Port Adelaide, Semaphore Anchorage—Leading Lights.

Referring to Notice No. 12 of 1888, as to the removal of the Bettrice, mariners are now hereby informed that, on and after the 1st of December 1888, two Red Lights will be exhibited ashore, one from the time-ball tower, and the other from the flagstaff at the shore end of Semaphore jetty.

These lights in line, bearing S.E. \(\frac{1}{2}\) S., lead through the deepest water in the semaphore anchorage, and up to the ocean steamers' mooring buoy.

DIRECTIONS.

By Night.—Vessels approaching the anthorage should not bring the Port Adelaide light to the north of N.E. until the above lights are in line, then steer in on that line with the lead going until the requisite water is found, or the mooring buoy is pucked up. When the red light, east of the lighthouse, is just closing with the bright light on No. 11 Beacon, the vessel will be close to the mooring buoy.

The leading lights will not show south of the bell buoy on the Wonga Shoal, so that vessels of suitable draught, which do not intend to use the mooring buoy, may steer in for any part of the anchorage as soon as the two red lights are visible.

By Day.—Keep the lighthouse on the same bearing until the time-ball tower and the water tower are in line, then proceed as above.

GRANT OF ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY POUNDS (£150) AS PRIZES FOR THE BEST MANAGED FARMS IN VICTORIA.

REGULATIONS.

- 1. Two first prizes of Fifty pounds each will be awarded:—One for the best farm in the Northern districts, and one for the best farm in the Southern districts of the colony. A second prize of Twenty-five pounds will be awarded for the second best farm in each of the above districts.
- The work of selecting the most suitable farms for competition will be entrusted to the Agricultural Societies.
- 3. Notice of nomination must be forwarded to the Secretary for Agriculture, Government Offices, Melbourne, not later than the 30th November 1888.

- 4. The notice must contain full particulars as to the name of the owner, and where the farm is situated.
- 5. The competition is to be restricted to freeholders in occupation and to Crown tenants.
- 6. Upon receipt of information as to the farms selected for competition the Minister of Agriculture may appoint three judges to decide the merits of such farms, and the decision of a majority of such judges shall be final.
- 7. The judges will be required to communicate to the Minister of Agriculture their decisions; and also to report on the merits of the whole of the farms selected for competition.

GRANT OF ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY POUNDS (£150) FOR INVENTION OF MACHINERY FOR THRESHING PEASE.

REGULATIONS.

- 1. A sum not exceeding £150 may be paid to any person or company who shall, in the opinion of the Minister of Agriculture, produce a machine capable of threshing, within twelve hours, eight hundred bushels of pease without injury thereto.
- 2. The reward shall be paid only to the inventor, or his agent, of such machine as shall most cheaply, efficiently, and rapidly perform the work required, and within the time aforesaid.
- 3. Persons intending to compete for the award must give notice in writing of their intention to the Secretary for Agriculture, Government Offices, Melbourne, not later than 31st December
- 4. One or more trials of the machines shall be made at such place or places, and at such times, as the Minister may direct.

 5. All costs and expenses of forwarding, attendance, and working the machines at the times to be appointed shall be paid by the persons entering the machines for competition.
- 6. The Minister may appoint three or more judges to report upon the merits of the competing machines, and the decision of a majority of such judges shall be final.
- 7. The judges may recommend payment of an amount or amounts, the total of which shall not exceed £150, to the inventor or inventors, or his or their agent or agents, of the successful machine or machines, such amounts to be apportioned to the value to the colony of the said invention or inventions.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the said provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth for the purposes aforesaid, so far as these may relate to a certain irrigation and water supply trust duly appointed and created under the said Act, and known as the Western Wimmers Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, make the regulations following, viz.:—

 1. Interpretation of terms.—In these regulations "the Minister" shall mean the Minister of Water Supply; "the trust" or "the said trust" shall mean the Western Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply Trust; and "the district," "the said district," or "the irrigation district" shall mean the lands, as defined by the Order in Council appointing and creating the said trust, wherein the trust shall have authority.
 2. Period for which commissioners shall hold office.—Subject to the preprint of the production of the

THE subjoined Rules and Regulations have been submitted to the Governor in Council, in accordance with section 9 of The Cemeterics Statute 1864 (27 Vict. No. 201).

Rules and Regulations.

- 1. The Rules and Regulations numbered 1 to 32 shall be the Rules and Regulations of the Ballaarat General Gemetery, and after the publication hereof in the Government Gazette all Rules and Regulations and Scales of Fees heretofore made shall be rescinded.
- 2. The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sundays, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted) from Ten a.m. to Four
- p.m.

 3. No burial shall under any circumstances be permitted in the cemetery until an application has been made, name, age, late place of residence, occupation, and probable cause of death of the deceased given at the office of the Trust, an order in the form Schedule A obtained, and the fees where not remitted paid.

 4. The fees mentioned in Schedule B shall be the fees payable under the Act, and shall be paid at time of making application for any order.
- for any order.

 5. A burial right, Schedule C, shall give the holder and his representatives for ever the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right, on obtaining the permission of the trustees as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, centraph, tablet, or other erection therein.

 6. A permit, Schedule D, will, on application of the holder of a burial right, and deposit of a plan, design, or drawing of the proposed erection, or a copy of the proposed inscription or

epitaph thereon, be granted to construct a vault or grave, and to erect a monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection thereon if approved by the trustees, and subject to such terms and conditions as they may see fit to impose.

- 7. Any application for ground exceeding twelve feet in width shall be reserved for the special decision of the trustees.
- 8. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person having paid the fee for a private grave, and requiring a grave or vault, shall be permitted to construct same, subject to the approval of the trustees. Every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron securely cemented.
- Any tomb, monument, or material requiring to be removed on re-opening a grave or vault must be removed and re-erected or replaced by the owner.
- 10. No person other than the owner or his agent, duly authorized in writing, shall be permitted to interfere in any way whatever with a grave or enclosure unless by special direction of the
- 11. Every grave, vault, tombstone, or other erection shall be maintained and kept in repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owner.
- 12. Any grave may, on approval of the trustees, be converted into a private grave on payment of the fees or balance of fees provided for herein.
- 13. Every grave shall be six feet deep for an adult's body, and not more than two adults, unless the grave be of greater depth or of extra width, shall be interred in each, two infants being considered equal to an adult.
- 14. Notice of any burial shall be given at the cemetery eight working hours prior to the time fixed for the burial.
- 15. Before a private grave shall be re-opened, the consent in writing of the person entitled to give the same shall be given.
- 16. No order for burial shall be issued until there has been deposited at the Trust office a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths; and in case of re-interment on removal from another cemetery, verified copies of such certificate, and of the license of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf, and on payment of the usual fees.
- 17. The hours for burial, unless by special permission of the trustees, shall be:—On week days, September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m. On Sundays, throughout the year, from Eight to Ten a.m. or from Two to Five p.m.
- 18. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time when the funeral is to be at the cemetery, and the same shall be punctually observed.
- 19. Hearses and mourning carriages only are allowed within the cemetery, and the drivers are to observe such directions of the trustees, their officers, and servants as may be found necessary from time to time for the regulating of the traffic.
- 20. Every coffin shall have on the lid a lead plate with the distinguishing number of the Order for burial stamped thereon.
- 21. No catacomb or wooden erection shall be allowed within the cemetery.
- 22. No tree or shrub shall be planted in any portion of the cemetery except as approved by the trustees.
- 23. Licensed exhumations shall be made between the hours of Six and Eight a.m., and in all cases of exhumation the trustees may, where necessary, impose special conditions, any non-com-pliance therewith being a breach of these rules.
- 24. An additional fee, according to the circumstances of the case, shall be paid for any exhumation or sinking involving extra labor.
- 25. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.
- 26. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shruh, or plant from the cemetery unless by authority of the trustees first had and obtained.
 - 27. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.
- 28. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from sunrise to sunset daily throughout the year, but the trustees shall have the right by themselves, their officers, and servants to remove from the cemetery all persons misconducting themselves, or violating the rules of propriety or decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any erection or tree, shrub, flower, or border, or otherwise infringing the Act 201 or any Act made or to be made amending the same.
- 29. No person employed by the trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or special authority from
- 30. Any workman employed in the cemetery, though not in the employment of the trustees, shall be required to comply with such general directions of the trustees or their secretary as may be necessary for the control and good order of the cemetery.
- 31. Sculptors, stonemasons, and others desirous of creeting tombstones, monuments, tablets, or railings, or of constructing vaults, or of placing inscriptions and epitaphs, shall obtain licenses, in the form of Schedule E, from the trustees.
- 32. All material required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery. Stones, refuse, and rubbish remaining after the work is completed shall be removed at once by the person employed on the work.
