## "THE FEDERAL COUNCIL OF AUSTRALASIA ACT 1885."

By His Excellency Sir Robert George Crookshank Hamilton, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Tasmania and its Dependencies.

### A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the Act of the Imperial Parliament of the 48 & 49 Vict., ch. 60, intituled "*An Act to constitute a Federal Council of Australasia.*" it is enacted that the Federal Council of Australasia shall be summoned and prorogued by the Governor of the colony in which the Session shall be held, and shall be so summoned and prorogued by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* of each of the colonies in the said Act referred to in respect to which the said Act is in operation: And whereas the present Session of the said Federal Council has been held at Hobart, in the Colony of Tasmania: And whereas it is expedient that the said Federal Council shall be prorogued: Now therefore I, Sir Robert George Crookshank Hamilton, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief as aforesaid, in pursuance of the said Act, and by virtue of the power thereby conferred upon me, do, by this my Proclamation, prorogue the said Federal Council.

THE attention of persons intending to exhibit at the Centennial International Exhibition, Melbourne, 1888, inventions for which letters patent may lawfully be granted under the Patent Laws of Victoria is invited to section 22 of Act 808, *The Patents Act 1884*, and particularly to the conditions of protection therein mentioned. The terms of the section are as follows:—

"The exhibition of an invention at an Industrial or International Exhibition, or the publication of any description of the invention during the period of the holding of the Exhibition, or the use of the invention for the purpose of the Exhibition in the place where the Exhibition is held, or the use of the invention during the period of the holding of the Exhibition by any person elsewhere without the privity or consent of the inventor, shall not prejudice the right of the inventor or his legal personal representative to apply for and obtain provisional protection and a patent in respect of the invention or the validity of any patent granted on the application, provided that both the following conditions are complied with (namely):—

- (a) The exhibitor must, before exhibiting the invention, give the law officer one month's notice of his intention to do so; and
- (b) The application for a patent must be made before or within twelve months from the date of the opening of the Exhibition."

## REVOCATION OF THE PROHIBITION AGAINST THE INTRODUCTION OF CATTLE, SHEEP, AND SWINE FROM PLACES OTHER THAN THE AUSTRAL- ASIAN COLONIES AND NEW ZEALAND INTO VICTORIA.

**WHEREAS** by an Order made in pursuance of the provisions of an Act intituled *An Act to amend the Laws relating to or affecting the Public Health*, and bearing date the tenth day of July One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, the Governor in Council did, *inter alia*, prohibit the introduction of cattle, sheep, or swine from places other than the Australasian Colonies and New Zealand into Victoria: And whereas it is expedient to revoke the said Order: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke the Order aforesaid.

## INTRODUCTION INTO VICTORIA OF SWINE.

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fourteenth day  
of February 1888.*

**WHEREAS** by the 109th section of an Act intituled *An Act to amend the Laws relating to Public Health* and numbered 782, among other things the Governor in Council is empowered from time to time to make, alter, or vary and revoke such Orders as may seem necessary for the purpose of prohibiting or regulating the introduction into Victoria from any country or colony or part of a country or colony (in which respectively any disease in sheep, cattle, horses, dogs, swine, or other animals of the same or any other kind or kinds whatsoever is known to exist), and for the detention in quarantine in such place and for such period as the Governor in Council by such Order appoints or directs of all sheep, cattle, horses, dogs, swine, or other animals of the same or any other kind or kinds whatsoever, or of meat, skins, hides, horns, hoofs, or other parts of any animals, or of hay, straw, fodder, or other articles likely to propagate amongst men or other animals any infectious or contagious disease whatsoever: And all Orders for any of the purposes hereinbefore in this section mentioned shall have the like force and effect as if the same had been inserted in the now in part recited Act: And all persons offending against any Order made under the authority of this section shall for each and every offence forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Fifty pounds, or such smaller sum as the Governor in Council may in any case by such Order direct; and such sum shall go to and form part of the consolidated revenue: Provided that nothing in this section shall apply to the disease in sheep called scab: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order, in exercise of the

powers conferred by the above recited Act and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, order as follows (that is to say):—

1. The introduction of swine into Victoria from the countries following, that is to say, Europe, Asia, Africa, America, and the islands in the Atlantic, Pacific, and Indian Oceans, save and except the Australasian Colonies and New Zealand, is hereby prohibited.
2. No person shall do or attempt to do, cause to be done or to be attempted to be done, or assist in doing or attempting to do, any Act forbidden by this Order, or obtain or endeavour to obtain, or assist anyone in obtaining or endeavouring to obtain by fraud any authority under this Order, or forge any such authority, or make use of any such forged or fraudulently obtained authority, or fraudulently grant or issue any such authority, or obstruct or refuse to carry out the directions of any inspector or other person acting under the authority of this Order.
3. All persons offending against this Order shall for each and every offence forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50).

## VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

**BYE-LAW No. 62.**

**T**HE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred by *The Victorian Railways Commissioners Act 1883*, do hereby make the following Bye-law, and all previous Bye-laws conflicting therewith are hereby repealed:—

## CHARGES ON GOODS ARE FIXED AS FOLLOWS:—

1. Seed Potatoes, in cases or bags, to be charged Special "A" Rates, with 1st Class minimums, when sent in small quantities.
2. Wine Butts, Pipes, and Vats to be charged Miscellaneous Class Rates, with 1st Class minimums.
3. Returned Empties.—The radius of 100 miles for Returned Empty Casks of all sorts is extended to 101 miles; and the rates shown in Bye-law 28 for under 150 miles are made the maximum for any distance.
4. Acids, assorted lots, in quantities of 5 tons and upwards, to be charged Single 4th Class Rates, owners' risk.
5. Old Zinc, melted into Cakes or Ingots, to be carried under Special "A" Class Rates and Conditions.
6. Black Sand, Quartz, and Quartz Tailings, to be carried at Firewood Rates, minimum 6 tons per truck, otherwise Special Class Rates and Conditions.
7. Boilers, manufactured up country, and sent to Melbourne, Geelong, or Portland for exportation, to be granted a rebate to 2nd Class on proof of exportation.
8. New Machinery and Cast Iron Pipes, manufactured at Sandhurst, and sent to Dawson, to be carried at a class lower than Classification Rates.
9. Store Sheep and Cattle.—The minimum number of trucks of Sheep or Cattle which may be sent at Store Rates from Newmarket to Country Stations is reduced from two to one, and Store Horses and Store Dairy Cattle may be sent on similar terms.
10. Sheep or Cattle, carried between stations in Victoria and South Australia, to be charged for the Victorian Local Rate at the same Mileage Rate as if the whole journey took place on Victorian Lines.
11. Out of the through rates for Carriage of Fruit between Melbourne and Adelaide, the proportion due to the Victorian Railways shall be as follows:—

## SHIRES OF DUNDAS AND MINHAMITE.

## PROPOSED SEVERANCE OF AREA.

IN pursuance of the provisions of *The Local Government Act 1874* (No. 506, sec. 46), the substance and prayer of a petition, in accordance with the 44th section of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, are published, viz.:—

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the rate-payers in the portion of the Shire of Dundas described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the said Shire of Dundas and annexed to the Shire of Minhamite as a separate riding to be called the North Riding.

Area described in the petition:—

Commencing at a point on the Weerangourt Creek north of the north-west angle of the Weerangourt pre-emptive section; thence by that creek to the south-west angle of allotment 16A, parish of Byaduk, and by the west boundary of that allotment and the west, north, and east boundaries of allotment 16, same parish, to the north-west angle of allotment 8A, parish of Napier; thence by the north boundaries of allotments 8A, 7A, 6A and B, 5A and B, 4A, 3A, 2, 1A, and A4 to the north-west angle of A3 to its south-east angle; thence by a one-chain road bearing easterly to the county boundary; thence by that boundary (or Eumeralla River) to the Macarthur town boundary; thence north, west, and south by that boundary to the main Hamilton road; thence by that road to the north-west angle of section 2, parish of Warabkook; thence by a line to the south-west angle of the Weerangourt pre-emptive section and the west boundary of that section to the point of commencement.

Petitioners state that their interests are not identical with those of the northern parts of the shire of which Hamilton is the principal town, but with Macarthur, which is near at hand, and where all the necessary public conveniences for carrying on any business are established. ## REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A CRICKET AND RECREATION GROUND AT LILLYDALE.

**W**E, Richard Tamplin Kings, Robert Harman, Edward Poyner, and Joseph M. Poyner, the surviving members of the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for a Cricket and Recreation Ground at Lillydale, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 133 of *The Land Act 1884* :—

## REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for cricket matches, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
5. No person shall put into the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.
6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the committee of management.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.
8. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Malice Pastoral Leases Act 1883* it was amongst other things enacted that the Local Committee should within thirty days from its appointment, and thereafter in the month of January in each and every year, recommend to the Governor an annual rate or assessment, specifying the amount thereof to be paid by the owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within its vermin district, in respect of each square mile of land owned, held under lease, or occupied, under the provisions of the said Act; and also in respect of the sheep or cattle depasturing thereon; and it was further enacted that such rate or assessment on being proclaimed by the Governor in Council in the *Government Gazette* should be the rate payable by the owners, lessees, and occupiers of land within the vermin district for the current year for the purposes of the said Act, and should be paid to the Minister at the same time as the rent payable by such lessees and occupiers: And whereas the Local Committee duly appointed for the Northern Vermin District has recommended a rate of Two shillings per square mile upon all lands within the boundaries of the said vermin district: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim an annual rate of Two shillings per square mile to be the rate payable by the owners, lessees, and occupiers of lands within the Northern Vermin District for the current year.
