PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of Victoria, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

- "An Act to amend the Acts relating to the Election of Members to serve in and the Constitution of the Legislative Council."
- "An Act to amend *The Sales by Auction Statute 1864.*"
- "An Act to regulate the business and to provide for the licensing of Collectors of Special Wares, Marine Stores, and Old Metals, and to provide for the Licensing of Dealers in Special Wares, Marine Stores, and Old Metals, and for amending *The Old Metal Dealers Act 1876.*"
- "An Act to amend *The Mining on Private Property Act 1884.*"
- "An Act to facilitate the Amalgamation of the Union Trustees Executors and Administrators Company Limited, the Colonial Permanent Trustee Executor and Agency Company Limited, the Australasian Natives Trustees Executors and Agency Company Limited, and the Guardian Trustees and Executors Company Limited."
- "An Act to amend *The Discipline Act 1870*, and the Acts amending the same, and for other purposes."
- "An Act to make better provision for the Employment Transfer and Promotion of Teachers in the Education Department, and for other purposes."
- "An Act to amend *The Banks and Currency Statute 1864.*"
- "An Act to make provision for the Vesting of certain Lands in the Board of Land and Works, the Victorian Railways Commissioners, the Mayor Aldermen Councillors and Citizens of the City of Melbourne respectively."
- "An Act to amend *The Electoral Act 1865* and for other purposes."
- "An Act for the Further Restriction of Chinese Immigration."

"THE FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACT 1885."

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the 29th section of *The Factories and Shops Act 1885* (49 Vict. No. 862), and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of the said section 29 in

ALL THE WOOLLEN FACTORIES IN VICTORIA

for a further period of three months from the 1st January 1889, upon these express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factories any female or any male under the age of sixteen for more than fifty-six hours in any one week, or more than ten hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That no female or male under the age of sixteen shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without her or his consent.
3. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in each such factory for the information of all concerned.

GRANT OF ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY POUNDS (£150) FOR INVENTION OF MACHINERY FOR THRESHING PEASE.

REGULATIONS.

1. A sum not exceeding £150 may be paid to any person or company who shall, in the opinion of the Minister of Agriculture; produce a machine capable of threshing, within twelve hours, eight hundred bushels of pease without injury thereto.
2. The reward shall be paid only to the inventor, or his agent, of such machine as shall most cheaply, efficiently, and rapidly perform the work required, and within the time aforesaid.
3. Persons intending to compete for the award must give notice in writing of their intention to the Secretary for Agriculture, Government Offices, Melbourne, not later than 31st December 1888.
4. One or more trials of the machines shall be made at such place or places, and at such times, as the Minister may direct.
5. All costs and expenses of forwarding, attendance, and working the machines at the times to be appointed shall be paid by the persons entering the machines for competition.
6. The Minister may appoint three or more judges to report upon the merits of the competing machines, and the decision of a majority of such judges shall be final.
7. The judges may recommend payment of an amount or amounts, the total of which shall not exceed £150, to the inventor or inventors, or his or their agent or agents, of the successful machine or machines, such amounts to be apportioned to the value to the colony of the said invention or inventions.

The births of 1,329 children, viz., 692 boys and 637 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of November. In the month of October 1,468 births were registered, or 139 more than in the month under review. The births were 480 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, or 260 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in November numbered 819, viz., 445 of males and 374 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 510, or 62 per cent. The deaths were more numerous than those in October by 249, and exceeded the average of November during the previous ten years by 313. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded that average by 182.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 3.39, and of deaths registered 2.09.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 102.0° on the 23rd, and the lowest was 38.1° on the 1st. The mean temperature of the month (62.7°) was three degrees above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (46.7°) took place on the 17th, viz., from a maximum of 91.2° to a minimum of 44.5°. The least range (9.7°) was on the 29th, viz., from a maximum of 66.1° to a minimum of 56.4°. The mean daily range was 22.3°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.349 inches on the 18th, and the lowest was 29.507 inches on the 9th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.911 inches) was slightly above the average.

Rain fell on 6 days, the amount of rainfall being .625 inch. The average rainfall in November during the previous ten years was 2.98 inches, or more than two inches above that in the month under notice.

Males contributed 54 per cent., and females 46 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 47 per cent. to that mortality, as against 41 per cent. in 1887, 54 per cent. in 1886, 48 per cent. in 1885, 53 per cent. in 1884, 45 per cent. in 1883, 38 per cent. in 1882, 38 per cent. in 1881, 41 per cent. in 1880, 39 per cent. in 1879, and 35 per cent. in 1878.

Thirty deaths of persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, a female, aged 75, and a gentleman, aged 81, died of diarrhoea; two females, aged 75 and 77 respectively, of cancer of the breast; a gentleman, aged 83, of apoplexy; a female, an inmate of Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, aged 80, and a female, an inmate of the Immigrants' Home, aged 82, of insanity; an army captain, aged 76, of syncope; a farmer, aged 75, a female (a storekeeper), aged 78, a musician, aged 79, and a gentleman, aged 89, of disease of the heart; a servant, an inmate of the Benevolent Asylum, aged 76, a carpenter, aged 80, two farmers, aged 81 and 85 respectively, one being an inmate of the Benevolent Asylum, of chronic bronchitis; a female, aged 87, of Bright's disease of the kidneys; a female, aged 78, of gastritis; two laborers and a female, each aged 76, two females, each aged 78, a clerk, aged 81, a female, aged 82, a male, of occupation unknown, aged 84, a seaman, aged 85, a market gardener, aged 87, and two females, inmates of the Benevolent Asylum, aged 90 and 94 respectively, of old age.

Sixty-one deaths arose from external causes during the month, of which forty-five were set down to accidents, six to homicide, nine to suicide, and one to execution. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A male child, aged 18 months, was killed by a tram-car passing over him; a male child, aged 5, an engineer, aged 32, a nightman, aged 40, a carter, aged 42, a cabdriver, aged 47, a publican, aged 48, and three laborers, aged 50, 57, and 64 respectively, were passed over by vehicles; a boy,

aged 10, a female, aged 36, a market collector, aged 38, two laborers, aged 44 and 57 respectively, a female Asylum attendant, aged 63, were killed by falls; a laborer, aged 21, a shunter, aged 23, and an engine-driver, aged 39, were passed over or otherwise fatally injured by railway trains; a clerk, aged 27, whilst suffering from delirium tremens, succumbed to injuries received by a case falling on him; a wood carter, aged 29, of injury to the hand, how caused not stated; a male, aged 6, and three females, aged 1, 28, and 51 respectively, of burns, consequent on their clothes catching fire; a female child, aged 18 months, of scalds, caused through falling into a tub of hot water; a female infant, aged 4 days, of sunstroke; a Chinaman (a gardener), aged 50, was killed by lightning; a female child, aged 14 months, two boys, aged respectively 10 and 11, an office boy, aged 13, a laborer, aged 22, an architect, aged 24, a bookbinder, aged 27, a male, of occupation unknown, aged 35, a bootmaker and a laborer, each aged 50, two males, of unknown occupation, each aged 55, a wool-classer, aged 63, a fellmonger, aged 64, a male, of occupation unknown, aged 70, and a female (a ship's cook), aged 42, were found drowned, the last in Hobson's Bay; an infant, aged 2, was overlain. The homicidal deaths were those of three male and two female infants, who were suffocated, verdicts of murder being returned in all cases; and of a Chinaman, aged 57, who was beaten to death, a verdict of wilful murder being returned. Of the suicidal deaths, a bread carter, aged 17, a laborer, aged 30, an importer, aged 37, and a master mariner, aged 55, shot themselves; a civil servant, aged 39, and a female, aged 46, died of the effects of self-inflicted wounds in the throat; a clerk, aged 45, drowned himself in the River Yarra; a shoemaker, aged 62, hanged himself; and a cabdriver, aged 27, jumped out of a window. The case of judicial hanging was that of a man who was executed in the Melbourne Gaol for murder.

One hundred and fifty deaths, or 18 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—60 in the Melbourne Hospital, 23 in the Alfred Hospital, 2 in the Homeopathic Hospital, 14 in the Children's Hospital, 7 in the Women's Hospital, 7 in the Immigrants' Home, 15 in the Benevolent Asylum, 5 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 4 in the Austin Hospital, 5 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Blind Asylum, and 5 in the Protestant Refuge.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 385, of which 196, or 51 per cent., were of males, and 189, or 49 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 323 were under one year of age, 36 were between one and two, 8 were between two and three, 8 were between three and four, and 10 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 434. Of these, 249, or 57 per cent., were males, and 185, or 43 per cent., were females; 19 were between five and ten, 10 were between ten and fifteen, 14 were between fifteen and twenty, 37 were between twenty and twenty-five, 30 were between twenty-five and thirty, 36 were between thirty and thirty-five, 33 were between thirty-five and forty, 29 were between forty and forty-five, 33 were between forty-five and fifty, 31 were between fifty and fifty-five, 35 were between fifty-five and sixty, 38 were between sixty and sixty-five, 32 were between sixty-five and seventy, 21 were between seventy and seventy-five, 14 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 16 were upwards of eighty.

In November, as compared with the previous month, deaths from diphtheria fell from 9 to 8, those from typhoid fever from 10 to 8, and those from measles from 3 to 1. On the other hand, deaths from diarrheal diseases rose from 9 to as many as 87, those from scarlet fever from 2 to 5, and a large increase took place in deaths from diseases of the stomach and bowels. Ten deaths of child-bearing women occurred during the month, as against 7 in October. If these numbers be compared with the births, it will be found that 1 death of a mother took place to every 133 births registered during the month under notice, and 1 to every 210 such births in the previous month.

No. 24.—URBAN DISTRICT OF WARRACKNABEAL.

The following are the rates which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes by the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust within the urban district of Warracknabeal—that is to say, in regard to houses or tenements fronting any streets in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which houses or tenements if not on such streets are supplied by water by reticulation from such pipes:—

- (1.) For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

- (4.) Such before-mentioned rates shall be based upon the municipal valuation.
- (5.) Such rate is hereby made for the year 1889, commencing on the 1st of January 1889, and terminating on the 31st of December 1889, and shall be payable—the one moiety on the 1st of January and the other moiety on the 1st of July of such year.

The foregoing Regulations, Nos. 21, 22, 23, 24, were made by the Commissioners of the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of Section 119 of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, this 23rd day of November 1888.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations in connection with the above-named Grant 1888-9:—

Regulations for the distribution of the sum of Seven hundred and fifty pounds granted by Parliament to Horticultural Societies 1888-9.

- 1. That each society claiming to participate in the Grant shall furnish to the Secretary for Agriculture, on or before the 1st February 1889, a statement in the Form marked A, which must be verified by statutory declaration in the Form marked E.
- 2. The distribution of the vote will be made one month after the above-mentioned date, when a sum equal to the amount of the prize-money awarded and paid away will be allotted to each society having a claim, and be made payable to the treasurer thereof, provided that the sums claimed do not exceed in the whole Seven hundred and fifty pounds, and if they do exceed this amount then they will be reduced *pro rata*, and the allotment made accordingly.
- 3. No society whose expenditure in prizes between the 1st January 1888 and the 31st December 1888 amounts in the total to less than Fifty pounds shall be entitled to participate in the vote.

WE, Edward John Buller, Thomas Ewart, John Kennedy, Peter Crerar, David Crichton, George Davidson, Henry Blomfield, John Thomas Robinson, and Charles Vincent Collins, the duly appointed committee of management of the reserve for public recreation in the parish of Warburton, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*:—

REGULATIONS.

- The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise and sunset.
 - No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
 - No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
 - No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the trees, fences, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
 - No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.
 - No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management.
 - No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.
 - No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
 - No person shall remove timber, soil, or other material from the reserve without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management.
 - No person shall deposit or leave any glass, rubbish, or other matter of a similar nature upon any part of the reserve.
- Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five

pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

WE, Edmund Duffett, Frederick William Ullithorne, William Henry Barr, James Bell the elder, and James Hanlon, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Racecourse and General Recreation purposes in the Parish of Homerton, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 133 of *The Land Act 1834* :—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for race meetings, &c.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees or seats, or roll or throw stones in the Reserve.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, except as hereinafter provided.
6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management.
7. No person shall erect any building in the Reserve, or any booth, or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.
8. No person, except laborers or workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
9. No person shall remove any earth from the Reserve, or deposit thereon manure or rubbish.
10. The committee of management shall be at liberty to allow any part of the Reserve to be depastured by quiet stock, provided always that the moneys received for a justment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
11. The following shall be the scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the Reserve and special enclosures therein on such days as the Reserve may be set apart for race meetings, &c. :—
For the admission at the gates of every person on horseback, the sum of One shilling.
For the admission of every vehicle, the sum of Two shillings.
For the admission of every person to the special enclosures, such as the saddling paddock and stand, the sum of Two shillings and sixpence.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1834*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith

apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

CHRISTMAS AND NEW YEAR'S EXCURSIONS.

Holiday excursion tickets will be issued to and from all stations (Suburban lines excepted) from the 17th December to the 5th January, both dates inclusive, available by all ordinary and extra passenger trains and for return for one calendar month from date of issue. Example:—An excursion ticket issued on 17th December will be available till 17th January. When the last day falls on a Sunday, the ticket will be available till next day. The journey must be commenced on the date the ticket is issued, but after a distance of 15 miles has been travelled the journey may be broken at the discretion of the passengers.

Sydney Excursion Tickets.—From the 17th December to the 4th January, both dates inclusive, excursion tickets will be issued at Melbourne to Sydney at the following return fares:—First class, £5 6s. 6d.; second class, £4 1s. These tickets will be available for return for two calendar months from date of issue, but will not be available by the express on the New South Wales lines.

Adelaide Excursion Tickets.—From the 17th December to the 4th January, both dates inclusive, excursion tickets, available by express and ordinary trains, will be issued at Melbourne to Adelaide at the following return fares:—First class, £4 2s. 6d.; second class, £2 12s. 6d. These tickets will be available for return for two months from date of issue. The journey can be broken. Fares to and from other intercolonial stations proportionately low.

Brisbane Excursion Tickets.—From the 17th December to the 4th January, both dates inclusive, excursion tickets, available by express and ordinary trains on all lines, will be issued at Melbourne for Brisbane at the following return fares:—First class, £10; second class, £6 17s. 6d. These tickets will be available for return for two months from date of issue. The journey can be broken.

Luggage.—Excursion passengers to and from stations in Victoria will only be allowed to carry such luggage free as can be stowed under the seats without inconvenience to other passengers, and those who have luggage for the van are required to be at the station half-an-hour before the train starts. Stamped parcels rates will be charged for it. All luggage should be plainly addressed with the owner's name and the station it is for.

Horses and vehicles.—From the 20th December to the 5th January, both dates inclusive, the Department cannot engage to forward horses and vehicles by passenger trains, unless accommodation can be provided by special arrangement.

Commercial Travellers' Samples.—From the 20th December to the 5th January, both dates inclusive, commercial travellers' samples will only be taken to or from roadside stations by mixed or goods trains.

Goods Sheds Holiday.—The 1st January will be observed as a holiday in the goods branch, and goods trains will not run. Perishable goods will, however, be delivered at all stations on application. Consignees of powder can ascertain from the station-master at Footscray when explosives will be received in lieu of this date.

Seaside Excursions.—The issue of these tickets at the principal stations will continue as already advertised (see posters at all stations).

EXTRA TRAINS AVAILABLE FOR EXCURSION AND ORDINARY PASSENGERS.

Northern System.—Leave Melbourne for Sandhurst on 29th December at 3.25 p.m.; 31st December at 6.39 a.m., 12.10, 3.25, and 7.9 p.m.; 1st January at 6.39 a.m., 12.10, 3.25, and 7.9 p.m.; 2nd January at 6.39 a.m., 12.10, 3.25, and 7.9 p.m.; 3rd, 4th, 5th, and 7th January at 3.25 p.m. Leave Sandhurst for Melbourne on 29th December at 11.50 a.m.; 31st December at 6.40, 11.50 a.m., 3 and 7 p.m.; 1st January at 6.40, 11.50 a.m., 3 and 7 p.m.; 2nd January at 6.40, 11.50 a.m., 3 and 7 p.m.; 3rd, 4th, 5th, and 7th January at 11.50 a.m. With the exception of the 3.25 p.m. train from Sandhurst, which will stop at all stations, these trains will only stop at Sunbury, Woodend, Kyneton, and Castlemaine. The 3 p.m. train from Sandhurst will stop at Castlemaine, Kyneton, and all stations thence to Melbourne.

Woodend and Daylesford Line.—On 1st and 2nd January an extra train will leave Daylesford at 7.45 p.m., and return from Woodend at 9.50 p.m. It will connect with the last main line passenger train.

Western System.—From the 22nd December to the 2nd January, both dates inclusive, all trains for Geelong and Ballarat will start from the east side of the Williamstown platform, at Spencer-street station. (The entrance to this platform is opposite Collins street.) Passengers will be booked at special windows at that end of the station. Increased accommodation will be provided on the ordinary trains, which may take 10 minutes longer on the journey. Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at any station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Oaten hay will be preferred. If sheaf hay be tendered, it must be so stated in the tender.

Telegrams or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or oaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (Victorian grown) and bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oaten or wheaten hay.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Botanic and Domain Gardens may be called upon to supply any other Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, and for which no contracts have been taken, at the same rates.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be endorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10.
