. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based upon the municipal valuation.

Such rate to be for domestic purposes only. All water supplied for other than domestic purposes shall be by measure, to be charged for at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per one thousand gallons.

The before-mentioned rate is made for the year commencing on the first day of January 1887 and ending on the thirty-first day of December 1887, and shall be payable on the first day of September 1887. Such persons as the Commissioners of the Bet Bet Shire Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate.

"The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883."

SHIRE OF CAULFIELD.

BYE-LAW No. 4, AS TO DAIRIES, DAIRY CATTLE, AND MILK.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Caulfield, in the Colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in *The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883*, and every other power enabling the said Local Board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 4 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said shire.

Registration of Cowkeepers, Dairymen, and Purveyors of Milk.

4. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of January in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the Secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of Twenty shillings.

Application for Registration as

To the Secretary of the Local Board of Health for the Shire of Caulfield.

Sir,—I desire to be registered in accordance with the particulars in the schedule hereunder:—

Schedule.

Name in full
Trade in respect of which registration is desired
Style or firm under which trade is to be carried on
Every place within the jurisdiction of the Local Board of Health at which such trade or any part of it is to be carried on, including a full description of all paddocks, grass lands, grounds, and enclosures occupied or used or intended to be used by the applicant
Period of time for which registration is desired
Year commencing the 1st day of January 18

5. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the Secretary for the Local Board of Health shall endorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said Local Board, or by any person authorized in writing by the Chairman or Secretary of the said Local Board; and if, on inspection, such paddocks, grounds,

or enclosures, or any one of them, are or is likely in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said Local Board may, by an order in writing signed by the Secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or in the case of an unregistered person served personally or left at his dwelling-place, or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said Local Board may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated; and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept, and be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person, or any member of the family of any person, registered as aforesaid, or not so registered, but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the Local Board or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said Local Board or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, until danger, in the opinion of such Local Board or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until, in either case, all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy, or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the Local Board, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force; and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep or permit or suffer to be kept any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

13. In the interpretation of this bye-law words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

14. Every person guilty of any breach of this bye-law or of any of its provisions shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings, for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

The foregoing bye-law was duly made, ordered, and passed by the Local Board of Health (being the Municipal Council) in and for the Shire of Caulfield this twenty-eighth day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

STOCK QUARANTINE DISTRICTS ABOLISHED.

SHIRES OF NARRACAN AND TRARALGON.

PROPOSED SEVERANCE OF AREA.

IN pursuance of the provisions of *The Local Government Act 1874* (No. 506, sec. 46), the substance and prayer of a Petition, in accordance with the 44th section of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, are published, viz.:

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the ratepayers in the portion of the Shire of Narracan described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the said Shire of Narracan and annexed to the Shire of Traralgon.

Area described in the petition:—
Commencing at Walsh's Crossing on Morwell River; thence west as far as the selection of Alex. Mulvenna, on the western corner; thence south along the Darlimurla road to the corner of the selection of Donald McPhee; thence west to the eastern corner of Jas. Wright's selection; thence in a direct line south across the Railway line along the outer boundaries of the selections of M. Rout, J. Hopkins, W. F. O'Grady, Richard Marshall, Reuben Wright, and John Wright, there joining the Traralgon Shire.

Petitioners state that portion sought to be severed forms a narrow strip of land running into Traralgon Shire, and that naturally it should be in that shire; that owing to being on the extreme outskirts of the Shire of Narracan, they are neglected; that the Traralgon Shire ratepayers some time since started an agitation for a steam tramway to connect Mirboo with the railway line at Boolara, the last three miles of the tramway being in Narracan Shire; the tramway being of the greatest importance to the petitioners, they thought Narracan Shire Council would assist them in forwarding same, but instead of doing so have thrown obstacles in the way, and at last refused to have anything to do with the matter; that the Traralgon Shire Council has done all in its power to forward the interests of the ratepayers, and has received a promise from the Minister of Railways that he will favorably consider the request for a portion of the Government grant for tramways, and a contract has been let for survey of the line, which would now be completed but for Narracan Shire refusing to have any connexion with the movement; that it will be much better for the future working of the proposed tramway that all the line should be in one shire.

The petitioners therefore humbly pray that Your Excellency will be pleased to exercise the powers conferred by the 19th section of *The Local Government Act 1874*, and cause that portion of the Shire of Narracan above described to be severed from the Shire of Narracan and annexed to the Shire of Traralgon.

WE, Walter Duncan, John Henry Dyer, John Cromie, Hugh McLean, and Charles McDonald, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved, by Order of 15th March 1887, as a Site for Public Park, Racecourse, and Recreation purposes in the parish of Lallat, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 33 of *The Land Act 1834*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on days set apart for shows, sports, fêtes, and holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding 2s. 6d. may be charged and taken for the admission to the reserve of every adult person.
2. The committee of management may allow any duly recognized committee of any shows, sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements to use the reserve; and such latter committee shall abide by any order given by the committee of management in reference thereto, or to the buildings or other erections for the time being thereon.
3. No person shall remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
4. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor light fires therein.
5. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, or stick bills or cut names thereon, or in any way damage the trees, seats, or buildings whatsoever, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
6. No person shall put in the reserve any horses, cattle, or sheep, or take horses therein, without first obtaining the written permission of the committee of management; provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
7. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantation of young trees or shrubs.
8. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, or any booth or other structure for the sale or exhibition of any article or animal, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.
9. No person shall dig any holes or remove or destroy any surface grass or turf in the reserve, without the consent in writing of the committee of management first obtained.
10. Any person committing in the reserve or in any of the buildings or other structures for the time being thereon any of the following offences shall be liable to be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased and shall or may be in possession of a ticket of admission thereto:—

1. Assaulting any person.
2. Being drunk.
3. Using profane or obscene language.
4. Using abusive or insulting words.
5. Behaving improperly or riotously.
6. Obtaining admission to the reserve or any buildings thereon when not entitled to such admission, or refusing to surrender (if required) to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the committee of management any ticket duly authorizing admission to the reserve.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1834*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

GOBUR PUBLIC CEMETERY.

Rules and Regulations.

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.
2. Any person or persons making a vault, or erecting or placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees, under these rules, and upon payment of the proper charge, is entitled to have the right to keep and maintain a vault, monument, or tombstone, in accordance with the purport of such permission, to and for the sole use of such person and his or their representatives for ever.
3. Application for such permission to be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate in the form of Schedule A will be granted to any person or persons applying for such permission on payment of the proper charges.
4. Due notice for orders for interments should be given to the trustees the day preceding same, between the hours of 10 o'clock in the forenoon and 4 o'clock in the afternoon.
5. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but in the event of persons requiring brick graves or vaults, they must construct them under the direction of the trustees or a substitute appointed by them for that purpose; in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent (in writing) of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.
6. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery on the certificate of a minister of religion, or such evidence as will fully meet with the approval of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relations or friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.
7. Hours of interment from 10 a.m. till 5 p.m., except in special cases, as where death is occasioned by any contagious disease. The hour fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually attended to.
8. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences to be kept in proper repair at the expense of the owner. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office. Registers of all permissions are kept by the secretary.
9. Any person wantonly destroying, defacing, or causing to be done any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fencing, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the cemetery is by the statute guilty of a misdemeanor.
10. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these rules.

- 1st. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.
- 2nd. Orders for interment to be given to the secretary the day previous, before Four o'clock p.m.
- 3rd. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.
- 4th. The usual hours for the performance of funerals will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. from September to April inclusive, and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. the remaining months of the year, except on Sunday, when the usual and only hours for funerals will be from Two to Five o'clock throughout the year.
- 5th. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but parties requiring brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the trustees or their surveyor; or in case of interment to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.
- 6th. By the Act 27 Vict. No. 201, any person making a vault, or erecting or placing a monument or tombstone in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees and upon the payment of the proper charges, is entitled to have maintained and kept up a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the terms of such permission, and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons and their representatives for ever.
- 7th. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in proper repair and condition at the expense of the owners.
- 8th. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be cemented and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.
- 9th. A drawing of every stone, tomb, fence, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, to be submitted to the trustees, who are empowered by the Act to withhold permission and prevent the erection of any monument which shall appear to them inappropriate or unbecoming, and who are required to determine and fix the position of any monument having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner; and in the erection of tablets copper clamps must be used.
- 10th. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery on the certificate of a minister of religion or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relations and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the charges.
- 11th. No person engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees shall be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.
- 12th. The ground will be open to the public daily from sunrise to sunset.
- 13th. A plan of the cemetery will be kept at the office of the secretary for inspection.
- 14th. Any person who wantonly or wilfully shall destroy or do or cause to be done any damage to any grave, vault, monument, tombstone, or fence, or damage or remove any shrub, tree,

or plant, shall, on conviction before any two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds or be otherwise dealt with as the Act provides.

15th. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.

16th. The dimensions of ordinary graves will be as follows, viz.:—6 feet deep, 7 feet long, 2 feet 2 inches wide at the shoulders, with other parts proportionate; in the event of any larger size being required, due notice must be given, in default thereof the undertaker will have to enlarge the same at his own expense.

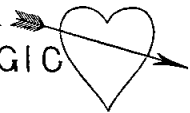
