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# REGULATIONS RELATING TO CIPHER TELEGRAMS.

Post Office Act 1883, Section 95.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has approved of the cancellation of the undermentioned regulations relating to ciphers in telegrams, viz. :—

5. Local and intercolonial telegrams containing any ciphers but proper names or plain dictionary words in the English language will be charged cipher rate.

6. Cipher rate (50 per cent. in addition to the ordinary charge) will be charged for messages containing words not to be found in a dictionary, or a combination of letters, such as DCKNO; or figures 89765. A group of five, or less, to count as one word. One group renders the whole message chargeable with cipher rate.

And the substitution thereof of the following regulations, viz. :—

"Local and intercolonial telegrams in secret language, or consisting of words in any admitted language (English, French, German, Italian, Dutch, Portuguese, Spanish, and Latin) having no connective meaning, groups of letters or figures, shall be regarded as cipher messages, and be subject to an additional charge of 50 per cent.

"In a message containing one or more words in cipher every such word shall be counted as two words, and the extra charge shall be added to the minimum rate for a message, provided that such extra charge shall not exceed 50 per cent. on the ordinary rate which would be payable on account of the said telegram.

"Groups of five letters or five figures shall count as one cipher word."

## BIRDS TO BE DEEMED "NATIVE GAME."

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

**WHEREAS** by an Act of Parliament passed in the thirty-first year of Her Majesty's reign, intituled *An Act to protect Game* (31 Vict. No. 311), it is amongst other things enacted that for the purposes of the said Act the term "game" shall mean and include all birds and other animals mentioned in the first schedule to the said Act; and the term "native game" shall mean and include all birds and other animals mentioned in the second schedule to the said Act; provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, at any time after the passing of the said Act, by proclamation to name any other bird or animal which shall be included in such first or second schedule respectively, and after the publication of any such proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, and the expiration of the period mentioned in such proclamation for the time of its coming into operation, the birds or other animals so named shall be deemed and considered as being thenceforward included in such schedule: And it is also enacted that the period of the year during which the said Act shall be in operation as regards all or any of the birds and other animals mentioned in the second schedule shall be from and after the first day of August until the thirtieth day of November in each year, or such other period as the Governor in Council may by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* from time to time direct: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby name each of the birds named in the schedule hereto annexed as a bird which shall be included in the second schedule to the said Act annexed upon the expiration of the period hereafter mentioned for the coming into operation of this proclamation, and that the period of the year during which the said Act shall be in operation as regards each of the birds named in the aforesaid schedule hereto annexed shall be the period set forth opposite the name of each bird respectively: And, with the advice aforesaid, I do appoint that this my proclamation shall come into operation upon the first day of March One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. Regulation for the making of a rate for the year 1888 on all rateable property in that portion of the Wimmera United Waterworks District, of which notice has been given that the same has been supplied with water, under the provisions of *The Victorian Water Conservation Acts 1887-1888*, and which notice was published in the *Government Gazette* of March 12th, 1886, wherein the portion of the district so described as supplied with water is as follows, that is to say—the whole of the area of the Wimmera United Waterworks District, except in the parishes of Hindmarsh, Joop, Jeparit, Balyik, Tarranyurk, Willenabrina, Yellangip, Katyl, and Dimboola.

Whereas the Governor in Council has, by an Order made the thirteenth day of April 1886, under the provisions of section 93 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883*, divided the Wimmera United Waterworks District into divisions, and directed that the necessary rates for paying interest on all moneys borrowed by the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust for the construction and maintenance of their waterworks, or to meet any other expenses in connection therewith, shall be levied in the following only of such divisions, viz.:—The Shire of St. Arnaud division, the Shire of Kara Kara division, the Shire of Dunmunkle division, the Shire of Stawell division, the Shire of Wimmera division, and the Shire of Dimboola A division; and has further directed that such rates be levied differentially as between such said several divisions, and that the proportion in which such several divisions shall be rated respectively one to another shall be as follows, that is to say, that the respective ratings in the pound sterling on the annual value of rateable property rated for municipal purposes in the said several divisions shall be—Shire of St. Arnaud division, Seven pence; Shire of Kara Kara division, Fifteen pence; Shire of Dunmunkle division, Fourteen pence; Shire of Stawell division, Nine pence; Shire of Wimmera division, Thirteen pence; Shire of Dimboola A division, Twenty-four pence.

And whereas the Governor of the Colony of Victoria, by proclamation dated 28th June 1886, proclaimed certain areas in and around the townships of Murtoa and Warracknabeal to be respectively Urban Districts under the provisions of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883*, No. 778.

And whereas by further proclamation, dated the 29th of December 1887, the Governor of the Colony of Victoria proclaimed certain areas in and around the townships of Donald and Dimboola to be respectively Urban Districts, under the provisions of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, No. 946.

And whereas the Governor in Council by an Order, dated the 18th day of December 1886, diminished the extent of the said Wimmera United Waterworks District by excising therefrom the territory described above as the Shire of Wimmera division.

The following rate is made on the annual value of all the rateable property in the said several divisions of the Wimmera United Waterworks District, excepting in the said parishes of Hindmarsh, Joop, Jeparit, Balyik, Tarranyurk, Willenabrina, Yellangip, Katyl, and Dimboola, and in the said Urban Districts of Murtoa, Warracknabeal, Donald, and Dimboola, according to the valuation for the time being on all such lands and tenements for the municipal rates of the Shires of St. Arnaud, Kara Kara, Dunmunkle, Stawell, and Dimboola respectively, that is to say—on rateable property within the Shire of St. Arnaud division, a rate of Seven pence in the pound sterling of such valuation on rateable property; in the Shire of Kara Kara division, a rate of Fifteen pence in the pound sterling of such valuation; in the Shire of Dunmunkle division, a rate of Fourteen pence in the pound sterling of such valuation; in the Shire of Stawell division, a rate of Nine pence in the pound sterling of such valuation; and in the Shire of Dimboola A division, a rate of Twenty-four pence in the pound sterling of such valuation.

(1.) For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

(2.) For every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds per annum, the sum of Ten pounds per centum per annum on the annual value of such property.

(3.) The births of 1,186 children, viz., 594 boys and 592 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of January. In the month of December 1,077 births were registered, or 109 fewer than in the month under review. The births were 339 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but only 123 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in January numbered 842, viz., 441 of males and 401 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 344, or 41 per cent. The deaths were fewer than those in December by 75, but exceeded the average of January during the previous ten years by 243. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded that average by only 90.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 3.04, and of deaths registered 2.16.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 104.0° on the 15th, and the lowest was 48.8° on the 25th. The mean temperature of the month (64.9°) was fully a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (45.3°) took place on the 26th, viz., from a maximum of 95.2° to a minimum of 49.9°. The least range (5.2°) was on the 23rd, viz., from a maximum of 65.0° to a minimum of 59.8°. The mean daily range was 16.8°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.153 inches on the 29th, and the lowest was 29.395 inches on the 15th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.841 inches) was slightly lower than the average.

Rain fell on 12 days, the amount of rainfall being 2.58 inches. The average rainfall in January for the last ten years was 1.48 inch, or more than an inch below that in the month under notice.

Males contributed 52 per cent., and females 48 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 53 per cent. to that mortality, the proportion being the same as in January 1887, as against 54 per cent. in January 1886, 48 per cent. in January 1885, 44 per cent. in January 1884, 48 per cent. in January 1883, 49 per cent. in January 1882, 45 per cent. in January 1881, 43 per cent. in January 1880, 44 per cent. in January 1879, and 47 per cent. in January 1878.

The deaths of 22 persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month, viz.:—Those of a gardener and a female, each aged 76, who died of diarrhoea; a gunsmith, aged 76, a female, aged 81, and a gentleman, aged 85, of apoplexy; a miner, aged 76, of bronchitis; a female, aged 76, of pneumonia; a female, aged 76, of disease of the heart; a carpenter, aged 80, of congestion of the lungs; a female, aged 84, of gastritis; a gentleman, aged 89, of uræmia; a female, aged 93, of hepatitis; a farmer and a female, each aged 78, a sawyer, aged 80, a gentleman, aged 83, a dairyman and a gentleman, each aged 84, a gentleman, aged 85, a female, aged 86, a female, aged 95, and a gentleman, aged 101, of old age.

As many as 47 deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which 34 were set down to accident, 4 to homicide, and 9 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A male infant, aged 4 days, died of fracture of the leg, sustained during birth; a boy, aged 5, was killed by coming into contact with a machine in a tile factory; an employé at a sugar refinery, aged 12, had his head cut off by a lift descending on him; a male child, aged 4, died of injuries received by falling; a platelayer, aged 48, of injuries to the back, occasioned by falling from a railway bridge; a hawker, aged 66, of injuries sustained

through falling from a cart; and a female, aged 66, of fracture of neck and thigh, through falling out of bed. A laborer, aged 24, died of fracture of the spine, caused by diving in shallow water; a boy, aged 7, of injuries to the chest—a dray wheel having passed over him; a calman, aged 44, of fracture of the spine, the result of the upsetting of a cart; a female, aged 72, was killed through being thrown from a cart; a carpenter, aged 24, died of fracture of the spine, a tree falling on him; and 2 laborers, aged 27 and 28 respectively, of fracture of the skull, caused by a quantity of earth and other matter falling on them. A boy, aged 14, was accidentally shot; a boy, aged 9, died of tetanus, consequent on a wound in the foot; 2 male infants, aged 1 year and 2 years respectively, died of scalds, the former occasioned by the upsetting by him of a pot of boiling water; a female child, aged 4, of scalds and ulceration of the duodenum; and a girl, aged 14, of burns, caused by setting fire to her clothes with a candle; a female telegraph operator, aged 28, died of sunstroke; a female child, aged 14 year, was poisoned with phosphorus; and a female, aged 18, died from the effects of eating camphor. A boy, aged 13, was drowned whilst bathing; a ship's carpenter, aged 26, was drowned in the River Yarra; and 2 ordinary seamen, aged 16 and 52, were drowned in Hobson's Bay. A printer, aged 29, a commission agent, aged 33, and a sign-writer, aged 60, were found drowned in the River Yarra; a woolsorter, aged 26, and a ship's steward, aged 45, were found drowned in Hobson's Bay; a male infant, aged 4 months, was suffocated in bed; and a quarryman, aged 60, was suffocated in a manner not stated. The homicidal deaths were those of a male infant who was murdered at birth; a laborer, aged 39, who died of dislocation of the neck, resulting from a blow received in a drunken quarrel; a cook, aged 45, and a gardener, aged 64, whose deaths resulted from fractures of the skull, under what circumstances not stated; in the last three instances the verdict was "manslaughter." Of the suicidal deaths, a female, aged 35, poisoned herself with a liquid used for cleaning metals; and a laborer, aged 45, with strychnine. A female servant, aged 19, and a laborer, aged 49, drowned themselves in the River Yarra; and a gas stoker, aged 28, in Hobson's Bay. A store dealer (a prisoner of the Crown), aged 24, a female, aged 45, and a farmer, aged 54, hanged themselves; and a female shopkeeper, aged 54, died of injuries resulting from throwing herself from a window.

One hundred and thirteen deaths, or 13 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—57 in the Melbourne Hospital, 18 in the Alfred Hospital, 5 in the Homoeopathic Hospital, 5 in the Children's Hospital, 3 in the Women's Hospital, 3 in the Immigrants' Home, 3 in the Benevolent Asylum, 5 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 8 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Pentridge Stockade, and 3 in the Protestant Refuge.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 439, of which 231, or 53 per cent., were of males, and 208, or 47 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 357 were under one year of age, 63 were between one and two, 8 were between two and three, 6 were between three and four, and 5 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 403. Of these, 210, or 52 per cent., were males, and 193, or 48 per cent., were females; 15 were between five and ten, 11 were between ten and fifteen, 19 were between fifteen and twenty, 40 were between twenty and twenty-five, 38 were between twenty-five and thirty, 30 were between thirty and thirty-five, 34 were between thirty-five and forty, 27 were between forty and forty-five, 39 were between forty-five and fifty, 24 were between fifty and fifty-five, 33 were between fifty-five and sixty, 28 were between sixty and sixty-five, 21 were between sixty-five and seventy, 22 were between seventy and seventy-five, 8 were between seventy-five and eighty; and 14 were upwards of eighty.

In January, as compared with December, there was a falling off of 6 deaths caused by specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and of 69 deaths caused by local diseases. Under the former head, deaths from measles fell from 15 to 6, and those from diarrhoeal diseases from 142 to 119. On the other hand, deaths from typhoid fever rose from 15 to 39. The deaths from this complaint in January 1887 numbered 40, or one more than in the month under review. Under the local head, deaths from affections of the brain and nerves fell from 110 to 75, and those from lung and chest complaints from 55 to 36. Nine deaths of child-bearing women occurred during the month, as against 4 in December. If these numbers be compared with the births registered during the same months, it will be found that one death of a mother took place to every 132 children born alive in the month under notice, as against no more than 1 to every 269 such children born alive in the previous month.

EXPLOSIVE SUBSTANCES.—REGULATIONS.

**H**IS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in accordance with the provisions of, and in exercise of the powers conferred by *The Explosives Act 1885*, doth hereby rescind clauses 2 and 7 of the Regulations dated the twenty-eighth day of November One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, made under the provisions of the Acts Nos. 196 and 440 respectively, and doth order that the following shall be read as and taken to be clauses 2 and 7 of the said Regulations (that is to say):—

2. No person or persons shall, under any circumstances, import into Victoria any explosive other than gunpowder which has been manufactured for more than six months prior to the date of its arrival, provided, nevertheless, that the Commissioner of Trade and Customs may in special cases, on the recommendation of an Inspector of Explosives, allow the importation of explosives which have been manufactured for a longer period than six months prior to date of arrival. Each case imported into Victoria, containing any explosive, shall be marked in legible and indelible characters, showing the date of its manufacture, the name of the explosive, and the name of the consignee or importer.

7. No explosive other than gunpowder that has been manufactured more than nine months shall remain in any Government magazine or hulk, or in any licensed magazine, unless an Inspector of Explosives shall, after due inspection, recommend that such period may be extended, in which case such explosives may remain in any Government magazine, or hulk, or licensed magazine, for such further period as such Inspector may approve.

**W**HEREAS by *The Land Act 1884* (48 Vict. No. 812, sec. 73) it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might from time to time, by a notice in the *Government Gazette*, proclaim as a street or road, or as a township any portion or portions of Crown lands, and the lands in such township, or within any city, town, or borough proclaimed before the passing of the said Act should be sold by auction in the manner therein provided for the sale of Crown lands by public auction, and the lands upon which such street or road have been proclaimed should be and be deemed to be thenceforward dedicated to the public: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony bearing date the fourteenth day of November One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, the boundaries of a township at the Lakes' Entrance, in the parish of Colquhoun, were, in pursuance of the said Act, defined and described: And whereas it is expedient to extend the boundaries of the said township: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this notice extend the boundaries of the said township at the Lakes' Entrance, in the parish of Colquhoun, by the addition thereto of the land in the said parish comprised within the boundaries as defined by description hereunder, that is to say:—

**REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE MEREDITH CRICKET AND PUBLIC RECREATION RESERVE.**

**W**E, John Armstrong, John Murphy, and William Henry Ridgway, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by Order of 19th June 1883 as a site for Cricket and other purposes of Public Recreation in the town of Meredith, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*.—

**REGULATIONS.**

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
  2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
  3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
  4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats.
  5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, pigs, or geese, or bring any dog therein, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the committee of management.
  6. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.
  7. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
- Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

## CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules; but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be according to sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. In other cases the supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. A preference will, however, be given to goods of Victorian manufacture, provided the quality is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labor may be required in the packing of stores.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods, and be transmitted through the Stores and Transport Department, except in the case of supplies for the Local Military Department, the Naval Forces, the Harbor Department, and for Works and Buildings. From these departments the order will be sent direct to the contractor. All orders must accompany the goods on delivery, otherwise the goods will not be received. Delivery, as a rule, is to be of the full quantity ordered.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williamstown districts are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office; and Williamstown district will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officers ordering the goods.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and, in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officers named in condition 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account.

8. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form simultaneously with delivery of the full quantities of goods ordered, the account being rendered with the order to which it relates. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officers issuing the orders. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the goods.

10. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carriers to act as agent for and charge the freight to the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 13 of these conditions.

11. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. All articles rejected must be immediately replaced by the contractor, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in condition 7.

12. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the colony for the time being, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 7.

13. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in condition 7, or from the contractor's security. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

14. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited, and in addition the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

15. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

16. It will be competent either for the contractor on his own behalf, or for the Secretary of the Tender Board on behalf of the Government, to terminate the contract, by giving notice, in writing, of three full calendar months to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made, and under no other circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract.

17. 
