## LIGHTHOUSE AT EDDYSTONE POINT, ON EAST COAST OF TASMANIA.

Notice is hereby given that a lighthouse, now in the course of erection at Eddystone Point, East Coast of Tasmania, in latitude 40° 59' 40" S., longitude 148° 20' 50" E. approximate, will be ready for exhibition on or about 1st December.

The site of the tower is 47 feet above the sea level, and the height of the tower to base of the lantern is 85 feet.

The light will be 1st order Dioptric Group Flashing Light, showing every half-minute bright white flashes in triple series, the time of revolution of the whole five groups being thus two and a half minutes.

There will also be a subsidiary red light, having a radius of two and a half miles, to mark the Victoria Rocks.

## GRANT OF ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY POUNDS (£150) AS PRIZES FOR THE BEST MANAGED FARMS IN VICTORIA.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations in connection with the above-named grant :—

## REGULATIONS.

- Two first prizes of Fifty pounds each will be awarded, one for the best farm in the Northern districts of the colony, and one for the best farm in the Southern districts. A second prize of Twenty-five pounds will be awarded for the second best farm in each of the above districts.
- The work of selecting the most suitable farms for competition will be entrusted to the Agricultural Societies.
- Notice of nomination must be forwarded to the Secretary for Agriculture, Melbourne, not later than the 3rd October 1888.
- The notice must contain full particulars as to the name of the owner, and where the farm is situated.
- The competition is to be restricted to freeholders in occupation and Crown tenants.
- Upon receipt of information as to the farms selected for competition, the Minister of Agriculture may appoint three judges to decide the merits of such farms, and a decision of a majority of such judges shall be final.
- The judges will be required to communicate to the Minister of Agriculture their decisions; also to report on the merits of the whole of the farms selected for competition.

## VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

## EASTER EXCURSIONS.

Holiday excursion tickets will be issued to and from all stations (suburban lines excepted) from the 26th March to the 7th April, both dates inclusive (Sundays excepted) available for return for one calendar month from date of issue. Example:—An excursion ticket issued on the 28th March will be available till the 28th April. When the last day falls on a Sunday, the ticket will be available till the next day. The journey must be commenced on the date the ticket is issued, but after a distance of 15 miles has been travelled, the journey may be broken at the discretion of the passenger.

*Intercolonial Excursion tickets* will also be issued from the 26th March to the 6th April inclusive, available for return for two (2) months, as under :—

- From Melbourne to Sydney and Sydney to Melbourne.—These tickets will not be available by Express trains on the New South Wales Line, and the journey cannot be broken in that colony.

- From Sydney to Adelaide and Adelaide to Sydney.—Available by Express trains on all lines.

*Luggage.*—Excursion passengers to and from stations in Victoria will only be allowed to carry such luggage free as can be stowed under the seats without inconvenience to other passengers, and those who have luggage for the van are required to be at the station half an hour before the train starts; stamped parcels rate will be charged for it. All luggage should be plainly addressed with the owner's name and the station it is for.

NOTE.—The apparent increase of population in 1887, or that obtained by adding the excess of registered births over registered deaths to the excess of recorded arrivals over recorded departures—was 39,055; which was not so large by 2,119 as the apparent increase in 1886, but was larger than the apparent increase in any other year since 1857. The actual increase is known to be less than this, in consequence of the departures by sea being imperfectly recorded. If allowance be made for the probable number of these, the net increase of population during the year will be reduced to 33,067, viz., 18,598 males and 14,469 females, as shown above.

The registered births numbered 33,022, and the registered deaths 15,993 in 1887; thus the former exceeded the latter by 17,029, or 106 per cent. The births exceeded those in 1886 by 2,198 and the deaths exceeded those in 1886 by 1,041; both births and deaths were also much more numerous than in any other year.

The recorded arrivals by sea numbered 90,147 and the recorded departures by sea numbered 68,121 in 1887. The gain to the population by excess of the former over the latter was thus apparently 22,026. This number, however, must be reduced by an allowance for unrecorded departures, estimated to amount to 6,988; which brings the probable net gain by immigration down to 16,038.

From the period of the census of 1881 to the end of 1887, the whole reduction made for supposed unrecorded departures has been 35,988. Had no such reduction been made the population at the end of 1887 would apparently have amounted to 1,072,098.

The gain by excess of births over deaths in 1887 exceeded that in 1886 by 1,157, but the gain by excess of recorded arrivals over recorded departures in 1887 was less than in 1886 by 3,276.

In 1887 the recorded arrivals from, were greater than the recorded departures for, New South Wales by 939; South Australia by 3,991; Tasmania by 3,106; New Zealand by 1,538; the United Kingdom by 8,813; Foreign Countries by 3,639. In no other year since 1877 have the arrivals from New South Wales been set down as more numerous than the departures for that colony.

The population of New South Wales is estimated by the Government Statistician of that colony to have numbered 1,042,919 (viz., 574,012 males and 468,907 females) at the end of 1887, or 6,809 (made up of 23,962 males, less 17,153 females) more than the estimate for this colony. The total increase during the year is set down as 40,953, or 7,886 above the estimated increase in Victoria. No account is or can be taken in either colony of the emigration of the population overland, and the population estimates are based upon the assumption that the numbers going from and coming to each colony over its borders are equal.

As regards the Victorian estimate, it should be stated that the figures of births and deaths during 1887, and consequently those of population, will probably be slightly altered when the returns of the Deputy Registrars are finally examined.

The births of 1,065 children, viz., 522 boys and 543 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of February. In the month of January 1,186 births were registered, or 121 more than in the month under review. The births were 315 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but only 121 above that average if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in February numbered 729, viz., 417 of males and 312 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 336, or 46 per cent. The deaths were fewer than those in January by 113, but exceeded the average of February during the previous ten years by 179. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded that average by only 37.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 2.72, and of deaths registered 1.86.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 97.2° on the 12th, and the lowest was 43.1° on the 15th. The mean temperature of the month (64.9°) was exactly one degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (47.5°) took place on the 19th, viz., from a maximum of 92.9° to a minimum of 45.4°. The least range (5.9°) was on the 13th, viz., from a maximum of 68.3° to a minimum of 62.4°. The mean daily range was 22.4°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.174 inches on the 10th, and the lowest was 29.470 inches on the 1st. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.907 inches) was slightly above the average.

Rain fell on 6 days, the amount of rainfall being 0.42 inch. The average rainfall in February was 1.83 inches, or nearly one inch and a half more than in the month under notice.

Males contributed 57 per cent., and females 43 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 47 per cent. to that mortality, as against 52 per cent. in February 1887, 48 per cent. in February 1886, 48 per cent. in February 1885, 40 per cent. in February 1884, 42 per cent. in February 1883, 46 per cent. in February 1882, 45 per cent. in February 1881, 52 per cent. in February 1880, 45 per cent. in February 1879, and 52 per cent. in February 1878.

The deaths of 24 persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month:—Of these, a plumber and a female, each aged 75, and a female, aged 87 died of heart disease; a farm laborer, aged 77, and a gentleman, aged 89, of apoplexy; a gentleman, aged 73, of hemiplegia; a female, aged 78, and a seaman, aged 85, of bronchitis; a female, aged 79, of paralysis; a grazier, aged 81, of meningitis; a cooper, aged 83, of valvular disease of the heart; a female, aged 84, of softening of the brain; an engineer, aged 84, of hepatic scirrhus; a baker, aged 85, of enteritis; a female, aged 89, of continued fever; a sign writer, aged 75, a female, aged 76, a farmer, aged 78, a physician, aged 79, a contractor, and a gentleman, each aged 83, a gentleman, aged 85, a laborer, aged 88, and a laborer, said to be aged 100, of old age.

Forty-one deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which 34 were set down to accident, and 7 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A school boy, aged 13, died of fracture of the skull, he having been struck by a stone thrown by another boy; a laborer, aged 21, of peritonitis, occasioned by a fall from a scaffold; a carter, aged 60, of injury to the spine, the result of a fall from a spring cart; a farmer, aged 75, of meningitis, and laceration of the brain, caused by a fall; a carter, aged 35, was passed over by a dray; a laborer, aged 43, by a waggon; a driver, aged 17, and a shearer, aged 38, were passed over by railway trains; a shunter, aged 47, died of internal injuries, a truck wheel having passed over him; a gardener, aged 63, of fracture of the ribs—a dray wheel having passed over him; a wheelwright, aged 28, of fracture of the skull, sustained whilst working at a lathe; a cab proprietor, aged 37, died of dislocation of the ankle, resulting from a fall in the street, and a groom, aged 48, of fracture of the thigh, resulting from a fall—both these cases were complicated by the recipient of the accidents being in a state of delirium tremens; a ship's carpenter, aged 55, died of injury to the spine—also, the result of a fall. A laborer, aged 42, was shot whilst working at the Rifle Butts; a male patient in the Kew Lunatic Asylum, aged 67, died of laceration of the lung, through being gored by a bull; a female child, aged 3, was burnt to death during a conflagration; a female machinist, aged 21, died of burns, her clothes catching fire; a female child, aged 1 year and 5 months, of scalds caused by pulling a basin of boiling water from a table over herself. A boy, aged 13, died from inhaling chloroform whilst suffering from typhoid fever; a female, aged 32, was poisoned by taking belladonna, whilst intoxicated; a sugar refiner, aged 35, by eating poisonous fungi; and a butcher, aged 43, by alcohol. Two boys, aged 9 and 12 respectively; a male, of occupation unknown, aged 40, and a hotel-keeper, aged 74, were drowned, the first two whilst bathing; a grocer, aged 17, a female servant, aged 21, a male, of occupation unknown, aged 30, a laborer, aged 46, a housekeeper, aged 50, were found drowned; two male infants, aged 15 days and 4 months respectively, were suffocated in bed. Of the suicidal deaths—a journalist, aged 38, shot himself; a pawnbroker, aged 62, cut his throat; a commission agent, aged 59, poisoned himself; a male of occupation unknown, aged 26, drowned himself; a waiter, aged 46, and a laborer, aged 60, hanged themselves; and a laborer, aged 38, died of rupture of the spleen, consequent on throwing himself from a window. All who committed self destruction were set down as laboring under temporary insanity, with the exception of the male, aged 26, of whom little was known.

One hundred and forty-three deaths, or 20 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—66 in the Melbourne Hospital, 24 in the Alfred Hospital, 6 in the Homœopathic Hospital, 5 in the Children's Hospital, 7 in the Women's Hospital, 10 in the Immigrants' Home, 8 in the Benevolent Asylum, 4 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 3 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 3 in the Austin Hospital, 6 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 1 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 339, of which 182, or 54 per cent., were of males, and 157, or 46 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 252 were under one year of age, 61 were between one and two, 16 were between two and three, and 10 were between three and four.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 390. Of these, 235, or 60 per cent., were males, and 155, or 40 per cent., were females; 13 were between five and ten, 10 were between ten and fifteen, 24 were between fifteen and twenty, 40 were between twenty and twenty-five, 31 were between twenty-five and thirty, 26 were between thirty and thirty-five, 35 were between thirty-five and forty, 33 were between forty and forty-five, 24 were between forty-five and fifty, 15 were between fifty and fifty-five, 34 were between fifty-five and sixty, 43 were between sixty and sixty-five, 18 were between sixty-five and seventy, 19 were between seventy and seventy-five, 11 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 13 were upwards of eighty.

In February, as compared with the previous month, deaths under the head of specific febrile or zymotic diseases decreased from 179 to 136, and those from constitutional diseases from 140 to 107. Under the zymotic head, deaths from measles fell from 6 to nil, those from diphtheria from 5 to 2, and those from diarrheal diseases from 119 to 66. On the other hand, deaths from typhoid fever rose from 39 to 63. Under the constitutional head, deaths from cancer fell from 20 to 16, and those from phthisis from 83 to 58. Three deaths of child-bearing women occurred during the month, as against 9 in January. If these numbers be compared with the births registered during the same months, it will be found that no more than one death of a mother took place to every 355 children born alive in the month under notice, whilst 1 such death occurred to every 132 such children born alive in the previous month.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE TREASURY GARDEN.

WHEREAS by section 133 of *The Land Act 1884* it is among other things enacted that the Board of Land and Works shall have power from time to time to make, alter, and rescind any rules and regulations made for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby rescind all rules and regulations heretofore made in respect of the Treasury Garden, and doth make the regulations following for the care, protection, and management thereof:—

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall interfere with the trees, shrubs, flowers, birds, fish, or any property in this garden, or throw stones or other missiles, or commit any nuisance therein.
2. No person shall climb on or jump over the fences or seats in or around the garden, or lie on the seats or grass, or stick bills on the fences, gates, or trees, or deface the same or write thereon.
3. No person, except those in the employ of or authorized by the Board of Land and Works, shall bring into the garden any horse or other animal or any vehicle, or enter plots of ground enclosed for plantations or other purposes.
4. No person shall bring into the garden any dog unless the same be held by a chain or cord.
5. Cricket, football, or other games or sports shall not be played in the garden.
6. Preaching in the garden or public harangues, whereby a crowd is collected, shall not be permitted.
7. Any person found in a state of intoxication, or behaving in a disorderly manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or committing any act of indecency in the gardens shall be liable to be forthwith removed by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, and shall be liable to prosecution for an offence against these regulations.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF ALBERT PARK.

WHEREAS by the Crown grant issued in favour of the mayor, councillors, and citizens of the city of South Melbourne, the mayor, councillors, and burgesses of the borough of Saint Kilda, and the Board of Land and Works, and their successors, in respect of Albert Park, it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted and the buildings for the time being thereon shall be maintained and used as and for a Public Park for the recreation, convenience, and amusement of the people, and offices and conveniences connected therewith, under and in accordance with such regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Governor or Administrator of the Government of the colony of Victoria for the time being, with the consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in the meantime under and in accordance with such rules, orders, bye-laws, and regulations as shall from time to time be made by the mayor, councillors, and citizens of the said city of South Melbourne, the mayor, councillors, and burgesses of the said borough of Saint Kilda, and the said Board of Land and Works: Now therefore the council of the city of South Melbourne, the council of the borough of Saint Kilda, and the Board of Land and Works do

hereby make the Regulations following for the care, protection, and management of Albert Park, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein:—

REGULATIONS.

1. Unless otherwise directed by the trustees, the double gates of the park shall from the first day of April to the thirtieth day of September be closed to the public from half-past six o'clock in the evening to six o'clock in the morning, and from the first day of October to the thirty-first day of March from eight o'clock in the evening to half-past five o'clock in the morning.
  2. No vehicle used for hire or transport of goods, stores, or materials of any description bearing either name or number shall be allowed within the park without permission in writing of the trustees, and no person shall ride or drive on the footpaths or on the embankment of the lake within fifty feet of the margin thereof.
  3. No person shall interfere with the trees, shrubs, birds, fish, or other property in the park, or throw stones or other missiles, or commit any nuisance therein, or leave thereon any bottles, orange peel, paper, cast-off clothing, or any litter.
  4. No person shall climb on or jump over the fences in and around the park, or stick bills on the fences or gates, or cut names, letters, or marks on the trees, or write on the seats, gates, posts, or fences, or otherwise deface or injure the same.
  5. Any person found in a state of intoxication, or behaving in a disorderly manner, or using obscene language, or creating or taking part in any disturbance in the park shall be liable to be forthwith removed therefrom, and to prosecution.
  6. No person, except those authorized by or in the employ of the trustees, shall enter any of the enclosed plantations, shrubs, berries, &c., in the park.
  7. No person shall bring into the park any dog for coursing or other purposes of sport, or for bathing, and all dogs so brought in, and all goats and poultry found within the park, shall be liable to be destroyed.
  8. No person shall depasture any horses or cattle in the park without permission, in writing, of the trustees, and then only in such portions thereof as may be specified in such permission.
  9. No person shall hawk or offer for sale any goods or articles of any description in the park without having obtained written permission from the trustees, and no person shall light any fires within the park without special permission, in writing, of the trustees.
  10. Cricket, football, or other athletic sports, shall not be played or take place within the park, except in such places as the trustees may direct, and in every case must not be at a less distance than sixty (60) yards from any path or roadway.
  11. No person shall convey into the park or place upon the lake therein any boat in respect of which a license or other authority from the trustees has not been obtained.
  12. All proposed buildings in the park, and all piers or jetties in connexion with the lake therein, shall be constructed in strict accordance with plans to be submitted to and approved by the trustees.
  13. The trustees shall be at liberty at any time to require any buildings or erections in the park to be altered or removed, and no stakes or posts shall be driven into the bed of the lake without the authority, in writing, of the trustees having been first obtained.
  14. Bathing in the lake shall not be allowed.
  15. Fishing in the lake shall not be permitted without special permission, in writing, of the trustees.
  16. Permits for the temporary occupation of sites within the park, and for any other special privilege in connexion therewith, shall, if issued, be subject to such terms and conditions as may from time to time be approved by the trustees; and no person shall occupy any site within the park or enjoy any special privilege therein unless the consent of the trustees has been first obtained.
- Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any officer or servant of the trustees, or by any constable, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such officer or servant or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

**WHEREAS** by *The Land Act 1884* power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein specified: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

**REGULATIONS.**

*Depasturing Cattle in Timber Reserves.*

- Persons resident in Victoria and within twenty miles of the timber reserves in the parishes of Barmah, Picola, Yielima, and Yalca, situate immediately south and east of and adjoining the Barmah and Yielima State Forest, may, subject to the conditions hereinafter specified, depasture in such timber reserves any number not exceeding in the whole thirty head of cattle.
- All cattle so depastured must be the *bona fide* property of persons resident as aforesaid.
- Depasturing shall be subject to the supervision and control of the forester in charge, and the forester shall be responsible for the registration of the cattle, and for the prevention of trespass.
- The fee for depasturing cattle in the timber reserves before mentioned shall be paid half-yearly in advance, and shall be at the rate of Four shillings per annum for every head of cattle.
- Every person desirous of depasturing cattle in the timber reserves before mentioned shall pay into the Receipt and Pay Office nearest to such reserves the full amount of the fee prescribed by these Regulations, and shall obtain a receipt for such payment in the form prescribed in the schedule hereto.
- A place shall be set apart as the necessities of the case may require, for branding all cattle prior to the same being depastured in the reserves; and all persons shall bring their cattle to such place to be branded by the forester or his assistant, on a day appointed by the forester for the purpose of branding cattle. The days appointed for branding cattle shall be notified by advertisement, authorized by the forester, in a newspaper circulating in the district.
- All cattle depasturing in the timber reserves before mentioned shall be deemed to be trespassers unless the same have been duly branded by the forester or his assistant and the fees for depasturing shall have been paid.
- The brand in use for the Barmah and Yielima State Forest shall be used for the purpose of branding cattle depasturing in the timber reserves before mentioned, and shall be kept by the forester and may be inspected by the public at the place set apart for branding on the days appointed for branding, or a description thereof may be obtained on application in writing to the forester.
- The brand shall be liable to alteration at any time, on approval of the Minister. Notice of every such alteration shall be published in a newspaper circulating in the district, and every such notice shall specify a time when the owners of cattle depasturing under license in such timber reserves shall bring the same for the purpose of being branded with such altered brand. Every person disobeying such notice shall be deemed to be a person not licensed or otherwise authorized to depasture cattle within the meaning of the 109th section of *The Land Act 1884*, and may be dealt with accordingly.
- For the purpose of these regulations the term "cattle" shall mean and include any gelding, mare, colt or filly, any ox, steer, cow or heifer, and any ass or mule.
- No animal affected with any contagious disease shall be allowed to depasture on either of the before mentioned timber reserves.
- When the forester in charge of the timber reserves before mentioned shall consider that the said reserves are stocked to their full carrying capabilities, he shall notify the Receiver and Paymaster accordingly, who thereupon shall discontinue to issue licenses for such reserves until otherwise advised by the forester.

The Melbourne District will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office; Williamstown District will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra, and all Government vessels which may be in Hobson's Bay during the currency of the contract; the Ararat and Beechworth Districts will include the Lunatic Asylums at these places; the Ballarat District includes the Industrial and Reformatory Schools; and the Geelong District embraces a radius of two miles from the Post Office.

The lock-ups at City Watch-House, Carlton, Collingwood, Fitzroy, Fitzroy North, Hobham Hill, King street, Little Bourke street, North Melbourne, Port Melbourne, Pralran, Richmond, St. Kilda, St. Kilda road, and South Melbourne are included in the contracts for the Melbourne District.

Samples of the sago, soap, rice, teas, and sugars required at Yarra Bend, Kew, Sunbury, and Ararat, can be seen at the respective lunatic asylums; and samples of the teas, sugars, soaps, and tobacco required at Geelong, Ballarat, Beechworth, Castlemaine, Maryborough, Sale, Sandhurst, and Portland can be seen on application to the governors of the respective gaols. Samples of the whole of the above-mentioned articles can also be seen at the offices of the Secretary to the Tender Board.

The prices must be expressed, without alterations or erasures, in words as well as in figures, and the total amount of tender stated.

Printed forms of tender, showing the estimated monthly consumption, and conditions of contract, may be obtained from the Secretary to the Tender Board, Melbourne; and for the respective districts from the Receivers and Paymasters at Geelong, Ararat, Ballarat, Beechworth, Castlemaine, Maryborough, Sale, Sandhurst, and Portland; the Medical Superintendent, Lunatic Asylum, Sunbury; and the Inspector of Forests, Macedon, by whom also information will be afforded to persons tendering.

Security will be required, either in Government debentures, bank deposit-receipt, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect. The security is calculated at Ten per cent. on contracts under £1,000, and Five per cent. over that sum; and the preliminary deposit at Ten per cent. of the security; but no deviation will be allowed from the amounts above specified.

Bank deposit-receipts to be in favor of the Secretary, Tender Board.

Tenders must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit, as shown above, in bank notes, or a bank draft payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application. #### CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best condition, and to be delivered in sound packages, free from all charges for cartage, freight, &c.
2. Supplies for country stations for which no local contract may have been taken, or for which the contract has been terminated, may be ordered under the Melbourne contract.
3. Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the price demanded, except brandy casks, porter casks, hogsheds, butter firkins, and soap boxes (not including fancy soaps), flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for. The empties to be removed at the contractor's expense.
4. Bread.—A sample of the best ordinarily retailed to the public will be considered as a test loaf for first quality. Third quality (that issued to prisoners of the Crown) to be made of flour, fine sharps, the produce of prime, strong, thin-skinned, good colored wheat, to be perfectly free from coarse pollard or other offal.
5. Milk.—The milk must be fresh, pure, and of the best quality, and subject to test when required by the department. Should the supply prove to be not of contract quality, any expense incurred will be charged to the contractor.
6. Fresh meat is to be supplied in such proportions as may be required, and, when the quality admits, to be delivered in fore and hind quarters alternately, also buttocks only when ordered. When shins of beef form a portion of the supply, a fair proportion of the bone, not less than ten inches, must have been cut off. The sticking pieces must be removed from the fore quarters of beef.
7. Potatoes to be dry and free from dirt. Contractors to supply 105 lbs. of potatoes for each cental credited to them, and, in addition, to take back all rejected before being cooked.
8. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of department concerned.
9. The order issued by the head of department must accompany the goods, and the account is to be rendered simultaneously with the delivery of the supplies. For the supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts, the account is to be rendered monthly for such quantities only as are issued, the difference between the supply and issue to be kept at the contractor's credit. Supplies not issued at the termination of the contract to be removed by the contractor. The rates or quantities quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.
10. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order, they will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account.
11. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a board of survey composed of persons

named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 10.

12. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which it will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 10.

13. In the case of supplies for lunatic asylums, it will also be competent for two or more of the official visitors, in conjunction with the medical superintendent, to reject any supplies that they may consider not in accordance with contract; and in such cases the reference to a board of survey will not be deemed to be necessary on the part of the contractor.

14. In the case of supplies for lunatic asylums, it will be competent for a board of survey, consisting of the medical superintendent (or, in his absence, of the deputy medical superintendent) and any two officers named by him, to examine and reject any supplies that may be objected to. It must be distinctly understood, however, that the contractor will have a right of appeal to the Treasurer of the colony for the time being; but pending such appeal, he must take back the rejected articles and at once supply others of approved quality; failing which, the supplies required may be obtained by the officer concerned, and the expense charged to the contractor.

15. As the exact quantity of any article of provisions which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same as ordered.

16. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the persons to whom the rations are due or to the contractor in waiting for a board to survey, the head of the department, or officer in charge of the station, will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which, it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 10.

17. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivery or replacing them when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the said Treasurer may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer to terminate the contract forthwith and forfeit the whole or any part of the security.

18. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carriers to act as agent for and charge the freight to the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 17 of these conditions.

19. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

20. It will be competent for the Secretary to the Tender Board on behalf of the Government, or the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of three full calendar months; it being understood that such notice can be given only from the first day of a month, and within the period for which the contract is made; and *under no other circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract*. It will also be competent for the Secretary to the Tender Board to terminate the contract, without notice, for the breach or neglect of the same, or should there be reason to know that the contractor takes advantage of his contract to communicate improperly with a prisoner.

21. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Imperial Commissariat or Defence Department, or on account of other Governments, or for rabbit extirpation, or for supplies to the aborigines; or by the consumption of the produce or surplus stock of any Government establishment; or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment.

22. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and in addition the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

23. In the event of any alteration in the tariff affecting any of the items included in these contracts, the Government, or the contractor, as may be the case, will make a proportionate allowance by way of deduction from or increase of the price of the item so affected.

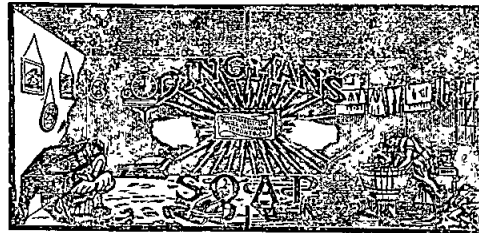

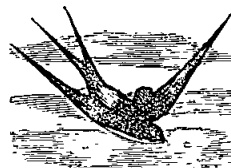

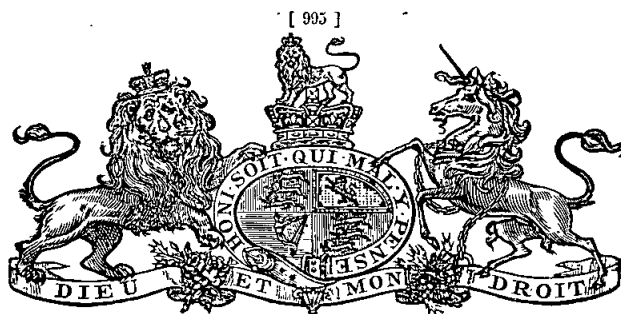
