DECLARATION, WITH ANNEX, AGREED UPON BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND FRANCE RELATIVE TO THE NEW-HEBRIDES.

With reference to previous correspondence respecting the Convention signed at Paris on the 16th of November last, between the Governments of Great Britain and France, relating to the New Hebrides, I have the honor to transmit to you, for the information of your Government, copies of a Declaration with Annex agreed upon between those Governments, pursuant to Art. III. of the Convention respecting the Joint Naval Commission which was signed at Paris on the 26th ult.

The Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has requested the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty to issue the necessary instructions in connection with this Commission to the Admiral-in-Chief on the Australian Station.

Declaration agreed upon between the Governments of Great Britain and France, pursuant to Article III. of the Convention of November 16, 1887, relative to the New Hebrides.

1. A Joint Naval Commission shall be immediately constituted, composed of naval officers belonging to the British and French Stations in the Pacific, charged with the duty of maintaining order, and of protecting the lives and property of British and French subjects in the New Hebrides.

2. The said Commission shall be composed of a President and two British and two French Naval officers: the said Officers to be named by any person having commission for that purpose from the British and French Governments respectively. From the date of the first composition of the Commission the President shall be in alternate months the Commanding Officer of the British and French Naval Forces respectively, present in the group; it being decided by lot which of the two officers shall first act as President. The Commission shall assemble at the request of either Commanding Officer. In the absence of the President for the time being, the other Commanding Officer shall preside, and the Commission shall have power to act if two other members be present, of whom one is British and the other French.

3. The Commission shall carry out its duties in conformity with the Regulations annexed to this Declaration, and with any further Regulations which may from time to time be agreed upon between the two Governments.

In witness whereof the undersigned, duly authorized by their respective Governments for that purpose, have signed the present Declaration, and have affixed thereto the seal of their arms.

Il sera décidé par la voie du sort lequel de ces deux officiers remplira le premier les fonctions de Président. En l'absence de l'officier commandant, Président pour la période courante, l'autre officier commandant présidera, et la Commission aura pouvoir d'agir si deux autres de ces membres, l'un Anglais, l'autre Français, sont présents.

## Annex.

Regulations for the Guidance of the Joint Naval Commission.

1. In the event of a disturbance of peace and good order in any part of the New Hebrides where British or French subjects may be settled, or in case of danger menacing the safety of life or property, the Commission shall forthwith assemble, and take such measures as it may think best under the circumstances for repressing the disturbance, or for the protection of the interests endangered.

2. No British or French Naval Commander shall take independent or isolated action, except as hereinafter mentioned.

3. Military force shall not be resorted to unless the Commission shall consider its employment to be indispensable.

4. In the event of the landing of a naval or military force, such force shall not remain longer than may be considered necessary by the Commission.

5. Where the circumstances may not admit of any delay, and the urgency of the case may call for immediate action before the assembling of the Commission, the British and French Commanders nearest the scene of action shall, in concert if possible, or separately if such concert be not practicable, take the necessary measures for the protection of the interests endangered, and shall report such action forthwith to their Senior Naval Officers on the Station, and await the further orders of the Commission. Each Senior Naval Officer, on receiving such report, shall at once communicate it to the other.

6. The Commission shall have no further or other powers than are expressly delegated to it by these Regulations, and shall not interfere in disputes concerning the title to land, or dispossession of their lands any persons, natives, or foreigners.

Dans le cas où les circonstances ne comporteraient aucun retard, et où il y aurait urgence à agir immédiatement sans attendre la réunion de la Commission, les Commandants Anglais et Français qui se trouveront le plus rapprochés du théâtre des événements prendront les mesures nécessaires pour la protection des intérêts en péril, de concert si cela est possible, ou séparément s'il y a des empêchements à ce qu'ils se concertent. Ils adresseront aussitôt à leurs Commandants de station respectifs un rapport sur les mesures prises, et ils attendront les ordres ultérieurs de la Commission. Les Commandants de Station se communiqueront l'un à l'autre ce rapport; dès qu'ils le recevront.

6. La Commission n'aura pas de pouvoirs, ni autres ni plus étendus que ceux qui lui sont expressément délégués par ces Règlements. 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# COMMISSIONS IN THE BRITISH ARMY TO OFFICERS OF COLONIAL LOCAL MILITARY FORCES.

Sir,—I have the honor to transmit to you, for your information, and for that of your Government, the accompanying copies of the amended Regulations under which Commissions in the British Army may be obtained by officers of Colonial Military Forces.

I request that these Regulations may be substituted for those which accompanied my predecessor's despatch of the 20th of September 1886.

*Regulations under which Commissions in the British Army may be obtained by Officers of Colonial Local Military Forces.*

1. Commissions in the Cavalry or Infantry of the Line will be granted to Officers who are *bonâ fide* colonists of the Local Military Forces of certain colonies, to be specified from time to time, under the conditions hereinafter prescribed as to age, physical, and moral fitness, length of service in the Colonial Forces, literary and military qualifications, and general eligibility for the position of an Officer in Her Majesty's Regular Forces.

2. A candidate will be required to have served at least fifteen months as an Officer in the Local Military Force of the Colony from which he is nominated, and must have attended two annual trainings, or have seen active service in the field. A certificate to this effect from his commanding officer must be attached to the candidate's papers.

3. The candidate must be between the age of 19 and 22 on the 1st January of the year in which he is allowed to present himself for the examination hereafter specified. A certificate of birth, or a declaration of his exact age, made by the candidate's parents or guardian before a magistrate, must be attached to his papers when forwarded to the War Office.

4. He will be required to undergo an inspection by a Medical Board, to be convened by the Governor of the Colony, or other proper authority, and will not be allowed to proceed further with his candidature unless certified by such Board to be physically qualified, in all respects for a commission in the Army.

5. An intending candidate must apply for a nomination to the Governor, through his Commanding Officer, or such other channel as the Governor may prescribe, in sufficient time to allow of arrangements being made for his undergoing the military examination before he has exceeded the limit of age specified in para. 3.

6. A candidate will not be allowed to enter upon his examination until he has satisfied the Governor of the Colony in which he is serving, that he is actually a colonist, that he is of good moral character, and, in all other respects, a fit and proper person to hold a commission in Her Majesty's Army. A certificate from the Governor to this effect must be attached to the candidate's papers when they are forwarded to the War Office.

7. The candidate will be required to undergo a qualifying literary examination in the following subjects:—

- (1.) Mathematics—viz. (a) arithmetic, including vulgar and decimal fractions, proportion and simple interest; (b) Euclid, Book I.; (c) algebra, up to and including simple equations.
- (2.) French, German, or some other modern language; the examination being limited to translation from the language and grammatical questions.
- (3.) Writing English correctly, and in a good legible hand, from dictation.  
English composition, tested by the power of writing an essay, letter, or précis.
- (4.) The elements of geometrical drawing; including the construction of scales, and the use of simple mathematical instruments.
- (5.) Geography.

In addition to the foregoing, the candidate will be required to select and qualify in two, and not more than two, of the following subjects:—

- (a.) Mathematics—viz., algebra, up to and including the binomial theorem; the theory and use of logarithms; Euclid, Books I. to IV. and VI.; plane trigonometry, up to and including the solution of triangles; and mensuration.
- (b.) Classics (Latin or Greek).
- (c.) English history—General.
- (d.) Freehand drawing.

8. The candidate will be exempted from the above examination, except in geometrical drawing, if he can produce a certi-

cate from the proper University authority that he has taken his degree in Arts, or has passed the examination for the degree of B.A. or M.A., at one of the following Universities, viz.:—

Oxford,	Edinburgh,
Cambridge,	St. Andrews,
Durham,	Glasgow,
London,	Aberdeen,
Dublin,	The Royal University, Ireland.*

or from one of the chartered Colonial Universities; or if he has passed one of the University Examinations specified below, viz.:—

Oxford, "Moderations."  
Cambridge, "the Previous Examination."  
Dublin, "the Final Examination of the Senior Freshman year," or, "the Final Examination of the School of Engineering."  
Durham, "the First Year's Examination."  
The Royal University, Ireland, "the Second University Examination in Arts or the second professional Examination in Engineering."  
Scotch Universities, "the Examination for Candidates for the Army."

London University, the "First Examination" for the degrees of B.A., LL.B., Sc., or M.B.; or if he has passed some other test which is accepted by the University as exempting from the above examinations.

An equivalent examination at one of the chartered Colonial Universities will likewise be accepted as a sufficient ground for exemption.

9. The subjects of the Military Examination and the maximum marks obtainable in each subject will be as follows:—

	Marks.
1. The Elements of Field Fortification	600
2. Military Topography	600
3. The Elements of Tactics	600
4. Military Law	600

In order to qualify for a commission, a candidate will be required to obtain 25 of the marks in each subject, and 5 of the aggregate.

The scope will be that embraced by the Synopsis of the Course of Instruction (in the subjects specified in paragraph 9) at the Royal Military College.\* There will, however, be no practical out-of-door examination in any subject. The text books will be those in use at the time at the Royal Military College, Sandhurst, which, for the present, are as follows:—

10. Sets of papers for the examination in both the literary and military subjects will be forwarded in due course, in sealed envelopes, to the Governors of the respective colonies, who will convene Boards, the duty of which will be to see that the papers are fairly worked by the candidates. The papers will then be returned without delay to the Director-General of Military Education, War Office, London, for adjudication.

The Governor of the Colony will notify to the War Office, through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, as early as possible in each year, whether he has any duly qualified candidates to nominate, and will, at the same time, state how many sets of papers he will be likely to require for their examination.

The literary examination will be held in the month of July.

11. Until further notice, two Army commissions will be allotted to each of the undermentioned colonies annually:—

New South Wales.  
South Australia.  
Victoria.  
Queensland.  
New Zealand.  
Cape of Good Hope.

12. In the event of the number of candidates nominated by the Governor in a colony at any time exceeding the allotted number of commissions, the selection will be decided by competition in the military portion of the prescribed examination.

THE Commissioners of the Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers contained in *The Water Conservation Act 1837*, do make the following Regulation:—

## No. 7.

Regulation for making a rate on the several lands and tenements to be supplied otherwise than by measure with water for domestic purposes in the Urban Districts of Kerang and Castle Donnington.

1. A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling on the annual value of the several lands and tenements to be supplied with water for domestic purposes in the urban districts of Kerang and Castle Donnington, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements comprised within the said urban districts of Kerang and Castle Donnington for the municipal rates of the shire of Swan Hill, is hereby made for the year commencing on the 1st day of January 1888 and ending on the 31st day of December 1888.

2. For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum shall be due and payable.

3. Such rate is hereby made payable in manner provided by section 118 of the Act No. 946.

4. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust shall from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rate.

The foregoing Regulation, No. 7, was made by the Commissioners of the said Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of section 119 of *The Water Conservation Act 1837*, on the 10th day of January 1888, and confirmed by the said Commissioners on the 7th day of February 1888.

## CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best condition, and to be delivered in sound packages, free from all charges for cartage, freight, &c.

2. Supplies for country stations for which no local contract may have been taken, or for which the contract has been terminated, may be ordered under the Melbourne contract.

3. Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the price demanded, except brandy casks, porter cases, hogsheads, butter firkins, and soap boxes (not including fancy soaps), flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for. The empties to be removed at the contractor's expense.

4. Bread.—A sample of the best ordinarily retailed to the public will be considered as a test loaf for first quality. Third quality (that issued to prisoners of the Crown) to be made of flour, fine sharps, the produce of prime, strong, thin-skinned, good colored wheat, to be perfectly free from coarse pollard or other offal.

5. Milk.—The milk must be fresh, pure, and of the best quality, and subject to test when required by the department. Should the supply prove to be not of contract quality, any expense incurred will be charged to the contractor.

6. Fresh meat is to be supplied in such proportions as may be required, and, when the quality admits, to be delivered in fore and hind quarters alternately, also buttocks only when ordered. When shins of beef form a portion of the supply, a fair proportion of the bone, not less than ten inches, must have been cut off. The sticking pieces must be removed from the fore quarters of beef.

7. Potatoes to be dry and free from dirt. Contractors to supply 105 lbs. of potatoes for each cental credited to them, and, in addition, to take back all rejected before being cooked.

8. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of department concerned.

9. The order issued by the head of department must accompany the goods, and the account is to be rendered simultaneously with the delivery of the supplies. For the supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts, the account is to be rendered monthly for such quantities only as are issued, the difference between the supply and issue to be kept at the contractor's credit. Supplies not issued at the termination of the contract to be removed by the contractor. The rates or quantities quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.

10. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order, they will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account.

11. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a board of survey composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 10.

12. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which it will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 10.

13. In the case of supplies for lunatic asylums, it will also be competent for two or more of the official visitors, in conjunction with the medical superintendent, to reject any supplies that they may consider not in accordance with contract; and in such cases the reference to a board of survey will not be deemed to be necessary on the part of the contractor.

14. In the case of supplies for lunatic asylums, it will be competent for a board of survey, consisting of the medical superintendent (or, in his absence, of the deputy medical superintendent) and any two officers named by him, to examine and reject any supplies that may be objected to. It must be distinctly understood, however, that the contractor will have a right of appeal to the Treasurer of the colony for the time being; but pending such appeal, he must take back the rejected articles and at once supply others of approved quality; failing which, the supplies required may be obtained by the officer concerned, and the expense charged to the contractor.

15. As the exact quantity of any article of provisions which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same as ordered.



16. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the persons to whom the rations are due or to the contractor in waiting for a board to survey, the head of the department, or officer in charge of the station, will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which, it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 10.

17. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivery or replacing them when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the said Treasurer may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer to terminate the contract forthwith and forfeit the whole or any part of the security.

18. **SHIRE OF LILLYDALE.**

*A Bye-law of the Shire of Lillydale, made under section 213 of "The Local Government Act 1874," and section 50 of "The Local Government Act Amendment Act 1883," and numbered 8, for the adoption of the undermentioned provisions of the 13th schedule of the said Act.*

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Local Government Act 1874," the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Lillydale, order as follows:—

That the following portions of Part I of the 13th schedule of "The Local Government Act 1874" is hereby adopted in and for the Shire of Lillydale:—

Subdivision 3—clauses 13 and 14.

Subdivision 4—clauses 15, 16, 17, 19, 23, 25, 26.

Subdivision 5—clause 27.

*Drains for discharge of surface water from land.*

Every owner or occupier of land in, adjoining to, or near any street or road, if such land be so situated that surface or storm water from or upon the same overflows or tends naturally, if not otherwise discharged, to overflow any footway of such street or road, shall within seven days next after the service of notice by the council for that purpose, construct and lay from such point upon such land being near to the footway as shall be specified in such notice by plan appended or otherwise, and higher in level than the bottom of the channel at the outer edge of the footway to the said channel, and through under and transversely to the footway, and keep in good condition such covered drain or trunk as and subject to the inspection of such officer as the Council shall have appointed in that behalf; and in default of compliance with any such notice within the period aforesaid, or with the provisions of this section, such owner or occupier shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty shillings for every day during which he shall make default.

It shall be lawful for the Council to make regulations for all or any of the purposes following (that it say):—

For regulating the materials, and the size, the level, and the fall of any drain or trunk to be laid or constructed under any footway, either absolutely or with relation to the level or fall of the footway, or channel, or otherwise, in like manner; and so if they please that such size be variable within limits prescribed in the regulation, according to the discretion of such officer as the Council shall thereby direct.

*Crossings over footways and channels.*

Every person who wilfully, and without lawful excuse, rides or drives any horse or other animal, or drives or wheels any carriage, cart, or other vehicle upon, along, or across any footway, or any water channel or gutter, herein called channel, by the side of any street or road, save in each such case upon and by or at some crossing to be made as hereinafter mentioned, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds, and shall also pay to the Council such sum, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of compensation for any damage done by him to the footway or channel as the justice adjudicating upon the information shall, on the hearing thereof, order.

If any land shall front to, adjoin, or abut upon the footway of any street or road, and if access with horses and vehicles from such street or road to such land or to some sufficient way appurtenant thereto cannot be had without riding, driving, or wheeling the same respectively upon or across the said footway or the channel (if any) lying along the outer edge thereof, and if the owner of such land shall desire that a crossing for horses and other animals and for vehicles be made as herein provided over such footway and channel, and shall give a notice in writing of such his desire to the Council, and in such notice describe the land in question and the proposed work by reference to the specification deposited as hereinafter mentioned, such specification being in accordance with the provisions hereof and with such regulation as may be force in that behalf. It shall be lawful for such owner, after seven clear days from the giving such notice, and not before (with no unnecessary delay or obstruction), at his own cost, and under the inspection of such officer as the Council shall have appointed for the purpose, to make such crossing according to the tenor of such notice and specification, and not otherwise, and the owner of such land shall afterwards in like manner maintain the same.

Every such owner who desires, as aforesaid, that any such crossing shall be made, shall, before giving notice to the Council as herein provided, deposit with the municipal clerk a specification, describing the proposed work with respect to each of the several matters hereby or by any such regulation in force in that behalf required or provided.

In streets or roads in which, at the site of any such proposed crossing, there is a curb of stone or wood along the outer edge of the footway, the crossing, so far as the footway extends, shall have on both sides a curb not higher in any part than the surface of the footway at that part, and similar in all respects to such first-mentioned curb, and such curb shall approach to and join the street-curb in gentle curves outwards, and such crossings shall be of such width, and the surface thereof, so far as the footway extends, shall have such inclination outwards, and be depressed so far below the footway as shall have been respectively appointed by some regulation in that behalf, and shall, with respect to the channel, be so laid or constructed as not to raise or obstruct the same or any part thereof.

If any private street or road shall meet at an angle the footway of any public street or road, and there shall be no crossing upon and across such footway and the channel adjacent thereto from such private street or road to such public street or road, it shall be lawful for the Council, if they shall see fit, to make, in accordance with any regulation in force in that behalf, a crossing upon and over such footway and channel of the description hereinbefore provided with respect to other crossings, and to recover from the owner of each of the tenements abutting on such private street or road such portion of the expenses of such making as shall bear to the whole of such expenses the same proportion as the rateable value of such tenement bears to the whole rateable value of all the tenements so abutting.

If any crossing shall be out of repair, and the person liable hereunder to maintain or repair the same shall, for seven days after notice from the Council to that effect, neglect properly and completely to repair the same, he shall forfeit for every day that such crossing shall remain so unrepared a sum of Forty shillings, and the Council may, if they shall see fit, effect such repair, and recover the same from such person before any justice.

It shall be lawful for the Council from time to time to make regulations for all or any of the purposes following, that is to say:—

For regulating the width, depression, and inclination of crossings across or over footways and channels, and the materials for making or constructing the same, the mode of laying and bedding such materials, the length, width, size, strength, and fall of bridge crossings and the said inclination and fall, either absolutely or with relation to the levels, inclination, or fall of the footway or channel, or otherwise in like manner.

*Deposit or discharge of rubbish, liquid, &c., on streets, &c.*

Every person who causes to run from any manufactory or any establishment for the boiling or preparing of any animal matter, or any brewery, slaughter-house, butcher's shop, or any dung-hill or other receptacle, or from any inn, into or upon any street or road, public or private, or any footway or channel, and every occupier of any land or premises who causes or permits to run from such land or premises into or upon any such street or road footway or channel any offensive liquid or matter shall, for every day during which any such liquid or matter shall so run, forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds.
