WHEREAS by *The Irrigation Act 1886* it is provided that any Municipal Council, or Waterworks Trust, or Irrigation Trust, or any two or more together of such Councils or Trusts, or the majority in number of the ratepayers in any proposed district, or the majority in number of the owners of land within any proposed district, such majority being the owners of at least half the land of the proposed district, may petition the Governor in Council to constitute such district an Irrigation and Water Supply District, and to appoint and create a Trust therein. And it is further provided by the said Act that, before any district or Trust can be constituted or appointed under the said Act upon a petition from any Municipal Council or Waterworks Trust, or from any two or more together of any such Councils or Trusts, or from a majority in number of the ratepayers in any proposed district, or upon a petition from a majority of the owners of land in any proposed district, that a petition from owners of land, being an absolute majority of the owners of land within the proposed district, such majority being owners of at least half the land in such proposed district, shall be presented to the Governor in Council, praying that the scheme or plan of works of such first petition, as set forth in the declaration of the Minister, published under the said Act, may be adopted in part or in whole. And it is further enacted that, after compliance with the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council may approve of the scheme proposed, either with or without any alterations, or additions, or restrictions as he may think fit, or he may disapprove of the same; and if he approve of the same, either with or without alterations, he shall make an Order in Council accordingly.

And whereas the majority in number of the owners of certain lands situate within the parishes of Yatchaw West, Yatchaw East, Croxton East, Croxton West, and Monivae, in the counties of Normanby and Villiers, in the Colony of Victoria, and within the boundaries of a proposed district (shown upon the plan accompanying their petition), being the owners of at least half the land within such proposed district, have, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, petitioned the Governor in Council to constitute the proposed district, as shown upon the plan accompanying their petition, an Irrigation and Water Supply District, and to appoint and create a Trust therein for carrying out the scheme or plan of works proposed in the said petition.

And whereas all the provisions of the Act necessary to precede the declaration in writing of the Minister of Water Supply upon the said petition having been complied with, the said Minister duly published his declaration in the *Government Gazette* on the thirty-first day of August 1888, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act.

And whereas, after due observance of the steps necessary under the said Act to precede such a petition, on this twenty-sixth day of November 1888, a petition of an absolute majority of the owners of land in the district so proposed to be constituted, such majority being the owners of at least half the land in such proposed district, hath been presented to the Governor in Council praying that the scheme or plan of works of such first-named petition as set out in the said declaration in writing of the Minister might be adopted.

And whereas the Governor in Council, having taken all the circumstances into consideration, and having ascertained and being satisfied that there has been a compliance with all the provisions of the said Act necessary to be observed before the approval of the scheme of the petition for the constitution of the proposed district as an Irrigation and Water Supply District and for the appointment and creation of a Trust therein, has determined to approve of the scheme proposed by such petition.

praying that the scheme or plan of works of such first-named petition, as set out in the said declaration in writing of the Minister, might be adopted: And whereas, after compliance with all the provisions under the said Act necessary to be observed before approval of the scheme proposed, the Governor in Council has, by an Order in Council, dated this twenty-sixth day of November 1888, approved of the said proposed scheme: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in accordance with the provisions of and in exercise of the powers conferred by *The Irrigation Act 1886* aforesaid, doth declare, order, and direct:—

1. That the said proposed district shall be and the same is hereby constituted as, from the date of this Order, an "Irrigation and Water Supply District" under the said *Irrigation Act 1886*; and an Irrigation and Water Supply Trust is hereby appointed and created to construct, maintain, and continue the works in this Order described, in accordance with the provisions of this Order and of the said Act.

2. That the limits and boundaries of the district within which such Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall have authority, and which district shall henceforth be an Irrigation and Water Supply District, shall be those contained within the limits and boundaries of the area of the said Irrigation and Water Supply District hereby constituted, as such limits and boundaries are set out in the First Schedule hereto.

3. That the name of the said Irrigation and Water Supply District shall be the "Yatchaw Irrigation and Water Supply District," and the corporate name of the said Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall be the "Yatchaw Irrigation and Water Supply Trust."

4. That the scheme of the said Yatchaw Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall consist of a system of subsoil drains, to provide for the removal of surplus storm water from the lands within the Trust District, with check sluices to control the flow in the drains and cause the irrigation of the subsoil. And the works to be constructed and maintained are those set out in the Second Schedule hereto. All of which works shall be Trust works.

5. That the total amount of money proposed to be expended by the said Yatchaw Irrigation and Water Supply Trust on Trust works is Six thousand pounds sterling (£6,000).

6. That the amount of money proposed to be advanced by the Board of Land and Works to the Trust, by way of loan, is Six thousand pounds (£6,000); that the rate of interest to be paid upon such loan is Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, being one-half per cent. higher than the rate paid by the Government upon the public loan out of which such moneys are to be advanced; the rate of such interest to be subject to reduction, in accordance with section one hundred and forty-six of the Act, in event of the interest paid by the Government upon such public loan being reduced.

7. That the number of persons to be elected as commissioners of the said Yatchaw Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall be six, and the period for which such commissioners shall hold office shall be three years.

8. That the amount of moneys which may be borrowed by the said Yatchaw Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall not at any time, together with any balances due from the Trust to the Board, or upon any Trust loan, exceed the sum of Six thousand pounds (£6,000); and no rate made by the Yatchaw Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall exceed the sum of Five shillings in the £ upon the annual value of the property rated within the Trust district.

9. That the maximum amount which may be paid out of a loan raised by the said Yatchaw Irrigation and Water Supply Trust in defraying the preliminary costs and expenses of application for this Order shall be Fifty pounds (£50).

"THE IRRIGATION ACT 1886."

IN the matter of the petition of E. Holloway and others, praying for the constitution of certain lands situate in the parishes of Kerang, Gannawarra, and Macorna, in the county of Gumbower, in the Colony of Victoria, as an Irrigation and Water Supply District within the meaning of the said Act, and for the appointment and creation of a Trust for such district.

Pursuant to section 18 of the said Act, I hereby declare upon the said petition the matters following, viz.:—

1. That the scheme or plan of the proposed works shall be—the construction of a supply channel to Kow Swamp, with head-works; regulating works at the outlet of the Kow Swamp storage basin; a weir on the Pyramid Creek; a channel thence to the River Loddon; and the improvement to the Box and Pyramid Creeks, together with minor collateral works; channels for the conveyance and distribution of water in the Trust district; and all minor works connected therewith.

2. That the Kow Swamp storage, with supply channels thereto, and channels of conveyance therefrom, and collateral works, shall be National works; the weirs across the Calivil and Pyramid Creeks shall be joint works; and all the other works shall be Trust works.

3. That the amount which it is proposed that the Board of Land and Works shall advance by way of loan for joint and Trust works shall be Seventeen thousand eight hundred and twenty-five pounds (£17,825) sterling.

4. That the rate of interest to be paid by the Trust upon such loan shall be Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum.

5. That the rate at which the Trust shall pay for water supplied from National works shall be a proportion of the total charges for interest, maintenance, and management of such works, equivalent to the proportion of the water from such works delivered to the Trust, and as far as at present can be ascertained about £855 per annum, for a supply of 420 cubic feet per minute from 1st July to 31st October, and 900 cubic feet per minute from 1st November to 30th April in each year.

6. That the Trust will not obtain any water except from National works.

7. That the powers of rating to be given to the Trust shall not exceed the sum of Five shillings in the £1 upon the annual value of the property within the Trust district.

The births of 1,468 children, viz., 777 boys and 691 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of October. In the month of September 1,376 births were registered, or 92 fewer than in the month under review. The births were 602 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but only 378 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in October numbered 570, viz., 315 of males and 255 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 898, or 158 per cent. The deaths were fewer than those in September by 43, but exceeded the average of October during the previous ten years by 137. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded that average by 25.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 3.75, and of deaths registered 1.46.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 86.0° on the 13th, and the lowest was 35.1° on the 9th. The mean temperature of the month (56.1°) was one point above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (38.2°) took place on the 16th, viz., from a maximum of 82.1° to a minimum of 43.9°. The least range (8.1°) was on the 17th, viz., from a maximum of 57.1° to a minimum of 49.0°. The mean daily range was 18.4°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.371 inches on the 9th, and the lowest was 29.433 inches on the 4th. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.046 inches) was slightly above the average.

Rain fell on 8 days, the amount of rainfall being 1.35 inch. The average rainfall in October during the previous ten years was 2.55 inches, or nearly an inch and a quarter above that in the month under notice.

From the beginning of 1888 to the end of the month under review, rain had fallen on 108 days; the total amount of rainfall, viz.: 16.08 inches. During a similar period in 1887 rain fell on 126 days, the total fall, viz.: 23.60 inches or about 7½ inches above that recorded to the end of October in the present year.

Fog occurred on 1 day during the month.

Males contributed 55 per cent., and females 45 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 35 per cent. to that mortality, as against 36 per cent. in October 1887, 32 per cent. in October 1886, 29 per cent. in October 1885, 46 per cent. in October 1884, 30 per cent. in October 1883, 31 per cent. in October 1882, 33 per cent. in October 1881, 37 per cent. in October 1880 and in October 1879, and 27 per cent. in October 1878.

Thirty-one deaths of persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, a laborer, aged 75, died of phthisis; a female, aged 75, and a male, of occupation unknown, aged 82, of bronchitis; a laborer, aged 75, of a crushed foot, occasioned by becoming entangled in machinery; a female, aged 76, of disease of brain and heart combined; a butcher, aged 77, of pleurisy; a female, aged 76, a farmer, aged 77, a gentleman, aged 78, a male, of occupation unknown, aged 80, a tailor, aged 81, and a laborer, aged 83, of apoplexy; a gardener, aged 79, of insanity; a cabinetmaker, aged 80, and a laborer, aged 83, of nephritis; a washerwoman, aged 81, and a female, aged 83, of paralysis; a female, aged 81, of pneumonia; a gentleman, aged 84, and a lady, aged 88, of hemiplegia; a farmer, aged 87, hanged himself whilst of unsound mind; a publican, aged 89, died of cirrhosis of liver; a female, aged 75, a farmer and a female, each aged 78, a gentleman, aged 80, two carpenters, aged 84 and 86 respectively, a female, aged 85, a female, aged 89, and a male, of no occupation, aged 94, of old age.

Forty deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which thirty-three were set down to accident, two to homicide, and five to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A male infant, aged 5 days, died of injury to the head received during birth; a male infant, aged 7 months, of concussion of the brain; and a male child, aged 4 years, of fracture of the skull (how caused not stated); a house-painter, aged 15, of concussion of the brain, resulting from a fall from a ladder; a boy, aged 10, of fracture of the skull, occasioned by being knocked down by a cart; a boy, aged 11, a police constable, aged 22, a grocer's assistant, aged 26, a railway porter, aged 34, a gentleman, aged 39, a carpenter, aged 46, and a birdstuffer, aged 60, were passed over or otherwise fatally injured by railway trains; a laborer, aged 17, died of tetanus following injury to the ankle; and a laborer, aged 75, from a crushed foot, through becoming entangled in machinery; a stonemason, aged 21, was killed whilst blasting, a stone falling on him; a laborer, aged 24, died of injury to the head, sustained whilst working; a boy aged 12, was shot by his companion; a male and a female infant, each aged 1 year, two male children, aged 2 and 3 years respectively, died of scalds; two female children, each aged 4, and a female, aged 20, of burns, through their clothes catching fire; a boy, aged 9, and a laborer, aged 30, were drowned in the river Yarra, the former whilst bathing; a boarding-house keeper, aged 34, was drowned in Hobson's Bay; a female bookfolder, aged 28, two males, of occupation unknown, aged 30 and 48 respectively, a ship's cook, aged 52, and a warehouseman, aged 55, were found drowned, the two last in Hobson's Bay; a male infant, aged two months, was overlain. The homicidal deaths were those of a male and a female infant, who were suffocated at birth, a verdict of wilful murder being brought in in each instance. Of the suicidal deaths, a hotelkeeper, aged 37, died from the effects of a self-inflicted wound in the throat; a commercial traveller, aged 55, from a self-inflicted wound in the wrist; a corn dealer, aged 54, drowned himself in Hobson's Bay; a farmer, aged 87, hanged himself; and a female, aged 25, threw herself from the Johnson street Bridge.

One hundred and eighteen deaths, or 21 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—59 in the Melbourne Hospital, 13 in the Alfred Hospital, 3 in the Homoeopathic Hospital, 6 in the Children's Hospital, 4 in the Women's Hospital, 7 in the Immigrants' Home, 7 in the Benevolent Asylum, 4 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 3 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 4 in the Austin Hospital, 4 in the Melbourne Gaol, 2 in the Industrial Schools, and 2 in the Protestant Refuge.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 197, of which 107, or 54 per cent., were of males, and 90, or 46 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 129 were under one year of age, 31 were between one and two, 16 were between two and three, 11 were between three and four, and 10 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 373. Of these, 203, or 56 per cent., were males, and 165, or 44 per cent., were females; 16 were between five and ten, 10 were between ten and fifteen, 17 were between fifteen and twenty, 28 were between twenty and twenty-five, 28 were between twenty-five and thirty, 28 were between thirty and thirty-five, 29 were between thirty-five and forty, 20 were between forty and forty-five, 28 were between forty-five and fifty, 40 were between fifty and fifty-five, 37 were between fifty-five and sixty, 27 were between sixty and sixty-five, 27 were between sixty-five and seventy, 7 were between seventy and seventy-five, 12 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 19 were upwards of eighty.

In October, as compared with the previous month, deaths from diphtheria fell from 19 to 9, those from scarlet fever from 3 to 2, from septic diseases from 11 to 4, from brain and nervous diseases from 82 to 61, from heart affections from 71 to 34, and from lung and chest complaints from 126 to 93. On the other hand, deaths from measles rose from 2 to 3, those from typhoid fever from 7 to 10, from diarrhoea from 4 to 9, and from phthisis from 60 to 86. Seven deaths of child-bearing women occurred during the month, as against 9 in September. If these numbers be compared with the births, it will be found that 1 death of a mother took place to every 210 births registered in the month under notice, and to every 153 in the previous month.

NOTE.—Vessels approaching and on the bar should carefully guard against the effect of the current, which is often experienced strongly setting across the entrance, sometimes from the eastward, but more frequently from the westward.

CHINA, EAST COAST.—CHUSAN ARCHIPELAGO.

The following information concerning certain sunken rocks and bank in Chusan Archipelago, the result of recent examination of the localities, has been received from Commander W. U. Moore, H.M. surveying vessel *Rambler*:—

I. *Sunken rock north-west of Steep Island.*

A sharp pinnacle rock (named Andersen Rock, from having been discovered by Captain Andersen, H.I.C.M.S. *Ping Ching*) with a depth of 4 feet, but on which the sea has never been seen to break, lies with Steep Island Lighthouse bearing S. 34° E., distant $\frac{1}{4}$ cables.

Position, lat. 30° 13' 0" N., long. 122° 35' 30" E.

II. *Sunken rock north-east of Radstock Point, Keu-shan Island.*

A pinnacle rock (Green Rock), with 1 foot over it, lies 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ cables north-east of Radstock Point, with which it is connected by a rocky ledge having a depth of 8 fathoms. From the rock Mwan Islet summit bears S. 43° E., distance 2.65 miles, and Wasps Islet summit N. 82° W., distant 1.32 miles.

Position, lat. 30° 16' 30" N., long. 122° 24' 20" E.

III. *Bank north-eastward of Gan-su Island*

A bank (Singleton Bank), composed of hard black sand, extends about 9 cables north-eastward of the northern coast of Gan-su Island; its north-east extreme, with a depth of 21 feet, lies with Gan-su Island summit bearing S. 57° W., distant one mile.

IV. *Sunken rocks in Tae-shan Channel.*

The sea does not break on this rock, and its position is only occasionally indicated by slight ripples. From it the rock (Entrance Rock) at the entrance to Chang tau Harbour bears S. 48° E., distant $\frac{5}{4}$ cables.

NOTE.—The east extreme of the easternmost islet eastward of Gan-su Island open of the western extreme of Chang tau Island leads westward of Baylis Rock.

V. *Sunken rock eastward of Castle Rock.*

CHINA—LIAU-TUNG GULF.

Liau River, great changes reported.

The United States Government has given notice, on the authority of Lieutenant Commander J. E. Craig, U.S.S. *Palos*, that admiralty chart, Liau River, No. 2894, is not now reliable from the light-vessel off the bar to Newchwang, a distance of about 17 miles:—

The channel of the river shifts, and the present positions of the beacons do not correspond in direction, one from another, as shown on the chart. Shoals have formed off some of the points of the river banks. Fishing stakes at intervals, surmounted by balls, may be mistaken for beacons, and the local pilots place in position coloured buoys, which, not being shown on the chart, are misleading.

From the changes above reported, the chart can only be considered as a rough guide, this, with the strong tides in the river, make it advisable to take a pilot.

1. All charges must be paid to the person in charge when orders are given for interment.
2. Application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument must be made to the trustees through the person in charge. A certificate of permission will be granted to the person applying upon the payment of the charges.
3. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but should a brick grave or vault be required it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees, or of some person appointed by them. No grave to be less than six feet deep.
4. The charges will be remitted for the burial of any person on evidence being produced to the trustees that the relations or friends of such person are unable to pay the charges.
5. The plans of all monuments, tablets, and fences to be erected, must first be submitted to the trustees for approval, the same to

be kept in proper order and repair at the expense of the owner, or they may be removed by order of the trustees.

6. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, or covered by slabs of stone or slate.

7. If an interment is to be made in any private vault or grave, the written consent of the owner must be left with the order.

8. All persons injuring the cemetery, its fences or monuments, will be prosecuted as the law directs.

9. The trustees reserve the right to alter these regulations and charges from time to time, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council.

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at any station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Oaten hay will be preferred. If sheaf hay be tendered for, it must be so stated in the tender.

Telegrams or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or oaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (Victorian grown) and bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oaten or wheaten hay.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Botanic and Domain Gardens may be called upon to supply any other Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, and for which no contracts have been taken, at the same rates.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be endorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of the delay in delivering or replacing it when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

12. It will be competent for the Secretary of the Tender Board, on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the 1st day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th September 1889, and in the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

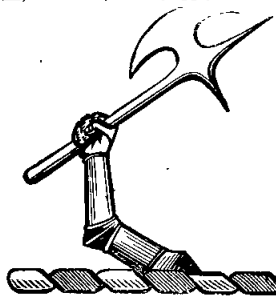
