DETENTION IN QUARANTINE OF VESSELS FROM TASMANIA.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the fourth day of October 1887.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor.

Mr. Deakin

Mr. Nimmo.

WHEREAS by *The Public Health Statute 1865* (28 Victoria No. 264, Sec. 90) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make such Orders as may be deemed expedient, upon any unforeseen emergency, with respect to any vessel arriving in Victoria under any alarming or suspicious circumstances as to infection or contagion, and also with respect to the persons and things on board the same: And whereas an outbreak of Small-pox has occurred in the Island of Tasmania, and it is expedient to make an Order to prevent, as far as possible, the spread of such contagious disease in Victoria: And whereas the vessels *Mararoa*, *Flinders*, *Falcon*, and *Isabel* have arrived from the said Island, and are now detained in quarantine at the Quarantine Station at Point Nepean: Now therefore I, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this Order direct that the said vessels *Mararoa*, *Flinders*, *Falcon*, and *Isabel*, and such other vessels as may arrive from the said Island of Tasmania until this Order be revoked, together with all persons and things on board such vessels, be detained in quarantine at the said Quarantine Station until severally released by the Health Officer.

And the Honorable Alfred Deakin, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"THE FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACT 1885."

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the 29th section of *The Factories and Shops Act 1885* (40 Vict. No. 862), and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of the said section 29 in the

SKIRT FACTORY OF MESSRS. EDWARDS AND CONROY, YOUNG AND VICTORIA STREETS, FITZROY,

for a period of three months from the date hereof, upon these express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said workrooms more than fifteen females for more than fifty-six hours in any one week in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without her consent.
3. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory for the information of all concerned.
