SIR,—I have the honor to transmit to you herewith, for communication to your Government, the accompanying copy of a Board of Trade circular dated November 1887, to which is annexed an Order in Council, of Her Majesty in Council, dated the 15th September 1887, relating to colonial certificates of competency granted to officers of British vessels.

This Order consolidates the regulations now in force; gives to colonial certificates the same force as to similar certificates issued by the Board of Trade; modifies the provisions of the Order in Council passed on 29th June 1882, and of all other Orders hitherto issued on the subject, by withdrawing the restrictions to the issue of a certificate of a lower grade, either temporarily or permanently, in the case of the suspension or cancellation of officers' certificates, and has been passed in consequence of representations received from the Government of Victoria relating to the hardship which might be inflicted upon men in the event of the suspension, &c., of their certificates (issued by the Board of Trade or some British Possession) in the absence of power for the issue to them of temporary certificates of a lower grade without previous application being required to the authority which originally granted the certificates dealt with.

**INSTRUCTIONS TO OFFICERS IN BRITISH POSSESSIONS ABROAD.**  
*Merchant Shipping (Colonial) Act 1869.*

The annexed Order in Council, dated the 15th day of September 1887, revokes all Orders previously issued relating to colonial certificates of competency, and consolidates all the regulations now in force relating to their use, issue, delivery, cancellation, and suspension.

As the colonial certificates of competency referred to in the said Order in Council are to have the same force as the similar certificates granted by the Board of Trade in the United Kingdom, such a colonial certificate must be accepted as occupying in every respect the place of one of the latter, and as entitling its *bond fide* holder to act in the capacity stated in it, or any inferior (but not a superior) capacity in any British ship, all over the world without the possession of a Board of Trade certificate.

Colonial certificates will have to be used, produced, and delivered at the times and on the occasions at and on which Imperial certificates of competency would have to be used, produced, and delivered.

When it appears from a certificate (Imperial or Colonial) officially produced to the officer that its owner possesses other certificates, their production also should be required, and if they are not produced their owner's explanation in writing should be demanded and forwarded to the Registrar-General of seamen with the least possible delay.

Officers in British Possessions abroad are empowered by regulation 9 attached to the Order in Council to demand, and, if necessary, detain, any such colonial certificate which they have reason to believe has been improperly issued, or has been forged, altered, cancelled, suspended, or to which the person using it is not justly entitled.

Whenever this power is exercised a report of the facts and circumstances must be sent by the officer, with the least possible delay, to either the Board of Trade or the Government of the Possession in which the certificate was originally granted or may purport to have been granted, accordingly as communication may be easier and quicker.

As the withdrawal of a certificate would in some cases entail inconvenience, not only upon its possessor but also upon the owners of the ship and cargo, it is scarcely necessary to caution officers that the exercise of this power should only be resorted to when the evidence is perfectly clear; and if the ship is bound to the United Kingdom, and the report above mentioned has been sent to the Possession in which the certificate was originally granted, the Board of Trade should nevertheless be informed of the facts.

Every case of death of a colonial certificate-holder which may come to the officer's knowledge should be reported without delay to the Government of the Possession in which the certificate was granted.

The attention of officers and functionaries in British Possessions abroad engaged in the conduct of official inquiries in wreck and discipline cases is directed to the fact that the certificates to which the Order in Council applies will be liable to cancellation and suspension in precisely the same way as certificates granted by the Board of Trade under the Merchant Shipping Acts, and by the same boards, courts, and tribunals. The provisions of

*The Merchant Shipping Act 1854, and The Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act 1862*, as to courts of inquiry will therefore be applicable to the colonial certificates in question, with the exception of the provisions specified in the Order in Council.

Attention is further directed to the provision now for the first time inserted in Regulation 6 attached to the Order in Council, under which colonial authorities are empowered to issue a lower grade of certificate in lieu of a certificate cancelled or suspended by an official Court of Inquiry, if the Court of Inquiry make a recommendation to that effect.

It will be noticed that Regulation 8 attached to the Order in Council provides that the cancellation or suspension of a certificate shall involve cancellation or suspension of all the other certificates (if any) possessed by its owner. With the view of carrying this Regulation strictly into effect, it will be desirable that the Court should endeavor to ascertain and should specify in their decision the particulars of all the certificates possessed by any person whose conduct is the subject of an investigation by them.

In cases of cancellation or suspension of such colonial certificates, copies of the report of the Court and of the evidence, together with the respective certificates, should be sent to the Governments of the British Possessions by whom the several certificates possessed by the offender were originally granted. A full report upon the case and the evidence should, at the same time, be sent to the Board of Trade, as required by the Act, and the sentence, giving the number of each certificate dealt with, and the possession in which it was granted, should be mentioned in it.

The holders of colonial certificates which are cancelled or suspended should be referred to the Government of the Possession in which the certificate was originally granted, instead of to this Board, if they desire to appeal from the sentence or to apply for a mitigation of it.

These instructions must be understood as having reference only to the certificates referred to in the said Order in Council.

WHEREAS by the *Merchant Shipping (Colonial) Act 1869*, it is (amongst other things) enacted, that where the Legislature of any British Possession provides for the examination of, and grant of certificates of competency to, persons intending to act as masters, mates, or engineers on board British ships, and the Board of Trade reports to Her Majesty that they are satisfied that the examinations are so conducted as to be equally efficient as the examinations for the same purpose in the United Kingdom under the Acts relating to Merchant Shipping, and that the certificates are granted on such principles as to show the like qualification and competency as those granted under the said Acts, and are liable to be forfeited for the like reasons and in the like manner, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by Order in Council:—

1. To declare that the said certificates shall be of the same force as if they had been granted under the said Acts;
2. To declare that all or any of the provisions of the said Acts which relate to certificates of competency granted under those Acts shall apply to the certificates referred to in the said Order;
3. To impose such conditions and to make such regulations with respect to the said certificates, and to the use, issue, delivery, cancellation, and suspension thereof, as to Her Majesty may seem fit, and to impose penalties not exceeding Fifty pounds for the breach of such conditions and regulations.

And that upon the publication in the *London Gazette* of any such Order in Council as last aforesaid, the provisions therein contained shall, from a date to be mentioned for the purpose in such Order, take effect as if they had been contained in the Act, and that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to revoke any Order made as aforesaid:

And whereas by the *Merchant Shipping Act 1876*, it is provided that Her Majesty may, by Order in Council, revoke, alter, or add to any Order in Council made by Her under the Merchant Shipping Acts:

And whereas by various Orders in Council Her Majesty was pleased to declare that, subject to certain exceptions, conditions, and regulations therein contained or set out in the schedules thereto, the colonial certificates granted as follows, viz.:—

1. On or after the 19th day of August 1871, by the Minister of Marine and Fisheries in Canada, to persons intending to act as masters or mates on board British ships, and referred to in an Order in Council dated the 19th day of August 1871.
2. On and after the 12th day of May 1874, by the head of the Government of the Possession of Malta and its dependencies, to persons intending to act as masters, mates, or engineers on board British ships, and referred to in an Order in Council dated the said 12th day of May 1874.
3. On and after the 1st day of April 1876, by the Steam Navigation Board of Victoria, to persons intending to act as masters, mates, or engineers of British sea-going steam ships, and referred to in an Order in Council dated the 12th day of February 1876.
4. On and after the 1st day of April 1876, by the Governor for the time being of the Possession of New Zealand, to persons intending to act as masters, mates, or engineers on board British ships, and referred to in an Order in Council dated the 12th day of February 1876.

5. On and after the 1st day of April 1876, by the Marine Board of the Possession of New South Wales, to persons intending to act as masters, first mates, second mates, first class engineers, or second class engineers on board British ships, and referred to in an Order in Council dated the 12th day of February 1876.
6. On and after the 1st day of April 1876, by the Marine Board of the Possession of South Australia, to persons intending to act as masters, first mates, only mates, second mates, first class engineers, or second class engineers on board British ships, and referred to in an Order in Council dated the 12th day of February 1876.
7. On and after the 1st day of April 1876, by the Governor of the Possession of Tasmania, to persons intending to act as masters, mates, or engineers on board British ships, and referred to in an Order in Council dated the 17th day of May 1876.
8. On and after the 27th day of June 1876, by the Lieutenant-Governor of the Possession of Bengal, to persons intending to act as masters, mates, or engineers on board British ships, and referred to in an Order in Council dated the said 27th day of June 1876.
9. On and after the 14th day of May 1877, by the Governor of the Possession of Newfoundland, to persons intending to act as masters or mates on board British ships, and referred to in an Order in Council dated the said 14th day of May 1877.
10. On and after the 11th day of July 1877, by the Governor of the Possession of Bombay, to persons intending to act as masters, mates, or engineers on board British ships, and referred to in an Order in Council dated the said 11th day of July 1877.
11. On and after the 1st day of October 1877, by the Marine Board of the Possession of Queensland, to persons intending to act as masters, mates, or engineers on board British ships, and referred to in an Order in Council dated the 26th day of March 1878.
12. On and after the 1st day of January 1884, by the Governor of the Possession of Hong Kong, to persons intending to act as masters, mates, or engineers on board British ships, and referred to in an Order in Council dated the 31st day of December 1883.
13. On and after the 1st day of January 1887, by the Minister of Marine and Fisheries in the Possession of Canada, to persons intending to act as first class engineers or second class engineers of sea-going British ships, and referred to in an Order in Council dated the 10th day of November 1886.

should be of the same force as if they had been granted under the said Acts, and subject to the conditions and regulations imposed and made by the Board of Trade, and set out in the schedules to the said recited Orders in Council respectively:

And whereas by Orders in Council of the 29th day of June 1882, and the 10th day of November 1886, Her Majesty was pleased to rescind the said conditions and regulations (except in so far as the same related to certificates of competency granted to masters, mates, or engineers by the Governor of Hong Kong), and to substitute therefor the conditions and regulations set out in the schedule to the said last recited Order in Council, and numbered 1 to 10 respectively, and to declare that the same should apply to all colonial certificates granted under any of the said recited Orders:

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that it is expedient that the condition and regulation numbered six, set out in the schedules to the said recited Orders in Council, should be altered so as to allow, upon the recommendation of the Court or authority which cancels or suspends a certificate, whether granted by the Board of Trade or by the Government of a British Possession, the grant, to persons whose certificates have been cancelled or suspended under the provisions of the said recited Acts, or of any Act or Ordinance for the time being in force in any part of Her Majesty's Dominions, of a colonial certificate of a lower grade without the previous sanction of the Board of Trade or of the authority by whom such cancelled or suspended certificate was originally granted, and that the conditions and regulations set out in the said recited Orders in Council should be rescinded and the said recited Orders in Council revoked, and a new Order in Council containing such modified and amended conditions and regulations substituted in lieu thereof:

Now therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of Her Privy Council, is hereby pleased—

1. To declare that the colonial certificates of competency granted—

(a) by the Minister of Marine and Fisheries in Canada from and after the 15th day of August 1871, to persons intending to act as masters or mates on board British sea-going ships, and from and after the 1st day of January 1887, to persons intending to act as first class engineers or second class engineers on board such ships;

(b) by the head of the Government of the Possession of Malta and its dependencies from and after the 12th day of May 1874, to persons intending to act as masters, mates, or engineers on board British ships, that is to say:—To masters of the first class, or masters of a foreign-going ship, to mates of the first class or first mate of a foreign-going ship, to mates of the second class or second mate of a foreign-going ship, to engineers of the first class or first class engineers, and to engineers of the second class or second class engineers;

(c) by the Steam Navigation Board of Victoria appointed by the Government of the Possession of Victoria, from and after the 4th day of January 1870, to persons intending to act as masters, mates, or engineers of foreign-going British steam ships;

(d) by the Governor for the time being of the Possession of New Zealand from and after the 1st day of May

1872, to persons intending to act as masters, mates, or engineers on board foreign-going British ships;

(e) by the Marine Board of the Possession of New South Wales, from and after the 18th day of June 1872, to persons intending to act as masters, first mates, or second mates, or as first class engineers, or as second class engineers on board foreign-going British ships;

(f) by the Marine Board of the Possession of South Australia from and after the 12th day of May 1874, to persons intending to act as mast is, first mates, only mates, or second mates, or first class engineers, or second class engineers on board foreign-going British ships;

(g) by the Governor of the Possession of Tasmania from and after the 1st day of April 1876, to persons intending to act as masters, mates, or engineers on board foreign-going British ships;

(h) by the Lieutenant-Governor of the Possession of Bengal from and after the 27th day of June 1876, to persons intending to act as masters, mates, or engineers on board foreign-going British ships;

(i) by the Governor of the Possession of Newfoundland from and after the 14th day of May 1877, to persons intending to act as masters or mates on board foreign-going British ships;

(k) by the Governor of the Possession of Bombay from and after the 11th day of July 1877, to persons intending to act as masters, mates, or engineers on board foreign-going British ships;

(l) by the Marine Board of the Possession of Queensland from and after the 1st day of October 1877, to persons intending to act as masters, mates, or engineers on board foreign-going British ships;

(m) by the Governor of the Possession of Hong Kong from and after the 1st day of January 1884, to persons intending to act as masters, mates, or engineers on board foreign-going British ships,

shall be of the same force as if they had been granted under the said Acts:

2. To declare that all the provisions of the said Acts which relate to certificates of competency for the foreign trade granted under those Acts, except so much of the 139th section of *The Merchant Shipping Act 1854*, and of the 10th section of *The Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act 1862*, as requires the delivery by the Board of Trade to any master, mate, or engineer of a copy of any certificate to which he appears to be entitled as therein mentioned, and except so much of the third sub-section of the 23rd section of the said last-mentioned Act as requires, at the conclusion of a case relating to the cancelling or suspending of a certificate, such certificate, if cancelled or suspended, to be forwarded to the Board of Trade, and except the whole of the provisions of the fourth sub-section of the same section, shall apply to such colonial certificates of competency; provided, however, that in the case of New Zealand the foregoing exceptions shall not interfere with or suspend the operation of an Act of the Legislature of New Zealand, intitled *The Merchant Shipping Act Adoption Act 1869* (32 & 33 Vict., No. 5):
3. To impose and make the conditions and regulations set out in the Schedule A. hereto, numbered 1 to 10 respectively, with respect to the said colonial certificates of competency, and to the use, issue, delivery, cancellation, and suspension thereof, and to impose for the breach of such conditions and regulations the penalties therein mentioned:
4. To revoke the conditions and regulations, numbered 1 to 10 respectively, set out in the schedules to the said recited Orders in Council, and to substitute therefor the conditions and regulations set out in the Schedule A. hereto, numbered 1 to 10 respectively, and to declare that, from and after the time when this Order takes effect, the conditions and regulations set out in the Schedule A. hereto shall apply to all colonial certificates that may have been or shall be hereafter granted as aforesaid:
5. To declare that this Order shall take effect in each of the said Possessions immediately it is published in the said Possessions enumerated in the Schedule B. hereto, and that all certificates granted in the said Possession subsequently to the dates named in the Schedule B., and before this Order comes into force, shall have the same effect, and be of the same value, and confer the same privileges on the holders thereof as if granted under this present Order:
6. To direct that the said hereinbefore recited Orders in Council shall be revoked in each of the said Possessions on the day on which this Order takes effect therein as provided in the preceding paragraph (5) hereof: provided, however, that the revocation of the said Orders in Council shall not affect or invalidate any colonial certificate of competency previously granted thereunder, or affect the validity or invalidity of anything done under the said Orders in Council before this Order takes effect.

#### Schedule A.

Conditions and Regulations with respect to the use, issue, delivery, cancellation, and suspension of colonial certificates of competency.

*Interpretation clause.*—In the construction and for the purposes of these conditions and regulations, the following terms shall have the respective meanings hereinafter assigned to them, that is to say:—

"Colonial certificate of competency" shall mean a certificate of competency authorized to be granted by the legislative authority of a British Possession to persons intending to

at masters, mates, or engineers of British ships or similar principles and conditions as those granted under the Imperial Acts relating to merchant shipping. "Authority" shall mean the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor, Administrator, Head of the Government, Minister, Board, Body, or Corporation of or in any British Possession for the time being authorized by the Legislature of such Possession to grant colonial certificates of competency.

#### Regulations and Conditions.

##### Form of certificate.

1. A colonial certificate of competency shall be on parchment, and as nearly as possible similar in shape and form to the corresponding certificate of competency for the foreign trade granted by the Board of Trade under the Acts relating to merchant shipping.

##### Name of Possession to be inserted.

2. A colonial certificate of competency shall have the name of the British Possession in which the same is granted inserted prominently on its face and back.

##### Certificates to be numbered consecutively.

3. The colonial certificates of competency granted in each British Possession shall be numbered in consecutive order.

##### List of certificates granted, cancelled, &c., to be sent to Registrar-General of Seamen.

4. The authority in each British Possession shall furnish the Registrar-General of Seamen in London, from time to time, with accurate lists of all such colonial certificates of competency which may be granted therein or as may for any cause whatsoever be cancelled, suspended, renewed, or re-issued; and shall also furnish him with duplicates of the applications for examination made by the persons to whom such certificates are granted.

##### Certificates to be granted only upon proof of service at sea.

5. A colonial certificate of competency shall be granted only upon proof that the previous service at sea of the person applying for the same has been such as is required by the regulations for the time being in force in the United Kingdom with respect to certificates of the like grade.

Certificates of competency granted contrary to this regulation, or upon any false, incorrect, or insufficient proof, certificate, or report of service, qualification, conduct, or character shall be regarded as improperly granted.

##### Certificates not to be granted when former are cancelled.

6. A colonial certificate of competency shall not be granted to any person who may have had a certificate, whether granted by the Board of Trade or by the Government of a British Possession, cancelled or suspended under the provisions of the said Acts or of any Act or Ordinance for the time being in force in any part of Her Majesty's dominions, unless the same is a certificate of a lower grade than the one so cancelled or suspended, and is issued upon the recommendation of the court or authority which cancelled or suspended the original certificate, or unless the period of suspension has expired, or unless intimation has been received from the Board of Trade, or the authority by whom the cancelled or suspended certificate was originally granted, to the effect that no objection to the grant of such colonial certificate is known to exist, or unless a new certificate has been granted to him by such board or authority; and in the last-named event no such colonial certificate of competency shall be for a higher grade than the certificate so last granted as aforesaid.

Colonial certificates of competency granted contrary to this regulation shall be regarded as improperly granted.

##### Certificates improperly granted may be cancelled without formal investigation.

7. A colonial certificate of competency which appears from information subsequently acquired, or otherwise, to have been improperly granted, whether in the above or in any other respect, may be cancelled by the authority by which the same was granted, or by the Board of Trade in the United Kingdom, without any formal investigation under *The Merchant Shipping Act 1854*, and the holder of such certificate shall thereupon deliver it to the Board of Trade or such authority or as they or either of them may direct, and in default thereof shall incur a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds, which shall be recoverable in the same manner as penalties imposed by the Acts relating to merchant shipping are thereby made recoverable.

##### Cancellation, &c., of a certificate shall involve cancellation of all the other certificates possessed by its Owner.

8. Every decision with respect to the cancellation or suspension of a certificate pronounced by any board, court, or tribunal under the provisions of the said Acts shall, unless otherwise directed, extend equally to all the colonial certificates at the time possessed by the person in respect of whom the decision is made, as well as to all certificates granted to him under any of the Acts relating to merchant shipping, and whether such certificates be specified in such decisions or not.

##### Certificates believed to be fraudulent may be demanded.

9. Any officer of the Board of Trade, or the Registrar-General of Seamen, or any of his officers, or a superintendent of a mercantile marine office, or a consular officer, or duly appointed shipping officer in a British Possession, may demand the delivery to him of any colonial certificate of competency which he has reason to believe has been improperly issued, or is forged, altered, cancelled, or suspended, or to which the person using it is not justly entitled, and may detain such certificate for a reasonable period for the purpose of making inquiries respecting such issue, forgery, alteration, cancellation, suspension, or possession, and any person who, without reasonable cause, neglects or refuses to comply with such demand shall incur a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds or its equivalent in local currency, which shall be recoverable in the same manner as penalties imposed by the Acts relating to merchant shipping are thereby made recoverable.

##### Suspended certificates to be re-issued only by colony by which originally granted.

10. A colonial certificate of competency which has from any cause been cancelled or suspended shall be renewed or re-issued only by the authority by which the same was originally granted.

#### REGULATIONS UNDER "THE FACTORIES AND SHOPS AMENDMENT ACT 1887."

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the seventh day of February 1888.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has, in accordance with the provisions of, and in exercise of the powers conferred by "The Factories and Shops Amendment Act 1887," been pleased to make the subjoined Regulations for the issue of certificates to engine-drivers for factories and work-rooms, that is to say:—

#### REGULATIONS.

##### Preliminary Requirements.

1. Each applicant for a Certificate must forward to the Secretary for Mines, Melbourne, notice in writing of his intention to present himself for examination, such notice to be given not less than fourteen clear days prior to the date of examination.

The notice must be accompanied by cash, post office order, postal note, or stamps to the amount or value of 10s.

Should the applicant pass the prescribed examination, the deposit shall, in each instance, go towards payment of the fee for Certificate; in the event, however, of the failure of the candidate to pass the examination, such amount shall be forfeited to the Consolidated Revenue.

No Certificate shall be issued until full payment of the fee required shall have been made to the Secretary for Mines.

##### Certificates of Competency.

2. The Certificates of Competency to be issued by the Board of Examiners shall be of two classes, namely, first and second.

A First-Class Certificate shall entitle the holder thereof to drive any engine used in or in connexion with a factory or work-room.

A Second-Class Certificate shall entitle the holder thereof to drive any engine used in or in connexion with a factory or work-room, the cylinder of which does not exceed twelve inches in diameter (or if two cylinders be used the combined area thereof must not exceed that of a cylinder twelve inches in diameter.)

3. An applicant for a Second-Class Certificate must produce to the Board satisfactory evidence—

(a.) Of his respectability of character.

(b.) That he has had not less than six months' experience in assisting at the working of an engine used in or in connexion with a factory or work-room.

(c.) That he is at the date of examination not under the age of eighteen (18) years, nor over the age of fifty (50) years.

(d.) That neither his eyesight nor his hearing is defective, and that he is not subject to any other mental or bodily infirmity likely to interfere with the efficient discharge of his duties.

A document signed by the applicant's employers, bearing on this clause, may be considered satisfactory evidence.



**4. An applicant for a First-Class Certificate must produce to the Board satisfactory evidence—**

- (a.) Of his respectability of character.
- (b.) That he has been the holder of a Second-Class Certificate, under these regulations, for a period of not less than twelve months, and that he has during that period driven a "second-class" engine for a period of not less than six months.
- (c.) That he is at the date of examination not under the age of eighteen (18) years, nor over the age of fifty (50) years.
- (d.) That neither his eyesight nor his hearing is defective, and that he is not subject to any other mental or bodily infirmity likely to interfere with the efficient discharge of his duties.

A document signed by the applicant's employers, bearing on this clause, may be considered satisfactory evidence.

5. Provided nevertheless that at the first series of examinations held at any place, under the provisions of these regulations, the Board may grant a First-Class Certificate of Competency to any such applicant as shall satisfy the Board that he has had experience in driving, and is fully competent to drive any and every kind of engine used in or in connexion with a factory or work-room.

6. Candidates for Certificates of Competency will be examined as to their practical knowledge and working of machinery, including steam engines and all connexions, boilers and mountings, or any other machinery used in or in connexion with a factory or work-room.

7. If a candidate shall fail to pass the examination prescribed, he shall not again present himself until a period of not less than six months shall have elapsed from the date of his last examination.

*Certificates of Service.*

8. The Certificates of Service to be issued by the Board of Examiners shall be of two classes, namely, first and second.

(a.) A First-Class Certificate shall entitle the holder thereof to drive any engine used in or in connexion with a factory or work-room.

(b.) A Second-Class Certificate shall entitle the holder thereof to drive any engine used in or in connexion with a factory or work-room the cylinder of which does not exceed twelve inches in diameter (or if two cylinders be used the combined area thereof must not exceed that of a cylinder twelve inches in diameter).

9. First-Class Certificates of Service will be granted to such candidates as satisfy the Board that they have been in charge of, and have efficiently managed and driven an engine the cylinder of which is not less than twelve inches in diameter used in or in connexion with a factory or work-room for a period of not less than twelve months prior to 17th December 1887.

10. Second-Class Certificates of Service will be granted to such candidates as satisfy the Board that they have been in charge of, and have efficiently managed and driven an engine used in or in connexion with a factory or work-room the cylinder of which does not exceed twelve inches in diameter (or if two cylinders be used the combined area thereof does not exceed that of a cylinder twelve inches in diameter) for a period of not less than twelve months prior to 17th December 1887.

11. Candidates must produce testimonials or certificates, signed by their employers, and such documents must specify clearly and distinctly the class of engines they have driven. The diameter of the cylinders of the engines driven must be stated on the testimonials.

12. If a candidate attempt to obtain a Certificate of Service by means of false testimonials, he shall not be allowed to again present himself to the Board of Examiners for examination until a period of not less than twelve months shall have elapsed from the date of his last examination.

*Examinations.*

13. Examinations will be conducted by the Board at such times and places as may from time to time be notified by the Secretary in the *Government Gazette* and in a newspaper or newspapers published or circulated in the locality, and candidates will be examined according to priority of receipt of notice required by clause 1.

*Miscellaneous.*

14. Whenever a person proves to the satisfaction of the Board of Examiners that he has, without fault on his part, lost or been deprived of any Certificate previously granted to him under the provisions of *The Factories and Shops Amendment Act 1887*, such Board shall, upon payment of such fee, if any, as they may direct, but not exceeding the fee specified in the Schedule hereto, cause a copy of the Certificate to which the applicant appears to be entitled to be made out and certified by the Secretary to the Board, and delivered to the applicant, and any copy so made and certified as aforesaid shall have the effect of the original Certificate. The fee, if any, herein referred to shall be paid to the Secretary for Mines, in cash, stamps, postal note, or post office order, and shall by him be paid into the Consolidated Revenue.

15. The holder of a Second-Class Certificate of Competency or Service, issued under *The Regulation of Mines and Mining Machinery Act 1883* and *The Factories and Shops Amendment Act 1887* shall be entitled to drive any "second-class" engine under either Act.

16. Every Certificate of Competency or Service issued under *The Factories and Shops Amendment Act 1887* shall specify the name, place, and date of birth of the person to whom such Certificate is issued.

17. No person under the age of eighteen years shall be placed in charge of or drive or have the control of any steam-engine or boiler used in or in connexion with any factory or work-room.

18. No person in charge of steam machinery used in or in connexion with any factory or work-room shall, under any pretext whatever, unless relieved by a competent person for that purpose, absent himself or cease to have continual supervision of such machinery during the time such machinery is at work.

*Disqualification of Holder of Certificate.*

19. Any person holding a Certificate of Competency or of Service under *The Factories and Shops Amendment Act 1887* as an engine-driver, and who is charged with (a) any offence or misconduct likely to be detrimental to the proper or efficient discharge of his duties, or (b) is by reason of incompetency or gross negligence, unfit to discharge such duties, or (c) has been convicted of any offence against *The Factories and Shops Act 1883*, or (d) has committed a breach of these regulations, may be called upon by the Board of Examiners to show cause why he should not be disqualified as a certificated engine-driver; and if he fail to satisfy the said Board, he may by an order of the Governor in Council, published in the *Government Gazette*, be disqualified for any period from acting as engine-driver.

Any such person shall, after such order, deliver into the charge of the said Board his Certificate of Competency or of Service, which shall be retained by the said Board during the period of his disqualification, and no such person shall during the period of such disqualification take charge of any machinery in which steam or air is used as motive power.

The Board may, if they think fit, hold an inquiry into the conduct of an engine-driver accused of any of the foregoing offences, and with respect to such inquiry the following provisions shall have effect:—

- (1.) The inquiry shall be held at such time and place as the Board may appoint, due notice of which shall be forwarded to the engine-driver.
- (2.) The Secretary to the Board shall, before the commencement of the inquiry, furnish to the engine-driver a statement of the case upon which the inquiry is instituted.
- (3.) The engine-driver shall attend such inquiry, and may produce such evidence as may be considered necessary.
- (4.) The Board shall, upon the conclusion of the inquiry, forward to the Minister of Mines a report containing a full statement of the case and their opinion thereon.
- (5.) An engine driver may, in addition to disqualification, be compelled to defray all or part of the expenses of any inquiry which may be held under the provisions of this clause.

NEW SOUTH WALES.—"DISEASES IN SHEEP ACTS AMENDMENT ACT OF 1878."

**THE** following Proclamation by His Excellency the Governor of New South Wales is published for general information.

NEW SOUTH WALES, } Proclamation by His Excellency the Right  
to wit. } Honorable Charles Robert, Baron Carrington, a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of New South Wales and its Dependencies.

**WHEREAS** by section 29 of an Act passed in the forty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled *The Diseases in Sheep Acts Amendment Act of 1878*, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, suspend, for any period not exceeding six months, such of the provisions of *The Sheep Act of 1866* relating to the introduction of imported sheep from the neighbouring colonies as will admit of fat sheep arriving by sea from any colony in which disease is not known or suspected to exist being taken direct to the abattoirs on Glebe Island, Port Jackson, for slaughter, under such Regulations as may be set forth in the said Proclamation: And whereas the disease called "Scab in Sheep" is not known or suspected to exist in the colony of Victoria: Now therefore I, **CHARLES ROBERT, BARON CARRINGTON**, the Governor aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby suspend, to the extent and for the purpose aforesaid, the provisions of sections 52, 53, and 54 of *The Diseases in Sheep Act of 1866*, with respect to fat sheep imported from the said colony of Victoria, for the further period of six months from the 4th proximo: And I do hereby declare and set forth the following Regulations as those under which such sheep may be so imported and landed for slaughter as aforesaid, namely:—

1st. The owner of such sheep shall give the inspector for the port immediate notice of their arrival, and shall produce to him a certificate from the inspector of the port from which such sheep were shipped, setting forth that he had examined such sheep, and that, to the best of his knowledge and belief, they were the produce of the colony from which they were shipped, and were free from disease and infection.

2nd. Such sheep shall not be allowed to leave the vessel by which they arrive until they have been examined by the inspector.

3rd. Upon being inspected and found free from infection, such sheep shall be taken direct to the abattoirs on Glebe Island, and there delivered into the charge of the Inspector of Slaughter-houses, to be slaughtered under his supervision.

4th. Any person failing to comply with or aiding or being concerned in the breach of any of the provisions of these Regulations shall incur a penalty not exceeding £5 for every sheep with respect to which any such penalty is incurred.

### AVOCA WATER TRUST.—REGULATION.

**THE** Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulation made in pursuance of the provisions of section 44 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881*, No. 716, and also of section 20 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1884*, No. 829.

### REGULATION No. 4.

**THE** Chairman and Commissioners of the Avoca Water Trust—the waterworks district which has been proclaimed an urban district on the 13th of March 1885, for the purposes of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by *The Victorian Water Conservation Acts 1881 and 1883*, make the Regulation following:—

1st. A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the £ sterling is hereby made for the year 1888 on the annual shire valuation of the urban districts of East and West Charlton, commencing on the 1st day of January, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1888.

2nd. The sum of One pound sterling shall be the minimum amount of rates to be annually paid by every owner or occupier of any house or tenement liable to be rated by the Avoca Water Trust in the urban districts of East and West Charlton.

3rd. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the Trust works, Three shillings and fourpence for every thousand gallons shall be charged.

4th. Such rate is hereby made payable, in equal moieties, at the office of the Trust, on the first day of June and first day of September 1888.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose, shall be authorized to demand the said rate.

The foregoing Regulation, No. 4, was made by the Commissioners of the Avoca Water Trust, under and by virtue of sub-section 4 of section 44 of *The Water Conservation Act 1881*, on the 12th day of December 1887.

4. An applicant for a First-Class Certificate must produce to the Board satisfactory evidence—

- Of his respectability of character.
- That he has been the holder of a Second-Class Certificate, under these Regulations, or that he has been the holder of a First-Class Certificate of Competency or Service issued under *The Factories and Shops Amendment Act 1887*, for a period of not less than twelve months, and that he has had at least three months' experience during that period in assisting at a winding engine.
- That he is at the date of examination not under the age of eighteen (18) years, nor over the age of fifty (50) years.
- That neither his eyesight nor his hearing is defective, and that he is not subject to any other mental or bodily infirmity likely to interfere with the efficient discharge of his duties.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1884* (48 Vict. No. 812, sec. 73) it was enacted that the Governor in Council might from time to time, by a notice in the *Government Gazette*, proclaim as a street or road or as a township any portion or portions of Crown lands, and the lands in such township, or within any city, town, or borough proclaimed before the passing of the said Act should be sold by auction in the manner therein provided for the sale of Crown lands by public auction, and the lands upon which such street or road have been proclaimed should be and be deemed to be thenceforward dedicated to the public: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this notice proclaim as a township the portion of Crown lands hereinafter described, that is to say:—

## VERMIN DISTRICTS.—ANNUAL RATES.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Mallee Pastoral Leases Act 1883* it was amongst other things enacted that the Local Committee should within thirty days from its appointment, and thereafter in the month of January in each and every year, recommend to the Governor an annual rate or assessment, specifying the amount thereof to be paid by the owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within its vermin district, in respect of each square mile of land owned, held under lease, or occupied, under the provisions of the said Act; and also in respect of the sheep or cattle depasturing thereon: And whereas it was further enacted that such rate or assessment on being proclaimed by the Governor in Council in the *Government Gazette* should be the rate payable by the owners, lessees, and occupiers of land within the vermin district for the current year for the purposes of the said Act, and should be paid to the Minister at the same time as the rent payable by such lessees and occupiers: And whereas the Local Committees duly appointed for the undermentioned vermin districts have recommended the rates hereunder specified per square mile upon all lands within the boundaries of the said vermin districts: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the undermentioned annual rates to be the rates payable by the owners, lessees, and occupiers of lands within the said vermin districts for the current year, that is to say—

Within the boundaries of the Eastern Vermin District—Ten shillings per square mile on all holdings not exceeding twenty square miles in extent; and Ten shillings per square mile on the first twenty miles, and Two shillings and sixpence per square mile on the area in excess of the first twenty miles on all holdings exceeding in extent twenty square miles.

Within the boundaries of the Middle Vermin District—Eleven shillings per square mile or part thereof.

Within the boundaries of the North-Eastern Vermin District—Two shillings per square mile.

Within the boundaries of the North-Western Vermin District—One shilling per square mile.

Within the boundaries of the Warracknabeal Vermin District—Seven shillings per square mile.

“THE MALLEE PASTORAL LEASES ACT 1883.”—NORTHERN AND NORTH-WESTERN VERMIN DISTRICTS.—VARIATION OF BOUNDARIES.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Mallee Pastoral Leases Act 1883* (No. 766, sec. 43) it was enacted that the Governor, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, might from time to time declare any lands situate within the Mallee country or Mallee border to be “Vermin Districts” for the purposes of the said Act, and fix the boundaries thereof, and might from time to time in like manner cause any lands to cease to be Vermin Districts, or might vary the boundaries thereof: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony bearing date the twenty-fifth day of November One thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, and made in pursuance of the said Act, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, did, *inter alia*, notify and proclaim the boundaries of the Northern and North-Western Vermin Districts: And whereas it is expedient to vary the boundaries of the said districts: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby vary the boundaries of the Northern and North-Western Vermin Districts by transferring Mallee Blocks 28 and 46 from the Northern Vermin District, and including them within the boundaries of the North-Western Vermin District.

The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labor may be required in the packing of stores.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods, and be transmitted through the Stores and Transport Department, except in the case of supplies for the Local Military Department, the Naval Forces, the Harbor Department, and for Works and Buildings. 18. In the event of any alteration in the tariff affecting any of the items included in these contracts, the Government, or the contractor, as may be the case, will make a proportionate allowance by way of deduction from or increase of the price of the item so affected.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1874 and the Local Government Act Amendment Act 1883, the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Bairnsdale order as follows:—

That sections 41 and 42, subdivision 9, Part I., Schedule 13, of the Local Government Act 1874, viz:—

Section 41.—"If any cattle shall be found upon any land not being a common and such that there is no fence whether upon the same land or any other dividing such first mentioned land from any street or road whether public or private with-out any person having charge of such cattle the owner of such

cattle shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings for every head of such cattle and the proper officer of the council may seize such cattle and place the same at some neighboring place of safe custody and any justice if such owner be not known upon proof of the issue of a summons in the usual form addressed to such owner as "owner," only without otherwise naming or describing him such cattle and the place of seizure being truly described therein and of the publication of such summons in some newspaper commonly circulating in the neighborhood may after the expiration of twenty-four hours from such publication proceed with respect to such owner not appearing as if personal service of a summons stating his name had been effected or if such owner appear then as in other cases and the justice may order the cattle to be sold and the money arising from the sale after deducting the said penalty and the costs awarded and the reasonable expenses to be estimated and assessed by the justice of seizing keeping and selling the said cattle shall be paid if demanded within one month to the owner of the cattle and if not so demanded then to the municipal fund and if the said money shall not be sufficient for all the purposes aforesaid the amount whereby the same falls short or if no such sale be ordered the whole of the said amount may be recovered from the said owner of and when known in like manner as other penalties and sums adjudged or ordered to be paid by justices are to be recovered."

Section 42.—"If any cattle be any time found in any street without any person having the charge thereof the owner of such cattle shall forfeit for every head of such cattle a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings and if such cattle shall by reason of having been so found at large have been impounded by the council the amount of such penalty and costs if adjudged respectively before the release or sale of such cattle shall be added to the pound fees and charges payable in respect of such cattle and the amount thereof of such lesser amount if any as after the sale of the cattle may remain in the hands of the poundkeeper shall be paid over by him accordingly and if the proceeds of any sale of such cattle shall not be sufficient after paying the lawful fees and charges aforesaid to satisfy such penalty and costs or if such penalty and costs shall have been adjudged after the release or sale of the cattle the same or as much thereof as remains unpaid shall and may be recovered from the owner of the cattle in like manner as other penalties and costs adjudged by justices are by law to be recovered and if in case of any information under this section the owner be not known then the provisions of the last preceding section so far as necessary to give the adjudicating justice jurisdiction shall apply."

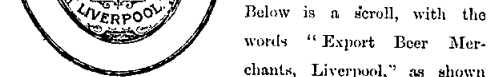
