Sir,—With reference to my Circular Despatch of the 14th of September last, transmitting to you copies of revised Regulations governing the examination and entry of Naval Cadets, I have the honor to transmit to you, for information in the Colony under your Government, an extract from a letter from the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, stating that they have decided to allow to colonial candidates who fail to pass successfully at their first examination the opportunity of being examined again in about six months' time, provided they are still within the prescribed limit of age.

EXTRACT FROM A LETTER FROM THE ADMIRALTY TO THE COLONIAL OFFICE, DATED THE 11TH OF OCTOBER 1887.

My Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty having had under their consideration the disadvantages under which, in some respects, candidates for colonial cadetships suffer, as compared with candidates who are examined in England, especially as regards a second trial, I am commanded by their Lordships to acquaint you, for the information of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, that they have decided to allow colonial candidates who fail to pass successfully at their first trial the opportunity of being examined again in about six months' time, provided they are then still within the limit of age.

2. My Lords have, therefore, given orders to the effect that when a candidate who is examined for the first time fails to pass successfully he is to be informed by the Commander-in-Chief on the station that he may present himself for re-examination in the following June or November, as the case may be, provided he will, at the date of his re-examination, be still within the limit of age prescribed by the Regulations.

## ALTERATION OF LEADING LIGHTS, OTAGO HARBOUR.

Marine Department,

Wellington, N.Z., 8th December 1887.

THE Otago Harbour Board have given notice that, on and after the 1st day of February 1888, a fixed green light will be exhibited from a white tower erected on the outer end of the recently constructed Cargill Mole, which runs 4,100ft. to seaward from the sandspit at the west side of the entrance to Otago Harbour. The light will be 29ft. above sea-level, and will be visible about six miles all round the compass. Also that, on the same date, the present inner leading light for crossing the bar will be changed from green to red, the outer light remaining white as before.

## ROCK IN TAWHITINUI REACH, PELORUS SOUND.

The position of the rock in Tawhitinui Reach, Pelorus Sound, reported by Captain William Turner, of the cutter *Dart*, has been examined by Captain Fairchild, of the Government steamer *Stella*. The rock, which is 25ft. across, and has 1ft. of water on it at low-water springs, is steep to all round, and is surmounted by a beacon painted red. It lies about midway and a little to the southward of a line drawn between Camel Point and Gregoe Point; Camel Point bearing N.W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  N., and the eastern extreme of Awaiti Island bearing S. by W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W.

## "THE PASSENGERS HARBORS AND NAVIGATION STATUTE 1865."

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Passengers Harbors and Navigation Statute 1865* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, by proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, may from time to time define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria, and from time to time in like manner may alter, amend, and repeal any such limits and boundaries, and substitute others in their stead: And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the thirteenth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, did define the limits and boundaries of the Port of Belfast: And whereas the name of the borough of "Belfast" has been duly changed to that of "Port Fairy" and it is expedient that the limits and boundaries of the "Port of Port Fairy" be defined in lieu of those of the "Port of Belfast": Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby repeal such portion of the above-mentioned Proclamation as relates to the "Port of Belfast," and do declare that the following shall be substituted in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

The Port of Port Fairy shall consist of all inlets, rivers, and bays contained within a line running north-east from the eastern point of Rabbit Island to the opposite shore.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony of Victoria, at Melbourne, this twenty-ninth day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and in the fifty-first year of Her Majesty's reign.

## REGULATIONS OF THE MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST COMMISSIONERS.

## REGULATIONS OF THE MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST COMMISSIONERS.

In pursuance of "*The Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1876*," "*The Melbourne Harbor Trust Act Amendment Act 1883*," and "*The Melbourne Harbor Trust Further Amendment Act 1883*," the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following Regulation:—

Clause No. 87 of Part II. of the Regulations made by the Commissioners on the fourth day of December 1884 is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following shall be substituted and shall be read with and as forming part of said Regulations, viz.:—

## GOODS ON WHARVES.

"All goods imported and landed upon any wharf, as well as all goods placed thereon for the purpose of export, shall be removed therefrom within twenty-four hours after having been so landed or placed thereon; and unless such goods shall be so removed they may be removed by the Harbor-master and stored in any bonded or other warehouse, on behalf and at the risk and expense of the owners thereof, and payment of the cost, charges, and expenses attending such removal and storage may be enforced and recovered in the same manner as tolls, rates, charges, and expenses are enforceable and recoverable under section 93 of *The Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1876*."

"Provided that no goods liable to duty shall be removed unless with the consent of the Landing Surveyor in charge of the Customs Station, who shall nominate the warehouse to which such goods shall be removed."

In witness whereof the said Commissioners have hereunto affixed their common seal this 21st day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

**"THE LICENSING ACT 1885."—TIME FOR HOLDING THE LICENSING COURT FOR THE BERWICK LICENSING DISTRICT EXTENDED.**

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1885* (No. 857, s. 64) it was enacted that the Licensing Court for each Licensing District should, in the month of December in every year, hold an annual sitting of the Court at the place appointed, of which annual sitting one month's previous notice should be given in the *Government Gazette*: Provided that the Governor in Council might, by an Order in Council, extend the time for the holding of such Court by a period not exceeding two months from the thirty-first day of December: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order extend the time for holding the Annual Sitting of the Licensing Court for the Berwick Licensing District appointed to be held on the second day of December One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven by a period not exceeding two months from the thirty-first day of December One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven inclusive.

HIS Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in exercise of the powers conferred by *The Discipline Act 1870*, doth hereby make the following additions to the Regulations for Rifle Clubs, that is to say:—

To paragraph 17 add . . . . . "and any member so absent, except on leave obtained from the officer in charge of Rifle Clubs, shall be liable to be struck off the strength of the club to which he belongs: provided that any member on leaving the locality of his club may, at his own request, be transferred to any other club, if he be eligible under the rules of such club."

And the Honorable Sir James Lorimer, Her Majesty's Minister of Defence for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

**VICTORIAN MILITARY FORCES.—  
REGULATIONS FOR RIFLE VOLUNTEERS.**

HIS Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in exercise of the powers conferred by *The Discipline Act 1870*, doth hereby approve of the following Regulations for Victorian Rifle Volunteers, that is to say:—

**PART VI.—REGULATIONS FOR RIFLE VOLUNTEERS.**

*Section I.—Constitution and Establishment.*

1. The rifle volunteers shall consist of such members of a rifle club as elect to join that branch of the club, and are approved of by the officer commanding rifle volunteers.

2. Detachments of rifle volunteers may, on the recommendation of the commandant, be established in any rifle club where not less than 20 members elect to engage, provided that within a radius of 35 miles where rail is available, or 10 miles where rail is not available, a sufficient number of similar detachments can be raised to form a company of not less than 120 men.

3. Engagement shall be for a period not exceeding three years, but members may, with the sanction of the commandant, re-engage during the last year of their service for a further period of one, three, or five years.

Any person so engaged may (with the approval of the Governor in Council if an officer, or of the commanding officer if below the rank of an officer) resign from the rifle volunteers by giving 14 days' notice in writing to the officer commanding his detachment.

4. No person shall be engaged unless he be a British subject and between the ages of 18 and 35, but persons who have previously served in the Imperial, regular, or auxiliary forces, or in any colonial militia, or volunteer force, may be enrolled if under the age of 45. Persons who have served in a volunteer cadet corps for a period of not less than two years may be engaged between the ages of 17 and 18, if fulfilling all other conditions.

5. Boys may be engaged for the purpose of being trained as drummers, buglers, or musicians. Not more than two boys per company will be allowed. Age 14 to 18 years.

6. All applicants for engagement in the ranks must attend recruit drill until passed into the ranks.

7. After being passed into the ranks, members will be required to undergo a minimum of 12 daylight drills and 12 night drills per annum. Such drills will be held at such time and place as may be found convenient, and in the presence of the commanding officer or such other officer as he may appoint.

Daylight drills shall be attended by two or more detachments of a company; 50 per cent. of the collective strength of the detachments ordered to parade must attend in order that a daylight drill may count towards effectives.

8. No rifle volunteer shall be classed as effective unless he shall have completed 12 daylight drills and 12 night drills during the twelve months between 1st July and 30th June in each year, and completed his course of musketry training.

Recruits passed into the ranks between 1st July and 30th September must attend 12 daylight drills and 12 night drills, and have completed the course of musketry.

Recruits passed into the ranks between 1st October and 31st December must attend 6 daylight drills and 6 night drills, and have completed the half-yearly course of musketry.

Recruits passed into the ranks between 1st January and 31st March must attend 3 daylight drills and 3 night drills, and have completed the quarterly course of musketry.

Recruits passed into the ranks between 1st April and 30th June must attend 2 daylight drills and 2 night drills.

9. Any combatant rifle volunteer who fails to carry out the provisions of paragraph 7 by the 30th June in each year may be struck off the strength, unless such failure was caused by illness, to be certified to by a duly-qualified medical practitioner.

10. If temporarily resident in another district, a rifle volunteer may, by order of the commanding officer, be transferred to a detachment serving in such district, and drills done with such detachment shall be returned to his commanding officer and count towards effectiveness.

11. Attendance at church parade or funerals shall not be allowed to count towards effectiveness.

12. Any extra number of parades and drills shall be called in order to allow members the opportunity of qualifying as effectives.

13. When the commandant, or officer deputed by him, makes the annual official inspection of a company or a detachment, every officer, warrant officer, non-commissioned officer, or man should be present in the ranks, unless prevented by sickness or urgent necessity. In the former case, a certificate from a medical practitioner to be produced; in the latter, leave may be granted by the officer commanding the detachment, but only in urgent cases.

14. Annual musketry training will be carried out in accordance with instructions which will be issued under the authority of the commandant, except in places where such practice is impossible, when the practice laid down for members of rifle clubs shall be equivalent.

15. Every rifle volunteer on enrolment will be supplied, free of charge, with the following articles, which must be kept in good order, remain the property of the Government, and be returned whenever called for:—

M.-H. rifle, complete, with bayonet and sling.  
Waist-belt and frog.  
Bandolier or pouch.

16. Any officer who does not qualify as an effective shall not be allowed to retain his commission, unless it be represented by the commandant that there are special reasons for a relaxation of this regulation.

17. Non-commissioned officers will be appointed by the officer commanding the rifle volunteers.

18. Any non-commissioned officer who does not qualify as an effective shall be reduced to the ranks, unless it shall appear to the commandant that there are special reasons for the relaxation of this regulation.

19. After any company or portion of a company has been called out for actual military service, it shall be released from such service only by order of the Governor in Council; and, before such portion of the battalion is released from actual military service, it shall be returned to the locality to which it belongs.

20. No company, or any portion of it, is to quit, as a military body, the district to which it belongs unless the sanction of the commandant be previously obtained; and no member is to quit for a period of more than one month the neighborhood of his detachment without returning his complete free kit to the officer commanding the detachment to which he belongs.

21. The Queen's Regulations and the customs of the Imperial Military Service shall be taken generally as a guide in all matters not specifically dealt with in these regulations, so far as the same may not be inconsistent with *The Discipline Act 1870* and the Acts amending the same.

*Section II.—Discipline.*

1. As it is desirable to keep up in all ranks a proper feeling and high sense of honor, by which the correct and willing discharge of duty will best be insured, officers of every rank should be impressed with the advantage which they individually, their own corps, and the service at large will derive from the adoption towards the non-commissioned officers and privates of a system of command and treatment which shall insure respect towards superiors.

2. Officers are to adopt such a system themselves, and are to require it to be adopted by the non-commissioned officers; and the example of officers will have the effect of checking the use of improper and offensive terms on the part of the non-commissioned officers towards the privates. If acts of intentional neglect or of insubordination should take place, and the means of correction and punishment authorized by the regulations of the service have to be resorted to, these measures will have double effect if not preceded by intemperate language.

3. Officers are to avoid reproving non-commissioned officers for any irregularity, neglect of duty, or awkwardness in the presence or hearing of the privates—unless it shall be necessary, for the benefit of example, that the reproof be public—lest their authority should be weakened or their self-respect lessened.

4. Officers are at all times accountable for the maintenance of good order and the rules and discipline of the Service, and they are to afford in these respects the utmost aid and support to the commanding officer. It is their duty to take notice of, repress, and instantly report any negligence or impropriety of conduct in non-commissioned officers and privates, whether on duty or off duty, although the offenders may not belong to their particular company or detachment.

5. Deliberations or discussions, having the object of conveying praise, censure, or any mark of approbation towards superiors or any others in Her Majesty's service, are strictly prohibited, as being subversive of discipline, and an assumption of power which belongs to the Sovereign alone, or to those officers to whom the command and discipline of the troops may be entrusted. Every officer will therefore be held responsible who shall allow himself to be complimented by officers, non-commissioned officers, or men, who are serving, or who have served under his command, by means of presents of plate, swords, &c., or by any collective expression of their opinion.

6. No company, or portion of a company, is to assemble for any purpose unconnected with military parade, drill, or rifle practice except with the approval of the commandant.

7. Members of the rifle volunteers are not individually or collectively to attend political meetings or join in public political discussions or demonstrations in uniform. Bands are not to appear in uniform, except at parade or drill, without the consent of commanding officers.

8. Commanding officers of companies and detachments are to use their utmost vigilance to prevent rifle volunteers from publishing information relative to the numbers, movements, or operations of troops, or any military details; and any volunteer will be held personally responsible for reports of this kind which he may make without special permission, or for placing the information beyond his control, so that it finds its way into unauthorized hands. Furthermore, volunteers are forbidden to give publicity to their individual opinions in any manner tending to prejudice questions that may at the time be undergoing official investigation by the military authorities. Anonymous complaints, and the publication through the medium of the press of anything calculated to act injuriously to the interests of the service, or to excite discontent in the force, are also strictly prohibited.

9. Commanding officers of companies and detachments shall be responsible for the discipline, drill, and instruction of the various companies or detachments under their command, and they shall notice any infraction of the provisions of the law, or of the orders of the commandant, relating to the use of arms, the regulations about clothing, distinctive marks of rank, discipline, and the like.

10. When members of the force belonging to one or more corps are brought together under arms, at rifle matches, or on other occasions, either in or out of uniform, the senior officer present is to be considered as in command; and although his position in this respect does not involve any authority for his interference in the arrangements of the meeting, yet he is held responsible for the due maintenance of order and discipline among the members of the force present.

11. Disobedience of orders or disrespect shown to higher authority shall be instantly reported to the commanding officer, and it is impressed upon all ranks that discipline depends entirely upon instant obedience; so that not only must all commissioned officers see that it is always duly enforced, but non-commissioned officers failing to report any contempt or neglect of their authority will be liable to be summarily reduced. Obedience must be rendered even when it may be considered justifiable subsequently to prefer a complaint.

12. Any volunteer may, for any offence against good order and discipline, be placed under arrest by his superior officer.

13. Arrest shall signify suspension from all military duty and participation in rifle shooting; and any member placed under arrest shall deliver up his arms and accoutrements to such person as his commanding officer may direct.

14. If any volunteer, while under arms or on duty with the company to which he belongs, or any portion of the military forces, or while engaged in any military exercise or drill—either in uniform or plain clothes, or while going to or returning from any place of exercise or assembly—disobeys any lawful order of the officer under whose command he then is, or is guilty of misconduct, any superior officer may order the offender, if an officer, into arrest, and, if not an officer, into the custody of any non-commissioned officer or private; but so that the offender be not kept in such custody longer than during the time such portion of the military forces as aforesaid remains under arms or on duty. After which his case will either be disposed of by the officer commanding on the spot, or he will be suspended from duty under paragraph 13, and reported to higher authority.

15. Duty with a company, or any portion of the military forces, is held to mean not only presence under arms on parade, but the performance of all administrative duties of a military nature in or out of uniform.

16. Officers commanding shall, immediately after parade, receive the reports of officers as to any volunteers who have misconducted themselves, and shall either deal summarily with the case or report it to a higher authority.

17. If any volunteer has cause to think himself aggrieved, he may represent his case, through the officer commanding his

company or detachment, to the commanding officer. Any appeal against the decision of the commanding officer will be made through the proper channel to the commandant, and any further appeal will be made through these officers for transmission to higher authority.

18. Any volunteer who fails to produce, for inspection, when required, any arms, accoutrements, or other property entrusted to his care may be proceeded against under the Act, and steps taken for his summary discharge for disobedience of orders. Every member failing to become effective shall, on demand, immediately return to the head-quarters of his company all arms, accoutrements, clothing, stores, &c., which may have been issued to him.

19. Any volunteer whose services are dispensed with shall deliver up in good order, fair wear and tear only excepted, all arms, ammunition, accoutrements, clothing, or appointments, or any public stores or property issued to him; and if he refuse or neglect to comply with this regulation, he may be proceeded against under the Act.

20. When a volunteer has been dismissed for misconduct, a notification of the fact, with the cause of dismissal, will be inserted in regimental orders, in addition to the *Government Gazette*.

21. Volunteers must not, under any circumstances, alter or tamper with their rifles, or use other than the authorized ammunition; and any rifle which, on inspection, may be found to have had its lock or any other part altered or damaged will be at once returned into store, and repaired at the expense of the member to whom such rifle was issued.

22. Any loss, damage, or destruction of arms, accoutrements, uniform, or stores which may be traced to any member, unless caused by circumstances beyond his control, will be required to be made good by him; or, in default thereof, proceedings against him will be instituted under the Act.

23. The commandant may summarily reduce in rank any non-commissioned officer, or may dismiss any warrant officer, non-commissioned officer, or private for misconduct. Such dismissal shall entail dismissal from the rifle club to which the dismissed member belongs, and the commanding officer may discharge any non-commissioned officer or private.

24. Any volunteer absent without leave for a period of three months shall be dismissed, unless in the opinion of the commandant there be extenuating circumstances.

25. Any volunteer contravening the regulations under the Railway Act, with reference to the free conveyance of members of the military forces, thereby renders himself liable to dismissal.

### Section III.—Interior Economy. OFFICERS.

1. A commanding officer is invested with authority which renders him responsible to his Sovereign and his country for the maintenance of discipline, order, and a proper system of economy in the corps, or portion of a corps, under his command. He is to exact from officers and men the most implicit obedience to regulations, and he is not only to enforce by command, but to encourage by example, the energetic discharge of duty.

2. He is to see that the officers are practically instructed in their duties. The instruction of his men also forms a most essential part of the supervision of a commanding officer.

3. It is the duty of a commanding officer to bring specially to the notice of the commandant, without favour or partiality, any officers who may be distinguished for attention to and proficiency in their duties, as well as those who, from incapacity or habitual inattention, are deficient in a knowledge of their duties, or show an indisposition to afford the commanding officer that support which he has a right to expect from them, or conduct themselves in a manner injurious to the efficiency and the credit of the corps.

4. An officer in temporary command is not to give out any standing orders, or to alter those issued by the commanding officer, without a reference to him or to the commandant. On the other hand, a commanding officer, when absent from his corps, is not justified in issuing regimental orders.

5. Commanding officers are to cause every order and circular issued for general information and guidance to be made known throughout the corps; and they are to afford all officers under their command every facility for becoming acquainted with current changes in regulations and orders. Ignorance of published orders will never be admitted as an excuse for their non-observance. All orders relating to the corps are to be read and explained immediately after such orders are received, and those of an important nature are to be read on three successive parades.

6. Nothing more essentially tends to the maintenance of regularity and good order than that system or chain of responsibility which should extend from the highest to the lowest grade.

7. Officers commanding companies should make themselves thoroughly acquainted with the ability and acquirements of their subalterns, who ought at all times to look to them for information and advice.

8. Great attention is required from the officers commanding companies and detachments to the cleanliness of the clothing, arms, and accoutrements. The dress and appearance, as well as the demeanour, of volunteers should, on all occasions and in all situations, be such as to create a respect for the service. Volunteers must be properly dressed when going to and returning from parade.

9. For purposes of interior economy, each company is to be permanently designated by a letter of the alphabet.

For the convenience of inspection and general supervision, each company is to be divided into detachments. The officers to whose supervision and command each detachment is entrusted are responsible to the officer commanding the company, who is answerable for the whole of his company to the commanding officer. Each detachment officer is to keep a nominal roll of his detachment, and is to make himself acquainted with the character, age, place of residence, and service of each man in it. The officer commanding the company will keep a nominal roll of the whole company, showing the date of enlistment of each man in it and the name of his detachment.

10. Non-commissioned officers and men will address warrant officers in the same manner as they do officers, but will not salute them.

11. Non-commissioned officers, after having served as such for five years, may be retired on the recommendation of commanding officers.

12. Every sergeant will be provided with a copy of the Regulations of the field exercise and movements of the branch of the service to which he belongs.

13. When additional non-commissioned officers are required, corporals may be appointed to act as sergeants (to be styled lance-sergeants), and privates as corporals (to be styled lance-corporals), who, if they prove themselves efficient, are to be promoted as vacancies occur.

14. The number of these acting non-commissioned officers is not to exceed one lance-sergeant and four lance-corporals to each company.

#### Section V.—Leave of Absence.

1. Leave of absence, not exceeding three months, may be granted by the commanding officer, or he may delegate this power to officers commanding companies. Beyond this period, application must be made to the commandant through the proper channel.

#### Section VI.—Honors and Salutes.

1. Warrant and non-commissioned officers and privates in uniform shall give the military salute to His Excellency the Governor and to all commissioned officers.

2. No volunteer shall be buried with military honors, except by the express desire of his friends, notified to the officer commanding.

#### Section VII.—Commissions and Promotions of Officers.

1. The Council of Defence shall, on the nomination of the commandant, recommend to the Governor in Council candidates who may be considered suitable for appointment as officers in the rifle volunteers. All such candidates as may be approved will be appointed as officers on probation for six months, during which time they must pass such examination as may by general order be directed, failing which their commissions will not be confirmed. The time of probation may be extended on the recommendation of the commandant for a period not exceeding six months.

2. All recommendations for appointments, promotions, and resignations of officers will be made by the commanding officer to the commandant.

3. The appointments, promotions, and resignations of commissioned officers shall be inserted in the *Government Gazette*.

4. Any officer applying may, on the recommendation of the commandant, be placed on the unattached list of the volunteer force.

7. The professional examinations required will comprise the following subjects:—

- (a.) Regimental duties.
- (b.) Drill.
- (c.) Duties in the field.

The scope of each subject will vary according to the rank for which the examination is required. The various subjects, (a) to (c), showing the scope to be required from officers of each rank, will be detailed in a syllabus to be published in general orders.

#### Section VIII.—Dress and Equipment.

1. Every member of the rifle volunteers will be required to provide himself with authorized uniform as laid down in the dress regulations, viz.:—

- Jacket*.—Head-dress.—As for mounted rifles, but with scarlet facings.
- Trousers*.—Khaki, with scarlet welt.
- Leggings*.—Brown canvas.
- Boots*.—Lace or ankle.

2. Members of the rifle volunteers must appear in authorized uniform; or in purely civilian dress—the unsoldierlike appearance of volunteers dressed partly in uniform and partly in civilian costume bringing discredit not only on themselves but on the force to which they belong.

And the Honorable Sir James Lorimer, Her Majesty's Minister of Defence for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

#### "THE IRRIGATION ACT 1886."

IN the matter of the petition of the Shire of Yarrowonga Waterworks Trust, praying for the constitution of its waterworks district as an Irrigation and Water Supply District within the meaning of the said *Irrigation Act 1886*, and for the appointment and creation of a Trust for such district.

Pursuant to section 18 of the said Act, I hereby declare upon the said petition the matters following, viz.:—

1. That the particulars of the proposed scheme of irrigation and of the proposed works are:—

- (a.) The diversion, by means of a weir and regulating works, of water from the Broken River, and its distribution by the channels of the Broken Creek, Yabba or Major Creek, Boosey Creek, Wild Dog Creek, and Baala Creek, and by artificial channels therefrom for the domestic and stock supply of the landholders in the Trust district.
- (b.) The supply of the Township of Yarrowonga by pumping water from the Murray River, and the distribution of such water by means of iron pipes.
- (c.) The partial supply of water for irrigation to land in the neighbourhood of the creeks above-mentioned.

2. That no portion of the works shall be National works. The following shall be joint works with the Shepparton Waterworks Trust, viz.:—Off-take works at the Broken River; deepening

part of the Broken Creek; weir on Broken Creek with off-take to Baala Creek; defining part of Baala Creek; crossings over creeks where necessary. The remaining works shall be Trust works.

3. That the amount of money which it is proposed that the Board of Land and Works shall advance by way of loan for the purpose of carrying out the said works is £20,500, and that such sum includes a sum of £17,000 already allotted as a loan to the Shire of Yarrowonga Waterworks Trust.

4. That the rate of interest to be paid by the Trust upon such loan shall be Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum.

5. That the sources of supply will be the Broken River and the Murray River, and that the proportion of water to be taken from the joint work on the Broken River shall be one-half of the available surplus over and above such compensation water as may from time to time be directed by the Minister of Water Supply to be allowed to pass down the river channel.

6. That with the exception of the supply of water to be taken from the Murray River for the purposes of the township of Yarrowonga, no supply of water is to be obtained from any other source than from the Broken River by means of the joint work above referred to.

7. That the power of rating to be given to the Trust shall not exceed the sum of 2s. in the £ upon the annual value of the property rated.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Water Conservation Act 1887* (No. 946) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may proclaim any city, town, borough, or populous place, comprising the whole or any portion of a Waterworks Trust, to be an "Urban District" for the purposes of the said Act, and may name the limits thereof: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the towns and land hereinafter described, forming portions of the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust District, to be "Urban Districts" for the purposes and within the meaning of the said Act, that is to say:—

*The Township of Dimboola*.—Commencing at the south-east corner of township reserve; thence north-westerly along its eastern boundary and a continuation of it to a point opposite the centre of the one-chain road between the suburban allotments 8 and 9; thence south-westerly along centre of said road to the River Wimmera; thence southerly and easterly along said river to its intersection with the northern boundary of township reserve; thence along that boundary to its north-west corner; thence south-easterly along its western boundary to south-west corner; and thence easterly to the point of commencement.

*The Township of Donald*.—Commencing at a point on the Richardson River where it is intersected by a line in continuation north-westerly of the south-western boundary of the Agricultural Society's show-grounds, township of Donald, parish of Banyong; thence south-easterly by that line and production thereof to its intersection with the centre of Campbell street; thence north-easterly to the three-chain road to Swan Hill; thence south-easterly along the western boundary of the said road to the north-east angle of allotment 12, section 9; thence north-westerly by northern boundary of said allotment to the north-east angle of allotment 11, same section; thence south-easterly by eastern boundary of last-named allotment, a line, and the eastern boundary of allotment 3, section 10, to the intersection of the latter with the Richardson River; thence in a general direction northerly by said river to the commencing point.

## SHEPPARTON URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.

WHEREAS by *The Water Conservation Act 1887* it was amongst other things enacted that, at the expiration of two months after the notice of any application should have been first advertised in the *Government Gazette*, the Minister, if satisfied that the provisions of the now in part recited Act have been substantially complied with, should submit such application, and the general plan and description therein referred to, and all petitions which have been received in respect of such application, to the Governor in Council, together with any recommendations as to the granting of the application or as to any alterations or additions he might think desirable in the proposed waterworks; and the Governor in Council might thereupon approve of the construction of such proposed waterworks, with or without any alterations or additions in the general plan and description thereof, or might disapprove of the construction of such waterworks, and should make an Order in Council accordingly: And it was further enacted that, if the Governor in Council should approve of the construction of such waterworks, with or without alterations, or additions, or restrictions of any such general plan and description, a Waterworks Trust should be constituted to construct, maintain, and continue the whole or any part of the waterworks therein described, in accordance with the provisions of such Order and of the now in part recited Act: And every Order approving the construction of any proposed waterworks, and of the constituting of a Waterworks Trust for the purpose, should—

(a.) State the amount of money which the Governor in Council will grant as a loan for the purpose of carrying out such proposed waterworks, and of paying the cost and expense of preparing the general plan and description of the same, and the costs of the application for the constituting of such Waterworks Trust; and also the rate of interest which will be charged for such loan, such rate being at least One-half per centum more than the rate payable by the Government on the Public Loan out of which such loan may be granted.

(b.) Specify the limits of the lands, whether within or without the municipal districts of the council or councils applying for the proposed waterworks, within which such Waterworks Trust shall have authority, to be called a Waterworks District.

(c.) State what are the principal works proposed to be constructed.

(d.) Assign a corporate name to such Waterworks Trust; and

(e.) Contain such provisions (not inconsistent with this Act) as, according to the nature of the application and the facts and circumstances of each case, the Governor in Council thinks fit:

And it was further enacted that whenever a waterworks district was either wholly or with the exception of the waterworks or proposed waterworks thereof within one municipal district, the Governor in Council might appoint the municipal council for the time being of such municipal district, together with one or more persons, not being members of such municipal council, to be the Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust of such waterworks district. Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, has approved of a general plan and description, as set forth in a certain application of the Council of the Shire of Shepparton for a loan of Nine thousand four hundred and sixteen pounds twelve shillings and five pence to carry out certain waterworks, for the supply of a waterworks district under the said Act, embracing such portion of the Shire of Shepparton as is shown on the plan accompanying the said application, together with the general plan and description therein referred to, deposited in the Department of Victorian Water Supply, Melbourne, and doth hereby order and appoint as follows:—

(1.) The construction of the said waterworks.

(2.) The Municipal Council of the Shire of Shepparton for the time being and one other Commissioner to be the Waterworks Trust of such waterworks district.

(3.) That the amount of the loan hereby granted shall be Nine thousand four hundred and sixteen pounds twelve shillings and five pence, for the purpose of carrying out approved works, and paying the cost of preparing the general plan and description of such works, and the cost of the application for the constituting of the Waterworks Trust hereby constituted; and that the interest to be charged for such loan shall be at the rate of Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, payable half-yearly.

(4.) That the limits of the land within which the said Waterworks Trust shall have authority shall be that portion of the Shire of Shepparton included within the boundaries hereunder described, viz:—

Commencing at the north-east corner of the Town of Shepparton, being at the intersection of Knight street and Archer street; thence southerly along the centre of Archer street (being the eastern boundary of the said town) to the intersection of Archer and Hayes streets; thence westerly along the centre of Hayes street (being the southern boundary of

the said town) and a continuation thereof to the centre of the Goulburn River; thence by the centre of the said Goulburn River (being the western boundary of the said town) to a point opposite the centre line of Knight street; thence easterly along the centre line of Knight street (being the northern boundary of the said town) to the starting point.

(5.) The principal works to be constructed shall be a pumping plant, a water tower, and pipe reticulation for the Town of Shepparton.

(6.) The name of the Trust shall be the "Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust."

And the Honorable John Lamont Dow, for Her Majesty's Minister of Water Supply for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

## REGULATIONS.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an urban district for the purposes of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883-4*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883-4*, repeal the Regulations numbered 1 and 2 of the Regulations made by the said Waterworks Trust dated the twentieth day of January 1887, and approved by the Governor in Council on the eighth day of March 1887, and do hereby make the Regulations following in lieu thereof:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said urban district (that is to say):—

1. (1.) For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twenty pounds annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

(2.) For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Twenty pounds annual value, an amount equal to five per cent. on the amount of the municipal valuation.

(3.) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons; and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of troughs shall be 16,000 gallons for any trough not exceeding twelve feet in length, and 8,000 gallons for every additional five feet or fractional part thereof.

(4.) Every trough situated in a paddock shall be supplied through a meter affixed by the consumer according to the directions of the Trust, provided nevertheless that the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall not be less than that charged for troughs supplied under the preceding clause.

(5.) For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement, the charge shall be Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 8,000 gallons for every inch of the diameter of the cylinder.

(6.) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon), and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purpose of irrigation or for ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—One-sixteenth of an acre and less, per annum, 8,000 gallons; exceeding one-sixteenth of an acre but not exceeding one-eighth of an acre, per annum, 12,000 gallons; exceeding one-eighth of an acre but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, per annum, 16,000 gallons; exceeding one-quarter of an acre but not exceeding half-an-acre, per annum, 28,000 gallons; exceeding half-an-acre but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons per acre; for every additional acre, and proportionately according to the foregoing scale, for every fractional part of an acre.

In livery and carriers' stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 2,000 gallons per stall used for stabling horses.

In open sheds used for the above purposes each space of five feet shall be charged for as a stall.

2. That each syphon pump must have a meter affixed, and that Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons be charged for all water registered at such meter.

The before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the first day of January One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, and ending on the thirty-first day of December One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance fourteen days after demand. Such persons as the Commissioners of the

Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and collect and recover the said rate.

#### KYNETON SHIRE WATERWORKS TRUST.— REGULATION.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulation made by the Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust, in accordance with the provisions of *The Victorian Water Conservation Acts*.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an urban district for the purposes of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by *The Victorian Water Conservation Acts 1881, 1883, and 1884*, make the Regulation following:—

#### REGULATION No. VI.

A rate of One shilling in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all the rateable property in the Waterworks District of the Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust liable in respect of rates levied by the said Trust, according to the valuation for the time being of such rateable property for the municipal rate of the Municipal District in which such rateable property is situate, for one year, commencing on the first day of January One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, and ending on the thirty-first day of December One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight. **RULES AND REGULATIONS.**

1st. The charge for burying in or otherwise using the cemetery must be paid before an order can be given for the particular work or privilege required.

2nd. The charge for occupying ground may be remitted by the trustees when it is shown to their satisfaction that the relatives or friends of the deceased are unable to pay the charge; but all such burials must be made in the part of the cemetery marked free grounds on the plans, and if the sexton be required to dig the grave then the usual fee for that service must be paid.

3rd. Orders for interment must be given to the sexton at least twelve (12) working hours before the time appointed for the burial, so as to allow sufficient time for digging the grave within working hours, otherwise the charge for digging will be increased by one half.

4th. The sexton will dig all ordinary graves, but when the friends of any indigent person deceased wish to dig the grave themselves, or when brick graves or vaults are required, then the excavations must be made and the ground filled in or removed under the inspection and to the satisfaction of the sexton.

5th. The hours fixed for interment are from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. from September to April inclusive, and from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. during the other four (4) months, except on Sundays, when the hours are from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m. throughout the year.

6th. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences must be kept in proper condition and repair by the owners, otherwise they may be removed by the trustees, after having given notice of their intention to remove them by posting such notice to the last known address of the parties concerned.

7th. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, also fence, also a copy of every inscription, must be submitted to the trustees, without whose approval it shall not be erected or inscribed.



8th. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave must be bricked in and cemented, and covered in by a slab of stone, slate, good blue or red gum plank.

9th. No grave shall be allowed to be re-opened for further interment at a shorter interval than twelve (12) years, except it be to place a second coffin or more in such grave, and this will only be allowed when the grave has been originally sunk to admit of such interments.

10th. No new grave can be made without paying for the ground or satisfying the trustees that it has been already paid for.

11th. A plan of the cemetery showing the situation of the purchased and other grounds shall be kept at the secretary's office.

12th. No servant or person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the said trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

13th. No dogs will be allowed to enter the cemetery, nor will smoking be allowed.

14th. It has been provided by the Cemetery Act that any person who shall wantonly or wilfully destroy or attempt to destroy, or do or cause to be done any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant shall, on conviction before any two or more justices of the peace, forfeit or pay a sum as a penalty not exceeding Twenty (20) pounds.

15th. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these regulations.

#### Conditions.

An applicant for appointment must be not more than twenty years or less than sixteen years of age. He will be required to produce a medical certificate to the effect that he is of sound constitution, and not affected with any physical infirmity which would interfere with the proper exercise of his profession. He will also be required to produce satisfactory evidence of having received a good general education, including a competent knowledge of euclid, algebra, and arithmetic, also a specimen of his plan drawing.

#### Competitive Examination.

Having duly complied with the foregoing requirements, he will undergo a competitive examination on a date of which he will be duly notified—subjects, plane trigonometrical computation, plotting, and plan drawing—when the competitors to whom shall be awarded a sufficient number of points by the Board of Examiners will be recommended for appointment in the order of merit, subject to the regulations of the department as to probation.

#### Term of Service.

The pupil's service in the department shall be for a term of four years, the first two of which will be served in the office, where he will be engaged in drawing and computing. He will then (if thought necessary) be examined in trigonometry, including computation of areas and reduction of traverse surveys, also plotting from field-book and plan drawing. If his progress up to this time is not deemed satisfactory he will be liable to be dispensed with, but, if satisfactory, he will be placed under a departmental surveyor for two years for field practice.

Afterwards he will have the privilege of attending for two months at the Melbourne Observatory, where he will be instructed in such branches of practical astronomy as are necessary for the duties he may be called on to perform as a qualified surveyor.

He will be allowed to present himself at the next ensuing examination for land surveyors (without payment of fees), for the purpose of obtaining the formal certificate of the Board of Examiners as to his qualifications.

#### Remuneration.

He will receive the following remuneration during the term of his pupillage:—1st year, £52; 2nd year, £58; 3rd year, £66; 4th year, £72.

#### Subject to Regulations.

During the whole term of his pupillage and service in the department he shall be subject to the Regulations for the Public Service of Victoria dated 31st December 1884, or any subsequent substituted or additional regulations.

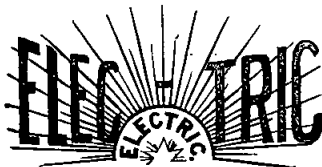
